Cacchiotta Ranch's homebred Anthonys Cleopatra scored a 3 3/4-length victory in the \$75,000 California Oaks run at Golden Gate Fields on April 30 to become the first Washington-bred stakes winner of 2022. Unraced at two, the Tim McCanna trainee was making her stakes debut and expanded her record to 3-1-0 from four starts. The daughter of Constitution—Luxor Lady, by Pioneerof the Nile has earned \$88,000, all at the Albany track. Frank T. Alvarado was aboard Anthonys Cleopatra as they finished the 1 1/16-miles race in 1:45.36. Music Festival, by Vancouver (Aus), was second, a head better than She's Got a Way, by Tonalist.

Anthonys Cleopatra had been purchased in utero at the 2019 Keeneland January Sale of All Ages for \$30,000. She is the first foal for her dam, who produced a colt by Stay Thirsty this spring. Luxor Lady is a half-sister to Grade 3 \$206,950 stakes winner Euphrosyne.

Thirty-one horses were offered and sold during the online dispersal of Glen Todd horses held April 27 to May 3, 2022. The first phase of the dispersal consisted of 14 two-year-olds, seven three-year-olds, three older runners and seven yearlings. A major British Columbia horseman, Todd had passed away on March 26. The Todd horses were consigned and stabled with Pegasus Training Center in Redmond. The 31 head sold for a \$1,197,500 gross, \$38,629 average and \$24,000 median.

Topping the sale for \$200,000 was Adiva, a daughter of Street Sense that had been purchased at the 2021 Keeneland September Yearling Sale for \$230,000. NJP Racing, the sale's leading buyer, signed the ticket for her, 2020 Washington Oaks winner Princess of Cairo (Cairo Prince—Lovely Cool) for \$110,000 and Call Me Fast, a three-year-old gelding by Dialed In out of British Columbia stakes winner Caged Mistress, for \$60,000. NJP Racing is an international syndicate group and the trio will be joining trainer Mike Puhich's string in Kentucky.

Kenny Alhadeff and his Elttaes Stable purchased three-time stakes winner Five Star General, a 2016 son of Distorted Humor who also placed in the Longacres Mile (G3) twice and earned \$310,174, for \$110,000, the third highest offering.

2021 Emerald Downs stakes-placed Board Approval, a 2018 daughter of Carpe Diem, was sold to Machmer Hall for \$55,000.

Another \$55,000 sale was Extraordinaire, a two-year-old Tapwrit gelding purchased by Jody Peetz, of Issaquah.

Washington-bred sophomore filly Chivalryisnotdead, by Honor Code, the final foal out of Emerald Downs champion and multiple Emerald champion producer Taste the Passion, was a \$30,000 sale.

Duane Weber, of Bonney Lake, purchased Toe Dancer, a threeyear-old Tapizar filly out of stakes winner Marketway, for \$30,000.

Three 2021 WTBOA Yearling Sale purchases were resold: the \$47,000 saletopper Termsofengagement, a gelding by Liam's Map, brought a \$70,000 bid from Anthony Spinazzola; Adjournment, a Harbor the Gold—Flying Memo gelding was sold to Barry Arnason

for \$46,000; and Duplication, by Cairo Prince, brought \$30,000 from Dr. Robert M. Jones.

Another juvenile, Lahun, a colt by Cairo Prince out of Todd's Washington champion racemare Castinette Dancer, was sold to Don Danard for \$28,000.

The high price among the yearlings was a colt by Bernardini— Beauty's Cause, which brought a \$24,000 final bid. Portland, Oregon, resident Eric Jensen purchased a Free Drop Billy—Doe Run filly for \$20,000.

There were a total of 250 registered bidders for the sale who cast 1,305 bids, for 42 average bids per horse.

Basis a three-year-old with a second place finish in a six-panel turf maiden special weight race at Santa Anita. After running sixth in her second outing at the Arcadia oval, Blazingbellablu was sent north to Emerald Downs where she was runner-up in another maiden special weight. She proved victorious in her fourth maiden allowance try and after following up that tally with another allowance win, the daughter of Grazen has raced exclusively in stakes company.

Blazingbellablu made her stakes debut in the 6 1/2-furlong Kent Stakes, going off as the \$2.00-to-one favorite in the field of eight. After breaking mid-pack, the gray/roan filly drew away to score a 2 1/4-length victory.

Blazingbellablu would next finish fourth in both the Washington Oaks and WA Cup Filly and Mare Stakes. Seattle Stakes winner and eventual 2021 Washington most improved claimer Ms Lynn ran third in each of those stakes.

Blazingbellablu next headed south to Arizona's Turf Paradise where she would finish the year competing in three stakes, the first two against older fillies and mares.

In November, at 12-to-one odds, she was victorious in the six-furlong Jack and Jeff Coady Sr. Stakes. Three weeks later Blazingbellablu was back to take the mile City of Phoenix Stakes by nearly two lengths.

Blazingbellablu finished her year with a second place finish in the December 29 Bell of the Ball Overnight Stakes, a mile run for sophomore distaffers.

Since leaving Santa Anita, Blazingbellablu has been trained by her co-owner and co-breeder Charlie Essex and partnered in the saddle by 2021 leading Emerald Downs rider Alex Cruz in all nine of her other starts.

Not only is Blazingbellablu the leading Washington-bred earner of 2021, she is also the only Washington-bred to earn three stakes victories last year.

Blazingbellablu was sired by top California stallion Grazen, who ranked third in the Golden State in 2021 with over \$3.5-million in earnings. Grazen, now 16, stands at Tommy Town Thoroughbreds in Santa Ynez, California, where his 2022 stud fee is \$6,000. A son of the good Alydar stallion Benchmark, Grazen won three stakes – led by a nearly three-length tally in the Affirmed Handicap {G3) – from his four wins in just seven starts and earned \$245,400.

Blazingbellablu is only the sixth sophomore distaffer to claim

WTBOA Sales Graduate

As a two-year-old Coastal Kid showed promise, when after winning his initial start, a six-furlong Emerald Downs maiden special weight race by 3 3/4-lengths, he finished third to Washington champion Dutton in the Gottstein Futurity. His connections thought so highly of him that he was sent to Del Mar for two November stakes.

Coastal Kid was the only Washington-bred nominated to the 2021 Kentucky Derby (G1).

After a four-month break Coastal Kid made his sophomore debut in a mile turf allowance at Golden Gate Fields and ran second by three-quarters of a length in the April 4 event. Three weeks later he was back to finish fourth in the mile Singletary Stakes over Santa Anita's turf course. In his next four starts, he added one second (at the Los Alamitos Thoroughbred meet) and two thirds (at Golden Gate).

August saw his return to Emerald Downs, where he ran second, beaten a nose, in a mile allowance. Coastal Kid followed that with another close second in the Muckleshoot Derby, where he finished a head back of 2021 Emerald Downs horse of the meet Top Executive in a "game effort."

Sent against older Washington-bred rivals in the Muckleshoot Tribal Classic, Coastal Kid "kicked clear" to take the 1 1/16-mile race by 3 1/4 lengths.

After an unplaced stakes effort at Del Mar in November, the Coast Guard gelding appeared in the entries at Turf Paradise where he finished the year with a second in a mile turf allowance and a fourth in the Richard Hazellton Overnight Stakes.

Coastal Kid is the third Washington champion – joining twoyear-olds So Lucky and Windy Point – sired by El Dorado Farms stallion Coast Guard. The Grade 1-placed full brother to Eclipse sprint champion Stormy Liberal led the Washington two-year-old

Coastal Kid and his stakes-winning and still competing eightyear-old half-sister Camano Comet, were produced out of Chileanbred Crème, who is also the dam of Crème de Menthe, a 2020 daughter of California-based Curlin to Mischief.

Coastal Kid's first five dams were bred in Chile. His sixth dam, Iuria, was born in Argentina in 1956 and produced Premio Parteno winner and four-time North American victor *Rejucilo.

Lewin, whose first experience with racehorses was working at S. J. Agnew's T9O Ranch breaking yearlings in 1974, also bred Celtic Dreamin, a Grade 3 California-bred stakes winner of \$600,543, and Washington-bred stakes winner Expressionator.

Blazingbellablu is the final and only foal bred by Petra Lewin's Rainbow Meadows Farm and Essex out of the Sky Mesa mare Bellomesa, who had been purchased by Lewin five years ago as a pasturemate for her then yearling filly Street Sonata (who won at Turf Paradise on March 8).

hough not a stakes winner, three-year-old Harbored Memories proved a worthy opponent in California turf allowance races. Unraced at two, Harbored Memories made his sophomore debut in January, in the first of three consecutive maiden special weight seconds (mile turf, 6 1/2-furlong dirt, mile dirt). In his fourth outing, he scored by a head in a 6 1/2-panel maiden special weight over Santa Anita's turf course.

In his next outing, an allowance/\$100,000 optional claiming race (N), under the same conditions and track as his previous win, Harbored Memories "drove clear" for a 1 1/2-length victory.

Sent to Del Mar, Harbored Memories made two starts. After finishing tenth as the third betting choice in the one-mile turf Oceanside Stakes, the bay colt ran second (by a length) to Grade 3 turf stakes winner Beer Can Man in a five-panel turf allowance,.

In his first start of 2022, Harbored Memories finished second by a head in a 6 1/2-furlong race over Santa Anita's turf course on March 12, adding \$14,400 to his totals.

Harbored Memories and 2021 Washington champion Papa's Golden Boy are among 29 state champions (including two 2021 Oregon champions) sired by the late Oregon powerhouse Harbor the Gold, who earned his 13th leading Oregon sire award last year. Both Harbored Memories and Papa's Golden Boy were bred by Neal and Pam Christopherson's Bar C Racing Stables, home to Harbor the Gold until his death at age 20 last May due to major stifle issues.

Harbored Memories is the second state champion produced out of the 2007 El Prado (Ire) mare Fresia. She is also the dam of Galilean, a son of champion and top sire Uncle Mo, who was named 2019 California champion three-year-old male. All six of Galilean's wins came in California stakes at ages two and three. He also ran third in the Grade 2 Rebel Stakes at Oaklawn Park. The \$592,522 earner entered stud in 2022 at Hidden Lake Farm in Stillwater, New York, for a \$7.000 fee.

The Christophersons had purchased Fresia, carrying Galilean, for \$35,000 at the 2015 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. The couple sold Galilean for \$60,000 at the Barretts August Yearling Sale and the following year his new owners pinhooked him for a sale topping \$600,000 at the Barretts Two-year-old Spring Training Sale.

In 2019 the Christophersons partnered with the Uncle Mo Syndicate to breed Fresia back to that stallion. That foal, Caribbean Beauty, brought a \$700,000 bid at the 2021 Keeneland September Yearling Sale.Fresia produced a Goldencents filly in California in 2021 for the Christophersons.

nraced at two, the Lusk family's Papa's Golden Boy continues to improve with age.

At three, Papa's Golden Boy made four starts with his best a second in \$25,000 maiden claimer.

Returning to Emerald Downs the following June, he won a 6 1/2-furlong waiver maiden \$25,000 claiming race (N) by 1 1/4 lengths in gate-to-wire fashion. Three weeks later he scored an eight-length tally, again in gate-to-wire fashion, even after a bobble at the start of the six-panel allowance.

The runner next finished second, by a half-length to champion Elliott Bay, in his initial stakes foray, the 6 1/2-furlong Mt. Rainier Stakes. A fifth place finish in the Longacres Mile (G3) followed and his third win of the year came via a 2 1/4-length victory in a six-panel allowance.

Papa's Golden Boy breezed into 2021 with three consecutive wins, the first in a 5 1/2-furlong allowance/\$40,000 optional claiming race that he wired by six. He returned to stakes company with a 2 3/4-length tally over multiple state champion Baja Sur in the sixfurlong Budweiser Stakes. Then, sent off as the even-money favorite in the 6 1/2-panel Governor's Stakes, he outfinished two-time state champion Unmachable by 2 1/2 lengths.

A repeat in the Longacres Mile followed, and while he did improve his finish to fourth in the historic race, it was almost 2 1/2 lengths behind winner Background.

All of Papa's Golden Boy's Emerald Downs starts had been in trainer Vince Gibson's care. Later that fall, he was sent to trainer Jack Steiner's barn in California. The six-year-old gelding made two starts. Following a fourth and last place finish in a five-furlong allowance/\$100,000 optional claiming race at Del Mar in his first attempt on the turf, he returned to Steiner's home base at Golden Gate Fields and finished his year with a sixth place finish in the six-furlong Oakland Handicap after setting the early fractions.

Papa's Golden Boy and his year-younger full brother Gold Crusher, who won the 2020 Muckleshoot Derby, are among the 45 stakes winners sired by Harbor the Gold, a half-brother to Eclipse champion two-year-old colt Boston Harbor.

Also due to having two stakes winners, Bar C Racing Stables' Brookie Girl was named 2021 Washington broodmare of the year.

riginally purchased by Mark Dedomenico LLC for \$4,700 out of the 2018 WTBOA Summer Sale, Itsallinthenotes made four starts (led by two third place runs) while in his colors and being trained by Mike Puhich, before being claimed for \$7,500 at Turfway Park in December of her sophomore season. Unraced at two, her first three starts had been in maiden \$50,000 claiming events at Keeneland and Churchill Downs.

