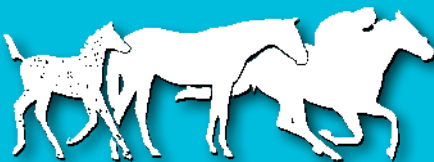

2018 Racing at Emerald Downs, Purses Boosted by Generous Donor

In an unprecedented development, an anonymous sponsor has donated \$180,000 to be added to the 2018 stakes schedule at Emerald Downs Racetrack and Casino.

The donation will be used to fund a new six-figure stakes event for three-year-olds, and also to restore to \$50,000 four stakes previously announced as \$30,000 events for the 2018 season.

"This is truly astounding," said Emerald Downs President Phil Ziegler. "This person wishes to remain anonymous and we certainly plan to honor that request."

The \$100,000 Getaway Stakes for three-year-olds at 1 1/16 miles will be run closing day, Sunday, September 23, while the first four stakes of the meeting – Seattle Stakes for three-year-old fillies, Auburn Stakes for three-year-old colts and geldings, Hastings Stakes for older fillies and mares and Governor's Stakes for three-year-olds and up – have all been bumped back up to \$50,000.

The revised schedule increases the stakes total to 29 and aggregate stakes purses to \$1,630,000.

"An open stakes race for three-year-olds is perfect for our schedule," Ziegler said. "Except for the Washington Cup, we didn't have a stakes for three-year-olds in August or September."

Per the anonymous sponsor's request, a portion of nomination, entry and starting fees for the Seattle, Auburn, Hastings and Governor's stakes will be donated to four different Thoroughbred aftercare programs, and all of the entry and starting fees to the Getaway Stakes will be donated to the same charities: The Prodigious Fund, Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance, Old Friends Thoroughbred Retirement Farms and Thoroughbred Charities of America.

Emerald Downs Racetrack and Casino has announced a 67-day live racing season beginning Sunday, April 22, with first post at 2 p.m.

Emerald Downs and Hastings Racecourse Announce New "Northwest Triple"

It was announced in February that Northwest three-year-olds will have their own triple crown this coming year.

Hastings Racecourse and Emerald Downs, which are separated by just 165 miles, will offer a \$100,000 bonus for any horse that sweeps a new three-race series.

The "Northwest Triple" begins with the Muckleshoot Derby at Emerald Downs on

Sunday, July 29, continues with the British Columbia Derby at Hastings on Saturday, September 8, and concludes with the debut of the Getaway Stakes at Emerald Downs on September 23. Additionally any horse with a top-three finish in all three races will receive a \$10,000 bonus and any horse starting in all three races will receive a \$1,000 bonus.

Hastings general manager Darren MacDonald said the Northwest Triple is a natural given the tracks' proximity and race dates.

"We have some great racing in the Northwest and these bonuses should create a lot of excitement for owners, trainers and the fans," MacDonald said.

Emerald Downs Vice President of Racing Jack Hodge believes the bonuses will help both tracks, "Our partnership with Hastings

grows each year and the horsemen have a chance now to run for some nice bonuses."

Emerald and Hastings Also Team Up on Three Additional Bonuses*

- \$25,000 bonus for any horse sweeping the Longacres Mile on August 12 and BC Premiers on October 8.

- \$25,000 bonus for sweeping the Washington Oaks on July 22 and British Columbia Oaks on September 8.

- \$25,000 bonus for sweeping the Emerald Distaff on August 12 and Ballerina Stakes on October 8.

Hastings opens its 52-day season on Saturday, April 21, and Emerald Downs opens its 67-day meeting on Sunday, April 22.

Brief biography: (Ex: Growing up, education, what got you involved in the industry, goals):

I have always had horses and I was raised on a farm in North Dakota. I competed in barrel racing and was the leader for Pony Club for 38 years. I managed the kitchen at Sun Downs in Kennewick where I met my husband Bill and that is where I got into horse racing.

I was raised in Sweet Home, Oregon, and have had horses since I was young. When I got married we started racing Quarter Horses and then Thoroughbreds. We raced all over the Northwest in Boise, Portland, Kennewick and Seattle. In 1981 Neal and I bought a 40-acre ranch in Hermiston that became Bar C Racing Stables. For the last ten years we have been focusing on the Thoroughbred breeding industry and really love it.

What has been your most memorable experience since being a Thoroughbred owner?

I really enjoyed training.

When we got Harbor the Gold, that was one of my highlights. We had a friend that called us a dozen times from Overbrook Farm in Kentucky saying we just had to get this stallion and finally we gave in. Brief Biography: (Ex: Growing up, education, what got you involved in the industry, goals):

I grew up in Southern California and got my bachelor's and graduate degrees from California State University. Del Mar's "4 o'clock Fridays" brought us to the track. One guy had a family member who was a licensed owner. We got to the backstretch and Barry Abrams sold us the dream. When we moved

to Miami, Ralph Nicks and his wife got us a bit deeper; and upon moving to Washington we had a small piece of a horse before we had a home. We are the quintessential "ham and eggs" operation, living in the claiming world, looking for the budget buys at the sales, but that is the blue collar portion of the industry and I am happy to be there.

What has been your most memorable experience since being a Thoroughbred owner?

Being new to the ownership game there have been some great moments. Riding along with Stryker Phd's journey, thanks to his owners Jim and Mona Hour and trainers Sharon and Larry Ross; or our first win in our colors at Golden Gate Fields with Taelyns Prince. The top moment for us was our first win with our WTOBA Sale purchase, Seattle Smoke, and getting our colors to the winner's circle at Emerald Downs for the first time.

If you were granted three wishes what would they be?

The limited time I get to spend with my family and friends; trackside mornings watching the works; eating at Sally and Joe's Quarter Chute Café; lunch out at the Ross farm and spending time with the retirees like Stryker Phd, Starbird Road and Norm's Nephew. Those are my Zen times. I recognize how lucky I am to have become a part of this community . . . and come on, who doesn't love when "the mountain is out?" ■

After a disappointing, though not unproductive, season at three, Mach One Rules returned to Emerald Downs, where by the end of the 2017 meeting, he was crowned horse of the meet.

A \$40,000 2014 WTBOA summer sale yearling, Mach One Rule joins Trackattacker and multiple state champion (and now successful sire) Atta Boy Roy as the third state-bred champion raced by Roy and Ellie Schaefer's R. E. V. Racing.

Conditioned by all-time Emerald Downs leading money-earning trainer Frank Lucarelli, Mach One Rules started his season in April with a third place finish in a \$50,000 optional claiming race. Mach One Rules next finished second, by a neck to his 2016 nemesis Barkley in the Governor's Stakes.

The Budweiser Stakes yielded a different result, as Mach One Rules rallied to take the 6 1/2-furlong race by three-quarters of a length over Prime Engine. Barkley ran fourth.

Boosted by the win, Mach One Rules came back four weeks later to annex the Mt. Rainier Stakes by two lengths.

The four-year-old son of Harbor the Gold was next sent off as the local favorite in the 82nd running of the Longacres Mile Handicap-G3, where he finished second to Gold Rush Dancer in the marquee event "with good energy."

In his next start, Mach One Rules won the restricted Muckleshoot Classic Stakes and then was sent to California. While he didn't fare very well in a \$75,000 stakes over the Santa Anita turf course in October, Mach One Rules finished the year with a strong second – beaten only a nose by Right Hand Man – in the November Oakland Stakes run at Golden Gate Fields. His current SSI is a credible 3.43.

Citizen Kitty is the second state champion produced out of Charlie Dunn's homebred 2007 Washington champion juvenile filly and 2016 state broodmare of the year No Constraints. Not a bad record from the mare's first three foals.

Placed in her only start at two, Citizen Kitty has scored five of her six victory laps at Emerald Downs. Her lone departure came in an allowance/optional claiming \$25,000 race (N) at Fresno in October of her three-year-old season.

In her first two stakes attempts, also at three, she ran fourth in both the Irish Day Handicap and Comcast SportsNet Stakes at Emerald. At four she added her first black-type, a third in the Auburn track's Hastings Stakes.

Her championship season began at Turf Paradise, where the Jeff Metz trainee ran second in a 5 1/2-furlong allowance after a nearly eight-month layoff. Back at Emerald Downs, she next ran second to her champion half-sister Invested Prospect in an allowance/optional claiming test.

