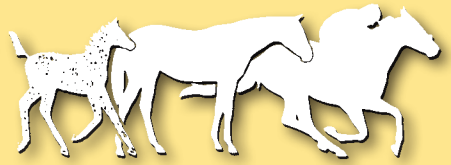

2022 WTBOA SUMMER YEARLING & MIXED SALE PREVIEW

Prestigious Washington sale offers pedigree strength and variety

The 55th WTBOA Summer Sale will take place on Tuesday, August 23, starting at 1:00 pm, one hour earlier than in recent years. This year's offering, which will again be held at the WTBOA Sales Pavilion located at Emerald Downs, has 85 yearlings, 18 broodmares – including a three-in-one package – and one weanling cataloged.

Auction activity begins with a chance to bid on a trip for two to the 2022 Breeders' Cup World Championships, scheduled to be run November 4 and 5 at beautiful Keeneland Race Course in Lexington, Kentucky. Trip includes prime seating, hotel accommodations and an air transportation voucher. Proceeds benefit the Washington Thoroughbred Foundation and its many programs.

Sire Strength

Sires of the yearlings cataloged include 2022 national leading juvenile and freshman sire Sharp Azteca – whose 16 winners (to August 7) include two wide-margin stakes winners – and other top national sires Connect, Exaggerator, First Samurai, Klimt, Midshipman, Race Day, Speightster, Take Charge Indy, Tale of Ekati and Tapizar.

Leading California sires represented include Clubhouse Ride, Curlin to Mischief, Danzing Candy, Grazen, Smiling Tiger, Stanford, and in his first North American crop, the impressive Sir Prancealot (Ire).

This marks the last full crop of outstanding Pacific Northwest (PNW) sire Harbor the Gold, whose offspring have won 71 Emerald Downs stakes. Other leading

PNW sires include Atta Boy Roy, Coast Guard, Nationhood, Dynamic Impact – sire of 2-year-old filly sensation Miss Dynamic in his second crop – and 2022 freshman leader Gold Rush Dancer.

Mention must also be made of 2021/2022 Washington leading sire Conveyance, who is represented by two foals (one selling at side) from his first Washington crop and two mares who were covered by the Grade 3-winning son of Indian Charlie.

Classy Dams

Among the top broodmares represented by a yearling are 14 mares who were

state champion runners and/or produced a champion. Six others also won stakes and another eight have placed in one or more stakes.

If you subtract the 19 mares who only have two-year-olds and/or yearlings, the others have already produced 23 stakes winners, 31 stakes-placed runners and more than a dozen others who are members of the "\$100,000 club."

Pedigree Updates

There have been quite a few exciting and important updates since the catalog was printed. Not only has there been many added

wins and winners, but also added stakes activity under several of the first dams, led by four first-time stakes winners.

At Monmouth Park, three-year-old That's Right won the \$102,000 My Frenchman Stakes on July 17, upping his earnings to \$154,150. His half-brother by Take Charge Indy sells as Hip 52.

Slack Tide, herself a 2020 WTBOA Sale graduate, took the Kent Stakes by 2 1/4 lengths at Emerald Downs on July 17. It marked the third stakes victory (second in 2022) for the three-year-old filly whose half-brother by Sir Prancealot (Ire) is being offered as Hip 80.

2021 WTBOA sale graduate Runnin Out of Days, came out running when, in his first start, he took the July 10 King County Express Stakes by 10 1/4 lengths. His half-brother by Coast Guard, is consigned as Hip 40.

Finishing third in the 5 1/2-furlong stakes was It's Turbo, a son of Curlin to Mischief, who would come back to win the August 7 WTBOA Lads Stakes. His half-brother by Grazen is selling as Hip 8.

KD Thoroughbreds four-year-old Slew's Tiz Whiz now has five wins to his credit, including his tally in the July 24 Governor's Stakes. He is out of winning sister to three-time Washington champion Lady Rosberg, whose yearling filly by Danzing Candy is consigned as Hip 25, and Lady Rosberg has a Grazen filly consigned as Hip 4.

Itsallinthenotes, Washington's 2021 champion older filly or mare, was second in

the Molly Brown Stakes on July 31, pushing her earnings to \$154,669. Her half-brother by Raised a Secret sells as Hip 76.

Other yearlings with significant updates under their first dams include Hips 10, 22 and 79 (new juvenile winners), Hip 64 (additional stakes placement), and Hips 29, 79 and 82 (allowance wins).

Broodmares

Among the broodmares offered are daughters of Broken Vow, Candy Ride (Arg), Fusaichi Pegasus, Malibu Moon, Roar, Smart Strike and Unusual Heat. They are carrying foals, in addition to the previously mentioned Conveyance, by Cat Burglar, Misremembered, Sixthirteen and the promising stallions Bodexpress, Jess Mo, One Bad Boy and Outlash.

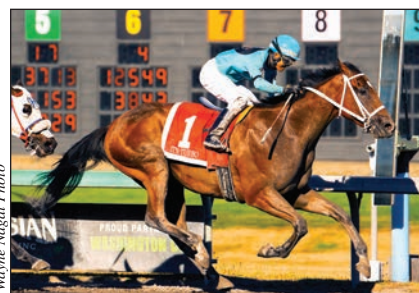

If you would like to bid on a horse but are not available at the time of the sale, you can find the lot you would like to bid on by clicking the inventory button on the right of the sale on the calendar page, locating the lot, and entering a pre-bid amount. If your pre-bid is high enough, the computer will bid on your behalf up to your pre-bid amount at the time of the sale. If your pre-bid is not high enough, you will be notified via e-mail.

Northwest Race Series Nominated Stallions

Stallion nominators' awards are paid for each race in the Northwest Race Series each year. These awards equal five percent of the total gross purse of each Northwest Race Series race and are paid to the nominators of the sires of the first, second and third place horses as follows: 50% for first, 30% for second and 20% for third.

The NWRS Stallion Stakes will not be run in 2022. In lieu of that, \$10,000 in additional bonus money, known as the **NWRS Nominated Sire Awards**, will be allocated as follows: \$2,500 in owners' bonuses will be distributed for each of four NWRS two-year-old stakes races – Angie C. Stakes, King County Express, WTBOA Lads Stakes and Barbara Shimpoch Stakes – with \$1,250 going to the owner of the first place finisher, \$750 to second and \$500 to third. These bonuses will be paid in addition to the normally allocated NWRS nominator's awards. *Remember: Offspring of nominated stallions MUST ALSO be nominated to the Northwest Race Series to be eligible to receive NWRS Nominated Sire Awards.*

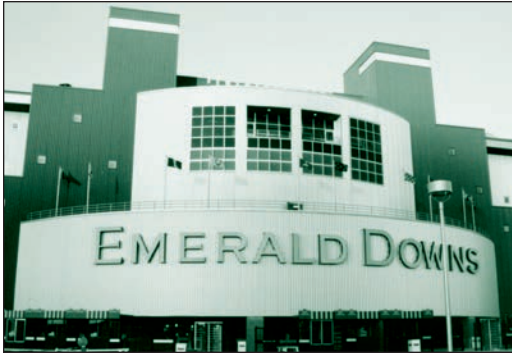

Developmental Orthopedic Disease in Young Horses

Diseases related to abnormal bone formation

Developmental orthopedic disease (DOD) is a blanket term that covers a number of conditions that affect skeletal development in the young, growing horse. Dr. Gary Baxter, University of Georgia, says this group of developmental diseases are all related to abnormal bone formation. "Even angular limb deformities in very young foals are related to some sort of developmental abnormality," he said.

Regarding the age at which foals and young horses are effected, the next problem you might see in a young foal is phytitis (involving swelling around the growth plates of certain long bones). "Then as foals get a little older, we might see the OCD (osteochondritis dissecans) joint problems, flexural deformities and wobblers syndrome."

Some of these problems develop as the foal grows, and some show up when the young horse is put into training. Many young horses are at risk for some types of DOD because of the way they are bred (genetics programmed for fast growth), raised and managed – with rich diets and not enough exercise.

"The good news about many of the developmental problems is that, depending on where it occurs (like angular limb deformities and OCD problems in the joint), a lot of them are treatable. They don't necessarily cause permanent lameness.

OCD Lesions

The OCD conditions that are in the non-weight-bearing aspects of the joint are the ones that have the best prognosis. The trochlear ridges of stifle and hock are not on the weight-bearing surface, for instance. The ones we have the toughest time dealing with are OCD lesions in the shoulder, and bone cysts in the stifle. These can cause a fair amount of lameness and can definitely result in permanent lameness. Those are the most common sites that cause severe lameness and are less likely to fully recover," he commented.

"Not only are there a number of things that can be included in DOD, but the term OCD refers to a couple different types, as well. It encompasses both the bone fragments in the joints, as well as the bone cysts – hollow spots within the bone. Mostly, bone cysts occur on weight-bearing surfaces on the joint," continued Baxter.