In January 2021, Itsallinthenotes would win her next outing by five lengths (a maiden \$20,000 claiming race at Oaklawn Park), but then would change hands again after taking her following race, a \$12,500 claimer, also at the Arkansas track, in April.

Sent to the allowance ranks by new owner Dennis Bailey's RMFR Stables. Itsallinthenotes moved to Louisiana Downs where she had a fourth, a third and a ninth (in her first turf attempt) and then ran third in a \$12,500 claimer before returning to allowance company.

After a 2 1/2-month rest, the filly's next start came at Remington Park where she finished second by a neck in the mile test. Itsallinthenotes finished off her year with a half-length win in a 1 1/16-mile allowance in December. Her \$103,771 earnings rank fourth among all Washington-bred starters in 2021.

In February, Itsallinthenotes ran third in her 2022 debut in an allowance/\$50,000 optional claiming race at Oaklawn. On March 26, the mare again changed hands after being claimed for \$30,000 by trainer Robertino Diodoro for M and M Racing Stables LLC.

Itsallinthenotes is the second Washington-bred champion distaffer sired by the California-based Ministers Wild Cat, his other being 2011 three-year-old champion Castinette Dancer. The \$368,729 stakes-winning son of Deputy Minister has sired 20 stakes winners and the earners of \$22-million. Now 22, the Tommy Town Farm stallion was recently pensioned from stud duties.

Itsallinthenotes is the second winner and third foal out of \$146,165 earner For Real Too, whose six wins were evenly distributed between Monmouth Park and Penn National and came at a mile, mile and 70 vards and 1 1/16 miles.

For Real Too is a half-sister to 16-race winner Brimstone Island, who placed in three Maryland stakes and earned \$302,593.

A daughter of two-time Grade 2 winner E Dubai, For Real Too produced a colt by Raised a Secret in 2021.

Itsallinthenotes is the sixth Washington champion bred by Charlie Dunn's Dunn Bar Ranch LLC. His first champion was two-year-old Sundance Circle (2003), who was followed by the runner's full sister No Constraints in 2007. No Constraints would produce two state champion fillies for Dunn: Invested Prospect

A fter winning his initial outing – a June 30 maiden special race at Emerald Downs – by 6 1/2 lengths while racing solely for Roy and Ellie Schaefer's R. E. V. Racing, Aron Wellman's Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners and winning trainer Frank Lucarelli's Lucarelli Racing Corp. names appeared as co-owners less than three weeks later for his next outing. And the new owners weren't disappointed, as the dark bay gelding romped to a gate-to-wire 13 1/2 length victory in the King County Express Stakes.

Sent off as the \$1.60-to-one favorite in the WTBOA Lads Stakes, Cobra Jet was bumped at the start of the 6 1/2-furong race and chased eventual winner A View From Above to the wire. The latter beat him by 1 1/4 lengths, while giving him three pounds, but it was 10 3/4 lengths back to third place Sargent Kline.

In his final start of the year Cobra Jet redeemed himself with a 5 1/4-length win in the WA Cup Juvenile Colt and Gelding Stakes, again at 6 1/2 furlongs. A View From Above ran third.

Cobra Jet is a son of the extremely well-bred, but unraced, Curlin to Mischief. The son of two-time Horse of the Year and classic winner Curlin is a progeny of 2016 broodmare of the year and stakes winner Leslie's Lady, dam of three-time champion Beholder and her Grade 1-winning half-brothers Into Mischief and Mendelssohn. Into Mischief has led the North American sire rankings the past three years including his record-setting 2021 mark of \$24,411,267.

Curlin to Mischief, whose first crop turned four in 2022, stands for a \$3,500 fee at Rancho San Miguel in California.

Cobra Jet, who had been a \$5,500 WTBOA Summer Sale yearling, is the first foal out of another well-bred, but unraced, individual. Atta Gal Val is a daughter of multiple Washington champion racehorse and sire Atta Boy Roy, and her dam Coup de Foudre was named Washington broodmare of the year in 2012. The daughter of Basket Weave produced two state champions: 2012 Washington horse of the year and Emerald Downs top three-year-old male runner Makors Finale; and four-time Washington champion Absolutely Cool, who won or placed in 28 Emerald Downs or Turf Paradise stakes. Love Makor, a full sister to Makors Finale, placed in four Turf Paradise stakes and is her dam's third \$100,000-plus winner. Love Makor is the dam of juvenile stakes-placed Love the Vino.

Atta Gal Val produced a full sister to Cobra Jet in 2021.



oron's championship season only lasted 36 days, but in those three starts she proved unbeatable. After winning a five-furlong maiden special weight in gate-to-wire fashion on August 7, she came back two weeks later to take the 6 1/2-furlong Barbara Shinpoch Stakes by 5 1/2 lengths. The Blue Ribbon Racing Ladiesraced filly finished her campaign with a 1 1/4-length tally in the WA Cup Juvenile Filly Stakes, also at 6 1/2 furlongs. All her starts were at Emerald Downs.

While Koron is trainer Kay Cooper's first "official" Washington champion, she was her father Jim Penney's "second in command" for many others.

Koron, which is Polish for "crown," is one of two Washington filly champions sired by Nationhood. The other being 2014 three-year-old filly Find Your Spot, who was also bred by Rick and Debbie Pabst.

Nationhood, a three-time stakes winner of \$181,920, stood his entire career at the Pabsts' Blue Ribbon Farm in Buckley. Until his death in November 2020 at 18 due to cancer of the spleen, he was one of the few remaining stallions representing the Red God link to the *Nasrullah sire line. Nationhood was one of 53 stakes winners sired by champion sprinter Cherokee Run, a son of Travers Stakes (G1) winner Runaway Groom, who in-turn was sired by French twoyear-old champion Blushing Groom (Fr), by Red God. Nationhood's final crop of foals are yearlings of 2022.

Muchas Coronas was represented by three winners in 2021. Besides Koron, her daughter La Una won an allowance/\$50,000 optional claiming (N) race and ran third in Seattle Stakes. Cascade Dancer, a 2017 full sister to Koron, won her only start, a 5 1/2-furlong Emerald allowance by two lengths.

At the track, Muchas Coronas – who was also bred and raced by the Pabsts – finished fourth in her only start at two, the \$50,000Angie C. Stakes. She won a 5 1/2-furlong maiden special weight race in her first start as a three-year-old. Her second win would come at four in a \$25,000 claiming race.

Muchas Coronas, a daughter of Eclipse champion two-year-old Macho Uno, was one of three winners produced out of two-time Emerald Downs stakes winner Cascade Corona, another stakeswinning distaffer bred and raced by the Pabsts. Cascade Coronas' two other winners were both stakes-placed: Sunpenny, by Good Reward; and Frisky Bear, by Nationhood.

Koron's third dam, Aqueduct allowance winner Warna Corna, was a full or half-sister to three graded stakes performers, led by \$795,991 earner Casual Lies. In addition to winning four California stakes, the Lear Fan colt ran second in the 1992 Kentucky Derby

Atotal of seven Washington-breds had a year-high five wins last year, but outside of horse of the year Blazingbellablu, Avalon King had the most earnings. The others were, in order of earnings, fellow claimers River Jumper, Cats Touch, Judicial, Distorted at the bar and minor Alberta stakes winner Golden Cowboy.

Avalon King's 2021 campaign began at Turf Paradise on January 7 for his breeders Sylvia Kenney and Regan Bray. After being claimed for \$8,500 by Larry O'Brien on March 22 (in a runner-up effort), it ended on December 13 at Turf Paradise. He also had five starts at Arizona Downs in between.

Avalon King ran on the grass six times and in one 1,000-yard Quarter Horse race. His wins came at five, 5 1/2 and six furlongs on the dirt, though in his first 2022 outing, the now six-year-old gelding took a 7 1/2-furlong turf race at the Phoenix track. The gelding's other wins came at the \$15,000 (two) and optional \$10,000 and \$20,000 claiming levels. In the latter two races he was not eligible to be claimed.

Avalon King was sired by Heatseeker (Ire), a son of Giant's Causeway who won the Santa Anita Handicap (G1), two other graded stakes and over \$1.1-million. He stood at Harris Farms in California until his early death at age 13 in 2016.

"My wife and I have been racing horses for close to 50 years" said owner Larry O'Brien "and we are thrilled to be fortunate enough for Avalon King to be part of our lives."

Avalon King is one of three named foals out of six-race winner Oneknightledo, a half-sister to 2009 Washington champion juvenile filly Knight Raider, stakes winner Knight Club and stakes-placed Trump Itz and Say Say. Oneknightledo's most recent foal is twoyear-old Gonzaga, a colt by Harbor the Gold.

Racing as a homebred for Ronald Bohlman, Ms Lynn had won a \$15,00 maiden claiming race in September of her juvenile season. She began 2021 with a second, by a neck, effort in a \$15,000 claiming race on May 20 and graduated to the winner's circle three weeks later when taking a race at that same price and distance (5 1/2 furlongs) by two lengths.

Boldly moved up to stakes company for her next start, the Roy Lumm trainee won the six-panel Seattle Stakes by 1 1/2 lengths on June 20 and spent the rest of the year running exclusively in stakes company. In those four starts she finished third in the WA Cup Filly and Mare Stakes and Washington Oaks, one place ahead of champion Blazingbellablu, but was three lengths behind that same runner, again in third, when Blazingbellablu won the Kent Stakes. All of Ms Lynn's 15 lifetime starts have been at Emerald Downs.

Ms Lynn is the first stakes winner sired by Gibson Thoroughbred Farm stallion Linchpin, a \$650,000, 2011 Keeneland September sale yearling. Linchpin had been offered for sale the year following his full brother Quality Road's retirement after six Grade 1 or Grade 2 stakes wins and over \$2.2-million earnings. Since then, Quality Road has become one of the nation's leading sires with four champions – including 2021 Eclipse champion two-year-old colt Corniche – among his 57 stakes winners. His first eight crops of racing age have earned over \$77.3-million.

Ms Lynn is the first foal out of four-race winner Point Da Harbor, who produced a filly by Abraaj in 2020 and a filly by Coast Guard in 2021.

or the second year in a row, Winter Knight has earned honors as Washington Off the Track Thoroughbred (OTTB) of the year. Last year the former race winner, who is shown by his owner Khilia T. Giacobone (Sandston, Virginia) under the name Maei Platinum Star (barn name Wynter), earned his 1,547 points while competing in English pleasure, halter and hunter classes.

The full brother to Oregon champion Catalina Harbor, \$146,237 stakes winner Carrabelle Harbor, stakes winner Fuzzy Dolphin. stakesplaced Silver City Sizzle and \$203,912 earner Can't Get Enough was bred by Neal and Pam Christopherson's Bar C Racing Stables Inc. out of their two-time Oregon champion broodmare Silver City Lilly, a full sister to Oregon champions Silver Patrona and Corona Del Hielo.

Finishing second with 425 points was Audrey Newbrey's Rag Top (shown as Takehertothemoon), who competed in equitation and jumper events. Placed at three, the 2005 gelding by He's Tops out of seven race winner Girls Nite, by Jazzing Around, was bred by Elttaes Stable and Jeff and Doris Harwood. Rag Top is a full brother to five-time stakes-placed Eighty Eight, who won 14 races and earned \$84,656.

Coming narrowly behind in third place was Kaisa Gifford's Best Hoff, who compiled 403 points while competing in English pleasure, dressage and equitation. The 2003 gelding, who was bred by Boyd and Susan Lusaretta, won three races and earned \$13,023. A son of Peterhof, Best Hoff is out of stakes-placed, ten-race winner Bestoftheprairie, by Captain Courageous.

Filling out the next three spots are Kaytie J, Henricks' Stormin' Bubsy, a 2009 gelding by Storm Blast out of 2017 Washington broodmare of the year Chedoodle, by Slewdledo, who competed in Western events; rider Heather Hornung's Melangeofgold, a 2013 winning full sister (Harbor the Gold—Ms. Melange, by Slewdledo) to \$101,265 stakes winner My Chief, who competed in dressage; and Norah K. Springgate's Son of an Eagle (competing as Jaywalker), a 2010 gelding by Flying With Eagles—Dynamatch, by Septieme Ciel, who was active in eventing and combined training events.

am and Neal Christopherson acquired Brookie Girl from owner-trainer Mark Glatt and his partner Cory Wagner after the then six-year-old mare's last place finish in a January 2011 claiming race at Los Alamitos. The partners had haltered the mare three races earlier out of a \$16,000 claiming sprint at Del Mar in August 2010, a race which she had won by 4 1/2 lengths. Earlier that same year the five-year-old distaffer had won three races in a row: a \$32,000 maiden claiming race at Santa Anita, by 5 1/4 lengths; a Santa Anita starter allowance; and an Hollywood Park allowance by 1 1/4 lengths.

Bred to Oregon powerhouse stallion Harbor the Gold that spring, Brookie Girl produced her first winner, George W, on April 30, 2012. Her next four foals were all sired by the son of Seeking the Gold, led by 2021 Washington champion older horse and sprinter Papa's Golden Boy and 2020 Muckleshoot Derby victor Gold Crusher. Her 2018 filly, Lotta Prada, by Sixthirteen, has yet to race and her 2021 filly is sired by recent Bar C Racing Stables stallion addition Outlash.