With Invested Prospect sent south in search of sprint stakes, Citizen Kitty was left at Emerald to uphold the family honor – and that's just what she did. In her next five outings at the Auburn oval – all in stakes races – she posted a 3-2-0 record.

Citizen Kitty first redeemed herself in the June Hastings Stakes with a three-quarter-length score over B C Z Middleton, giving trainer Metz a one-two finish in the six-panel sprint.

A month later, Citizen Kitty finished second in the half-furlong longer Washington State Legislators Stakes to Profound Moment.

The Highlander Racing LLC of Bruce and Cass Maller – who had also raced 2013 Washington horse of the year E Z Kitty – next received top honors with their current champion in the nine-furlong Emerald Distaff, where she drew clear by 1 1/2 lengths and defeated nine other older fillies and mares in the \$65,000 test.

Citizen Kitty finished the season with a disappointing seventh and last in the Grade 3 Ballerina Stakes at Hastings Racecourse in October.

The \$41,000 WTBOA Sales graduate has earned nearly five times her purchase price and has a 2.12 SSI.

Karl Krieg's Risque's Legacy continued the family tradition by earning her second state championship. Her "aunt" Lady Rosberg had started the ball rolling when she took the first of her three titles in 2014.

Unfortunately, Risque's Legacy is the only offspring her dam produced before her early demise. Lady Rosberg's first foal just turned a year (a colt by Krieg's champion Makors Finale – who is from another multiple champion family nurtured by the Oak Harbor horseman).

After taking her two juvenile races by a combined 12 lengths – which included a three-length tally in the WA Cup Two Year Old Filly Stakes – Risque's Legacy began her 2017 campaign with a second place finish to Alliford Bay in the Seattle Stakes in May.

Three weeks later, in what would be her champion defining race, the Tom Wenzel-trained filly won the Kent Stakes by a length over Retreat Yourself. Though she floundered for the rest of her season at Emerald, and later at Turf Paradise while under Valorie Lund's care, her early accomplishments in open stakes gave her the nod for the title.

Risque's Legacy was the first stakes winner for multiple Washington champion and Grade 2 sprinter Atta Boy Roy, Washington's leading freshman sire in 2016 and leading juvenile sire in 2017. The son of Tribunal is also the sire of Emerald Downs stakes-placed fillies Targa and San Juan Star from his first crop and his second crop has so far yielded impressive Canterbury Park stakes winner Mr. Jagermeister – and the Minnesota-bred is currently his leading earner with a \$103,00 total – and twice 2017 stakes-placed filly Faith Flies Again. The up and coming sire also ranked second to seven-time leading Washington sire Parker's Storm Cat on the 2017 Washington general sire listing.

While Risque's Legacy's third and fourth dams may prove a little weak on black-type, her fifth dam, the 1971 *Malicious mare Dark Roots, was a half-sister to 1968 Belmont Stakes winner and champion three-year-old colt Stage Door Johnny, who would turn out to be an influence for stamina as a sire.

Their dam, Peroxide Blonde, was sired by 1958 European Horse of the Year *Ballymoss, and her dam *Folie Douce was a daughter of Grand Steeplechase du Printemps winner Caldarium. *Folie Douce was quite a prominent broodmare, producing what today would be

Pulpits Power placed in his only race at two, beaten one length in a maiden \$8,000 claiming race in early September. Returned to the Emerald races the following April, he reeled off two consecutive seconds at the same level before winning a maiden \$15,000 claimer by five lengths in early June for then owner Jack Stecker and owner/trainer Alan Bozell. Next came a third place finish at the \$20,000 level, followed by a fifth in an allowance/\$25,000 optional claiming race. In late July, the dark bay gelding ran second, beaten three-quarters of a length by Maurice Code, in a \$15,000 level race. Racing at the same level on August 13, trainer Blaine Wright dropped a claim for the runner for Kevin Haynes' Below the Rim Stable LLC and Paul Barbano's Woodway Stable.

A field of seven started in the WA Cup Sophomore Stakes on August 27, and Pulpits Power amply took care of his cost to claim with his 1 1/2-length score in the mile race. In his final start of the meet and year, Pulpits Power finished fourth in an allowance/\$40,000 optional claimer.

Pulpits Power is from the first crop of War Power, a three-time winner at Deauville in France and half-brother to European highweight Declaration of War, who sired four group/graded runners in his first crop last year, including top French colt Olmedo. He is also a half-sibling to two-time Grade 3 winner and Grade 1-placed War Correspondent, stakes winner and Grade 2-placed Vertiformer, and French stakes-placed War Pact.

War Power's second dam produced Belmont Stakes (G1) winner and top flight first and second year sire Union Rags, the sire of two-time 2017 Grade 1 winner Paradise Woods.

Pulpits Power was bred by Elwin and Patti Gibson, who stand his sire at their Thorp-based Gibson Thoroughbred Farm. They also bred his unraced dam Parker's Jewel, who produced another colt by War Power, All Powered Up, in 2015; a filly by Linchpin, named Linchpins Jewel, in 2016; and a colt by that same sire in 2017.

Stark Winter, the fourth dam of Pulpits Power, was a decent racemare, taking the restricted First Lady Handicap at Beulah Park and earning \$61,180 in the mid-1970s, but it was in the breeding shed where she excelled. The daughter of Graustark produced nine winners, led by multiple Grade 1 grass winner Bien Bien (\$2.3-million), two-time Grade 3 winner Dr. Schwartzman and \$100,000-plus stakes winner and Grade 3-placed Fantasy Lover. Another of her daughters produced Donn Handicap (G1) winner and good sire Spring At Last. The most recent runner from this female line to add a Grade 1 tally is Oh Susanna (Aus), a daughter of Street Cry (Ire) out of Grade 2 winner Sharp Susan, who took the Sun Met Celebrated with G. H. Mumm Stakes at Kenilworth in South Africa in January.

Elliott Bay, a \$14,500 purchase by trainer Howard Belvoir at the 2016 WTBOA Sale, is looking like quite the bargain. After finishing second in his June debut in a 4 1/2-furlong Emerald Downs maiden special weight race, the well-named runner served up the only blimp in his so far five race career when – after being bumped at the break – he finished fifth, at nearly 17-to-one, to winner and fellow longshot He’s Not Grey in the 5 1/2-furlong Emerald Express Stakes in July.

Elliott Bay made up for it in his next outing when he broke his maiden in the six-furlong WTBOA Lads Stakes in early August, defeating his paternal half-brother Sippin Fire by three-quarters of a length.

The two Harbor the Gold sons traded places in the WA Cup Juvenile Colts and Geldings Stakes, as Sippin Fire won the six-panel with Elliott Bay running second.

After Sippin Fire was waylaid due to injury, Elliott Bay went off as the second betting choice, narrowly behind unbeaten My Heart Awakens, among the field of eight contesting the Gottstein Futurity. Ridden by Jennifer Whitaker, who had been aboard the Rising Star Stable II’s colorbearer in each of his races, Elliott Bay pressed the early pace before opening up to take the 1 1/16-mile race by 1 1/2 lengths over Trump Itz and by doing so secured himself the title of champion juvenile male runner on the final day of the meet. Elliott Bay earned \$52,250 of the \$90,000 purse for his win in 1:48.03.

Elliott Bay is the seventh state champion bred or co-bred by Washington Racing Hall of Fame breeders Rick and Debbie Pabst.

Melba Jewel, the stakes-winning dam of Elliott Bay, had been acquired by the Pabsts from Chris and Diane Randall shortly after the \$123,970 earner and five-race winner had been retired from the track. All seven of the mare’s foals were bred and raised at the Pabsts’ Buckley-based Blue Ribbon Farm. Melba Jewel’s most recent foal is a two-year-old filly by Blue Ribbon stallion Nationhood named Billyinthefridge.

Melba Jewel is one of four stakes winners and 11 named foals of racing age produced out of the stakes-winning Ohio-bred mare Chasseur Dame, a 1992 daughter of French Legionaire who won nine races and earned \$110,406 while racing exclusively in her home state.