Fragments are due to abnormal development in which the bone does not form properly. A cartilage-bone fragment may break off or may not have grown together solidly. Something happens to cause separation of the fragment from the main bone. Instead of a normal end of the bone (at the joint surface), it splits off.

"These fragments mainly occur on non-weight-bearing parts of the joints and we see more OCD in the hock and stifle than any other joints. The hind legs seem more prone to some of the OCD abnormalities in the joints, whereas angular limb deformities are more common in the front legs," he went on to add.

"We don't really know why certain joints are predisposed to formation of OCD lesions. We also don't know why in some horses it affects the stifle and in other horses it affects the hock. In a few horses it affects multiple sites, but we don't have a good explanation as to why. There are many predisposing factors."

Fast Growth and High Energy Diets

Fast growth and high energy diets are thought to predispose young horses to problems. Faster-growing individuals seem to be more at risk, so there may be a genetic component, aggravated by feeding practices.

"The only proof of any genetic link is for hock OCD in Standardbreds. With the advances being made in finding human diseases genetically linked and associated to developmental problems, however we must be concerned that some of these problems in horses have hereditary components." It may or may not show up, depending on other factors, such as how much the youngster is pushed, nutritionally, for fast growth.

Multiple factors enter into this, and they may all have to line up to have it occur. "This is one of the difficulties in trying to sort it out; you can't just blame one thing, in any given horse. It probably isn't just one predisposing factor," he said. This makes it more challenging to deal with.

"Unfortunately, in many instances, by the time you diagnose a problem, it's too late to change anything. This is another frustrating thing for the owner. Once you diagnose the situation, it's too late to go back and look at the nutrition of the mare or the foal. You now have to deal with the problem. The main thing is to be aware of it, and try to correct it in future foals."

If a mare produces a foal with problems, you should be careful in her feed and management in future pregnancies and lactations.

"If you are looking for OCD, probably one of the first things you will see in the affected foal is extra fluid in the joint. The joint may be puffy or large. The foal may or may not be lame. Some of the foals with OCD on the non-weight-bearing surfaces of the joint are not necessarily lame. Those joints are just larger than the others. One of the best ways to diagnose OCD is to x-ray the joint," Baxter added.

The individual might be less eager to run and play with other foals or weanlings because of discomfort. Any lameness in a young horse should be a concern, since it may well be the sign of

a developmental problem. Young horses should not be lame or sore; they haven't done any hard work yet!

Wobblers Syndrome

“With wobblers, the first sign you might see is clumsiness or incoordination, or the youngster may not be able to keep up with the rest of the herd, or may occasionally fall down. This is a result of abnormal angulation of the vertebrae, which causes narrowing and compression on the spinal cord. The cervical vertebrae are not at the proper angle, and this is thought to be due to abnormal formation of the vertebrae during the developmental period as the animal grows,” he explained. Sometimes, compression of the cord is due to trauma, but often it's due to abnormal growth.

Different DOD Issues Appear at Different Ages

The different conditions of DOD come at different ages. Angular deformities and inflammation of growth plates in younger foals are seen in the first weeks or months of life, whereas most of the joint effusions and OCD lesions occur in the weaning to yearling stage and wobblers don't show up until they are yearlings or a little older.

Dealing with a Problem

Treatment will depend on the condition. Angular limb deformity may respond to confinement and proper hoof care, and straighten up on their own. Severe cases may need corrective surgery to straighten the leg (periosteal stripping, for cases that have time to resolve with this technique, or bridging the growth plates at the ends of the long bones if you want to make sure the correction will work). Knees have a bigger window of time in which correction can be made than do fetlocks. The growth plate closes earlier in the fetlock joints.

When a foal is young and growing, lengthening of leg bones occurs swiftly due to changes and growth at the ends of those bones. The region of bone-growing activity is called the physis or growth plate. This is where new cartilage cells are formed and then replaced by bone. Growth plates at the ends of the cannon, distal radius and distal tibia are instrumental in lengthening these bones as the foal grows larger and taller. Inflammation in one or more of the growth plates is called physisitis.

“Most cases of physisitis will also resolve on their own, if you confine the foal, minimize trauma to the physis (growth plate at the ends of the long bones) and use anti-inflammatory medications. The physisitis usually goes away, unless it results in abnormal bone growth. Then you can get secondary angular limb deformities, which must be dealt with,” he added.

Treatment can be variable, depending what you are dealing with. The horses that have OCD and puffiness in the joint – and

have fragments on the bone surfaces – are best treated by arthroscopic removal of the fragment or some newer techniques in which the surgeon tacks the cartilage down to the bone underneath it,” said Baxter.

Some sort of arthroscopy is usually the treatment of choice for dissecans lesions that have small bony fragments in the joints. “The type of OCD that has bone cysts (hollow spots) in the stifle remain one of the most difficult things to treat. The hole in the bone is on a weight-bearing area. These horses are often lame. There are lots of different treatments used, but none of them are ideal for all cases. Those are the horses that are the biggest challenge, to get sound. Some of the things that are tried are non-surgical (such as intra-articular injections or putting them on some kind of subchondrial protective agents like Adequan and nutraceuticals) to try to get them to heal without surgery.”

If they don't respond, surgical options are debridement (scraping the inner surface of the cyst), or injection of the cyst with corticosteroids (to decrease inflammatory mediators in the cyst lining that are eating the bone away and keeping it from filling in properly).

“Inflammatory mediators cause inflammation and resorption of the bone. By decreasing those, you allow the defect to fill in with bone. Debridement removes all the abnormal tissue and bone, and then there's a chance for it to fill in normally,” he further commented.

Another treatment involves debriding the cyst and then packing it with spongy, lattice-like bone taken from the medullary cavity of another long bone, and then a

chondrocyte graft (of mature cartilage cells) is put over the surface to try to get the cartilage to heal. “This is a combination of trying to fill in with cancellous bone (so it has lots of good mediators to promote bone growth and allow the defect to fill in faster with bone), and then resurfacing the joint surface with a chondrocyte-laden graft. The implant has osteo-induction cells that promote healing,” added Baxter. This a complicated procedure because you have to grow chondrocytes (taken from young horses) in the lab and then put them on at the time of the surgery. The most common surgical treatments are the debridement and the cyst injection.

Surgical treatment for a wobbler may involve putting an implant (basket) in the site of the abnormality to stabilize that area of the cervical vertebrae.

“The idea is to stabilize the affected area and decrease the amount of bone produced, to minimize compression on the spinal cord. Nutritional management has been tried, but for this to be effective, you have to diagnose the problem when the horse is fairly young, before there are severe signs of ataxia. The researchers decreased the total calories in the diet quite a bit in order to minimize the horses' growth,” said Baxter.

“If you are having problems with developmental problems in young horses, it would be wise to consult a nutritionist and try to develop a proper ration and avoid pushing the horses for fast growth. There's some thought that excess energy in the diet predisposes young horses to DOD.

Some people think copper deficiency or mineral imbalances (calcium-phosphorus ratio) is also important, as well. Which factors are most important, we don't know. It's multi-factorial. I don't have nutritional recommendations other than trying to feed a well-balanced diet, and not push young horses with a lot of energy.”

Almost any joint and bone can be affected, but some are more commonly involved.

“We still don't know why some horses are affected in certain joints while other individuals are affected in different ones. The hock is most common, followed by the stifle, then fetlocks, shoulder and pastern. There are various theories about cause – we don't know whether it's a defect and then trauma knocks a piece off (in OCD problems) or whether it's all just related to abnormal formation,” Baxter ended. ■

Unraced at two, Anthony's Cleopatra won her debut, a six-furlong maiden special weight race,

in gate-to-wire fashion by 1 1/4 lengths at Golden Gate Fields on January 8.

She used the same tactics to make it two in a row in a 5 1/2-furlong allowance/\$50,000 optional claiming (N) race which she took by four lengths over the Albany track on February 6.

On March 19, Anthony's Cleopatra, as the \$1.10-to-one favorite, finished second to the sophomore Florida-bred colt Uncaptured in a mile allowance/\$62,500 optional claimer (N).

Back racing against her own sex, Cacchiotti Ranch's homebred filly took the 1 1/16-mile California Oaks by nearly four lengths. Frank Alvarado has been aboard the Tim McCanna trainee in her first four starts.

Anthony's Cleopatra's dam, Luxor Lady, had been purchased for \$30,000 by Jacqueline Cacchiotti while carrying her first foal and future stakes winner from the 2019 Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale.

Bred by WinStar Farm LLC, Luxor Lady had been a \$17,000 2016 Keeneland September Sale yearling. She raced three times at two at Hastings Racecourse. After unseating her rider in her first start – the Hard Rock Casino Stakes – she finished her race career with seconds in maiden special weight and maiden/\$40,000 optional claiming (N) races, the latter race which she lost by a nose.