Brookie Girl is a daughter of the good racehorse and stallion Proud Citizen, who was one of the top three-year-olds in 2002 after winning the Coolmore Lexington Stakes (G2) by 3 1/4 lengths and then being runner-up to War Emblem in the Kentucky Derby (G1) and finishing third in War Emblem's Preakness Stakes (G1). He was trained by D. Wayne Lukas.

Sired by one of Mr. Prospector's best sons, Gone West, Proud Citizen's third dam was a full sister to Northern Dancer. The amiable stallion entered stud in 2004 at Airdrie Stud and stood at the Midway, Kentucky, farm until his death in June 2016 due to complications from laminitis. He sired 13 crops in North America and five crops in Chile. His progeny earnings are over \$47-million and among his 44 stakes winners are three champions, including Alabama Stakes (G1) and Kentucky Oaks (G1) winner Proud Spell.

Brookie Girl's dam, Skatesheba, was a winner in her native France and ran third in the 2001 Blue Northern Handicap at Santa Anita. The best winner among her nine foals was her last, the 2012 Majesticperfection gelding Perfectly Majestic, who has won 13 races and placed in 33 more in his 67 race career over seven years. Among his 11 stakes placements were seconds in the Grade 2 Mathis Brothers Mile Stakes (to Om) and the Thunder Road Stakes, both run at Santa Anita. He also narrowly missed (by a neck) winning the Old Friends Stakes at Kentucky Downs and Santa Anita's Joe Hernandez Stakes (by a nose). The now ten-year-old Perfectly Majestic appeared on the Hawthorne work tabs on March 29.

Brookie Girl's second dam, Touraille, is a daughter of Jim French, a runner who placed in all three of the 1971 Triple Crown races. Touraille produced 17 foals during her long career in the paddocks, the last in 2000 when she was 24. Three other of her foals were also stakes-placed, led by French stakes winner Kandakiev.

Trelex, Brookie Girl's third dam, was a half-sister to Dandy Lute, a stakes-winning son of Luthier who was considered "a high-class miler, with a sharp turn of foot." He originally went to stud in France, but was later sent to Japan, where he was a successful sire.

2020 had proven to be a bit of a rough year for Rick and Debbie Pabst and their Blue Ribbon Farm. First their soon to be named three-time leading sire Atta Boy Roy had been sold and moved to Kentucky that fall and then just a few months later they lost their second stallion, Nationhood, to cancer.

As they still wanted to stand a stallion and support the Washington breeding industry, they were soon on the lookout for a new stallion. Besides having a good race record and family, they wanted a young stallion who already had a few crops on the ground. They found what they were looking for at Buck Pond Farm in Versailles, Kentucky, in the then 13-year-old graded stakes winner Conveyance, an earner of \$496,500 in the US and Dubai.



One of 94 stakes winners sired by Indian Charlie, and a half-brother to stakes winner Yukon Bill and stakes-placed Atlantic Bull, Conveyance had entered stud in 2016 at the Kentucky nursery. At the time of his purchase, the gray/roan stallion had produced stakes winner and Grade 1-placed Water White, stakes-placed juvenile Becca's Bouquet and a total of three \$100,0000-plus earners in his first two crops (69 foals total).

In 2021, Water White added a Grade 2 placing, Rock On Luke and Miss Conveyance both became stakes winners – the latter won and placed in Grade 2 events in Panama – Nobody Listens and Mexican Silver (G2 in Mexico) had both become stakes-placed and his \$100,000 earners had climbed to five. Nobody Listens, who earned \$172,462 of his sire's \$1,124,831 total, was Conveyance's leading earner in 2021, while Water White remains his top earner overall with \$374,175. In November, Water White, as a racing or broodmare prospect, brought \$550,000 at Fasig-Tipton's elite The November Sale.

As of April 4, Conveyance leads the 2022 Washington rankings as well, led by three-year-old daughter Sandy's Garden, who became his seventh stakes horse at Aqueduct in January.

Conveyance's first crop of Washington-breds arrives this spring.

A^{\$310,000} Keeneland September yearling, Pontiff – who was bred by Claiborne Farm – is a son of champion runner and sire Giant's Causeway and a half-brother to Blue Grass Stakes (G2) winner and additional influential sire Pulpit.

Unraced at two, Pontiff had finished second by a nose in a Gulfstream Park maiden special weight race at three, which prompted his connections to next start him in Grade 1 Florida Derby.

After winning a maiden allowance at Sam Houston Racecourse at four, he added allowance wins at Will Rogers Downs and Canterbury Park, retiring with earnings of \$126,481.

Purchased as a sire prospect by Tim Floyd's Warlock Stables, Pontiff retired to stud in Washington, but was moved to Daehling Ranch in California last fall.

Pontiff sired a dozen foals in his first crop with seven starting and his total progeny earnings was \$30,953. His lone winner, Octavius Prince, won a \$25,000 maiden claiming race on the turf at Golden Gate Fields on October 29 for Warlock Stables and partners. Pontiff is also the sire of the filly Pontiffany, who placed twice and ran fourth in the Barbara Shinpoch Stakes in 2021.

Todd and Shawn Hansen established their 175-acre Scatter Creek Training Center on property that was once part of DanDar (nee T9O) Farm, a farm and stallion station that was managed by Todd's mother Stevie Hansen for many years.

Todd and Shawn and their very enthusiastic equine-loving son Ethan raced Washington-bred earners of \$258,615 to top all owners of statebreds last year.

The Hansens breed their mares to some of the finest stallions in North America, some which they foal at home and others who end up being Kentucky-breds.

In 2016 they sent their \$309,030 stakes-winning Flying With Eagles mare Gadget Queen to the court of Midshipman at Darley in Kentucky. The following spring she produced a colt at their Washington farm. Named Huge Bigly, he won three races in 2021, a maiden special weight race at Golden Gate Fields and allowance/ optional claiming (N) races at Colonial Downs and Churchill Downs. His \$140,396 earnings last year bested all Washington-breds with the exception of horse of the year Blazingbellablu. Gadget Queen, who is also the dam of Washington-bred stakes winner Perfect Dude, produced a Washington-foaled colt by Nyquist in 2020.

The Hansens also own other prominent Washington racehorses or producers including their three-time state champion Ethan's Baby, who produced a filly by Frosted in 2021 at Scatter Creek. Another prominent mare is Washington broodmare of the year Striking Scholar, whose 2017 offspring, the Washington-bred gelding No Slo Mo, contributed \$35,829 to the Hansens 2021 total. Striking Scholar's 2021 colt by Hard Spun was also foaled in Washington.

The second leading owner of the year was the partnership of Petra Lewin (Rainbow Meadows Farm) and trainer Charles Essex, whose lone runner, Blazingbellablu, won three stakes (one at Emerald Downs and two at Turf Paradise) and earned \$154,584 en route to being named Washington horse of the year and champion three-year-old.

Finishing in the third spot was John E. Parker, whose Washington-bred runners made 47 starts and earned a \$145,390 total. His biggest contributor was Franks Fix It, a 2018 son of Gold Aly who won two \$25,000 claiming races at Emerald Downs and earned \$33,284.

The partnership of Chad Christensen and Josh McKee (2020 Washington leading owners), racing as Chad and Josh, finished fourth with \$136,102 in earnings. Their leading earner was Lone Star Park allowance/OC\$25,000 (N) winner Spot On (\$32,151), but their two-year-old Gold N Glitter placed in two stakes and took home \$24,331.

Coming in fifth was the one-horse stable of Bar C Racing Stables (also his breeder) and Steve Gasperelli's Slugo Racing's threeyear-old Harbored Memories, who made five of his seven starts (all at Santa Anita or Del Mar) on the grass, winning two and having turf earnings of \$102,300, from his \$126,700 total. He was named Washington champion turf horse for his efforts.

Finishing sixth were Steve and Letha Haahr, whose Coastal Kid earned \$76,760 of their \$91,193 total and was named Washington champion three-year-old colt or gelding.

The partnership of Greg and Chuck Conley and trainer Joe Toye's Terra Firma Farm finished only \$805 further back in seventh at \$90,388. Among their several winners was the six-year-old mare Judicial, who won five of her nine starts and earned \$38,260.

or the seventh time Buckley-based breeders Rick and Debbie Pabst have earned the title of Washington's leading breeder by monies earned. They took the 2021 title with 27 starters, who won 21 races and had total earnings of \$395,855. Their leading 2021 earner was unbeaten state two-year-old champion filly Koron (\$66,196). They also bred juvenile stakes winner A View From Above (\$44,696), stakes-placed La Una – a year older half-sister to Koron – and additional winners Balius, Cascade Dancer, Finished My P H D, Fortune in Silk, Fortune's Freude, Ididntseethatcomin, Rings of Saturn, Spot On, Suddenly Awesome, Suddenly Winning and Tothemoonandback. Koron races for Blue Ribbon Racing Ladies, a partnership of five women led by Debbie.

The Pabsts, who stand 2021 Washington leading sire Conveyance at their Blue Ribbon Farm, also led the state breeder ranks in 2011-14, 2018 and 2020 and were second in 1999 and 2019.

With Koron's latest championship title, the Pabsts, who were inducted into the Washington Racing Hall of Fame in 2017, have bred nine state champions (two in partnership).

Reigning second in the standings was Pam and Neal Christopherson's Bar C Racing Stables Inc. The Hermiston, Oregon, stallion station and nursey – who led the breeder list in 2016 – had also finished in the runner-up spot in 2020. In 2021, they had 18 starters that won 17 races and earned \$355,471. Their leading moneymaker was three-year-old Harbored Memories, who earned \$126,700 and champion turf honors. The Christophersons are also the breeders of 2021 champion older horse and sprinter Papa's Golden Boy, whose dam Brookie Girl was named Washington broodmare of the year. In addition, though not adding to their 2021 earnings profile, the Christophersons bred Winter Knight, shown as Maei Platinum Star, who was named top Washington-bred OTTB for the second year in a row. Harbored Memories, Papa's Golden Boy and Winter Knight are all offspring of the Christophersons' 2009-21 Oregon leading sire Harbor the Gold, who died last year at age 20.


Finishing third in the standings were former five-time leading breeders Nina and Ron Hagen and their Enumclaw-based El Dorado Farms. Last year their 22 runners won 13 races and were less than \$1,000 (\$354,490) behind the Christopherson's second place. Their leading runner also won a state championship title, as Coastal Kid (\$78,661) was named top three-year-old male. Among their other runners were juveniles Diamond Willow and Big Paper Daddy – the Gottstein Futurity two-three finishers – and Let It Reign.

Rounding out the top five were Todd and Shawn Hansen (\$308,152), who were the leading owners of Washington-breds in 2021, and Keith and Jan Swagerty (\$193,833). The Hansens bred and race Huge Bigly, a son of the stakes-winning Washington-bred Gadget Queen. Churchill Downs allowance winner Huge Bigly's \$140,396 was the top earnings for any Washington-bred male horse in 2021.

The Swagertys, who race under Swag Stables and also stand stallions at their Auburn-based West Coast Training Center, produced 14 starters who won 16 times and earned \$193,833. Turf Paradiseraced River Jumper (\$50,846) was their top earner.

Coming in sixth and seven, and with only six runners each, were Steve Meredith (Lucky Acres, \$161,229) and Terry and Mary Lou Griffin (Griffin Place, \$158,067). Meredith's runners won 15 races. Among the Griffins' winners was Washington champion two-year-old Cobra Jet.





Earlier this year, Emerald Downs announced a new incentive program. Beginning with the May 15 opening day, all three-year-olds and older that ran in any claiming race at least once at any track – including Emerald Downs – since January 1, 2021, receive a \$1,000 bonus (\$750 to the owner, \$250 to the trainer) in the horse's first start in any claiming race at Emerald Downs, which must occur before July 1.

Other incentives include initial stall bedding for all horses arriving prior to starting day, all hot walkers will be free throughout the season and participation money on any race that has eight or more starters will be increased to \$300 (horses finishing sixth through last).

Emerald Downs is owned and operated by the Muckleshoot Tribe. Approximately 20 percent of all purses for the season are the result of a purse supplement from the Tribe.

Emerald Downs to Offer Lowest Takeout in Country on Win, Place and Show Wagers

On April 29, Emerald Downs announced that the track will offer a reduced takeout of 14 percent on all win, place and show (WPS) wagers for its upcoming 2022 season. The reduced takeout is the lowest for WPS wagers in the country.

Track president Phil Ziegler explained, "The most popular wager at Emerald Downs remains wagering to win, and reducing the takeout in this pool, along with place and show, is a big benefit for bettors, especially on-track patrons."

Live racing returns to Emerald Downs on Sunday, May 15, with a post time of 2:15 p.m. PDT. The 52-day season covers 19 weekends. More information is available at www.emeralddowns.com.

WASHINGTON RACING HALL OF FAME Ropersandwranglers

The first, and as of now, the only non-Washington-bred to be so honored

R opersandwranglers was a Californiabred with a Golden State pedigree, but her prowess at Emerald Downs earned her a spot in the Washington Racing Hall of Fame in 2015. She became the first horse to break the out-of-state barrier, racing her way into the Washington record books with ten victories in 12 tries at Emerald Downs and five track titles.