All but her first foal, the winning Lit de Justice gelding Lethal Justice, were bred by retired Montana State Senator and horseman

After using her first start on June 11, in a 4 1/2-furlong maiden special weight race at Emerald Downs, as a learning experience, John and Janene Maryanski's Bella Mia remained unbeaten the rest of the season.

The Blaine Wright-trained miss came back 20 days later to score an impressive gate-to-wire win a five-panel maiden allowance, drawing clear by 5 1/4 lengths.

The first juvenile filly stakes of the Emerald meet, the 5 1/2-furlong Angie C. Stakes, attracted a field of nine. Bella Mia broke on top and was never headed, taking the race by 2 1/4 lengths.

Three weeks later came another gate-to-wire victory in the six-panel Barbara Shipoch Stakes, where Bella Mia, the even-money favorite, drew clear by nearly five lengths.

The Maryanski's talented filly concluded her season with a one-length tally in the WA Cup Juvenile Filly Stakes, also at the six-furlong distance. Each of her victories came with Julien Couton guiding the reins.

Bella Mia was bred by Terry and Mary Lou Griffin, who in 1993 had ventured to Kentucky for the November Keeneland Breeding Stock Sale in search of a broodmare to add to their select band. With a winning bid of \$17,000, the Buckley couple came home with eight-year-old Outofthebluebell, a stakes-winning daughter of Mr. Prospector's full brother Red Ryder. The \$195,966, seven times stakes-placed mare was carrying her third foal, a filly by Time for a Change, who was foaled at Griffin Place the following April.

Outofthebluebell's first foal, Dona Coquis, had been exported to Mexico where she placed in two stakes. As she was sired by the Seattle Slew son Fast Play, the Griffins decided to go back to that proponent sire line for the first of several successful times with the Outofthebluebell family. Bred to Metfield, a Grade 3 winner by the great "Slew," Outofthebluebell produced Grade 1 winner and Washington horse of the year Rings a Chime. The 2000 Washington broodmare of the year also produced \$123,200 earner Outofthe Blue Slew, by Slewdledo. Another of her daughters, Campanita, when bred to Slewdledo, produced stakes-placed Bella Campana, the dam of Bella Mia.

Four-time leading Washington sire Slewdledo continues to leave his mark as a broodmare sire, as not only is Bella Mia out of one of his daughters, but so is stakes winner and 2017 most improved plater Exit Sixty Slew and 2017 plater of the year Mike Man's Gold. Chedoodle, the dam of Mike Man's Gold and the 2017 Washington broodmare of the year, has so far produced two of the 25 stakes winners to represent Slewdledo as a damsire.

A multiple stakes winner in his early days of racing, Mike Man's Gold was claimed from his breeders, Keith and Jan Swagerty, for \$10,000 in his first start in 2016 and then changed hands an additional three more times via the claiming box during his Emerald Downs season.

Twice he had been haltered by father and son Chuck and Greg Conley and trainer Joe Toye's Terra Firma Farm; and twice by Kelly Dougan and Brett Brophy through trainer Jeff Metz. The Conleys and Toye prevailed and Mike Man's Gold has run in their silks for his last 15 starts, including his nine outings last year.

Mike Man Gold ran fifth in his first two starts of 2017, both \$10,000 claiming events, with the first over the grass at Turf Paradise.

He returned to Emerald Downs in May and promptly won a \$22,500 claimer. He followed that with three more consecutive victories – one a month – at the \$22,500, \$20,000 and finally \$40,000 levels, the latter which he won by nearly four lengths.

Next Mike Man's Gold made his first attempt in a stakes race since the 2016 Governor's Handicap, with a third place finish in the Muckleshoot Tribal Classic, a race he had won in 2014.

In his final two starts of the season, the consistent seven-year-old ran third in an allowance/\$40,000 optional claiming race and then won a six-furlong starter allowance by 3 1/4 lengths.

A record number of Washington-breds were registered to compete in the 2017 The Jockey Club Thoroughbred Incentive Program (TIP). Christina Klein's versatile Back to Wine (pictured at right) earned his second straight award as Washington's top OTTB winner in 2017 with 1,293 points. The eight-year-old chestnut gelding – who also serves as Klein's therapy horse – earned points while competing in English pleasure, Western, equitation and halter. In his prior life, the gelding by Baquero—Wine At Dawn, by Desert Wine, had three wins at the track for his then owner/breeder Henry Gott, who like Klein is from Yakima.

Finishing in the number two spot was Ruth Jelinke's 11-year-old Bucky B Lucky, who competed in dressage, English pleasure and halter, garnering 605 points. Also a winner of three races, Bucky B Lucky, a gelding by Kentucky Lucky—Dixie Dew, by Rolls Aly, was bred in Yakima by Steve Meredith and Roy Dane.

The third place horse, 20-year-old Brian's Honor, is owned by Carrie Callahan of New Jersey. The son of Gumboy—Prima's Best, by Gallant Best, excels in dressage where he earned 516 points. He was bred by Charlene Keys of Enumclaw.

Of the top dozen 2017 Washington-bred TIP horses, nine are geldings and three are mares. Eleven raced, of which nine were winners and the other two placed. Two were stakes-placed, Tiz I Is, a 2007 gelding by Cee's Tizzy who finished fourth in the TIP standings, was bred by Al and Sandee Kirkwood and won 11 races and earned \$60,605 as a runner. Sharper Edge, a 15-year-old gelding by Snowbound who ranked sixth last year, was bred by Elizabeth and William Ramsey and was a stakes-placed winner of three races and is the second leading money earner with \$48,455.

Half of the 12 horses had been sold through the WTBOA Sales program as yearlings, for prices ranging from \$1,200 to \$16,000.

As far as pedigree similarities, two of the athletes were sired by sons of Seattle Slew, the aforementioned Bucky B Lucky (who is inbred 2x3 to Slew) and 12th place Ava Rose is a daughter of Slewledo. Eleventh place Moondowner, by Nahuel, is also out of a Slewledo mare.

Cee's Tizzy is both the sire of Tiz I Is and the damsire of ninth place Office Hours. In addition to Bucky B Lucky, eighth place mare Mia's Mystery is also out of a Rolls Aly mare.

No duplicate breeders were noted, but two additional horses competed on national circuits outside the Pacific Northwest. Sharper Edge is owned by Hannah Evenson of Utah and Skyler Icke Voss's Office Hours is based in Virginia.

After placing as a juvenile at Del Mar, Exit Sixty Slew won a maiden \$16,000 claimer at Golden Gate Fields in the spring of her sophomore season and wheeled right back to take a starter allowance at the Albany track, but was then sidelined after a nose defeat in May. She came back to Golden Gate later that fall, but the best she could do was two thirds in five starts.

The daughter of Abraaj made her 2017 debut at Emerald Downs with a 6 1/4-length tally for trainer Blaine Wright and Shawn Sudo and his partners' Mediocre Racing in an \$8,000 claiming sprint, where she was haltered by trainer Charles Essex for Joe Crawford and Jingyi Zhuang. She won both her starts for the couple, the first for a \$15,000 tag (by three lengths) and the second for a \$20,000 price, but was reclaimed at the higher value by Mediocre, with the addition of Kevin Haynes' Below the Rim Stables LLC, and returned to her former shed row. Exit Sixty Slew then ran third in an allowance/\$40,000 optional claimer before winning a \$20,000 claimer by an easy 2 3/4 lengths in early August.

That win was enough to give the "green light" for her first stakes appearance in the WA Cup Filly and Mare Stakes, a race in which she upset 2017 champion Citizen Kitty by 3 1/2 lengths. Exit Sixty Slew finished her year with an unplaced effort in the British Columbia Distaff Handicap in October.

in which every other entrant would be a stakes horse, including \$226,761 stakes winner Que Fail Corazon and stakes-placed and future multiple stakes producer Knight Weave. The latter won the 6 1/2-furlong test, and according to the chart Chedoodle “broke awkwardly, then rushed up to duel for the lead from along the inside and stopped after a half mile.” Chedoodle’s future offspring would more than make up for her troubled and oh-so-short race record.

In the early 2000s Keith and Jan Swagerty were developing their 20-acre West Coast Training Center and farm in Auburn. The couple heard that Chedoodle, whose owners were getting out of the business, was for sale. After learning about the early talent she had shown and the fact that she was a daughter of Slewledo, they purchased the then eight-year-old mare bred to the Storm Cat stallion Storm Blast. That foal turned out to be their four-time stakes-winning mare No Flies On Doodle.