Luxor Lady is a half-sister to 2014 Honeybee Stakes (G3) winner Euphrosyne and Mighty Beau Stakes (N) winner Forgive. Their dam, Canterbury Park stakes winner Three Graces, also produced a two-year-old filly (She's Mybuddybuddy) and a yearling colt, both sired by Good Samaritan. In 2022 Three Graces produced a filly by Global Campaign.

Luxor Lady's second dam Manila Rose, by Manila, also produced two multiple graded stakes performers – Grade 2 winner Private Horde, by Brunswick, and G3-placed Pricearose, by Repriced.

Luxor Lady's third dam, Golden Horde, by Czaravich, a half-sister to stakes winner Drop a Gem, won the 1985 Monmouth Oaks (G1) and won or placed in four other stakes, earning \$215,693.

Luxor Lady's most recent offspring is a January 28, 2022, California-foaled colt by Stay Thirsty.

Anthony's Cleopatra is one of 35 stakes winners (21 graded), in North America and Chile, sired by 2014 Florida Derby (G1) and 2015 Donn Handicap (G1) winner Constitution. The son of Tapit's first Northern Hemisphere crop, foaled in 2017, produced ten graded stakes winners, led by 2020 Belmont and Travers stakes (both G1) winner Tiz the Law. Among his 2022 stakes horses are G3 winners Glass Ceiling, We the People, Breakpoint (Chi) and Boheryn (Chile) and G1-placed Warrant, Ynada Mas (Chile) and Never Surprised.

Constitution stood the 2022 breeding season for an \$85,000 fee at WinStar Farm in Versailles, Kentucky.

After the scratch of morning line favorite Blazinbellabl, a field of five contested the 26th running of the Washington State Legislators Stakes for three and up fillies and mares. Even though she had yet to make it to the winner's circle in her first three tries this year, K D Thoroughbreds' Dontkissntell was sent off as the nine-to-ten favorite. Maybe fans were thinking that the third time would be the charm, as Dontkissntell had finished third in the 2019 edition of the stakes and was runner-up to Daffodil Sweet in 2021.

In taking the 2022 Washington State Legislators Stakes by a head over the resilient You Go Girl, Dontkissntell gave trainer Tom Wenzel his fourth score in the stakes. Wenzel had previously won the race in three consecutive years with Exclusive Diva (2013), Stopshoppingdebbie (2014) and Kikisoblu (2015).

After running second in the Arizona Juvenile Fillies Stakes, Dontkissntell earned her first stakes win with a three-length victory in the 2018 WA Cup Sophomore Filly Stakes. Two weeks later she almost scored a WA Cup double, finishing second in the WA Cup Filly and Mare Stakes behind Fly Far Away. The gray/roan distaffer would finish second or third in six other Emerald Downs stakes (at ages four to six) before earning her second stakes win.

Dontkissntell is one of two full stakes-winning sisters, the other being HPPA Claiming Championship Stakes winner Donttellymyhusband, out of Low Key Affair, a daughter of leading British Columbia sire Vying Victor. A five-race winner of \$172,459, Low Key Affair had placed third in the 2004 Rose City Stakes at Fort Erie. Low Key Affair's last recorded foal is the two-year-old Lent filly Shameless Affair.

Dontkissntell's sire Rosberg was one of 156 black-type winners sired by 1992 Horse of the Year A. P. Indy. A winner at Santa Anita and in Dubai. Rosberg's final win had been in the Grade 3 Premier's Stakes at Hastings Racecourse.

In his short career at stud, Rosberg also sired British Columbia champion Lord Rosberg, three-time Washington champion Lady Rosberg and Lady Rosberg's winning sister Ros's Girl, whose son Slew's Tiz Whiz won the Governor's Stakes on the same card Dontkissntell took the Washington State Legislators Stakes.

Lady Rosberg, Ros's Girl and Slew's Tiz Whiz were all bred by the late Karl Krieg. Dontkissntell and Slew's Tiz Whiz race for his widow Darlyne Krieg under the couple's K D Thoroughbreds.

Both Lady Rosberg – a filly by Grazen – and Ros's Girl – a filly by Danzing Candy – are represented by yearlings in the August 23 WTBOA Sale.

A \$27,000 purchase at the 2020 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October Yearling Sale – where he was wrongly cataloged as a filly - Executive Chef made his first starts at Golden Gate Fields as a three-year-old. He finished second, then third in two maiden special weight races before taking his next outing, a mile maiden special weight on April 29. He followed that with a close second – beaten a head – in an allowance/\$50,000 optional claiming race on May 21 before heading north to Emerald Downs. All five of Executive Chef's races have been for longtime racing partners John and Janene Maryanski and Gerry and Gail Schneider's

Riverbend Farm. The same connections captured both the 2019 (Baja Sur) and 2021 (Top Executive) runnings of the Auburn Stakes.

Trainer Blaine Wright, who saddled both of the June 19 stakes winners, upped his stakes victories at Emerald Downs to 48, and through July 24 has added three more.

His dam, Cynisca, was unplaced in her lone start, a maiden special weight race for three-year-old maiden fillies at Laurel Park.

Cynisca (or Kyniska) was named after a wealthy Spartan princess – a daughter of King Archidamus II – who owned, bred and trained horses. She became the first woman to win a competition at the Olympic Games, when in 396 BC, her team of four-horse chariots won their event. Though not driven by the then middle-aged princess, she was the first woman that was allowed to participate in the Olympic Games. Cynisca is credited for a second Olympic win in 392 BC.

Cynisca had her first foal in 2017, a colt by Cairo Prince who was never named. Executive Chef is her second foal and first starter. In 2020, Cynisca produced a colt by Astern (Aus) now named Pier Pressure, and the following year foaled her first filly, by Maximus Mischief.

Executive Chef's second dam was the multiple graded placed Giant's Causeway mare Floating Heart, whose dam Love Lock won the Hollywood Starlet Stakes (G1), Golden Rod Stakes (G3) and Debutante Stakes (G3), where she set a new Churchill Downs' 5 1/2-furlong mark. The daughter of Silver Ghost also placed in two other graded stakes and made \$483,122 in her ten starts.

As a broodmare Love Lock also produced three-time stakes winner Love Locket, the dam of \$405,172 stakes winner Ghost Locket.

Executive Chef is one of 21 stakes winners so far sired by two-time Grade 2 winner Cairo Prince. Also among his six 2022 stakes winners are Honeymoon and Providencia stakes (both Grade 3) winner Cairo Mistress and Grade 1 Panama stakes winner Sicliana. Cairo Prince is also the sire of two-time Emerald Downs stakes winner Princess of Cairo. The 11-year-old son of Pioneerof the Nile stood the 2022 breeding season at Airdrie Stud in Midway, Kentucky, for a \$15,000 fee.

Yet another talented offspring of the late Harbor the Gold, Itsallabouttheride started once at two, finishing third in a maiden \$25,000 claiming race and then was turned out until this spring. He made his sophomore debut on May 22, finishing third in a waiver/\$25,000 maiden claiming race where he was ineligible to be claimed. Fifteen days later, Itsallabouttheride, ridden by Javier Matias, took a maiden special weight race by 3 1/2 lengths as he "drove clear in the drive under steady pressure."

On June 19, Itsallabouttheride finished a strong second to Executive Chef in Auburn Stakes.

In their next meeting, Itsallabouttheride caught Executive Chef in the final strides to take the Irish Day Stakes by a head.

Itsallabouttheride had been purchased as a yearling for \$13,000 by the late Wally Jenne at the 2020 WTBOA Summer Sale.

The new winner was bred by Jenny Webber, now manager of Rancho San Miguel in California, and Ken Jochimsen. They had acquired his dam, Holy Rose, in 2017 from Elwin and Patti Gibson. She produced 2018 and 2019 foals by Harbor the Gold foals.

Holy Rose, bred to Showing Up, had been purchased by Elwin Gibson in 2009 at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock sale for \$1,500. Holy Rose's first foal, Greatly Blessed, would later produce Puerto Rican stakes-placed Sanjuanera.

Bred to the Gibsons' 2011-17 Washington leading sire Parker's Storm Cat, her 2021 foal, Parkers Rose, had seven wins, earned \$52,515

and won or placed in four Oregon stakes. Her full brother Cats Touch was foaled on 2016. So far he has won a dozen races – including an outing at Century Mile Racetrack Casino in Alberta on the same day Itsallabouttheride scored his maiden victory. He has earned \$110,085.

Itsallabouttheride's year-older sister Gold Rose won two races at Emerald Downs last year at three and took her third race, a \$3,500 claimer at Turf Paradise on January 25, by eight lengths. She has earned \$25,823.

Holy Rose – whose sole win came in a maiden special weight race as a four-year-old for Stronach Stables – is one of 17 foals and nine winners produced out of Wishing Well Stakes winner Holy Blitz, a daughter of Holy Bull who earned just shy of \$100,000.