A Good Buy

Himself a 2005 Hall of Fame inductee, trainer Bud Klokstad only had to spend \$2,000 to buy Ropersandwranglers at the California Thoroughbred Sales September Mixed Sale. The chestnut filly sold just seven months after her February 16, 1993, foaling date. She sported a young and intriguing pedigree, being out of the third crop of California Derby (G3) winner Endow and the first foal out of Silent Surprise.

A foal of 1986, Endow won six of his 14 starts and earned \$479,959 while scoring in five stakes and placing in another three, including the Grade 2 Illinois Derby and Swaps Stakes, while running at two and three. Among those juvenile victories, most appropriately, was a win in the B. J. Ridder Stakes at Santa Anita. Ridder had campaigned Endow's sire, Flying Paster, California's 1979 horse of the year, a threetime Grade 1 winner and the state's leading sire five times with 48 stakes winners.

Ropersandwranglers' dam, Silent Surprise, had placed twice in her 12 starts while running in California and Tijuana, Mexico. Her sire, Silent Screen, by Prince John, had been voted the nation's champion two-year-old in 1969 and later finished third in the Preakness Stakes. He was known for his precocious brilliance and being a bright chestnut, both traits that Ropersandwranglers inherited.

Silent Surprise would later produce two more stakes winners: four-time Arapahoe Park and Turf Paradise stakes winner Whats the Hush, a daughter of Calumar who earned \$137,885, and 2011 Rio Grande Senor Futurity winner Desert Road, a son of prominent New Mexico sire Desert God.

Interestingly, Ropersandwranglers was inbred 4S x 5D to Nearctic, but in neither case was it due to that Canadian stallion's most significant son, Northern Dancer.

Bill G. Michael bred Ropersandwranglers

and the star filly was campaigned by Klokstad's wife Billie.

Bud Klokstad, who passed away in 2012, had quite a reputation as a leader in the ranks of two-year-old racing. He saddled a staggering eight Washington-bred champion juvenile colts and fillies. He was also responsible for nurturing the first two seasons of the career of Washington-bred great Chinook Pass, the 1983 Eclipse Award champion sprinter.

Fast Out of the Gate

Ropersandwranglers debuted on May 4, 1995, at Golden Gate Fields under a leading apprentice rider named Victor Espinoza. Espinoza would go on to become one of the top jockeys in the country with classicwinning mounts such as American Pharoah, California Chrome and War Emblem. Ropersandwranglers flashed some of her own brilliance in that first outing, rolling to the lead and never stopping to win the 4 1/2-furlong contest by 6 1/2 lengths.

That opening race was so impressive that Ropersandwranglers went favored in her next start, the June 17, \$58,350 Moraga Stakes over 5 1/2-furlongs. She and Espinoza won

that as well, driving home by three lengths. Klokstad's reputation for having young horses fit and ready certainly rang true in the case of the speedy California-bred miss.

Sore shins would plague Ropersandwranglers during her racing career, and this led the Endow filly to a ten-month layoff after her first two starts.

In her April 1996 return, Ropersandwranglers finished third, beaten 2 1/4 lengths in a Golden Gate allowance race. She ran back in May and won, this time under multiple Hall of Fame rider Russell Baze, blitzing a six-furlong allowance race by 4 1/2 lengths.

North to Emerald Downs

Klokstad shipped Ropersandwranglers north for the inaugural season at the new Emerald Downs racetrack in Auburn. In her first outing at the Western Washington oval she started in a six-furlong allowance and proved much the best, defeating future three-time Washington champion Cocktails Anyone by three lengths.

The trainer then tried stretching Ropersandwranglers out to 1 1/16 miles in the \$64,500 Washington Oaks, but the prized filly had to steady late in the race and ultimately lost the lead to winner Ever Lasting.

Lest anyone forget her dominance sprinting, Ropersandwranglers won the \$30,000 Hastings Park Handicap over older fillies and mares by seven lengths and then won the then-open \$50,000 Belle Roberts Handicap. On that occasion, Ropersandwranglers defeated Pleas Write, a mare that had been knocking heads with the colts over the summer, by 2 1/2 lengths.

At the conclusion of the 1996 racing season, Ropersandwranglers was named the top sprinter and three-year-old filly at Emerald Downs.

Home Again in California

Ropersandwranglers did start once more that year, where back at Golden Gate trying two turns again in the sloppy, off-the-turf \$125,000 Moment to Buy Handicap, she finished sixth in what would be the worst performance of her career.

The Klokstad filly came back just nine days later to kick off the 1997 season with a third place effort in the \$36,120 Sonoma Handicap. She lost by only two necks that day in a driving, blanket finish.

Ropersandwranglers then ran twice at Bay Meadows, finishing fifth both times, before making a triumphant return to Emerald Downs.

Three for Three

Ropersandwranglers was only able to get in three Washington starts before sore shins sent her back to the Klokstads' farm in Maple Valley, but the chestnut filly made them count. She won the \$35,000 Auburn Handicap by a neck under Justin Vitek, then thrilled fans when winning the \$30,000 Boeing Handicap by seven widening lengths. The \$29,000 Ingenue Handicap served as her season curtain call, but Ropersandwranglers won it by 3 1/2 lengths, despite being forced wide at the top of the stretch. She was once again named the racetrack's top sprinter.

Rather than do battle in Northern California again, Klokstad had Ropersandwranglers primed for her 1998 debut at the start of the Emerald Downs meet. The mare picked up where she had left off, thrashing the field of six other distaffers in the \$25,000 Mountain View Stakes by three lengths, despite being blocked around the turn. Among her defeated foes were Washington sprint champions Spite and Malice and Cocktails Anyone. She then successfully defended her title in the Auburn Handicap, scoring by a length. Each of her wins came under the guidance of Frank Gonsalves.

Ropersandwranglers lost for only the second time at Emerald Downs in the \$35,000 King County Handicap, missing by a neck to Shay over a one-mile distance. Shay would go on to produce \$384,050-earning multiple stakes-placed Getback Time, dam of Canadian champion, Grade 1 winner and \$3.8-million earner Shaman Ghost.

Ropersandwranglers then defeated that rival when winning her second Boeing Handicap, again with Gonsalves in the irons, earning her third and final top sprinter title, as well as the honor of being named the meet's best older filly or mare.

1999

Now a five-time Emerald champion,

Ropersandwranglers entered the 1999 season with high hopes, but she was only able to make a single start. She won the Mountain View Stakes, by 1 1/4 lengths, for the second consecutive year, capping her career at 13 wins, two seconds and two thirds from 20 starts and a 7.34 SSI. Ropersandwranglers had parlayed the Klokstads' \$2,000 investment to a \$260,575 total.

Motherhood Beckons

Unfortunately, Ropersandwranglers proved to be a disappointment as a broodmare. Her first foal, bred by the Klokstads, was Valley Roper, a son of In Excess (Ire), who managed to only place once in his four starts.

Sold to multiple leading state breeder Jerre Paxton, she produced the winning Bertrando filly Seize the Moment for his Northwest Farms in 2001. Ropersandwranglers' Northwest Farms-bred colts by Fusaichi Pegasus and Thunder Gulch remained unnamed and died young. Another colt, Cascade Cool, by Awesome Again, did manage to place five times in his seven starts, but earned only \$6,230.

After producing a filly by Mineshaft in 2007, the unraced Iron Margaret, Paxton consigned Ropersandwranglers to the 2007 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale

where David Lavoie purchased the then 14-year-old mare, bred to El Corredor, for \$16,000. Two months later she brought a bid of \$20,000 from 4M Ranch at the January Ocala Breeders' Sales Company Winter Mixed Sale. Unfortunately, the filly she was carrying died before she became a yearling and Ropersandwranglers was sent through the December 2008 Fasig-Tipton Texas Winter Mixed Sale. Listed as not pregnant, she failed to reach the \$1,000 minimum bid. In 2011 Ropersandwranglers produced a filly named C'Mon Cowgirl, by C'Mon Tiger, for JEH Stallion Stallion, Oklahoma, which never raced. The multiple Emerald Downs champion's final foal was a 2012 filly by Dance Master whose registration was never completed.

Ropersandwranglers' daughter Seize the Moment, whose two wins had come in claiming races at Emerald Downs when she was a four-year-old, has produced six named foals (through 2015) and had four winners, led by \$107,508 earner Grasp. A 2007 daughter of Souvenir Copy, there is hope that Grasp will keep Ropersandwranglers' female line alive, as her 2015 daughter Our Bold Princess, by Bold Chieftain, is a winner of \$124,376, and her third foal is the 2018 filly Wonderfulwonderful, by Big Bad Leroybrown. Her second foal, Our Bold Prince, also by Bold Chieftain, earned \$113,136. Grasp is also the dam of a 2020 filly by Temple City and a 2021 filly by Pepper Crown.

Ropersandwranglers' daughter Iron Margaret is her only other daughter in production, but neither of her two fillies has won, including the 2016 Soldat-sired Oriental Tale. She produced a colt by Klimt in 2021.

On the track, Ropersandwranglers proved herself a starlet, winning all nine of her sprint starts at Emerald Downs and at one point riding a five-race win streak. She is thought to be Bud Klokstad's favorite among his numerous stakes winners. Her accomplishments make her a deserved entrant into Washington's racing hall of champions.

Hydrops in Pregnant Mares Two rare, but serious fluid conditions

n rare occasion a pregnant mare develops an increased amount of fluid within her placental membranes. Her abdomen becomes suddenly much larger than you would expect for her stage of pregnancy. Karen Wolfsdorf, DVM, DACT, Hagyard Medical Institute (field veterinarian and reproductive specialist at the McGee Fertility Center) explains that there can be two different scenarios - two different causes for the increased fluid build-up.

The normal volume of allantoic fluid in the near-term mare is about eight-to-15 liters. Hydrops allantois is a sudden increase in the amount of allantoic fluid (in the allantoic cavity or "water bag" within the placenta) over a period of ten-to-14 days. This is believed to be due to a placental problem. It is more common than hydops amnios, which is an excessive accumulation of amniotic fluid in the amniotic sac that surrounds the fetus itself. Hydrops amnios develops more gradually, building up over several weeks to months. It is often associated with a deformed fetus or with genetic or congenital abnormalities. Both of these excessive-fluid problems occur usually in the last trimester of gestation.

"There are some recent research studies done at the University of Kentucky looking into these conditions. In hydrops allantois, the main pathological finding is increased edema of the placenta. This is believed to be due to a significant decrease in capillary (blood vessel) density. The decrease in number of vessels is associated with an abnormal expression of angiogenic (blood vessel forming) genes. The disrupted vessel development and hypoxia (lack of oxygen) leads to further increase in edema and extra fluid accumulation." she explained. In this case, the fetus will be compromised and may not survive.

The normal volume of amniotic fluid in mares near term is about three-to-seven liters and composed of secretions of the amnion and from the nasal passages of the fetus, fetal saliva, seepage of fluid/serum from maternal blood vessels and fetal urine.

"With hydrops amnios there is much more of this fluid than normal. It has been suggested that the fetus actively regulates the volume and composition of the amniotic fluid; thus the prevention or impairment of swallowing may lead to hydroamnios," she added.

Signs of Trouble

"The main sign with both conditions is that the mare's abdomen becomes very large, very quickly. The abdomen looks like

an apple - very round - too large for that stage of pregnancy, and she may not want to move," explained Wolfsdorf. These mares may be off feed, uncomfortable and have high heart rates. They may be depressed and have severe ventral edema (swelling along the underside of the belly), abdominal discomfort and labored breathing caused by all the extra pressure on the diaphragm. If the mare has difficulty walking, she may prefer to remain lying down, especially with hydrops allantois.

"If horse owners recognize these signs early, they can have their veterinarian examine the mare and do something about it, and prevent catastrophe," said Wolfsdorf. "The veterinarian can diagnose hydrops allantois (and sometimes hydrops amnios) by palpating the mare."

Rectal palpation reveals a huge, taut, fluid-filled uterus. The fetus cannot be felt, and the uterus is usually tightly distended. "The fetus is so deep within all that fluid - way down in the abdomen - that it can't be identified by palpation or transrectal ultrasound, but we can identify a large amount of fluid," she added. Trans-abdominal ultrasound can confirm an excessive amount of fetal fluids.

Ultrasonography of the abdominal walls and prepubic tendon for evidence of edema



is necessary to monitor impending body wall tears and prepubic tendon rupture, which commonly occurs with hydrops allantois and can dramatically worsen the prognosis for survival and reproductive value of the mare.

Treatment

With mares that are evaluated and diagnosed early (at five-to-seven months of gestation) the veterinarian may opt to terminate the pregnancy. Later in gestation, or in mares with excessive abdominal enlargement and large volumes of fluid in the placenta, controlled drainage of fluid is necessary before the fetus can be delivered.

"Controlled, slow drainage is essential because a sudden alteration of total body fluid balance - with sudden loss of this large volume of fluid - may result in hypovolemic shock and the mare can die," she went on to say.

"You do not want all that fluid to come out at once or let the pregnancy go full term since this will be detrimental to the mare and foal. The other problem is that the weight and pressure of the excess fluid puts a lot of strain on muscles of the abdominal wall. This can cause rupture of the prepubic tendon, which is the large tendon that supports the abdominal cavity. When this happens, the prognosis for the mare is

worse," said Wolfsdorf.