The Swagertys, led by Jan’s input, like to incorporate both the horse’s pedigree and a family member’s name in naming most of their horses. For example, 2017 Washington plater of the year Mike Man’s Gold, Chedoodle’s second stakes winner, was named for the Swagertys’ grandson Mike and the “Gold” came from his sire Liberty Gold.

Chedoodle’s final foal, four-year-old Mike Man’s Bro, placed in the Oregon HBPA Overnight Handicap in January, but the Swagertys have retained all four of her daughters.

No Flies On Doodle has had three foals of racing age, including winner Runmissnataalia, a daughter of Liberty Gold. That same stallion is also the sire of her two-year-old filly Cate’s Gold, No Flies On Doodle produced a daughter of Atta Boy Roy in 2017.

Chedoodlejan, who unfortunately bowed a tendon before her first start, has a two-year-old filly by Smiling Tiger named Nodoubtinmymind and a yearling colt by farm stallion Mr. Rancho Vista christened Movetotheright.

Andiamo Deb’s first foal is a yearling filly by Mr. Rancho Vista and Chedoodlejo is scheduled to produce a foal this spring from the only crop of state champion Noosito.

Pachena, Chedoodle’s third dam, won or placed in 11 stakes in her native British Columbia and was also stakes-placed at Santa Anita at four. Pachena, named after the region’s Pachena Bay, was a daughter of good province sire *The Willies II, a grandson of English champion and major sire *Tudor Minstrel.

As a yearling Pachena had been chased through a barbed wire fence by a dog, but that didn’t seem to hinder her at the track, as she won four races (two stakes) at Exhibition Park and was named co-champion two-year-old filly and outstanding BC-bred runner of 1979. She later added four more stakes tallies at the Vancouver oval, and while she would only produce three foals, two of them were stakes winners, including Chedoodle’s granddam Pachena Bay.

Chedoodle made only one lifetime start, but her owners Riverside Thoroughbreds and Rob Sides must have thought highly of her, as that Emerald Downs race in August of her three-year-old year was not any kind of a maiden race, but an allowance/\$40,000 optional claiming race – in which she didn’t run for a tag – and

Married on horseback on the Pine Lake plateau (in what today is Sammamish) in May 1982, Nina and Ron Hagen brought a love of all animals and a background in horses when they purchased the Enumclaw property that would become El Dorado Farms in December 1983. Today El Dorado Farms – at 100 acres – consists of five individual properties in addition to the main farm.

Ron was raised in Montana and North Dakota where his dad had been a horse trader. A few years after Ron moved to Washington in 1969 he became involved with racing Quarter Horses. But after coming to the conclusion that while racing the sprint specialists was a lot of fun, it didn't pay the bills, so he switched to Thoroughbreds in 1981.

Nina, who is proud of her "West Seattle accent," rode as a girl but didn't become actively involved with horses until her early 20s, and it wasn't long before she was handling Quarter Horse and Arabian stallions in the breeding shed.

The two met at the stable where Nina was working when Ron was looking for a place to board his Quarter Horse.

The Hagens' first stallion was Drum Score, a 1980 son of Drum Fire. Since that early start El Dorado Farms has been home to many of the state's top sires, including the following stallions that have led the general, juvenile and/or freshman sire lists: Basket Weave, Cahill Road, Demons Begone, Free At Last, Liberty Gold, Matty G and Tribunal. The farm's current stallions Abraaj, Coast Guard, Private Gold and Raise the Bluff have also led in one or more categories.

Besides being an active stallion station, the Hagens have led the state breeders' list for a total of four years, 2008-10 and again in 2017 with \$392,670, which is their highest figure.

Indian Weaver became their first stakes winner in 2004 and seven years later the gelding was still going strong, earning the title of Washington plater of the year. Among the couple's other stakes winners are Knight Raider (2009 champion two-year-old filly), Slew the Man (2010 champion sophomore male and a half-brother to Indian Weaver), Knight Club (2016 plater of the year), Dallon's Gold and Irene's Bonus Baby.

In 2017 the Hagens were represented by two stakes-winning fillies – Exit Sixty Slew (co-bred with Holly Sturgeon and voted 2017 most improved plater) and Grace Bay – both who trace to their good foundation mare Moscow Symphony. The Enumclaw couple also bred Percy's Bluff, who was named 2016 Washington most improved plater, and the now six-year-old Raise a Bluff gelding continues his winning ways after taking his 18th race in January and upping his earnings to nearly \$225,000. Percy's Bluff was also the top earner among the 22 2017 starters that the Hagens bred, with \$106,725.

The Hagens' broodmare population sits around 20, with another ten mares in well-deserved retirement pastures. Nina also helps others by being a part of the local nurse mare network.

As part of their full service commitment to the industry, the Hagens also offer racing and mare syndicates and partnerships, rehabilitation and conditioning, and sales preparation. El Dorado Farms has also been a prominent sales agent at WTBOA sales for many years.

Nina's philosophy is to "Treat each horse, or any animal, with respect and love and as an individual."

Both Nina and Ron have taken an active role at the WTBOA. Nina has been a board of trustee since 1997, as well as serving on the important sales committee since 2014. Ron was a member of the sales committee 2006-08.

When asked if she had a favorite horse, Nina replied (nationally) it would be Seattle Slew, whom she named one of her beloved Doberman Pinschers after; but at home it was Cahill Road. She also has a soft spot for current stallions Coast Guard and "RB" (Raise the Bluff); and, of course, Peterhof – who lived to 38 – will always be her special "Teddy Bear." She also said she couldn't manage the farm without the longtime aid of her Pony of America teaser Mr. Mango Man.

When Ron was asked the same question he diplomatically replied that he had no individual favorite, but felt that all breeds and horses were special.

After dealing with mares and stallions for over 30 years, Nina laughingly said that the title of her autobiography will be "Nothing is Sacred in the Breeding Shed."

Finishing in second on the top breeders' listing were 2015-16 leaders Pam and Neal Christopherson (Bar C Racing Stables Inc.), who bred 2017 horse of the year Mach One Rules, with \$334,502. Elwin and Patti Gibson ranked third with \$263,513, led by three-year-old male champion Pulpits Power. Former (2011-14) leading breeders Rick and Debbie Pabst's \$236,937 was led by juvenile champion Elliott Bay. Rounding out the top five is Keith and Jan Swagerty, who bred plater of the year Mike Man's Gold, with \$158,482.

PARKER'S STORM CAT

El Dorado Farms Sire of the Year

2000, Storm Cat—Macoumba, by Mr. Prospector

In 2017, for the seventh consecutive year, the impeccably-bred Parker's Storm Cat led all Washington sires by progeny earnings. It also marked the first year since he was moved to Gibson Thoroughbred Farm in Thorp (for the 2009 breeding season), that his totals have not had the aid of his four-time Maryland horse of the year and 2017 Vox Populi winner, the late Ben's Cat.

Last year, the now 18-year-old son of national leader Storm Cat had 36 winners from his 66 starters – with 18 repeat winners – who earned a total of \$459,747. His top earner was Parkers Delight, who won a trio of races at Emerald Downs last year and most of her \$35,040 total. Parker's Storm Cat is also the sire of Oregon and Montana stakes winner Storm On the River, who contributed \$20,314. The leading earner among his juvenile winners was maiden Hemi Cat, who had four seconds from his six starts and added \$9,462 to his sire's standings.

Parker's Storm Cat is also becoming a useful damsire. Among the stakes horses produced out of his daughters last year were Moonlit Song, a five-time stakes winner of nearly \$250,000; Washington champion sophomore male Pulpits Power; and Canadian stakes winner Whatsnottolike.

Finishing second on the general sire list was Blue Ribbon Farm's 2016 leading freshman sire Atta Boy Roy. The Grade 2 stakes winner and multiple Washington champion was represented by 11 winners from his 23 starters who made \$351,928. His leading earner, who also helped him top the Washington juvenile standings, was Minnesota-bred two-year-old Mr. Jagermeister, a stakes winner of \$103,000. The son of Tribunal is also represented by two-time Washington champion filly Risque's Legacy and 2017 WA Cup Sophomore Filly stakes runner-up Targa. Atta Boy Roy's total among his seven juvenile runners last year was \$143,751, which also included the earnings of two-time Emerald stakes-placed Faith Flies Again.