Holy Blitz's main claim to fame is as the dam of Wesley Ward's Eclipse champion female sprinter Judy the Beauty, who won or placed in 16 stakes – all but one of which was graded – and featured wins in the 2014 Grade 1 Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint at Santa Anita and Grade 1 Madison Stakes at Keeneland. Another of Holy Blitz's foals, Spritz, ran second in the 2021 Bourbonnette Oaks.

At 23, Holy Blitz produced a 2020 colt by Speightster who brought a \$135,000 bid at the 2022 OBS April juvenile sale.

In addition, Holy Rose's third, fourth and fifth dams, Pagofire, Horsafire and She Can't Miss, respectively, were all Florida-bred stakes winners.

Unraced at two, Maybe I Will, who races for owner/breeder Tom Bachman's Fairview LLC, began her racing career in January of her three-year-old season at Golden Gate Fields. After finishing third in her initial outing, the bay filly went gate-to-wire to take a six-furlong maiden special weight race by 1 3/4 lengths.

Maybe I Will followed that race will a nearly four-length tally in a six-panel allowance/\$50,000 optional claiming (N) race at the Albany track.

After finishing unplaced in stakes at Santa Anita and Golden Gate, her final win in 2021 came in a 5 1/2-furlong allowance at Golden Gate in December.

In her four previous outings this year before coming to Emerald Downs, Maybe I Will's best finish was a second to Rebalation (a stakes-winning daughter of Washington horse of the year Reba Is Tops) in an allowance/optional claimer where she was eligible to be haltered for \$62,500.

Running second to Maybe I Will in the Hastings Stakes was 2021 Washington horse of the year Blazingbellablu in her first start since last December at Turf Paradise. In fact, every distaffer except Maybe I Will was a stakes winner going into the six-furlong stakes.

Maybe I Will is one of six 2022 stakes winners sired by 2013 Eclipse champion three-year-old Will Take Charge. Among them are Hollywood Gold Cup Stakes (G1) winner There Goes Harvard, W. L. McKnight Stakes (G3) winner Abaan and Grade 3 Panama stakes winner Luna Fortis. Will Take Charge is also the sire of Peruvian champion Esidio, Grade 3 winner and Grade 1-placed Will's Secret and stakes winner and Grade 1-placed Manny Wah.

A five-time graded stakes winner – led by victories in the Grade 1 Travers Stakes and Clark Handicap – Will Take Charge is one of 118 stakes

(five champions) sired by Unbridled's Song. His dam, three-time Grade 1 winner Take Charge Lady, was named broodmare of the year in 2013 and has also produced Grade 1 winner Take Charge Indy, Grade 2 winner As Time Goes By and is the granddam of champion Take Charge Brandi, Grade 1 winner Omaha Beach and Grade 3 winner Charge It, who ran second in the 2022 Florida Derby (G1).

Will Take Charge, a 12-year-old chestnut, stood the 2022 breeding season for a \$5,000 fee at Three Chimneys Farm in Midway, Kentucky.

Maybe I Will is the second foal out of Monmouth Park NATC Futurity-R winner My Due Process, a daughter of Henny Hughes who also placed in two Gulfstream Park stakes. In addition, she has produced two-year-old Sit Look and Hope, by Lookin At Lucky, a 2021 colt by Sir Prancealot (Ire) and foaled a filly by Omaha Beach this past spring.

My Due Process's dam, stakes-placed Easy Action, produced two other stakes horses among her eight foals. The daughter of Crafty Prospector was one of 14 winners out of \$285,817 stakes winner and Grade 3-placed Topsy Girl, who is also the dam of two stakes winners and three other stakes-placed horses.

Miss Dynamic became the first Washington-bred two-year-old winner at Emerald Downs on July 2 (and second state juvenile winner of 2022 following Chuckanut Bay's victory at Pleasanton the day before) when she wired a 4 1/2-furlong \$15,000 maiden claiming race and defeated five others by ten or more lengths, as "much the best."

Eight days after her impressive first win, Miss Dynamic became her sire's first stakes winner and the first Washington-bred two-year-old stakes winner of 2022 when she posted a 5 1/2-length victory in the Angie C. Stakes.

Miss Dynamic is from the second crop of Bar C Racing Stables' Illinois Derby (G3) winner Dynamic Impact, Oregon's leading Oregon freshman sire and third-ranking juvenile sire in 2021, Dynamic Impact is one of 93 stakes winners sired by Horse of the Year Tiznow, who earned over \$6.4-million and won the Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) in 2000 and 2001.

Miss Dynamic is the second foal and starter from the four foals produced out of Miss Salome, whose sole win came in a Les Bois Park maiden special weight race as a two-year-old.

A daughter of Harbor the Gold, Miss Salome was the final foal produced out of two-race winner Hot Zee, who also produced Oregon-bred stakes winners Kyla Jo, I'm Zee One and Hot Pink Shoes; and stakes-placed Abtastic, Cold and Heza Hottie.

Hot Zee is a four-year-older sister, both daughters of Table Run, to two-time Washington champion Run Away Stevie. The \$468,267 nine-time stakes winner is the granddam of Washington champion racemare Point of Reference, who in turn produced 2019-20 Washington champion male runner Unmachable.

Hot Zee and Run Away Stevie were among the 11 named foals, ten starters and ten winners – which also includes Louisiana Downs stakes winner Mississippi Man – produced out of the unraced Lt. Stevens mare Miss Stevens, a half-sister to multiple stakes-placed runners Phantom Pharoah and She Will Tell. Miss Stevens had been purchased for \$26,000 from the February 1983 Arkansas mixed sale while carrying future four-time winner Misacator. Misacator was sired by Advocate, a stakes-winning son of Horse of the Year and multiple champion Round Table, who also sired stakes winner and three-time champion Washington sire Table Run.

The Lusk family's 2021 dual state champion Papa's Golden Boy returned to stakes action with a domineering 3 3/4-length victory over 2021 Emerald Downs horse of the meeting Top Executive in the Budweiser Stakes in a quick 1:07.78. In their first meeting on May 28, Top

Executive had defeated Papa's Golden Boy by a head in a 5 1/2-furlong allowance/\$50,000 optional claiming race where neither runner ran for a tag. It had marked Papa's Golden Boy first out since last November. In his next start, Papa's Golden Boy ran second to Slews' Tiz Whiz in the July 24 Governor's Stakes.

Eltaes Stable's Five Star General, who had been purchased for \$110,000 out of the spring 2022 online dispersal for the late Glen Todd, finished a neck back in third in the ten-runner Budweiser field. The six-year-old son of Distorted Humor had won the British Columbia Derby (G3) and placed in two Longacres Miles (G3) among his now nine stakes placements.

Papa's Golden Boy, who was named state champion older male runner and sprinter, had earned his first stakes victory in last year's Budweiser Stakes, which he won in a comparable time of 1:07.71. In the 2021 edition of Papa's Golden Boy had defeated multiple Washington champion Baja Sur by 2 3/4 lengths.

One of 28 state champions and 46 stakes winners sired by Oregon's late powerhouse sire Harbor the Gold, Papa's Golden Boy is a full brother to 2020 Muckleshoot Derby winner Gold Crusher. Harbor the Gold offspring have won a record 71 stakes at Emerald Downs.

The two Emerald stakes winners dam, Brookie Girl, was named 2021 Washington broodmare of the year. Brookie Girl produced a 2021 filly by recent Oregon stallion addition Outlash, who stood his first season at Bar C Racing Stables this past spring after previously standing in Colorado.

A daughter of Grade 2 stakes winner and 2002 Kentucky Derby (G1) runner-up Proud Citizen, Brookie Girl is one of five winners produced out of French import Skatesheba, a two-year-old winner in her native France and stakes-placed at Santa Anita at three. Her final foal, and top runner, is the now ten-year-old Majesticperfection gelding Perfectly Majestic, who earned his 14th victory at Presque Isle Downs on May 17. Stakes-placed while running at three, four, five and six – led by seconds in the Mathis Brothers Mile Stakes (G2) and Thunder Road Stakes (G3), both at Santa Anita – through July 24, Perfectly Majestic has earned \$620,856.

Skatesheba is also the dam of \$172,712 earner Voluptuous, a 2011 daughter of Flashy Bull whose eight wins came at Arlington Park, Fair Grounds, Kentucky Downs and Hawthorne. Voluptuous produced her first foal in 2022, a filly by Copper Bullet. She and Brookie Girl are the only two of Skatesheba's five daughters to produce foals.

Two-year-old Runnin Out of Days made an impressive racing debut when he went gate-to-wire to take the King County Express Stakes, "with complete authority" by 10 1/4 lengths. Winning rider Juan Gutierrez commented after the race, in a belief now held by many, that the handsome chestnut gelding is "a very good horse." Gutierrez was also astride Miss Dynamic when she won the Angie C. Stakes by 5 1/2 lengths earlier on the same card.