"You want to identify the problem and drain the fluid prior to rupture of the prepubic tendon or an abdominal wall tear," she emphasized. It is an emergency because the excess fluid can appear suddenly and the consequences occur equally suddenly. The veterinarian may advise supportive care that includes abdominal support (an abdominal band), IV fluids, broad-spectrum antimicrobials and anti-inflammatory drugs.

Slow siphoning of the fluid can be accomplished by using a tube, inserted through the cervix and through the placenta with extension

tubing attached to control the flow rate, taking a couple of hours to drain. At the same time, intravenous fluids should be administered to maintain fluid/electrolyte balance in the mare and prevent shock. In many cases the mare will be sedated for this procedure.

"I don't drain all the fluid – just enough to relieve pressure on the abdominal structures and the uterus, and prevent shock. If you take too much fluid, even if you drain it slowly, the mare may still go into shock. There is a fine line between how much is enough and how much is too much," explained Wolfsdorf.

"When inserting the drain tube, we also need to be careful that we don't damage the cervix. Once enough fluid is drained, depending on the clinician, some will induce foaling to make sure someone is present to assist the delivery. Personally I prefer to let Mother Nature take its course because I think this relaxes the cervix a little better than when we induce labor. You do have to realize that with the uterus having been so distended it has no tone or strength to contract appropriately, and you will probably need to assist in delivery of the foal." The mare would have trouble pushing the foal out.

"Generally the mare will be brought into the hospital for us to drain the fluid and treat the mare. I advise sending the mare to a referral facility to have this done, so fluids can be administered at the same time as the drainage. If the mare is down, and bringing her to a hospital is not an option, the veterinarian can try doing this on the farm, but if the condition is detected early the mare should be able to travel to the hospital," said Wolfsdorf.

Prognosis

"Although we can drain the fluid and save the mare, we haven't had much success

in maintaining a viable fetus. Obviously the closer to parturition, the more likely the fetus could potentially survive, but most of the time this problem occurs at eight-tonine months of gestation, which is too early for the fetus to be viable," she added.

"There have been a couple of cases reported that had live foals, but they were cases of hydrops amnios and not hydrops allantois. It is up to the owner to decide whether or not they want to try to save the mare or the foal but they have to realize that the foal will be severely compromised at the end of the process," she explained.

Management of mares early in gestation in which fetal viability is not realistic includes inducing parturition. Close monitoring for impending parturition is necessary, since these mares may have poor cervical dilation and very weak uterine contractions (uterine inertia). Malpositioning and malpresentations of the fetus are also common. In most situations, the fetus cannot be saved, but prompt intervention will give the best prognosis for survival and recovery of the mare, as well as her future fertility. "I do not ever recommend inducing the mare without drainage; usually both the mare and foal die."

Conservative supportive management of mares with hydrops amnios can result in the birth of a live foal, though it may be deformed. In one report, the mare was monitored for signs of weakness in the prepubic tendon and abdominal wall, while the fetus and placenta were monitored for signs of stress and pending abortion. Anti-inflammatories and altrenogest were administered for pregnancy maintenance. With both hydrops allantois and hydrops amnios there are potential complications of hypovolemic shock and cardiac arrhythmias (irregular heartbeat) that can be addressed by supportive care (large-volume IV infusion). When the abdominal wall weakens or there is no viable foal, drainage of fluid and assisted delivery of the foal is necessary.

Horse owners wonder if the mare will be able to have another pregnancy and if it would be normal or not.

"There is some belief that the genes associated with abnormal vascular formation may be hereditary, but that is still to be determined. My advice would be to not breed that mare back to the same stallion, since the problem might be due to the gene combination in that particular mating.

"Interestingly, there is a new study – presented at the Society for Theriogenology in July 2021 – that looked at 30 mares in a case study and shows that none of them had recurrence of hydrops." Their subsequent pregnancies were normal.

"Dr. Louise Lemonnier found that 90 percent of mares survived if the problem was addressed appropriately, and that 95 percent of those surviving mares had a future foal. The key to success, however, is identifying the problem early, and taking the appropriate measures.

"The good news is that if you identify the signs and treat these mares quickly and appropriately, they have a good survival rate and good future fertility. It's only when they have ruptured prepubic tendons, abdominal wall tears, hemorrhage or peritonitis that the prognosis is poor," Wolfsdorf explained.

2021 Breeders' Awards

B reeders' awards distributed to breeders of Washington-breds who finished first, second or third in 2021 Emerald Downs races totaled \$212,731, compared to \$182,106 in 2020.

Mandated by the state's racing act in accordance with RCW 67.16.175, breeders' awards are funded from a percentage of the exotic pari-mutuel wagering during live racing at Emerald Downs and its OTBs (off-track betting locations) and are paid at the end of the race year. Beginning in 2004, of the Source Market Fees collected from advance deposit wagering, 2.5 percent goes to owners' and breeders' awards (WAC 260-49-070).

Breeders' Awards Factor

For many years, it was assumed that Emerald Downs retained six percent from daily gross receipts for exotic wagering on both live racing and simulcasting. Of that six percent, one percent was designated for breeders' awards.

In 2017, it was determined that, in actuality, Emerald Downs had not been retaining six percent from the daily gross receipts on exotic wagering from simulcasting. Hence, going forward, breeders' awards will be calculated on exotic wagering from live racing only.

The total of \$212,731 for 2021 is allocated as 75 percent for first, 15 percent for second and ten percent for third. These totals are divided by the total amount of corresponding purse monies earned by Washington-breds, which creates three corresponding factors. The appropriate factor is then multiplied by the total purse monies won by each Washington-bred to arrive at the breeders' award amount.

Beginning in 2004, of the Source Market Fees collected from advance deposit wagering, 2.5 percent goes to owners' and breeders' awards (WAC 260-49-070).

In 2021 the payment factor was 16.28 percent, compared to 13.86 percent in 2020.

Special Reserve Named 2021 HBPA Claiming Horse of the Year

Special Reserve, a 2016 Midshipman gelding who races for Bellevue resident David Staudacher and Peter Proscia's Paradise Farms Corp., was named 2021 Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association's claiming horse of the year. The yearly honor is given to the runner who most exemplifies the spirit of the award.

Special Reserve and his connections were honored at the National HBPA Annual Conference held at Oaklawn Park last March.

Special Reserve was claimed out of his first outing in 2021, an allowance/\$40,000 optional claiming race, by trainer Michael J. Maker for Staudacher and Paradise Farms Corp. The Kentucky-bred had gone off at odds of nearly 23-to-one and won the six-furlong race by a neck. He was the only runner in the eight-horse field running for a tag.

In his first start for his new owners, Special Reserve repeated with a win under the same allowance/claiming conditions – but not for a price this time – as his previous victory. His winning margin increased to two lengths.

The runner made his first stakes start in the seven-furlong Commonwealth Stakes (G3) at Keeneland in April and finished second to Flagstaff. A month later Special Reserve won the Maryland Sprint Match Series Stakes (G3) at Pimlico.

In July he won the Iowa Sprint Stakes at Prairie Meadows.

Sent to Saratoga, Special Reserve finished a half-length behind winner Lexingtonian in the Grade 1 Alfred G. Vanderbilt Handicap.

Back at Keeneland in October, Special Reserve won the Grade 2 Phoenix Stakes, in which he defeated eventual Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) winner Aloha West by a neck. Special Reserve would finish fourth to that rival in the \$2-million Del Mar race in his final outing of the year.

From a lifetime total of 28 starts with a 8-2-7 record, Special Reserve has earned \$566,100 of his \$738,647 total for Staudacher and Paradise Farms Corp. and Maker guided the runner to a 4-2-0 record from seven starts.

Staudacher has been involved in racing for over 40 years, mainly with claiming horses. "The award means a lot," he was quoted after learning of his runner's achievement. "Love the sport, love the people involved. It's so much fun."

Special Reserve was bred by Russell L. Reineman Stable Inc., one of three winners out of Love Spun, a Hard Spun half-sister to G3 stakes winner and Grade 1-placed Original Spun and \$259,322 stakes winner Humor at Last.

2021 Oregon Champions

On April 20, the Oregon Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association (OTOBA) announced the 2021 Oregon champions and other year-end awards.

There was an unprecedented tie for horse of the year honors between two-year-old colt or gelding champion El Maestro and threeyear-old filly champion Shellby.

A gelded son of Bar C Racing Stables' Sixthirteen-Meant to Be Mia, by War Chant, El Maestro had a 3-2-0 record from five starts. He won both the Douglas Fir Futurity (by four lengths) and restricted Thongs Fancy Stakes (by 4 3/4 lengths) at Grants Pass, earning \$32,230 for his breeder Lisa Baze and fellow owners Rancho Viejo and John Sneesby. He was trained throughout his champion season - which began at Emerald Downs with two seconds - by Rigoberto Velasquez. His dam Meant to Be Mia won nine races and earned \$41,050. She is one of four winners out of 100 percent producer Silver Spout, by Silver Deputy, a half-sister to \$103,040 stakes winner Aspen Hill. Meant to Be Mia produced foals by Harbor the Gold in 2021 (colt) and 2022 (filly).

Shellby had two wins and a third in her four starts last year. She earned \$49,492 for her breeder and owner Nirvana Farm LLC. The Cario Caramori trainee won a \$30,000 maiden claiming race at Keeneland in October. That win was followed by an allowance third at Churchill Downs in November and a 2 3/4-length allowance victory at Delta Downs in December. Now trained by Robertino Diodoro, Shellby took her second Delta Downs allowance win on February 2.

The daughter of Spring Warrior, a nearly \$100,000 earning son of Speightstown, is the second foal out of three-race winner Devils Dragonfly, a sister to \$182,525 stakes-placed Dare Me Devil, Washington's most improved plater of 2014. Voted Oregon's 2021 broodmare of the year, Devils Dragonfly is a 13-year-old daughter of Devil On Ice. She produced a colt by Paynter in 2021.

Devils Dragonfly was bred by Andria Mengucci, who was named 2021 Oregon breeder of the year and TOBA winner.

The late Harbor the Gold earned his 13th title as leading sire. Among his 40 winners last year – which also included two Washington state champions – were Oregon champions Enchanting Way (juvenile filly) and Bloodhorse Bud (sophomore male).

Bred by Lisa Baze and trainer Rigoberto

Velasquez, Enchanting Way won her only start for Baze, Luis Torres and Rancho Viejo. That win was a gate-to-wire 6 1/2-length romp in a \$25,000 maiden claiming race at Emerald Downs on August 1. Enchanting Way is the first foal out of the unraced Grindstone mare Kenzie's Angel, a sister to 2015 Oregon horse of the year and \$118,233 stakes winner Its Allabout Jerry and 2016 Oregon champion three-year-old male Grindcicle, and half-sister to 2013-14 Oregon champion older filly or mare Kenzie Carolina. All are offspring of 2015 Oregon broodmare of the year Icicle Angel, a triple stakes winner of \$138,087 by La Saboteur.

Bloodhorse Bud, who was bred by Tom Grether Farms Inc. and Robert Lawrence, was a 2019 WTBOA Summer Yearling Sale graduate. Out of Seven Fifty Miss, a daughter of Raise the Bluff—Morn 'n Mist, by Petersburg – a sister to \$301,619 stakes winner Miss Pixie (dam of 2016 Washington champion two-year-old So Lucky) and two other stakes horses – Bloodhorse Bud raced eight times last year for Homer Thoroughbreds Inc. and trainer Jason Homer. He took two wins at Grants Pass, where he also ran second in the Polynesian Flyer Stakes.

Owner-trainer Jacqueline Smith's Azee Rules earned the older horse or gelding title. The 2016 gelding by Papa Clem-No Rules Tonight, by Tribal Rule, was bred by Daniel and Angela Kerr. A stakes winner at three, and stakes-placed at four, Azee Rules won both the Don Jackson Sprint Stakes (by 4 3/4 lengths) at Grants Pass and the EOLS OTOBA Stakes (by seven) at the Eastern Oregon Livestock Show in 2021. In 16 starts, Azee Rules had a 3-3-2 record and earnings of \$26,385. Through his January 14, 2022, second at Turf Paradise, he as a 9-5-8 record from 31 starts and total earnings of \$58,359. His dam, No Rules Tonight, is a half-sister to \$276,060 four-time Southern California stakes-placed Fallfree.

Champion older filly or mare Jaded Tiger had been voted the state's top two-year-old filly in 2019. Bred by Dr. Rodney Orr, the 2018 WTBOA Summer Sale yearling is also raced and trained by Jacqueline Smith. Last year Jaded Tiger made 18 starts with a 7-2-2 record and \$44,685 in earnings. She won a trio of stakes - the Daily Courier and Revillew Slew stakes at Grants Pass and the Princess Stakes (by 2 1/2 lengths) at Great Falls. She finished the year with a second in the Siskiyou Stakes and a third in the Don Jackson Stakes, both at Grants Pass. With nine total wins and earnings of \$68,581. Jaded Tiger is the leading earner among the six winners produced out of the winning Skip Away mare Jadelet, a half-sister to \$104,242 stakes-placed Sweet Vision.

Teri Beckner, who had a 6-19-12 record from 91 starts and whose trainees earned \$88,162, was named 2021 Oregon trainer of the year.