Coming in third and fourth places on the general sire list were El Dorado Farms' veterans Abraaj – sire of 2017 most improved plater Exit Sixty Slew, who earned \$61,487 of her sire's \$339,516 total; and Raise the Bluff – sire of 2016 most improved plater Percy's Bluff, who added seven wins and \$106,725 to his sire's earnings last year and is already a winner in 2018. Raise the Bluff had a \$329,315 total.

Dreamstar Farm's Council Member ranked fifth with \$326,443 and his six winners were led by the \$40,740 earnings of Sea Myrtle, who is also a 2018 winner.

Finishing second on the juvenile list was 2015 leading freshman sire Coast Guard. The El Dorado stallion had two stakes-placed two-year-old runners at Emerald Downs last season: Bullet Drill and twice stakes-placed Trump Itz, who added \$36,892 to his sire's \$70,305 earnings total.

Former Washington sire Understatement finished in third on the juvenile list with \$56,517.

R. E. V. Racing (Roy and Ellie Schaefer)

NTRA Leading Owner

Port Orchard residents Roy and Ellie Schaefer's Washington-bred earners took home \$184,620 last year, of which \$145,595 was brought to the bank by Mach One Rules, who won a trio of stakes and was runner-up in three more. He was also named both Washington and Emerald Downs top older horse and amassed further accolades as horse of the year and horse of the meet.

The Schaeferes are not newcomers to racing elite Washington-bred runners. Mach One Rules had been voted champion Washington-bred two-year-old in 2015 and the Schaeferes also raced 2014 champion juvenile Trackattacker. But the best horse so far in their arsenal of quality runners has been three-time Washington champion, Grade 2 winner and now successful state sire Atta Boy Roy.

The Schaeferes, who own and run the family-operated Canopy World, first got into racing in 2002, purchasing "half" of Taylor James, a stakes-placed half-brother to Washington champion Candles n Moonlite, with trainer Valorie Lund. Lund, who handled Atta Boy Roy during his highly successful race career, and Frank Lucarelli, who trains the Schaeferes' West Coast-based runners, are tellingly the only two conditioners the couple have ever employed.

Roy, who firmly believes in the value of Washington-breds, was raised on farm on Miles City, Montana, where he first grew to love horses.

They currently have "5 1/2" runners, who are all slated to run during the 2018 Emerald Downs meeting. Besides, of course, Mach One Rule's return to racing, Roy is excited about just turned three-year-old C R Bullitt, who won a six-furlong maiden special weight race at Golden Gate Fields in January. The three-year-old son of Atta Boy Roy out of Washington champion racemare Aunt Sophie, by Altazarr, was another WTBOA Sale purchase, as were the couple's three champions.

Nevadans Bruce and Cass Maller's Highlander Racing Stables LLC finished in second place with Washington-bred earnings of \$120,418, all earned by their 2017 champion racemare Citizen Kitty.

Northern California-based trainer Jerry Hollendorfer, who now races under Hollendorfer LLC, only had one Washington-bred starter in 2017, but Percy's Bluff garnered a 7-0-2 record from his ten outings and earned \$100,725 for the National Racing Hall of Fame conditioner to place him third. A son of Raise a Bluff, Percy's Bluff was among the top statebred sprinters last year and had been awarded 2016's Washington most improved plater title.

Champion two-year-old filly Bella Mia led Auburn residents John and Janene Maryanski to their fourth place posting, as the daughter of Harbor the Gold handed in a \$91,523 total.

Rising Star Stable II's Elliott Bay's campaign netted the Auburn-based syndicate less than \$1,000 behind his juvenile champion counterpart, as the 2017 Gottstein Futurity winner and state champion, also by Harbor the Gold, earned \$90,687.

Wesley Ward

From Selah farm boy ...

1984, collecting riding titles at Aqueduct, Belmont Park and The Meadowlands. In 1985, he guided a horse named Ferdinand to win a maiden race at Santa Anita; Ferdinand later won the 1986 Kentucky Derby (G1) under Bill Shoemaker.

As he aged, Ward dealt with an increasing weight issue by riding abroad, racing in Italy and Singapore before he was forced to retire as a jockey in 1989. [His final official ride occurred at Longacres on September 24, 1985.]

Another Skill Set

After two years of serving as an assistant to his father, Ward began training on his own. He saddled his first winner – Martini Red – at Yakima Meadows on January 6, 1991. Just three years later he won his first stakes race as a trainer in the Will Rogers Handicap (G3) at Hollywood Park when Unfinished Symph scored a 16-to-one upset by a head. The Aloha Prospector colt won the Cinema Handicap (G3) next out to prove his mettle. At the end of the season, Unfinished Symph

Washington native Wesley Ward is one the great pioneers of modern day Thoroughbred racing. Though the Hall of Famer left to go on and conquer the world, first as a leading jockey and now as a reputable trainer, his global success traces right back to his Evergreen State roots.

Yakima County Roots

Wesley A. Ward, born March 3, 1968, in Selah, hails from generations of horsemen, leaving him little choice but to excel on the same path. Maternal grandfather Jim Dailey was an outrider in New York, while paternal grandfather Glenn Ward rode races and later worked as a blacksmith. His father Dennis Ward is still training and Wesley's mother, Jeanne, was also once a trainer

Although as a four-year-old Ward made a somewhat infamous riding debut via a runaway horse that he fearlessly got under control, by the age of ten he was learning to ride properly under the tutelage of his father. By the time he turned 12, Ward was racing on the fair circuits in Washington and British Columbia, racking up wins with an eye on getting his riding license as soon as age allowed.

Eclipse Award Winning Rider

At 16 and under the eye of agent Lenny Goodman, who had handled the book for young Triple Crown winning rider Steve Cauthen, Wesley Ward made an immediate splash on the racing scene. He rode 335 winners during his march to be the Eclipse Award champion apprentice jockey title in

finished third at 25-to-one in the Breeders' Cup Mile (G1). He ultimately won a pair of Grade 2 contests the following year.

Ward's career was stagnant for several years, but he never lost sight of his belief that as a trainer, he needs to be the first rider on the back of each young horse in his care, learning their quirks and talent before passing them on to other riders weeks later. When not in Kentucky or traveling the world, he spends

his hours at his Ward Ranch in Ocala, Florida, where he lives with his wife Kimberley and children Riley, Jackson and Denae. It is in Ocala that he breaks many of his equine charges himself.

This careful attention has led Ward to finding success with precocious juveniles. Since 2009, Ward has won 48 percent of the two-year-old sprints run during the Keeneland spring meets, and he also trained Madman Diaries to be the 2010 Sovereign Award champion two-year-old male in Canada. Next, Ward took his show to Royal Ascot in England.

Foreign Firsts

Ward became the first American-based trainer in history to win a race at the prestigious Royal Ascot meeting when his 33-to-one shot Strike the Tiger won the Windsor Castle Stakes in 2009. Just days later, Ward proved the first victory wasn't a fluke when Jealous Again took the Queen Mary Stakes (G2) by five lengths.

He still considers receiving that trophy from the hands of Queen Elizabeth a thrill.

Since then, he won the 2013 Norfolk Stakes (G2) in track record time with No Nay Never, a son of Scat Daddy.

That runner became a Group 1 winner when taking the Prix Morny at Deauville

Her final time of :57.45 was just one-hundredth of a second past the course record.

in France two months later. That trip to France was a triumphant return for Ward, who two years earlier had become the first American trainer to win at Longchamp with Tiz Terrific.

In 2014, Hootenanny won the Windsor Castle Stakes over 23 rivals, and Sunset Glow finished second in the Albany Stakes (G3). Sunset Glow, who raced for David Mowat's Ten Broeck Farm, Inc., came back to win the Grade 2 Sorrento Stakes at Del Mar less than seven weeks later, and three weeks after that added the Del Mar Debutante (G1) by a neck.