The first stakes winner bred by Tom and Becky Birklied, Runnin Out of Days was raised at their Suntuop Farm in Enumclaw and sold for \$14,000 at last year's WTBOA Sale. The couple are offering his yearling half-brother by Coast Guard (Hip 40) at this year's August venue.

The new winner comes from the final crop of Alfred G. Vanderbilt Stakes (G2) winner Abraaj, who has sired ten other stakes winners, led by regional filly champions Invested Prospect, Money Inthe Stars and Quatre Cat, and Washington sprint champion Kaabraaj. After originally standing in British Columbia, the \$338,050 stakes winner was moved to El Dorado Farms in late 2010 and stood at the Enumclaw nursery until his death in May 2019.

Runnin Out of Days is the second stakes winner produced out of an Atta Boy Roy mare following 2021 Washington champion two-year-old Cobra Jet. While both mares were unraced, each stemmed from strong Washington stakes families.

Annie Over is a half-sister to juvenile stakes-placed Toss'm Again. Their winning dam, La Mariah, produced seven winners and was a half-sister to Washington champions Makors Mark (\$430,753) and Clair Annette (\$179,287). Their stakes-winning, course-setting dam Windsong Maria was named Washington broodmare of the year in 2010 and also produced stakes-placed Windsong At Last. Windsong Maria's first foal, the winning Ferdinand daughter Win the Wind Blows, is the dam of stakes-placed Heavenly Wind and granddam of stakes-placed Major Dundee and What's Up Doc.

Atta Boy Roy, a Grade 2 stakes winner and multiple Washington champion, led the state sire ranks from 2018-20 before being sold to Kentucky interests in the Fall of 2020.

Runnin Out of Days' five-cross is unique among today's pedigrees, in that he has no inbreeding listed. But that isn't to say he isn't inbred, as he sports several crosses to *Nasrullah, Nearco, Native Dancer and *Princequillo just a bit further back on his pedigree page.

Last year, as a two-year-old, Slack Tide broke her maiden in the Angie C. Stakes, winning the July 18 event by three lengths in what would be her second and last start of the season.

She returned to the races in March 2022 at Golden Gate Fields and ran unplaced in an allowance/\$40,000 optional claiming race (N) in the only time she has been out of the top two in her seven-race career.

On April 1, Slack Tide finished a close second to Miss Union in an allowance/\$50,000 optional claimer, again while not running for a tag. Three weeks later Slack Tide returned with a 3 3/4-length triumph under the same conditions, except the race was at five furlongs, instead of six. All three of her starts at the Albany track had been over the Tapeta all-weather surface.

Slack Tide's win marked trainer Blaine Wright's record fourth victory in the Seattle Stakes, which began with Invested Prospect (2016), Alliford Bay (2017 and Mucho Amor (2019).

Slack Tide continued her Emerald Downs stakes streak with a 2 1/4-length win in the Kent Stakes at odds of .90-to-one. She has had different riders in each win, with the latest being Kevin Radke. Heribert Martinez was aboard her for her win in the Angie C. Stakes last year and California-based Evin Roman was astride her in the Seattle Stakes.

Slack Tide is the second foal, but first runner, out of stakes-placed Impeached. Her first foal, the 2018 Midshipman colt Trumped, has yet to start.

After missing 2020, Impeached produced a 2021 colt by Sir Prancealot (Ire) which is scheduled to sell as Hip 80 in the August 23, WTBOA Summer Yearling Sale. The daughter of Northern Afleet produced a colt by Outwork last May in California.

Slack Tide, which is defined as the period at the turn of the tide when there is little or no horizontal motion of tidal water, races for David Mowat's Ten Broeck Farm Inc. The Medina resident had purchased the filly for \$25,000 from her breeders' consignment to the 2020 WTBOA Sale.

Impeached earned \$126,692 of her \$174,497 on the turf where she had a 5-2-3 record from 13

starts. In her other nine outings she ran 2-1-2 and earned \$47,805. Her seven wins came at Belterra Park, where she won a maiden special weight race by 2 1/4 lengths, Mountaineer Park and Churchill Downs, where she added four wins. Her lone stakes placement was at Ellis Park where she ran second in the Ellis Park Turf Stakes – moved to the dirt – as a four-year-old.

Slack Tide is the first stakes winner in the first crop sired by Canadian champion, Queen's Plate winner and two-time US Grade 1 stakes winner Shaman Ghost, who stood his first season at stud in California. The son of Ghostzapper had 65 foals in his initial cop, now three-year-olds of 2022, with 28 winners and two additional stakes-placed runners – Highland Ghost and Madiba. The ten-year-old stallion currently holds court at Adena Springs North in Aurora, Canada, where his 2022 stud fee was \$7,500 (Canadian).

It was quite the July Sunday at Emerald Downs for owner Darlyne Krieg, trainer Tom Wenzel and jockey Jose Zunino. After the trio won the Washington State Legislators Stakes with race favorite Dontkissntell, the same connections came back three races later to take a 2 1/2-length victory with \$9.20-to-one, fifth betting choice Slew's Tiz Whiz in the 82nd running of the Governor's Stakes.

Both runners also share a pedigree link, as Dontkissntell is by Rosberg and Slew's Tiz Whiz is out of a Rosberg mare.

While Dontkissntell has only one cross to the great Seattle Slew, as Rosberg was sired by his best son A. P. Indy, Slew's Tiz Whiz is 5 x 4 x 4 to the 1977 Triple Crown winner.

Slew's Tiz Whiz was sired by Slew's Tiznow, who stood the 2022 breeding season for a \$3,000 fee at Rancho San Miguel in California. The 17-year-old stallion is one of 83 black-type winners sired by Horse of the Year Tiznow. Slew's Tiznow, a full brother to Grade 2 stakes winner Slew's Tizzy, was a stakes winner at Hollywood Park, where he also placed in the Grade 2 Californian Stakes, and Del Mar. He also finished second in the Breeders' Futurity (G1) at Keeneland and the Santana Mile Stakes at Santa Anita. Among the stakes winners in his first seven crops are El Camino Real Derby (G3) winner Zakaroff and Mt. Rainier Stakes winner More Power to Him.

Slew's Tiz Whiz is the first foal out of Ros's Girl, who won half of her eight starts for her breeder Karl Krieg and trainer Valerie Lund. All her wins came at Turf Paradise, where the multiple allowance winner took her first four starts by a combined 14 lengths.

Ros's Girl is also the dam of the placed Makors Finale (a Washington champion also bred and campaigned by Krieg) colt Onyourmarketsetgo; a two-year-old Atta Boy Roy filly named I'm a Riskie Girl who is yet to start; a yearling filly by Danzing Candy who has been consigned to the 2022 WTOBA Sale; and she foaled a colt by Smiling Tiger in 2022.

While Ros's Girl was a successful runner, her year-older full sister Lady Rosberg outshined her. In 17 starts over a three-year period, Lady Rosberg had a 8-2-4 record and earnings of \$183,997. The five-time stakes winner (two at Emerald Downs and three at Turf Paradise), also placed in four other stakes, led by a third in the Grade 3 Ballerina Stakes at Hastings Racecourse. For her efforts Lady Rosberg was twice named Washington champion turf horse and also earned an older filly or mare title in her home state.

ARTICLE IX – COMMITTEES – SECTION 9.2. Sales Committee.

The Sales Committee will derive its authority from and conduct its business subject to the direction of the Board. The Committee shall consist of eight (8) elected members, plus a member appointed by the President of the Association, for a total of nine (9) members. To be eligible for election to the Sales Committee, a person must be a member in good standing of the Association, and fulfill one of the following criteria as a participant in the Association's sales program: purchased a horse at the sale, consigned for sale, sold a horse at the sale, acted as sales agent, or acted as a purchasing agent during one of the four preceding Association sales. Elected members shall serve three (3) year rotating terms. The term of the appointed member will be at the discretion of the Association President. The nominating committee shall be made up of those members of the Sales Committee whose terms have not expired. The nominating committee shall select at least two (2) qualified candidates for each position that is open. Qualified persons not selected by the nominating committee who wish to be nominated may do so by submitting a "Nomination Petition" endorsed by the signatures of at least ten (10) Association members in good standing. The Sales Committee members will be nominated and elected at the same time and in accordance with the same regulations as the election of the Association's Trustees, except as stipulated herein. The appointed Sales Committee member need not be a member of the Board but must fulfill the criteria set forth above. The nine (9) members of the Sales Committee shall elect a chairperson who shall be responsible for keeping the Board informed of the committee's activities.