2022 Oregon Fair Racing

Racing on the Oregon Fair Circuit will begin with three days, June 10-12, in Union at the Eastern Oregon Livestock Show. A week later, the newly resurrected Southern Oregon Horse Racing Association (SOHRA) will hold a seven-day meet at Grants Pass, June 19-21, 27-28 and July 3-4. The Crooked River Roundup meet will be held over four days in Prineville, July 13-16. The Tillamook County Fair will finish off summer racing with a four-day meet on August 10-13.

Grants Pass Downs had cancelled its 2022 meeting due to lack of horses and "As a result of the Oregon Racing Commission's vote to deny an operating license to The Flying Lark, Grants Pass Downs has lost its economic engine," said Travis Boersma, owner of Grants Pass Downs. The spring meet was originally supposed to run from May 12 through July 5 with the fall meet scheduled for September 4 through October 25.

"When it became apparent that [Grants Pass Downs] was not going to renew their commercial license, we decided that the best thing was for the OHBPA (Oregon Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association) to seek that license for itself for the continuation of the commercial meet as well as the obvious benefits of the off-track betting (OTB) network," said Randy Boden, OHBPA executive director.

SOHRA was put in place after a two-year absence as "an experienced recent licenseholder to help keep the state's most suitable track open this spring and summer while hosting the formerly traditional fair meets at Grants Pass in June/July."

Dorado Farms. Of her 11 starters, 9 became winners, including stakes winners Irene's Bonus Baby and Grace Bay. She is also the granddam of 5 stakes winners, led by 2020 Washington co-champion 2-year-old Dutton ... From February 10, 2022, Thoroughbred Daily News under the column "Breeding Plans" for Jason and Silvia Hall: Chu and You, m., 11, You and I-Bronze Charmer, by Volponi. The Halls had purchased her 2019 yearling colt by Temple City, who as Boise, won 2021 Gold Rush Stakes at Golden Gate Fields last December. His impressed owners purchased his dam, Washington's 2013 Washington champion 2-year-old filly. They also bought Chu and You's stakes-placed sister Attyia at the 2022 January Keeneland sale. Both Chu and You and Attyia were bred by Michael and Amy Feuerborn and both mares will be bred to Temple City in 2022 ... Washington Hall of Fame trainer Wesley Ward lost three horses in a barn fire at his Versailles, Kentucky, farm on March 6 after lightning struck a service pole that led to the barn. Among the horses lost was 12-year-old Strike the Tiger, Ward's first Royal Ascot winner in 2009 when he won the Windsor Castle Stakes. More recently he served as Ward's pony. In early February, Ward's 12 golden Royal Ascot trophy boxes were stolen from his home. It was announced on March 10 that seven of the stolen trophies have been recovered, though heavily damaged burnt down in order to obtain any precious metals - and one individual was charged with receiving stolen property . . . Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale

Keeneland held their annual January mixed sale, after a one day weather delay, over four sessions from January 11-15, 2022. Along with several late entries, a total of 1,631 horses were cataloged, 1,013 changed hands in the ring and another 32 were sold post sale for a \$47,581,100 cumulative total, \$45,532 average and \$20,000 median.

Topping the venue for \$750,000 was Princesse Lele, a juvenile daughter of Quality Road out of Acorn Stakes (G1) winner Carina Mia, by Malibu Moon. She was purchased by Three Chimneys Farm.

Halvorson Bloodstock Services LLC signed for two yearling colts. The first, a Connect half-brother to \$202,398 stakesplaced Always a Suspect; and the second, by Air Force Blue out of \$88,996 earner Ready to Unleash, a sister to G3-placed Hype and half-sister to \$389,141 stakes winner Modern Cowboy – all offspring of 1998 Washington champion juvenile Western Woman.

Connie Belshay purchased four-year-old Saint Lo, an unraced daughter of Declaration of War. Saint Lo and her \$372,557 stakeswinning half-sister Veaisha are daughters of Aqueduct stakes winner Love Co.

John Parker purchased six-year-old mare Systemic Risk, a \$100,089 earner by Into Mischief, and through Terrie Baze as agent, the six-year-old mare So Gracious, a \$126,823 earner by Speightstown. Both mares were offered as racing or broodmare prospects.

Kara Toye, as agent, signed for five-yearold racing or broodmare prospect Yellen, an \$84,037 earner by Fed Biz; and for Chelsea Dryer, a yearling Big Blue Kitten filly from the family of Grade 3 winner Play It Again Sam.

Glen Todd's North American Thoroughbred Horse Company bought a yearling colt by Palace Malice out of \$297,326 stakes-placed Made Up, the dam of stakes-placed Drinking Dixie.

Carl Grether and former NBA Lakers player Robert Sacre – who went to school at Gonzaga University – partnered to sell the second-highest yearling offered during the auction's second session. His second dam is a Grade 2-producing sister to champion and major producer Serena's Song.

Among the other horses selling with a Pacific Northwest connection were: broodmare prospect Is That a Thing, by Will Take Charge, a half-sister to Emerald Downs' Getaway Day Stakes winner Yulong Warrior; Enchanted Fortune, an Indian Charlie daughter of Washington horse of the year Delicate Vine's Grade 2-winning granddaughter House of Fortune, bred to Instilled Regard; a yearling Good Samaritan colt out a winning half-sister to the stakesplaced dam of 2015 Washington champion three-year-old colt or gelding The Press; a Bolt d'Oro colt out of a half-sister to Northwest Farms' Emerald Downs champion two-year-old filly Goin to the Window; Woven, a six-year-old Bernardini mare out of Oak Crest Farm-bred Grade 1 winner Sutra, bred to Street Boss; and a yearling Flameaway colt out of a daughter of Washington champion Classy Cara.

Also noted as selling was a Speightster half-brother to 2021 Emerald Downs stakesplaced Broad Appeal. His dam is a half-sister to Bar C Racing Stables' 2021 Oregon leading freshman sire Dynamic Impact. CTBA Winter Mixed Sale

The 2022 CTBA Winter Mixed Sale was held at Fairplex in Pomona, California, on February 1. After 25 late additions, 163 horses were cataloged for the afternoon sale. After 16 outs, 113 of the 147 horses sold for a \$1,306,500 gross, \$11,562 average (up 45 percent) and \$5,450 median (up 70 percent).

Topping the venue for \$85,000 was the two-year-old Le Vron James, a Californiabred son of Vronsky—Amusing, by Cee's Tizzy. He was consigned by agent Checkmate Thoroughbreds LLC, as was the highest-priced filly, an unnamed juvenile daughter of Gun Runner—Mahogany Lane, by A. P. Indy, which sold to Ron Thomsen for \$42,000.

Washington and California trainer Tim McCanna purchased a two-year-old filly from the first crop of Santa Anita stakes winner Conquest Farenheit (by Scat Daddy) and a yearling colt by Mr. Big.

Trainer Jeff Metz, who plies his trade in California, Arizona and Washington, purchased a two-year-old colt by Northern Causeway; a four-year-old filly named Addydidit, by Time to Get Even; and fiveyear-old Jungle Roar, a gelding by Animal Kingdom.

John Parker signed for two Northern Causeway juveniles. The filly is out of a half-sister to Emerald Downs stakes winners Taste the Passion and Bisbee's Prospect; and the colt is out of a winning Tapit halfsister to stakes winner Frankiefourfingers. The Lakebay resident also purchased two three-year-olds: She's My D Gorgeous, an unraced filly from the first crop of Danzing Candy; and Preskitt, a placed daughter of 2021 California leading sire Stay Thirsty. In addition, Parker signed for Maddie's Mojito, a four-year-old \$58,550 winning daughter of Strong Mandate; and broodmare prospect Lady O'Prado, a five-year-old \$38,545 earner by Paddy O'Prado who came with a 2022 complimentary season to Danzing Candy.

The nine-year-old mare is a half-sister to Moger's Stilleto Boy – who had run third in the Pegasus World Cup (G1) just three days before the sale – and also to \$342,483 stakes winner Rosie My Rosie.

Oregon's Jack B. Root Jr., of Oakhurst Thoroughbreds, bought a trio broodmares: Be My Baby, by Artie Schiller, a winning half-sister to Grade 2 stakes winner and \$843,908 earner Kitten's Roar, bred to Mr. Big; Pandura, a ten-year-old mare by Midnight Lute who is the dam of stakesplaced Even Pandura, bred to Stay Thirsty; and 11-year-old \$71,365 winner Vivacious Beauty, by Into Mischief, bred to Tom's Tribute.

Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Winter Mixed Sale

After a one-day weather delay, Fasig-Tipton's two-day Kentucky Winter Mixed Sale got underway on February 8, 2022. The sale featured 109 late additions, giving the venue 608 total entries. After 121 outs and 56 RNAs, 431 horses sold for a \$17,345,500 gross, \$40,013 average and \$16,000 median. In 2021 the sale sold 425 horses for a \$12,506,700 gross, \$29,428 average and \$10,000 median.

Topping the sale for \$750,000 was supplemental entry Brilliant Cut, a four-yearold daughter of Speightstown who was Grade 1- and Grade 2-placed as a three-year-old. The half-sister to stakes winner Lemieumx is also from the immediate family of G1 winners Diamondrella (GB) and Life Is Good, who won the 2022 Pegasus World Cup Stakes (G1).

Halvorson Bloodstock signed for two yearling fillies. The first is a daughter of multiple Grade 1 stakes winner Gormley, whose first foals are three-year-olds, and out of a winning half-sister to Grade 3-placed Friends with K Mill and \$334,782 stakesplaced Clench. The other filly is a daughter of the late Speightster and out of \$155,920 stakes winner Menifeeque, the dam of \$444,292 Grade 3 stakes winner Thank You Marylou.

North American Thoroughbred Horse Company bought two three-year-old fillies and one yearling colt. Alobrah is a winning daughter of Mshawish out of the winning Mr. Greeley mare Damsah. Chivalaryisnotdead, by Honor Code, is a daughter of Northwest Farm's good stakes winner and even better stakes producer Taste the Passion. The colt is from the next to last crop sired by champion Bernardini and his dam is a half-sister to UAE Grade 3 winner Khusoosy.

Among the other horses selling with a link to the Pacific Northwest were racing or broodmare prospect My Pharoah Lady, a three-year-old filly by American Pharoah out of Washington broodmare of Striking Scholar, dam of multiple Washington champions Stryker PhD and Madame Pele; and Please to Remember Me, an eightyear-old Bullet Train (GB) half-sister to Budweiser Stakes winner Dedicated to You and three stakes-placed runners and her yearling filly by Coal Front.

Risk Premium, an unraced daughter of Take Charge Indy, was sold bred to Munnings for \$82,000. She is a half-sister to Grade 2 winner Iliad and G3 winner and \$1.1-million earner Melmich. Their granddam, Littlesuruki, won the 1996 Janet Wineberg Stakes and placed in three other Portland Meadows stakes

Nick Muir grew up in Lynwood, but has been in Pullman for the past six years, completing his bachelor of science in Animal Science, and then going straight into vet school.

His background is primarily in the

Quarter Horse industry, as he has been training and showing reining horses since he was ten.

For the past seven years, he has been shadowing a Pilchuck Veterinary Hospital ambulatory equine veterinarian. It was through him that he developed a passion for equine medicine, especially in the sports medicine and rehabilitation fields.

Since starting vet school, Muir has been active in all equine-related classes and organizations. He served a two-year term as president-elect and president of the WSU Student Chapter of the American Association of Equine Practitioners (SCAAEP).

He also has tried to enhance his skills as a practitioner by enrolling in elective courses, such as advanced equine medicine, equine sports medicine, large animal surgery and applied reproductive physiology.

2021 Rood and Riddle Sport Horse Winners Announced

In mid-January, the USEF Horse of the Year Awards were held in Naples, Florida. Among the award announcements made were the Rood and Riddle Thoroughbreds in Sports Awards.

Each year the prominent veterinary clinic, Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital, sponsors four Thoroughbred Sport Horse divisions – with open and rookie categories in each – dressage, eventing, hunter and jumping and an overall Sport Horse of the Year. The 2021 Rood and Riddle Sport Horse of the Year winner will be announced in October.

The winner in the 2021 Rood and Riddle Thoroughbred three-day eventing horse category was Washington-bred Office Hours, aka "Argyle," shown by Skyeler Icke Voss, who is based at Morningside Training Farm in The Plains, Virginia.

Bred by Billie Klokstad, Office Hours took his first two wins for her while being conditioned by her husband, Washington Racing Hall of Fame trainer Bud Klokstad. The 2008 son of Private Gold—Aunt Tizzy, by Cee's Tizzy, would win two more races and had total earnings of \$35,301.

Argyle had previously been named 2017 Rood and Riddle Sport Horse of the Year.

Rood and Riddle created these awards in 2010 with hopes to draw attention to the exciting possibilities of second careers for Thoroughbreds following their racing days.

Winners of 2021 TIP Performance and Polo Awards

The Jockey Club Thoroughbred Incentive Program (TIP), which encourages the retraining of Thoroughbreds into other disciplines upon completion of careers in racing or breeding, announced in March the winners and other placings from its 2021 performance awards program and the TIP/ USPA annual polo awards.