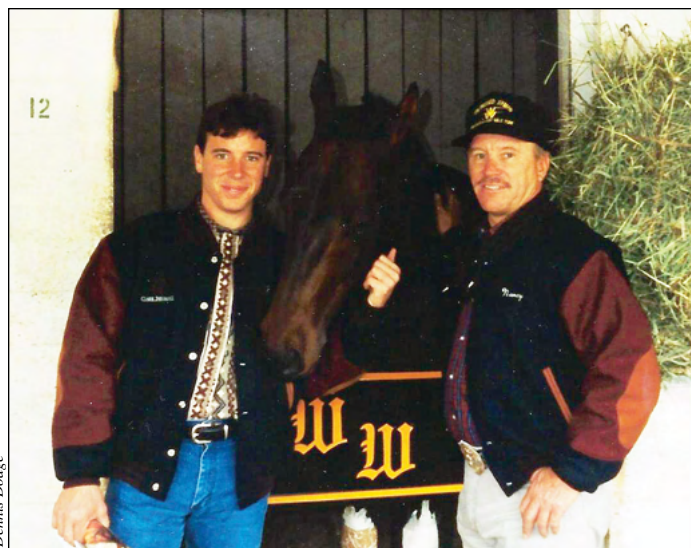
In 2015, Ward saddled a pair of brilliant

chestnuts to Royal Ascot glory. The filly Acapulco broke her maiden in the Queen Mary Stakes and the Scat Daddy daughter won the Sole Power Sprint Stakes at the The Curragh in Ireland in 2017, increasing her record to four wins in seven starts. Ward's popular runner Undrafted won the Diamond Jubilee Stakes (G1), a race where Ward had run second with Cannonball in 2009. Undrafted has earned over \$1.3-million with three stakes victories on his résumé.

Perhaps the most brilliant of all of Ward's runners has been Lady Aurelia. Yet another Scat Daddy, the bay filly broke her maiden going 4 1/2 furlongs at Keeneland in 2016, scoring by 7 1/2 lengths as the odds-on favorite. She took the Queen Mary Stakes at Royal Ascot, then the Prix Morny, and was the first American-trained Cartier Award winner when named champion two-year-old filly that year. After an extended break, Lady Aurelia returned at three, once again at Royal Ascot, to win the King's Stand Stakes (G1) by three lengths over older male sprinters. That effort earned accolades as an outstanding feat for a young, lightly-raced filly.

Other Clients

Leading owners Ken and Sarah Ramsey, who are best known for the success of their champion grass runner and sire Kitten's Joy, employ Ward as one of their trainers with the goal of winning a race at Royal Ascot. So far, Ward's best luck with the Ramseys has come domestically, with Pleasant Prince winning the Ohio Derby (G3) after running

In 2014, Ward reached a high-water mark in his North American training career, when he not only won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Mile with Hootenanny and Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint with Judy the Beauty, but placed with four other runners during the two-day world champion event at Santa Anita.

the 1,000 win milestone as a trainer in 2011, now has over 1,600 victories and \$53-million in purses to his credit. His ingenuity and courage in tackling new heights have not

only endeared him to those around the globe, but those in his home state of Washington, where he was enshrined in the Washington Racing Hall of Fame in 2015. ■

second by a nose in the Florida Derby (G1). Grade 3 heroine Emotional Kitten missed by a half-length in the \$350,000 American Oaks (G1), while Luck of the Kitten broke his maiden at Arlington Park, won the Zuma Beach Stakes at Santa Anita, and ran second in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (G1) in 2014.

That Breeders' Cup day was the best of Ward's career to date. He won the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint (G1) with subsequent Eclipse Award champion Judy the Beauty and ran one-two in the Juvenile Turf with Hootenanny and Luck of the Kitten. None of the six horses that Ward started that weekend ran worse than third, as he picked up second place finishes with Sunset Glow (Juvenile Fillies Turf), No Nay Never (Turf Sprint), and a third with Undrafted (Turf Sprint).

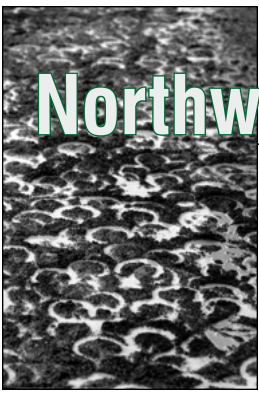

Evaluating and Shoeing Foal Limb Deformities

By examining and monitoring the horse early in life, the vet-farrier team can build a plan to provide a better outcome

Time is not a friend when a foal is presented with crooked legs.

Growth plates close relatively quickly, which doesn't leave a farrier and veterinarian much time if intervention is necessary.

"Growth is age and breed dependent, but the ballpark figure is that most of the fetlock growth is finished by 100 days," Cornell University Equine Hospital veterinarian Norm Ducharme told attendees at the 2015 Cornell Farrier Conference. "If we're going to do something, either with a shoe, with surgery or splints, we have to be working before 100 days. That means you have to do it before 99 days."

Enough time has to be allowed for bone growth or change.

"We tend to deal with fetlocks in the first three or four weeks of life because there's not so much growth," he explains. "As it closes, it's permanent. It is what it is."

The hock generally is finished with most growth by 12 months and the growth plates close at 14 months.

"We tend to work later in life if we're going to intervene," Ducharme says. "That's not true in all species. Draft horses grow longer, so big horses will have a longer window. The mini horse doesn't grow at all, so their window is much shorter. So, depending on the joint, we'll be more in a hurry or less in a hurry."

He encourages vets and farriers to work together and have a plan in place.

"You and the veterinarian should look at the foal in the first few weeks of life to make decisions," Ducharme advises. "Many crooked legs or deformities look better in a week and you don't need to intervene. Some don't. My advice to veterinarians is, look at the foal within two weeks of birth. If it's crooked, you and the farrier should follow it. If it's not crooked, the farrier should advise you if it does get crooked. When you have to intervene, you shouldn't wait too long because then nothing works."

Why Are Legs Crooked?

Times have changed for the better regarding foals with deformities.

"The veterinary perspective used to be, 'Don't worry, I'll put a screw in there and it'll be fine,'" he recalls. "Now, if we can see them early enough and farriers have a chance to work with it, then I won't have to do much surgery. That's better for everyone – the cosmetic of the foal, the well-being of the foal and so forth."

When looking at a foal for the first time, Ducharme and head farrier Steve Kraus determine the deformity and how it's affecting the horse.

"Some mild deformity could have a tremendous effect on the foal's gait," Ducharme says. "Some mild deformity

might barely affect how a foal walks. If the foal walks crooked and you let it walk this way, it's going to get more crooked. If it walks well, despite the deformity, then there's a good chance that the deformity will self-correct."

A foal can be crooked for a number of reasons. It could have an angular deformity, a flexural deformity or rotational deformity.

Angular deformity. Angular limb deformities can take the form of a lateral or medial deviation.

"That's a leg that's going outward or inward," Ducharme says. "If it's going outward, we call it valgus. If it's going inward, we call it varus. Rarely do foals have only one deformity – strictly valgus or varus. They're either toe-in or toe-out."

Flexural deformity. This deformation commonly is referred to as contracted tendons, although it's unlikely that true tendon contracture is the cause of the problem. The soft tissue structures of the forelimb, and less commonly the hind limb, align the limbs in varying extent of flexion.

Rotational deformity. The limb can have an acceptable alignment, but rotates outward because of variable muscle attachment. Foals with rotational deformation might appear to have a valgus fetlock at first glance.

"It can be rotated outward at the shoulder, the knee or the fetlock," he says. "It could be rotated in multiple areas."

Examining a Foal

When presented with a foal, it might seem logical to examine it from the front.

"The first thing to do is not look at it from the front," says Ducharme while displaying a photo of a foal that is toed-out. "From the front, you can tell the toes are facing outward (**Figure 1**). Now you want to decide, is this a valgus deformity or is this a rotational deformity. So, you move to the side and line yourself up with the foot (**Figure 2**)."

By doing this, you've removed the rotational component.