The Sales Committee will work autonomously regarding all things with respect to putting on any horse sale, with the exception that any substantial decisions with regard to the Sale including, but not limited to, changing the date or time of the sale, any substantial change to the catalog, or anything that will substantially impact the financial situation of the Association. Those substantial decisions will be presented to the Board for approval.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF WTBOA SALES COMMITTEE

General Requirements: Candidates must be a current member in good standing of the WTBOA and have purchased, consigned or acted as agent for a consignor/buyer at one or more of the WTBOA horse sales during the last two years. Sales committee members should be advocates and supporters of the WTBOA, particularly with regards to the horse sales and the actions of the sales committee. They will be looked to for leadership and guidance in long term planning, program development, evaluation and financial management of the sales program.

Desirable qualifications for potential Sales Committee members:

- Familiarity with the issues dealt with by the parent organization and sales committee, as well as general knowledge of both the Washington and national Thoroughbred industry and/or a keen willingness to learn.
- Ability to participate in a collegial, cooperative manner in group decision making and to carry out the decisions and plans of the sales committee.
- Enthusiasm for the work and mission of the sales committee and willingness to work to carry out the plans for the sales.
- Familiarity with WTBOA conditions of sale, as well as sales nomination forms, consignor and sales contracts, and veterinary issues relevant to sales horses. Much of this information can be found in the front of the WTBOA Sale catalog. Hands-on horse experience helpful but not required.
- Willingness to promote the sale by contacting past and prospective buyers, helping orchestrate and attending buyer events, i.e., pre-sale tutorials, breakfasts, barbecues, etc.

Specifically, each sales committee member will have the following responsibility:

- Term of Commitment: Serve a minimum of a three-year term. There are eight elected committee members and one person appointed annually by the WTBOA President.

- Committee Meeting Attendance: Attend sales committee meetings (usually five or six) held each year, which generally last from one to three hours.
- Duties: Support, review, evaluate and recommend policies, procedures, programs, staffing, budget and pursue the WTBOA mission statement. Be an advocate for the sales and the organization when asked.
- Additional Attendance: Be willing to attend the WTBOA sales, as well as outside events relevant to the sales and the WTBOA Annual Membership meeting and the Washington Annual Awards banquet, if possible.
- Volunteer: Be willing to help WTBOA Sales continue to be "The little sales company that could."

Concerning Election Qualifications for

TRUSTEES TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

ARTICLE III – MEMBERS – SECTION 3.11. Election of Trustees or Directors. The Nominating Committee of the Association shall be an ad hoc committee appointed by the President and comprised of current Board and Sales Committee members who are not up for re-election. The Nominating Committee shall meet no later than June 15 of each year and nominate four (4) or more persons for election to the Board to fill the four (4) positions on the Board, which are being vacated. The names of these nominees shall be printed in the first issue of the WASHINGTON THOROUGHBRED after the June 15 meeting. Persons other than those selected by the Nominating Committee can be nominated to the Board by filing with the Secretary and/or the General Manager of the Association a nominating petition with the signatures of ten (10) or more members in good standing. The Secretary and/or General Manager, on or before September 10 of each year, must receive such nominating petitions. The nominees shall submit resumes for publication in the magazine. Such resumes shall be not more than 75 words in length and contain biographical or other background information outlining the nominee’s qualifications for the position of Trustee. All names and resumes of said nominees shall be then printed in the Fall issue of the WASHINGTON THOROUGHBRED. Election ballots shall be mailed to each member of the Association on or before October 15 of each year. Members and dual members shall vote for up to four (4) candidates (one vote per candidate), so long as the number does not exceed four (4). All ballots, in order to be counted, must be received by the Association on or before November 15 of each year. The four (4) nominees receiving the largest number of votes will be the Trustees elected to the Board. Beginning in 2006, a new directive to encourage member participation was enacted. Henceforth, the Board incumbent with the least number of votes each year will be replaced on the Board with the non-incumbent receiving the most votes. If one or more incumbent chooses not to run for reelection or if a non-incumbent receives more votes than an incumbent, this procedure will not apply for that year’s voting. Any incumbent that might be removed due to this new policy is eligible to run for the Board the following year. Members of the Board shall take office at the first regular session of the Trustees meeting in their elected term.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF WTB OA BOARD OF DIRECTORS

General statement of responsibility: Board members will be advocates, ambassadors and supporters of the organization; they will provide leadership and guidance in long-term planning and visioning, financial management, public relations, program development, evaluation and fundraising.

Specifically, each Board member will have the following responsibilities:

- Regularly attend monthly Board meetings;
- Review, evaluate and recommend policies, procedures, programs, staffing, budgets and mission;
- Make a financial contribution to the program, including but not limited to membership dues and time invested;
- Participate on at least one committee;
- Attend the annual general membership meeting and applicable committee meetings;
- Participate in fundraising activities, including promoting giving among family, friends, and others, visiting local businesses, and helping to implement and attend fundraising events;
- Attend Board development trainings when scheduled;
- Understand and articulate the philosophy, mission and programming of the organization;
- Advocate for the organization when asked;
- Attend outside events relevant to the organization if possible.

Qualifications for potential Board members:

- Familiarity with the issues dealt with by the organization, knowledge of the Washington Thoroughbred industry and a willingness to learn;
- Skills useful to the organization, such as fundraising, public relations, financial management, program development or other skills that will help further the mission of the organization;
- Ability to participate in a collegial, cooperative way in group decision-making;
- Enthusiasm for the work and mission of the organization.

Time Commitment: Board meetings are held once a month for approximately two hours. In addition, Board members are expected to attend occasional fundraising events, the annual membership meeting and other meetings as applicable. Each Board member is elected for a minimum commitment of three (3) years service on the Board. Other work duties could include meeting with prospective Board members, participating in strategic planning and Board assessment activities, and reviewing the pre-board meeting packet materials.

Freshman Sire Gold Rush Dancer Celebrates Winners at Emerald Downs

John Parker's 2017 Longacres Mile (G3) winner and \$552,348 stakes winner Gold Rush Dancer is represented by his first crop of juvenile runners in 2022.

His first offspring arrived in the winner's circle on July 9 at Emerald Downs when Swag Stable's homebred filly Fly Patti Fly went gate-to-wire to win a \$25,000 maiden claiming race by 1 1/4 lengths. She is among the 16 foals the son of Private Gold sired in his initial crop.

Fly Patti Fly's is out of four-time stakes winner No Flies On Doodle, by Storm Blast.

Gold Rush Dancer, who won or placed in ten other stakes in addition to the Mile, retired to stud for the 2019 breeding season at El Dorado Farms. He also stood at the Enumclaw farm for the 2020 breeding season before Parker returned him to racing in January 2021 at Parx Racing. His last start came at the Pennsylvania track on February 7 of this year.

Both Gold Rush Dancer's dam Dances On Water, by In Excess (Ire), and his stakes-winning half-sister Dance With Effie have produced two-year-old winners for Parker at Parx Racing this year.

Gold Rush Dancer's second winner, John Parker's homebred Gold Rush Junior won a maiden special weight race at Emerald Downs by 4 1/4 lengths on July 31.

Annette Marie became the stallion's third winner when she took a \$25,000 maiden claiming race by 6 3/4 lengths on August 7.

Gold Rush Dancer is represented by a yearling filly named Hearts a Dancing from his second crop in the upcoming WTBOA Sale. The daughter of Free of Heart was bred in Washington by Linda Swanson and has been consigned by her through El Dorado Farms as Hip 77.

Raised a Secret Sires First Winner

El Dorado Farms' stallion Raised a Secret sired his first winner on June 12 when Remmah Racing Inc.'s Celinas Blue Bird took a maiden claiming race by two lengths at Emerald Downs. Celinas Blue Bird, out of Jacolatt, by Twining, was bred by Dr. Rodney Orr, who also raced Raised a Secret. The new winner is trained by Jorge Rosales.

One of 47 stakes winners sired by Grade 1 winner Songandaprayer (by Unbridled's

Song), Raised a Secret won or placed in seven stakes races, including the Grade 3 Los Angeles Stakes and Gottstein Futurity. The wins and stakes placements for the \$492,130 earner came from 5 1/2 to eight furlongs.

Raised a Secret's biggest pay day came in the \$100,000 Harris Farm Stakes, in which he defeated millionaire Richard's Boy, who had won or placed in 20 stakes, including a head defeat in the 2017 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (G1).

Raised a Secret is the first foal out of the stakes-winning Bernstein mare Sensitive Soul, who broke her maiden at three while running against a dozen older fillies and mares in Magali Farms Stakes at Hollywood Park. Among her five other winners are \$310,798 stakes winner Minister of Soul. \$283,157 stakes-placed Image of Joplin and \$276,739 stakes-placed Sapphire Kid.

Raised a Secret is also the sire of 2021 stakes-placed Raised a Redhead among the seven other foals in his first crop.

The 12-year-old stallion stood the 2022 breeding season for a \$1,500 fee.

He is represented by eight yearlings at the WTBOA Sale.