The performance awards recognize Thoroughbreds that have accumulated the most points at all horse shows and cover a wide variety of disciplines and experience levels. In 2021, 726 Thoroughbreds from 42 states and four provinces competed in more than 15,000 classes, divisions and events. Division awards were calculated in 14 discipline categories, as well as 92 discipline divisions and eight junior rider divisions. Category and division awards included the Green OTTB category for Thoroughbreds that last raced in 2019, 2020 or 2021, with generous sponsorship for these awards provided by Thoroughbred Charities of America (TCA). Winners received ribbons, prize money and a variety of prizes, including coolers, halters, bags, keychains and apparel. The complete list of winners and participants is available at tjctip.com/ PerformanceAwardsWinners.

In addition to the category and division awards, the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance (TAA) sponsored a performance award for horses adopted from TAA-accredited organizations, and the Retired Racehorse Project (RRP) provided awards for topplacing RRP Makeover alumni.

Among this year's category winners is Washington-based Kaisa Gifford, whose Louisiana-bred gelding Sharp Clark was named TCA Green OTTB – Last Raced 2021. Khilia Giacobone, who owns and rides 2020-21 top Washington-bred OTTB Winter Knight (shown as Maei Platinum Star), is also the owner/rider of Maryland-bred Crypt's Wisper (shown as Crypt's Maei Star) who was named top of the equitation division.

Matthew Joseph Alhadeff

Matthew Alhadeff, passed away January 19, 2022, in Henderson, Nevada. He was born in Seattle to Marjorie and Michael D. Alhadeff.

His childhood was neither typical nor atypical: weekend and holiday excursions to the cabin on Whidbey Island; wheeling and more wheeling; clam-digging at the Duck Club; horseback riding at Mountain Sky; camping trips to Salmon La Sac; July 4th firework shows at home on the shores of Puget Sound; Sundays at Longacres; and vacations to destinations near, far, and in between.

Roberta Louise Leckbee

Roberta Leckbee, 83, passed away June 19, 2021. She was born October 13, 1938, to Robert and Marguerite Irene Nor Velle, and had one brother, Robert Louis Nor Velle. She graduated from Reno High School.

Roberta married Mervin Leckbee January 18, 1960. They had three children, Amy, Terrie and Mervin II "JR." Roberta was a stay-at-home mom in Redmond, Oregon, until all three of her children had graduated high school.

She and Merv moved to Washington in the mid-1980s and founded their 80-acre Leckbee Thoroughbred Farm in Onalaska, where they offered boarding, mare care, foaling, sales prep and representation and breeding to their various stallions. Through the years the couple stood several stallions, beginning with El Rastro (Ire) in 1985. They later added Pyrite, Mongo Drums. Police Inspector, Shining Asset, Key to Contention, Snake Oil Man and Adbass. After the couple moved to Kentucky in 1996 to fulfill a lifelong dream, son JR managed the farm and added stallions like Bull inthe Heather, Alnnab, Stolen Gold, Tough Knight, Worldly, Taj Alriyadh, Raisor's Edge and Makors Mark to the roster. Alnnab, Makors Mark, Stolen Gold, Taj Alrivadh and Tough Knight all sired state champions at one point or another in their careers at stud.

JR's son Trè and his family now operate the family farm as Leckbee Cattle Company.

The best horse Merv and Roberta bred was the 1970 Oregon-bred filly Repeatable, a daughter of Irepeat who won or placed in eight stakes races in Oregon, Washington and British Columbia. Her dam, Free and Able, was their favorite horse and foundation broodmare. The daughter of Leisure Time only produced five foals, but all were winners and included additional stakes winner Termo, a Washington-bred son of Terlago. Daughter Terrie remembers Free and Able as "an incredible producing mare that never disappointed!"

Among the other stakes winners the couple bred or co-bred were Sweet Gallant (1989-90) and Leap to the Lead (1992).

In his younger days, Merv, who began his involvement with horses as a teenager, was both a jockey and a trainer. After their move to Kentucky, he remained active in the business as a night watchman at Three Chimneys Farm, first in the foaling barn and later in the stallion division where Seattle Slew was his favorite.

The couple was instrumental in bringing their former stallion Bull inthe Heather to Old Friends (Thoroughbred Retirement Home), where Roberta volunteered for several years in the gift shop, greeting guests and booking tours. She also enjoyed researching vintage bloodlines and being active in the Thoroughbred industry as a bloodstock agent, breeder and seller.

She was predeceased by her husband, Merv, in 2006. Roberta is survived by her daughters, Amy (Troy) Womack and Terrie Baze; son, JR; grandsons, Zac Baze, Stephen Womack and Josh and Mervin III "Tre" (Sara) Leckbee, the latter the parents of twins Mervin IV "Tuff" and Riot, 5, and Colt and Bristol, 3.

Janet Ellen (Wineberg) Leigh

Ellen Leigh passed away in January 2022 in Kentucky. She was one of three daughters born to William J. and Janet Wineberg.

Her sister Donna Jensen operated Portland Meadows, a track their father had purchased in 1962. Wineberg had been the second largest stockholder in the Portland Turf Association, which had operated Portland Meadows from 1959-61. Sold in 1969, the track returned to Wineberg ownership in 1974, and upon his death in 1975 was operated by the Wineberg Racing Association until 1984, when Donna Jensen and her husband John purchased the racing oval.

Ellen married Jack William Leigh on December 29, 1956, in Vancouver, Washington. The couple lived in Happy Valley, Clackamas, Oregon, until his death at 67 in July 1996.

Among the many winners Ellen bred and raced were six-race winner Seeking Love, five-race winner Symph and three-race winner Cher Charteau.

She was preceded in death by her parents; husband; and sisters, Donna Jensen and Sella Hatfield. Ellen is survived by her daughter, Donna Jean; granddaughter, Donell Wiskoski; nephews, Eric Jensen and John Jensen Jr.

Ellen Parker

Ellen Parker, 75, a longtime pedigree analyst and turf writer and a 17-year resident of Paris, Kentucky, passed peacefully April 5, 2022. in Lexington. Having post-deceased her beloved husband, Ron Parker, by a year, Ellen succumbed from a broken heart.

Born August 20, 1946, in St Marys, Ohio, to Bill and Carol Koenig, Ellen developed her early love for horses into a lifelong obsession after seeing Round Table race at Arlington Park in Chicago in 1956. Ellen's career started at Golden Gate Fields in Northern California as an assistant publicist, and she went on to become a turf writer and racing editor.

Ellen was well-known for her pedigree analyst work on Thoroughbred bloodlines, and with her husband she began the monthly newsletter *Pedlines*, which she considered one of her greatest achievements.

Ellen also wrote a non-fiction book on Round Table, as well as consulted on a documentary regarding Thoroughbred racing. One of her major achievements was the formation of *Reines-De-Course* (Queens of the Turf) in 1991 as a well-researched guide to influential female Thoroughbred families that could be utilized to improve the breed.

A longtime member of the National Turf Writers and Broadcasters, Ellen wrote for or served as an editor for many publications, including *American Turf Monthly, California Thoroughbred, The Northern California Thoroughbred* and *Washington Thoroughbred.*

Although Ellen's regard for all horses was in mostly equal measure, her love affairs with Round Table, Brown Bess, and most recently California Chrome, set the standard for what she considered the best of the best. Ellen covered Brown Bess' entire racing career extensively when she was the Northern California correspondent for *California Thoroughbred*, and she visited Round Table regularly at Claiborne Farm in Paris until his death in 1987.

Ellen and Ron attended several editions of the Breeders' Cup World Championships. They enjoyed traveling, especially to Bermuda.

Besides horses and Ron, Ellen loved cats, the British royal family, and crime and sci-fi novels and movies, and not necessarily in that order! Known for her sharp intelligence, fine sense of humor and discerning taste, Ellen will be greatly missed.

She leaves her adopted daughter Michele "Shelley" Whitney.

attitude allowed him to do many jobs around the racetrack. Ron was also an avid and accomplished golfer.

Theiline "Ty" (Pigott) Scheumann

Ty Scheumann, 90, passed away December 30, 2021, in Bellevue. She was born in Seattle March 28, 1931, one of six children born to Paul and Theiline (McGee) Pigott.

Her grandfather William Pigott Sr. founded the American Fortune 500 company and Washington-based Paccar, one of the largest manufacturers of medium- and heavyduty trucks in the world. The company's structural steel division fabricated the steel for the construction of the Seattle's landmark Space Needle – built by Howard S. Wright Construction – for the 1962 World's Fair.

Her father passed away in 1961 and her mother later married John McCone, a longtime family friend who at the time of the wedding was director of the Central Intelligence Agency and had been the former chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission.

As a teenager Ty traveled solo to the East by Great Northern Railroad to attend high school at the Madeira School in McLean, Virginia. She then returned to Seattle to attend the University of Washington and joined the Kappa Gamma Sorority.

Ty married Howard Wright in 1952, and began a family in the Sand Point neighborhood. In 1963 they moved to Redmond where she founded Grousemont Farm. Life on the farm was full of kids, horses, cats, dogs, station wagons, along with a hippopotamus.

Perhaps born before the era of women's empowerment, Ty was an independent force, an accomplished outdoorswoman. She was a horsewoman, hunter (bird), fisherman, pilot (floatplane), sailor (crossing the North Atlantic in 1999), tennis player and golfer; and she completed training as a certified mediator.

Some of her proudest accomplishments were in the complex world of horse breeding and racing. Ty always had a love for horses. She was an accomplished rider and breeder of Thoroughbreds. She also bred international caliber horses in Kentucky. There were few days when she wasn't on the phone discussing the business and the health of her mares.

In 2011, she was honored as Washington Racing Hall of Fame breeder. The Wrights had been introduced to racing by their friends, neighbors and fellow Hall of Fame breeders, William and Barbara Nelson.

The first winner, raised but not bred by the Wrights, was 1968 dual stakes winner Fitness. He would be followed by Washington horse of the year Rock Bath and additional Washington champions Savanna Blue Jeans, Marching Duke, Ladies Excuse Me and many other local stakes winners. Ty was a strong supporter of the Washington Thoroughbred industry. Her farm produced many sale toppers, including 2018 Keeneland January Sale topper Mrs. McDougal, which she sold for \$1.6-million. She also helped to secure future eight-time leading Washington sire Son of Briartic.

Grousemont Farm was one of the benefactors that contributed to the building of the WTBOA Sales Pavilion and offices at Emerald Downs in 1996.

On national level, Grousemont bred Thirty Slews (Bob Baffert's first Breeders' Cup winner), two-time Grade 1 winner Noble Nashua and additional graded stakes winners Nasty Storm, Speed World and Palmerio. Among the top distaffers she raced, many in partnership, but didn't breed, were Joli Vert, Descent, J Z Warrior, Downthedustyroad and Rossard (Den), the latter who would produce leading California sire Unusual Heat.

Ty served on many volunteer boards, beginning with Seafair to celebrate Seattle's centennial in 1951-52 (the Seattle area was without major league sports teams or the Seattle Center). Ty's legacy is defined by her commitment to the people and the community of the region. She was a wise, discrete and generous philanthropist. Her volunteer work also included the Junior League and the Seattle Art Museum.

Ty was a strong fan of UW football and the Seattle Seahawks, watching games at home until the weekend before her death.

We will always remember her great sense of humor, mischievous smile and bright blue eyes.

She was preceded in death by her parents; husbands, Douglas Scheumann and Howard S. Wright; and sister, Pat. Ty is survived by her five children, Lee (Stuart) Rolfe, Howard S. (Kate Janeway) Wright III, Jeff (Korynne) Wright, Taylor (Erin) Wright and David (Sally) Wright; 13 grandchildren; 11 greatgrandchildren; sisters, Ann Wyckoff and Mary Ellen Hughes; and brothers, Charles and Jim, and their families.

Fredrick Clell Sherwood

Clell Sherwood, 78, passed away February 17, 2022, in Selah. He was born December 12, 1943, in Springfield, Missouri, to Jesse and Mary Sherwood, the oldest of three children.

The family soon moved west and Clell graduated from Selah High School in 1962.

At a young age, he developed a love for horses and shortly before graduating high school he started his career as a jockey. Clell traveled the country for many years doing what he loved – riding racehorses. He was also a dedicated racehorse owner and trainer many times throughout his career.

Clell was a leading rider at Yakima Meadows in the 1960s and 1970s. He topped the jockey standings at Yakima Meadows in 1967 (16 wins) and was co-leading rider at the Yakima track in 1963 with Vern Gibson (ten wins). He guided the first two winners of the A. E. Penney Memorial Handicap: Bilmora (1965) and Wilbur (1966). Both runners were trained by Penney's grandson Jim Penney.

In 1967, he won the Harvest Handicap and the Washington State Breeders' Handicap at Playfair aboard Just Like Uptown. That same year, he also rode Quina Reigh to the win in the Miss Spokane Stakes. He finished seventh, behind leader Richard Wright, in that year's Playfair jockey standings, after being sidelined with injuries.

Clell won five races (from eight mounts) on September 3, 1967, at the Eastern Washington track. Earlier that same year, Clell was the first rider to win five races (from five mounts) in one day (March 25) at Yakima Meadows.

Washington Racing Hall of Fame rider Larry Pierce remembers Clell's nickname in Yakima in the 1960s was "Selah Shoe" (referring to top national rider Bill Shoemaker).