"You're only looking at the bones," he says. "Does the pastern line up with the cannon bone? If the answer is yes, then there's

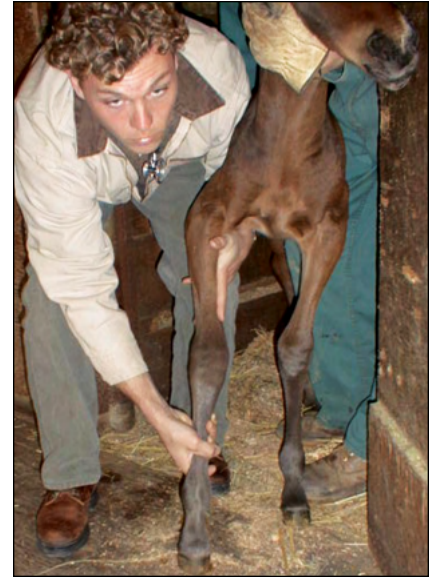

no deformity. If the cannon bone is lined up with the radius, then you'd say there's no angular deformity. The fact that the foot is outward is a pure rotational deformity."

The foal in the photo that Ducharme is presenting, though, does not fit that description.

"When you look at the foal's plumb line – or the mid-line of the cannon bone and the radius – there's an angle," he says. "This foal has a valgus deformity at the carpus."

When observing the radius, Ducharme advises to avoid looking at the entire limb.

"If you look at the whole leg, the muscle on the outside will make it look like the forearm of the horse is bigger," he says. "The muscle is bigger laterally, so it makes you think the bone is more on the outside than it is."

Not all deformities are bad, though.

"Many Thoroughbred racehorses are slightly varus behind, which is not necessarily a bad thing," Ducharme says. "A mild varus bilaterally might not be bad. Just like a mild valgus at the knee is not necessarily bad. Actually, it's protective of injuries. It's when they are more severe or when they are asymmetric. Of course, it depends on what a horse does for a living."

When taking radiographs, it's important that a veterinarian pays attention to where the foot is.

"The radiograph is not a better way to determine whether the leg is straight," he says. "The radiograph is a better way to tell us the cause of the deformity. If the veterinarian doesn't line up the X-ray beam with the toe, then the fetlock will never be straight. You've got to line yourself up with the joint radiographically as well."

There are instances, though, when a foal with an external rotation deformity or a valgus deformity breaks the mold.

"You still have to look at the leg because you have the odd horse that has a varus deformity, which is opposite as you'd expect," Ducharme says. "The toes can be out in both directions. If you line yourself up with the foot, the pastern lines up with the cannon bone, but the radius, forearm and cannon bone will not line up. This is a varus deformity with an external rotation."

Palpation can offer clues as well.

"I do a lot less surgeries because of the farrier work ..."

"If the bone is crooked, you can't straighten bone," he says. "If you can correct it by palpation (Figure 3), there's either laxity present or there's a condition called delayed ossification of the bone. The bones are not mature enough, so the leg is crooked because the bone has not ossified."

Assessing the foal while it walks has the greatest value for Ducharme.

"That's most important because it tells me how physiological it is," he says. "If the foal is walking crooked, then it's physical therapy is going the wrong way. The foal is going to get worse."

This is when farriers have the greatest influence, he believes.

"I've been doing surgery since 1979," Ducharme says. "I do a lot less surgeries on crooked legs now than I used to because of the farrier work. The shoes that were glued on back then would fall off every three days. I think it was a glue problem, but this is fixed now. The shoes you put on stay on now."

Actually, the farriers make the veterinarians look good."

The final aspect to observe is the foot's appearance and conformation.

"If a foal has yet to roll on the back of the heel," he explains, "it will have a varus or valgus appearance when walking because they are rolling on the heel – it doesn't have a flat heel."

This will offer a clue to the problem, says Mike Wildenstein, the former head farrier at Cornell.

"The foot already changes shape within the first couple of days of life," he says. "That's a road map to what is going on up above. If the heel is rolled under, that shows the horse has quite a deviation up above."

Shoeing for Deformities

When intervening with farriery, Kraus finds that he commonly uses the IbeX shoe on young foals.

"They're very simple and quick," he says. "Wherever the foal needs support, you leave the tabs. Where you don't need the tabs, you chop them off with your nippers. Then we glue it on real fast with Super Fast. You can do these by yourself, but it really makes a difference if you have a helper."

It's important that the client understands that a follow-up visit is absolutely necessary.

"If we didn't tell the client to get this removed or bring the foal back within a couple of weeks, they'd leave it on as long as it would stay on," Kraus says. "If it's left on too long, we'd restrict the foot. So, we don't want them on very long. Maybe we have it on for two weeks, off for a week and back on for a couple weeks."

When applying quick curing adhesive, it's critical to use care because it creates heat, which can lead to a foal sloughing its hoof.

"The aspect of the shoe is you're not

putting a great deal of glue on because it only takes a millimeter or two to hold those on," Wildenstein explains. "The times we ran into trouble were when we tried to do a build-up on the outside of the hoof wall."

To illustrate his point, Wildenstein recalls some experiments with cadaver limbs.

"We took a foal that had passed away for other reasons and brought the limb to room temperature," he explains. "Then we did a build-up of Super Fast on the outside of the hoof wall with a thermometer and the sensitive tissues. We brought the temperature up to 245 degrees on the laminae. That's the temperature that I cook my Thanksgiving roast at. So, that's how you slough the hooves – too much heat creates a laminitic episode."

Wildenstein recommends giving the foal breaks while gluing on the shoe.

"Use it in increments," he says. "Just layer it in small amounts. Let it cool off, and then put some more on. You can get away with about a quarter of an inch in thickness."

When intervening with a shoe, it's important that the foal is not placed in a stall.

"The shoe is doing nothing if the foal is not walking," Kraus says. "The foal has to have some exercise, some physical therapy that you're creating."

Another option when a foal needs lateral support is a Dalric Cuff.

"The side of the cup is mobile, so you wrap it around the foot," Kraus says. "There will be a wing sticking out. Some of it you will cut off. Then you will screw it in to hold it in place. It's very handy."

It's important to mind its placement, though.

"Be careful that the back of the cup is not hitting the back of the coronary band," Ducharme says. "Some horses will get bruises there because it's too high or it's high for that fitting of the foal."

There are deformities when a shoe won't help.

"The red flag is when you're dealing with a horse that has a valgus at the knee – the foot is outward and there's a touch of varus at the

fetlock," Ducharme explains. "You shouldn't use a shoe to try to bring that leg in because you'll bring the fetlock in and cause a varus at the fetlock while the knee is out. That's a lot harder to deal with."

Asymmetrical plates are another option that both Kraus and Wildenstein have found are very effective.

"You can buy them or make them," Kraus says. "It's very quick and easy to do. I drill some holes in there just to give it more purchase for the glue."

Preparing the foot and shoe is critical, though.

"The glues don't stick as well to mill finish on shoes," he says. "You definitely want a clean and roughened surface on the shoes."

Kraus recommends marking the shoes to avoid problems during application.

"It's very easy to get confused, especially when you're trying to work fast with these foals and glues," he says. "It's very important to have a plan, mark your shoes and know what you're doing. In recovery, when the foal is lying down, it's hard to tell which is right and which is left. So, you really have to pay attention because it's very easy to put them on backward."

Ducharme reemphasizes that it's imperative for the foal that the vet and farrier work together.

"I can look at the foal with a farrier and say, 'Look how the foal is landing. What would you do or how would you adjust it?'" he says. "We pretty much always agree on how the foal is landing. We don't always agree on the best way. Do you put on a shoe? Do you put on an extension? Do you address the trim? I've learned through the years to let farriers do their jobs and discuss it, because you make the better choice." ■

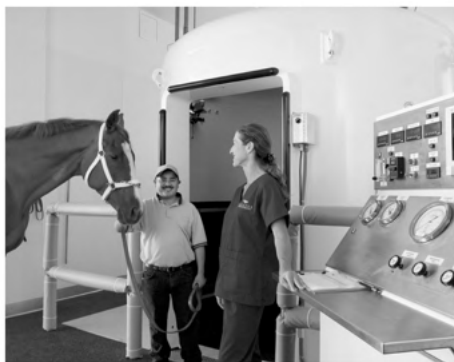

2017 Breeders' Awards

Mandated by the state's racing act in accordance with RCW 67.16.175, breeders' awards are funded from a percentage of the exotic pari-mutuel wagering during live racing at Emerald Downs and its OTBs and are paid at the end of the race year. Beginning in 2004, of the Source Market Fees collected from advance deposit wagering, 2.5 percent goes to owners' and breeders' awards (WAC 260-49-070), split evenly at 1.25 percent to owners and 1.25 percent to breeders.