Lord Lochinvar Sires First Winner

Lord Lochinvar, who stood from 2018-20 at Keith and Jan Swagerty's Auburn-based West Coast Training Center until being sold to Saudi Arabia interests in 2021, was represented by his first winner when two-year-old Ila Veiv Too won a 5 1/2-furlong maiden special weight race on July 31 at Emerald Downs by 3 1/2 lengths. Bred by Keith Swagerty, she is the second foal and first starter out of \$33,712 stakes-placed Ila View, by Rallying Cry. The new winner races for the Swagertys' Swag Stables and partner Kevin Erickson and is trained by David Martinez.

A well-bred son of Horse of the Year and champion sire A. P. Indy, Lord Lochinvar's only win came in a maiden special weight race at Golden Gate Fields in 2015 while under the care of trainer Jerry Hollendorfer.

Lord Lochinvar is a full brother to Grade 2 \$1,137,188 stakes winner and sire Master Command, a three-quarter brother to Grade 3 stakes winner Aurora Lights and a half-brother to stakes winner Street Lad.

Lord Lochinvar sired a half-dozen foals for the Swagertys while standing in Washington.

Shandra Smiles Pensioned

Dr. Rodney Orr's top broodmare Shandra Smiles has been retired from the breeding

shed to live out her days at Orr's farm in Silverton, Oregon. The 24-year-old daughter of Cahill Road had been originally purchased by Orr as a yearling in 1999 as a racing prospect through bloodstock agent Dana Halvorson.

About that same time Halvorson helped to obtain Cahill Road, a year-younger Grade 1-winning full brother to Kentucky Derby (G1) and champion Unbridled, for a move to the Washington stallion ranks, where he led the state sire rankings in 2000. Cahill Road, who had originally stood at Claiborne Farm in Kentucky, finished his stallion career at El Dorado Farms where he sired back-to-back Longacres Mile (G3) winners and Washington champions The Great Face and Wasserman among many good runners before his death on July 4, 2010, at age 22.

Shandra Smiles was one of seven winners out of the \$104,452 winning Great Above mare Beyond the Storm, who also produced Grade 3-placed, \$305,076 earner Traci Girl, \$247,050 stakes-placed Draw Fire and Puerto Rican stakes-placed Calidad.

Shandra Smiles, who was named in honor of Orr's wife Shandra, broke her maiden by nearly four lengths in the Federal Way Handicap as a three-year-old at Emerald Downs. She also placed in the US Bank Stakes while under trainer Steve Bullock's care.

After retiring at age four with \$29,855 in earnings, Shandra Smiles was bred to Salt Lake the following spring and produced six-race winner Datura.

Her third foal and the first of her three stakes winners, was three-time Grade 1 winner and \$1,480,704 earner Smiling Tiger. The son of Hold That Tiger, who was a \$40,000 yearling at the 2008 WTBOA Sale, has gone on to be a successful West Coast sire. Standing at Harris Farms in California, the chestnut stallion has sired at least nine champions and the earners of over \$13.5-million in his first six crops, which includes two-year-olds of 2022. Smiling Tiger is the all-time leading earner to go through the WTBOA sales program.

Shandra Smiles second Grade 1 winner did her half-brother one better as She's a Tiger, a daughter of Tale of the Cat, was named 2013 Eclipse juvenile filly champion. In her seven-race career she had a 3-3-0 record, \$727,657 in earnings and won or placed in five stakes – led by three Grade 1 placings.

She's a Tiger was sold as a broodmare prospect for \$2.5-million at the glitzy Fasig-Tipton The November Sale in 2014.

Shanda Smiles' third added money winner was the 2014 Giant's Causeway filly Smiling Causeway, who was a stakes winner at both Tampa Bay Downs and Parx Racing. She earned \$300,860.

Shandra Smiles also produced winners Grinning Gang, by Posse, and Next Right, by Orientate. Her son Raging Tiger, a full

brother to Smiling Causeway, entered stud this past spring at the Root family's Oakhurst Thoroughbreds outside of Newberg, Oregon.

Shandra Smiles final two foals are a 2019 Carpe Diem colt named Conquering King and a 2021 filly by Nyquist.

At the Sales

Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July Selected Yearling Sale

The yearling fireworks kicked off in the July 12, 2022, Fasig-Tipton July yearling sale. A total of 302 yearlings were cataloged, with the \$600,000 sale topper coming in at Hip 302, a Curlin half-brother to English stakes winner and Belmont Stakes (G1) and Dubai World Cup (G1) runner-up Gronkowsi, who made \$3.1-million while racing on three continents.

After 54 outs and 59 RNAs, 189 yearlings sold for a \$21,763,500 gross, \$115,151 average and \$90,000 median. The average (10.8 percent) and median (12.5 percent) were both up from 2021 sale figures, and the number of yearlings bringing over \$300,000 rose from six to 11. The RNAs held steady at 24 percent, versus 24.9 percent in 2021.

Among the other yearlings changing hands was Hip 214, a Bolt d'Oro colt out of a Smart Strike half-sister to Northwest Farms LLC's 2012 Emerald Downs juvenile filly champion Goin to the Window that brought \$240,000.

A Flatter filly out of stakes winner Cougarstown, dam of stakes winner and Grade 3-placed Elevenses, sold for \$130,000. Her \$328,765 stakes-winning second dam Fair Apache had brought a \$240,000 price tag when she was offered as a horse in training at the 2000 WTBOA Summer Sale.

A Flameaway colt out of \$122,372 winning half-sister to \$295,551 stakes winner and Grade 2-placed Classy Charm was sold post-sale for \$35,000. His second dam is 2000 Washington champion turf horse and two-time Grade 2 stakes winner Classy Cara.

A Dialed In colt, the first offspring of 2015 Washington champion juvenile filly My Heart Goes On, was a \$50,000 RNA.

Petra Lewin Named 2021 Washington TOBA Winner

Petra Lewin, who bred and raced 2021 Washington horse of the year Blazingbellablu with Charles Essex – who also trained the runner – was chosen the 2021 TOBA (Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association) winner for Washington State by the WTBOA Board of Directors at their May meeting.

Last year the three-year-old filly won three stakes and earned \$152,848, topping all fellow statebreds in both categories.

Lewin, a lifelong horsewoman, owns and manages Rainbow Meadows Farm, a 40-acre facility near Centralia and is also a successful real estate agent.

Among the previous good racehorses the former hunter/jumper champion rider has bred are California-foaled \$600,543 Grade 3 stakes winner Celtic Dreamin, by Game Plan; and \$83,858 Washington-bred stakes winner Expressionator, by Delineator.

The four other 2021 finalists were: Neal and Pam Christopherson's Bar C Racing Stables Inc., Ronald Bohlman, Todd and Shawn Hansen and Rick and Debbie Pabst's Blue Ribbon Farm.

The 37th TOBA Awards and Dinner will be held at Keeneland in Lexington, Kentucky, on Saturday, September 10.

Charlie led a full life that included lifetime membership at the Washington Athletic Club, Seattle Yacht Club, and Broadmoor Golf Club.

Nothing gave Charlie more joy than spending time with his family, especially his four grandchildren. His world absolutely revolved around his grandchildren.

He was predeceased by his sister, Judy Schaefer. Charlie is survived by his wife of 54 years, Inez Ingebritson Swanson; daughters, Nancy (John) Fisk and Sally (David) Wright; and four grandchildren, Lexi and Henry Wright, and Charlie and Billy Fisk.

Christopher Burke Thompson

Chris Thompson, 62, passed away July 4, 2022, in West Seattle. He was born April 9, 1960, in Houston, Texas, and grew up in West Seattle. Chris attended Madison Junior High before attending West Seattle High School. He graduated with a degree in history from the University of Washington.

In 1975, Chris suffered a severe paralyzing injury while playing football as a sophomore for West Seattle High School, which led to a landmark personal injury award for the quadriplegic. The ruling would help pave the way for safety changes in football.

As an adult, Chris split his time between Los Angeles and West Seattle.

Chris got into racing through his West Seattle friends and teammates. His first horse was Reardan's Gray, a 1985 claim at Longacres, The 1981 Washington-bred was a multiple winner at Longacres for Chris and also took him to the winner's circle at Santa Anita. His best horse was Big Paz, a 1986 Captain Courageous gelding trained by Mike Puhich that won or placed in eight Longacres and Portland Meadows stakes, earning over \$200,00, with his final win coming at Emerald Downs at age ten. Chris's final starter, also trained by Puhich, was with Drew Big at Emerald Downs on June 10.

According to his childhood friend John Good, "Chris dearly loved his horses. It was hard for Chris (who was 100 percent paralyzed from the waist down and about 60 percent from his waist to his neck) to get around, and when he went out, 99 percent of the time it was horse related: friends and family meeting him at the track, or if they weren't racing, he would visit his horses out at the bar."

He is survived by his wife, Cynda.

Edwin Theodore Welch

Ed Welch, 87, passed away June 7, 2022. He was born August 14, 1934, and raised in Seattle.