Clell was the jockey Tom Crawford took to River Downs in 1965 to ride Aryess, where the trainer made several big betting coups with the Washington-bred runner. A multiple stakes winner in his home state, the son of Mercenary was eight years old when he made his Ohio debut. In his nine starts at the Cincinnati track, Aryess won six, starting out for a \$1,500 tag and eventually winning two stakes. Clell purchased a new car with his share of the bounty.

After retiring from riding and training, Clell went on to work at Longacres as a jockey valet, He was the custodian of the jockeys room at Yakima Meadows and worked there until the track closed. Later, Clell managed the Emerald Downs jockey room from 1996 to 2015. After leaving his position at Emerald Downs, Clell ran the Casino Caribbean simulcast site in Yakima and worked there until his final days.

In the mid-80s Clell and his wife Sheryl decided to settle down and start a family. Clell and Sheryl were married from 1984-2002 and they had two children. He was a proud father and loved to take his kids on many adventures, including camping, fishing, hunting and road trips. Later, he thrived in his new role as Grandpa, taking the kids to fishing derbies and giving them pony rides at the farm.

Clell was an avid outdoorsman, storyteller and jokester. He loved to tell stories and could captivate an audience like no other. He also loved to hunt, especially chukar hunting with good friends and his bird dogs. Clell also enjoyed fishing and he could lead you to all the best spots for picking morel mushrooms and huckleberries.

He was preceded in death by his parents; and longtime partner, Patti Hakin. Clell is survived by his son, Jesse (Fernanda); daughter, Sally (Rick); grandchildren, Riley, Marijo, Mary, Henry, little Clell, Charlee, Lyndsey and Josh; and sisters, Nona and Marlene.

John Short Jr.

John Short, 76, passed away December 26, 2021. He was born October 1, 1945, to John and Catherine Short, in Yakima and grew up and went to school in that Central Washington town.

After serving in the Army as a sergeant, John returned to the US and went to horseshoeing school. He proudly took care of backyard horses, show horses and racehorses. John became an avid student of hoof physiology and was an encyclopedia of every horse he shod.

He and his wife Teresa were married for 28 years. They originally met when she was a youngster with horses at Central Stables with trainer Bruce Gilchrist. They reconnected years later when he helped with the hoof issues of her Paint horse.

John was the official farrier for WTBOA Sales from 2005-16 and worked for many of the Thoroughbred farms in South King County. He loved racing and all of the people involved.

He also operated Iron Horse Enterprises and helped to create and produce vitamins and healing aids for horses.

John loved working with children and introduced more than one troubled foster child to the healing power of horses.

He was predeceased by his parents and his sisters. John is survived by his wife, Teresa.

Roy Taylor

Roy Taylor, 90, passed away February 23, 2022. He and his identical twin brother and fellow trainer Troy Taylor were born on September 11, 1931, to Herb and Thera Taylor in Nebraska. Roy and his four brothers and two sisters were raised on the family farm in Payette, Idaho. In addition to Roy and Troy, their father and brother J. D. were also trainers. J. D. would later be the lead outrider at Longacres for 40 years and another brother, Hubert, was a well-known racetrack farrier.

The twins did pretty much everything together, including travelling to Santa Anita while in their late teens and early 20s to work under prominent California trainers.

Roy, Troy and J. D. served with the military during the Korean conflict. After their return home from military duty, the three brothers bought a few horses and formed Taylor Brothers Stable.

Roy led the Playfair training ranks in both 1961 (26 winners) and 1962 (22 winners). In addition to being Playfair's leading trainer in 1960, brother Troy was a leading trainer at Portland Meadows and an eight-time leading trainer at Hastings Racecourse.

Among the stakes winners Roy trained, many in conjunction with Troy, were Washington champions Sandy Fleet and Brief Grief and stakes winner Victory Trail. Roy was an outstanding all around horseman when it came to training, leg care and conditioning. He liked to handicap races more than his twin and also preferred to stay in the barn and view the races from the backside.

He was preceded in death by his brothers, Troy, in 2019, and J. D. Roy leaves behind his sister, Darlene Dolan.

John Glendon "Glen" Todd

Glen Todd, 75, of White Rock, BC, passed away March 26, 2022. He was born December 20, 1946, to John Cyril "Jack" and Eileen Todd in British Columbia. His parents had met in 1939 at Hastings Racecourse in Vancouver.

Glen's favorite childhood pastime was attending races with his father. Any opportunity he had to be around Thoroughbred horses and the people who worked with them was considered an education in how to recognize what makes a horse a frontrunner. When he was 16, Glenn worked as a writer and handicapper for a local newspaper and owned his first racehorse in his early 20s.

His professional career was with the family-owned export trading companies Pacific Custom Brokers (PCB) Ltd and ABC Customs Brokers Ltd founded by his father. Glen took the helm of both companies in 1981. Under his guidance, the group of companies grew in both services and size. Glen was so proud of his companies and staff of 300.

For the past decade, Glen published a daily e-newsletter, *The Derby Bar and Grill*, which was named after an OTB business he opened in 2008 in a Vancouver business complex.

He also was a part-owner of December Farm in Midway, Kentucky.

Glen was involved in Thoroughbred racing for nearly 60 years as an owner, trainer, breeder, publisher, OTB operator and supporter of horse racing in the Pacific Northwest. He was the winningest owner in Hastings' history. He and longtime friend Dr. Mark Dedomenico were partners in many good runners.

Glen also served on the BC Horse Racing Industry Management Committee, created in 2009 to develop new marketing strategies and increase revenue from horse racing, which at the time generated more than \$190-million annually in gross provincial revenue and employed approximately 3,600 people with thousands of additional agriculture jobs connected indirectly.

He was very proud of his relationship with top jockey Mario Gutierrez, who Glen considered family. Through Glen's mentorship Mario become highly successful worldwide, with wins in the Grade 1 Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes, after starting at Hastings Racecourse.

In 2021 Glen provided a \$1-million interest-free loan to Hastings to fund purses

so horseman would have a place to race their runners after corona virus restrictions had done much to shutdown racing in the province.

Glen was the co-winner of the 2011 Sovereign Award for outstanding owner during a year in which he won 34 stakes races.

Among his many top runners were graded stakes winners Commander, Sorryaboutnothing, Five Star General, Holy Nova, Sir Gallovic and 2012 Longacres Mile (G3) winner Taylor Said, who was ridden by Mario.

Glen, under his North American Thoroughbred Horse Company Inc. (NATHC) banner, also raced Washingtonbred champion fillies Castinette Dancer and Miss Prospector.

When his longtime trainer Troy Taylor retired, Glen – who had trained in the 1970s and 1980s – again took out his trainer's license at Hastings and was highly successful. Glen is credited with 156 wins from 970 starts and with purse earnings of \$1.8-million.

He was Inducted into the British Columbia Sports Hall of Fame in 2008. Glen, who founded and coached the first White Rock Renegades team in 1986, had begun as a coach in the South Surrey/White Rock Minor Softball Association. He would become the longtime president of White Rocks girls fastpitch organization.

He created the world-renowned Canada Cup Women's Fastpitch Tournament and gained acceptance of fastpitch as a contending sport in the Olympics. He was also a member of Softball BC, Softball Canada and the World Baseball Softball Confederation (WBSC) Hall of Fame.

Hastings Racecourse said on Twitter that Todd's "passion and commitment to the industry was unparalleled and will be sorely missed." The track is planning to commemorate Todd's contributions in a manner "befitting of his almost 60-year legacy to the Thoroughbred industry."

He was predeceased by his wife, Sandra, in 2007. Glen is survived by his daughters, Shelly (Mike) Bancroft and Dana (Jason) Barker; grandchildren, Dawson Bancroft, Lincoln, Declan and Fisher Barker; sister, Diane; and Mario (Rebecca) Gutierrez.

In lieu of flowers the family has requested donations be made to Glen Todd Legacy Fund benefiting New Stride Thoroughbred Adoption Society (www.newstride.com).

Edward W. Zenker

Ed Zenker, 80, passed away February 2, 2022. He was born on May 9, 1941.

A resident of Spanaway, Ed was a prominent Tacoma real estate broker (Parkside Realty), homebuilder and land developer.

He was also a longtime horseman. Many of his 128 wins and nearly \$1.5-million in earnings (2000-22) were in partnership with trainer H. R. "Pat" Mullens and Richard "Swede" Larson. Among their best runners were Washington champions She's All Silk and Hit the Beach and Washington plater of the year Bijou Barrister. Besides Mullens, Bud Klokstad and Joe Toye trained for him.

Ed was also an avid golfer.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Penny. Ed is survived by his daughter, Shelly (Mike) Mullen; son, Eddie Zenker; and grandsons, Tucker Mullen and Taylor Mullen.

Additional In Memoriams

Other recent deaths in our horse racing community include: **Bonnie Baze**, wife of trainer Robbie Baze, who died as the results of a car accident in December 2021; **Charles Ecklund**, son-in-law of Joe and Sally Steiner on April 17 as the result of injuries sustained in a car accident. He leaves his wife, Karrie Steiner Ecklund, son, Oskar and daughter, Maggie; and **Steve Pilgrim**, co-owner of 2018 Washington horse of the year Sippin Fire, who passed away last summer.

Equine In Memoriam

Fleet Pacific

2000-01 Washington champion older filly or mare Fleet Pacific was euthanized at her lifelong home on Vashon Island in early March 2022 due to a suspected ovarian tumor. According to her owner Marie Bradley, "She was sound until the end, and instigated and won the 'Daily Turnout Stakes Race' against her companion each morning."

Foaled in 1994, the bay mare was bred and raced by Mike and Marie Bradley's Rockin B Thoroughbreds and trained by Steve Bullock.

Unraced at two, Fleet Pacific won her first start at three, an Emerald Downs \$25,000 maiden claiming race in gate-towire fashion. She also took another \$25,000 claimer that season.

At four, she began her year with a victory in a \$40,000 claiming race, again leading at all calls over the Auburn racing surface. After her nine-length win in an \$50,000 optional claimer (N), all but one of her final 19 starts came in stakes company. She next won the HBPA Daycare Stakes and finished the season with a second, by a head, in the Belle Roberts Breeders' Cup Handicap.

Fleet Pacific only made four starts at five, but won the Auburn Handicap and was the half-length runner-up in the Emerald Breeders' Cup Distaff Handicap.

She made eight starts during her first championship season, all at Emerald, winning the Boeing (by 4 1/2 lengths), Emerald Breeders' Cup Distaff (by 3 3/4), Belle Roberts and Mae Harris (by 2 3/4) handicaps and finishing second in the King County Handicap.

At seven, the Bradleys' talented mare won a trio of Emerald stakes and finished fourth in two others in her five outings. Her new stakes tallies came in the Hastings Park and Washington State Legislators handicaps and she had a repeat victory in the Emerald Breeders' Cup Distaff Handicap.

In her 30 starts, Fleet Pacific retired with a 15-5-2 record, earnings of \$313,058 and a 6.49 SSI. She won at distances ranging from 51/2 furlongs to 1 1/8 miles and in any weather.

A daughter of Washington champion Colonel Stevens, Fleet Pacific was one of five winners produced out of the winning Piaster mare Pacific Patti. Fleet Pacific's second dam, winner Bold Pacific, by Saltville, produced Exhibition Park stakes-placed fillies Pacific Bette and Pacific Bitsy. Her third dam, Filly Will Fight, by Watch Your Step, was the dam of 1972 Washington champion and Longacres Mile winner Red Wind, stakes winner and stakes producer Kristi Anniti, stakes-placed and stakes producer Philandria and additional stakes producers Miss Tree Miss and Filly Will Fly.

As a broodmare, Fleet Pacific produced six foals from 2003 to 2011. Her lone winner from the three starters was the 2005 He's Tops gelding Sonic Fleet.

Sunpenny

Sunpenny and her 2021 filly by Misremembered were among the 24 horses that perished in the January 6, 2022, predawn barn fire at Springcliff Farm in Martinsville, Indiana.

Bred in Washington by Rick and Debbie Pabst, Sunpenny raced for the partnership of Steve Zerda's Z TB Racing, S. Centers, J. Conolly, W. Evans. R. Moore and R. Werner. for whom she was twice stakes-placed and earned \$70,527. She was trained throughout her 23-race career by Frank Lucarelli. Zerda had purchased Sunpenny for \$12,000 from the Pabsts' Blue Ribbon Farm consignment at the 2012 WTBOA Summer Yearling Sale.

Sunpenny, a daughter of Good Reward – a millionaire Grade 1-winning son of Storm Cat – was one of three winners produced out of the Pabst's \$91,000 stakes winner Cascade Corona. Her two other winners were stakesplaced Frisky Bear and Muchas Coronas, the dam of 2021 juvenile champion Koron and stakes-placed La Una. Cascade Corona was a half-sister to Grade 2-placed Son's Corona, stakes-placed Basin City Ben and multiple stakes producer Sarna.

In addition to her lost yearling filly, Sunpenny was the dam of Golden Gate winner Sunny Ride, an unraced three-yearold Grazen gelding named Grazen Sun and a two-year-old colt by Curlin to Mischief named Royal Halo.

In remembering his valued mare, Steve Zerda said, "Of all the horses racing for ZTR, Sunpenny had the most heart and class. Her try was unmistakable and always evident each race. She commanded attention and respect in the barn and on the training track. Sunpenny and her filly will be sorely missed."