Ed served in the Air Force where he qualified to captain the Lockheed Hercules. He flew cargo to Alaska during the

construction of the Alaska pipeline. Ed joined Alaska Airlines as a commercial airline pilot in 1959 and flew the first Alaska Airlines 727 to Alaska. At the retirement of the 727, he flew the last trip home to Seattle. His brother Harold was a pilot for American Airlines at the same time.

He met his future wife, Jean, when they were seated next to each other on a flight from the UK to Seattle. Jean had moved to the US to work as an operating theater nurse and was returning to Seattle after visiting her family. Ed had been visiting London. The couple were married in 1970.

When Ed was not up in the air, he and Jean built Tall Cedars Farm in Enumclaw and raised many good racehorses. The Welches had started with Arabians, but switched over to Thoroughbreds about 1984. Among the top runners coming out of their small broodmare band were 2018 Washington two-year-old champion So Lucky – who was also the leading Washington-bred earner that year – and 1987 state sprint champion Spite and Malice. Other good horses they bred and raised included stakes winners Misty Knight, Knightress Oxide and Tall Pines, multiple stakes-placed \$212,593 earner Marqula, and \$115,135 earner Kaiser Road. Marqula's three-year-old full sister Asena has already won two races at Canterbury Park this year and earned nearly \$50,000.

Respected veterinarian and good friend, the late Dr. Bud Hollowell, was their key bloodstock adviser throughout the early years of their Thoroughbred breeding program and the Welches leased their original broodmare from the equine reproduction specialist.

On Ed's retirement from flying, working on the farm opened up to a full time position.

Since 1996, the Welches have appeared among the top 50 Washington breeders 25 times, including nine times among the top ten. In 1997 they ranked third and they finished fourth in both 2016 and 2018.

Ed relished any farm project involving his tractor and another happy place was at the helm of the television remote controls to watch his sports programs. Whenever time allowed he and Jean would be out on the golf course.

Ed is survived by Jean, his wife of 52 years.

Jerry D. Woods

Former five-time WTBOA president and longtime industry member Jerry Woods, 83, passed away June 7, 2022, at his home in Chehalis. He was born November 18, 1938, in Cassville, Missouri, one of five children born to Francis and Evelyn (Holliday) Woods. When Jerry was quite young the family moved to Kinzua, a small town in rural northeastern Oregon.

Jerry attended Linfield College (McMinnville, Oregon) where he met his future wife Peggy Kuljis. They were married in 1958 and had three children, son John and daughters, Lisa and Dana.

Jerry graduated from Tacoma's University of Puget Sound with a degree in education and taught mostly elementary and special education in the Tacoma School District.

Peggy met Kitty Fletcher, who was the manager of the credit union where she worked. Kitty and her husband John – a longtime WHBA treasurer – had just acquired a new broodmare and were going out to Dewaine Moore's Rainier Stables in Enumclaw to see her. The Fletchers invited the Woods to go with them. It was then that Jerry and Peggy's interest in the Thoroughbred industry was sparked.

The Woods bought the Graham property that was the original Woodstead Farm in 1966. In 1971 they stood their first stallion, Mocker, and next came Dagger Dancer in 1972. Among the stallions that followed were Blue Serenade, Skin Head, No Back Talk, Seafood, Leroy S., Jazzing Around, Sharper One, Delineator, Altazarr, He's Tops, Jumron (GB), Katowice, Defensive Play, the recently deceased You and I. In 1995 they purchased and moved to a larger farm in Chehalis. There are several equine retirees still living at Woodstead Farm, which today mainly runs cattle.

Jerry joined the WTBOA Board of Directors in 1976, and served through 2008. During that time he served as vice president several times and was the association's president from 1999 through 2003, when the WTBOA made the transition from Longacres to its present-day Emerald Downs location. Jerry was named board member emeritus in 2009.

He also served on the Breeders' Cup Board of Directors in 2001 and 2002.

In 2004, Jerry was chosen as the recipient of the highly valued S. J. Agnew Achievement Award.

As a former educator, Jerry was actively involved in many of the WTBOA programs, including the Youth Project and the Horsemen's Short Courses.

Between Emerald Downs' opening season in 1996 and 2013, Woodstead Farm stallions sired 20 Emerald Downs' meet-end titleholders that earned 29 titles, many of whom also were named Washington champions. The 2009 Longacres Mile (G3) winner Edneator was sired by Delineator and No Giveaway, by He's Tops, won the 2005 edition of Washington's premier race. Other top runners were 2013 Washington horse of the year EZ Kitty, by He's Tops, and 2006 champion two-year-old colt or gelding Immigration, by Delineator, both of whom were bred by Jerry and Peggy Woods.

In 2005, Jerry, Peggy and their son John founded the Washington-based American Horse Transportation, which today is owned by John and managed by John's daughter Brittany Kaech.

Jerry enjoyed going to his grandchildren's functions and watching their various sporting events, from barrel racing to softball games.

He was predeceased by his parents; brother, Joe Woods; sister, Patsy Hoover. Jerry is survived by his wife, Peggy; daughters, Lisa (Rod) Nubgaard and Dana (Jay) Morton; son, John (Brenda) Woods; nine grandchildren and five great-grandchildren; brother, Lonnie Woods; and sister, Dixie Samples.

Equine In Memoriam

You and I

Grade 1 stakes winner and former Washington leading sire You and I, 31, passed away June 6 from the infirmities of old age at Old Friends. A paternal grandson of Roberto through his good son Kris S., You and I had been pensioned at the Georgetown, Kentucky, Thoroughbred retirement center since 2010.

Bred in Florida by W. A. Fabry and Jeffrey E. Johnson, You and I was purchased by Triumvir Stable for \$62,000 at the 1993 OBS February Two-year-olds in Training Sale. Trained by Stanley Hough, You and I was unbeaten in two starts at two, led by a five-length win in the Grade 2 Cowdin Stakes. He had won his first start, a maiden special weight race at Belmont Park, by 1 1/2 lengths. Among the runners in that 11-horse field was future Kentucky Derby (G1) winner Go for Gin.

After winning his sophomore debut in a Gulfstream allowance test in his next outing, he ran third in the Grade 3 Hutcheson Stakes.

The talented runner was then sold to Edmund Gann and sent to trainer Bobby Frankel's barn where he next finished a disappointing seventh in the Louisiana Derby (G3). Three months later he would take the Riva Ridge Stakes (G3), setting a new seven-furlong track record of 1:20.33 at Belmont Park.

At four, You and I finished third in the Grade 1 Carter Handicap and then added victories in the Grade 1 Metropolitan Handicap and Grade 2 Brooklyn Handicap. He missed by a nose in the Grade 1 Vosburgh Handicap and finished his 16-race career with an unplaced finish in the Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1).

He was retired with a 6-1-2 record, \$701,235 in earnings and an SSI of 29.38.

You and I entered stud at Airdrie Stud in 1995 and stood there until 2003. His top

runner, five-time G1 stakes winner You, was sired during his Kentucky tenure.

You and I moved to California in 2004 and stood for two seasons at Blooming Hills Farm. He was moved to the Woods' family Woodstead Farm in Chehalis, Washington, in November 2005, where he topped the state's sire list in 2006. He stood at Woodstead through the 2011 breeding season, and was then donated by Woodstead to be pensioned at Old Friends in November 2010.

Among the other 19 stakes winners sired by You and I were three Washington two-year-old champions: Schoolin You (2005), Chu and I (2011) and the latter's two-year-younger sibling and now two-time stakes producer Chu and You. You and I also sired Scandinavia champion filly In the Woods, Ron Crockett Inc.'s multiple graded stakes winner Harvard Avenue and additional graded stakes winners And That's That (in Puerto Rico), Zilan (in Turkey).

The near-black stallion, whose dam La Chaposa (Per) was a champion sprinter in her home country, was also successful in that South American country where he sired champion older mare Marimer. La Chaposa also produced six-time graded (two Grade 1s) winner Chaposa Springs and two other stakes-placed runners. Because of his dam's side of his pedigree, You and I proved an outcross to many of today's bloodlines.

You and I sired 15 crops, 498 foals, 418 starters and the earners of \$19,781,843.

As a broodmare sire, You and I's daughters have produced champions Winning Prize (Argentina) and Anunciata (Peru), Grade 2 winner Iliad, five-time Grade 3 winner Melmich and over 20 others.

"When we lose a horse it's always difficult, but some are more difficult than others," said Old Friends founder and President Michael Blowen. "You and I was tough, confident and haughty. Bobby Frankel and Governor Brereton C. Jones, two early, generous supporters of Old Friends, took care of You and I during his racing and breeding careers but we were honored to care for him in his golden years. To say he will be missed by all of us is a monumental understatement."

Last February Old Friends held a birthday celebration for the Valentine Day-born You and I. Over 100 fans sent cards and donations. ■