Breeders' Awards Factor

For many years, it was assumed that Emerald Downs retained six percent from daily gross receipts for exotic wagering on both live racing and simulcasting. Of that six percent, one percent was designated for breeders' awards.

In 2017, it was determined that, in actuality, Emerald Downs had not been retaining six percent from the daily gross receipts on exotic wagering from simulcasting. Hence, going forward, breeders' awards will be calculated on exotic wagering from live racing only. This dropped the distribution to breeders' awards from \$238,029 in 2016 to \$59,049 in 2017. Emerald Downs provided a supplement of \$100,000 to help make up the difference, in addition to \$113,378 (1.25 percent) from Source Market Fees.

The total of \$272,427 is allocated as 75 percent for first, 15 percent for second and ten percent for third. These totals are divided by the total amount of corresponding purse monies earned by Washington-breds, which creates three corresponding factors. The appropriate factor is then multiplied by the total purse monies won by each Washington-bred to arrive at the breeders' award amount.

Owners' Bonus Awards

The Washington-bred bonus was first established in August 1969. One percent of the pari-mutuel wagering, per RCW 67.16.102(1), during live racing at Emerald Downs and its OTBs (off-track betting locations) is paid at the end of the race year to all licensed owners whose Washington-bred horses place first, second, third or fourth at Emerald Downs.

Beginning in 2004, of the Source Market Fees collected from advance deposit wagering, 2.5 percent goes to owners' and breeders' awards (WAC 260-49-070), split evenly at 1.25 percent to owners and 1.25 percent to breeders.

In 2017 the payment factor was 17.24 percent, compared to 16.70 percent in 2016.

Richard Sena's seven-year-old campaigner Grinder Sparksaglo went off as the three-to-five favorite in the field of nine runners aged four and up in the 52nd running of the Portland Meadows Mile. With regular rider Kevin Orozco aboard, Grinder Sparksaglo was content to travel off the pace set by early leader Ontheshadyside for the first six furlongs. Challenged by Little Barn Racing's Dynamic Scoring, Grinder Sparksaglo pulled clear in the lane and drew off by 1 1/4 lengths over that rival to finish the race on the wet fast surface in 1:37.50.

Unraced at two, Grinder Sparksaglo was bred in Washington by Sena and the late Marvin Lynd. The runner broke his maiden by six lengths in a maiden/\$25,000 optional claiming race (N) in August of his sophomore season and in his next outing four weeks later won an allowance/\$40,000 optional claimer (N) by three-quarters of a length. His first stakes win came in the Stallion Stakes at Portland Meadows and he has won five other stakes – including both the Mile and the Oregon HBPA Overnight Handicap in 2018 – at the Rose City oval.

A son of 1996 Kentucky Derby (G1) winner and Oakhurst Thoroughbreds' stallion Grindstone, Grinder Sparksaglo is the only foal to race out of the winning Matricule mare Cule Flyer, a daughter of three-time Yakima Meadows stakes winner Flyer Aglo.

Flyer Aglo was a daughter of 1984-85 Oregon horse of the year and \$346,525 stakes winner Polynesian Flyer. One of the many stakes winners sired by multiple Oregon leading sire Flying Lark, Polynesian Flyer was voted state champion during each of his five seasons spent racing.

Sparkle Aglo, the third dam of Grinder Sparksaglo, won the 1988 Grants Pass Thoroughbred Futurity and was a half-sister to a trio of stakes-placed runners. All were offspring of the winning Grenfall mare Grenetta, a half-sister to Grants Pass Futurity and Derby winner The Sea King, by Sea Aglo.

AT THE TRACK

2018 Sun Downs Dates

The Washington Horse Racing Commission approved a six-day 2018 meet for Sun Downs Racetrack in Kennewick. The Eastern Washington meeting will run on the following Saturday-Sunday schedule: April 21-22, April 28-29 and May 5-6.

2017 Oregon Champions

The 2017 Oregon champions were led by James and Carol Owens' homebred horse of the year Furious Fire, a daughter of Grindstone—Jimbo's Fire Ant, by Baquero, who is trained by Ben Root. Also named best sophomore filly, Furious Fire won five of her seven starts, including the \$25,000 Fall Challenge Stakes and the \$15,500 Oregon Hers Stakes, earning \$45,450. The Owenses were also named 2017 top breeders and lauded as Oregon's TOBA winners of the year.

Oakhurst Thoroughbred's 1996 Kentucky Derby (G1) winner Grindstone was also responsible for two other year-end titleholders.

2016 state champion two-year-old male Gravel came back to earn his second title after the son of Grindstone—Cant Woman, by Can't Be Slew, won the \$15,500 Oregon His Stakes and finished second in the \$25,000 Fall Challenge Stakes. Gravel added \$34,163 to the coffers of Lisa Baze and Jerry Carmody. Trained by Rigoberto Velasquez and bred by Larry and Gay Welliver, Gravel has won four races and earned \$44,293.

Laurie Lukas and Margaret Root's Milady Rocks was named champion older distaffer. Unraced at two and three, Milady Rocks competed from January through May at Oaklawn Park, Keeneland and Churchill Downs while being tutored by her Racing Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas. After placing in maiden special weight and \$40,000 and \$50,000 maiden claiming races, Milady Rocks finished first in a \$40,000 maiden claiming race at Keeneland, only to be disqualified to third. In her final start of the year she finished second in a maiden \$50,000 claimer at Churchill Downs. Bred by Dr. Jack and Margaret "Cookie" Root, Milady Rocks—who is out of Milady de Winter, by Wildcat Heir – earned \$28,428.

Champion older horse honors went to Jacqueline Smith-owned and -trained Cantchaco, a 2010 gelding by Ochoco, also

bred by the Wellivers out of their stellar producer Cant Woman, who was named 2017 Oregon broodmare of the year. Cantchaco won six stakes among his ten victories from 16 starts last year: the \$9,200 Great Falls Turf Club Feature and \$5,000 Nobles Westside Features stakes at Great Falls; the \$8,050 OTBOA Summer Series Stakes at Tillamook; the \$7,000 Prineville OTBOA Summer Series Stakes at Prineville; and the \$5,000g Jack K. Goodman and \$5,000g Mr. Ed Stakes at Rillito. Cantchaco earned \$31,599 of his so far \$112,640 in 2017.

Two-year-old honors were shared by Shelly Nance, Steve Smith and Barbara Eakin's Grinning Tiger and Carol Duby's Stay in Grace.

Grinning Tiger, who is from the first crop of the California-based Smiling Tiger, was bred by Patrick Cosgrove and is trained by Jonathan Nance. Out of the Pioneering mare Karlee's Kitten, Grinning Tiger won half of his six starts last year – including tallies in the \$15,500 Bill Wineberg and \$10,000 Willamette River stakes – earning \$24,658.

Stay in Grace, who was also bred by the Roots, was undefeated in her three outings, which included wins in the \$15,500 Janet Wineberg Stakes and \$10,000 Detroit Lake Handicap. A member of the second crop of Understatement, she was produced from the Grindstone mare Bridled Style. Trained by Linda Bartels Northam, the filly earned \$18,607.

For the ninth consecutive year, Bar C Racing Stables' Harbor the Gold led all state sires with 2017 earnings of \$1,225,424. Among his 58 winners from 89 starters were five stakes winners and he had another six who placed in 2017 stakes races.

Rolland Ferguson was honored as 2017 Oregon trainer of the year.

2018 Oregon Summer Fair Dates

The 2018 Oregon summer fair dates will once again be spread over five meets beginning in June and ending in September: Union–Eastern Oregon Livestock Show (three days), June 8-10; Grants Pass (nine days), June 16-17, 23-24 and 30, July 1, 4 and 7-8; Prineville–Crooked River Roundup (four days), July 11-14; Tillamook (four days), August 8-11; and Burns–Harney County Fair (three days), September 7-9.

WTBOA Sales Graduates in the News

Team Hollywood dead-heated with Blue Chip Betty for the win in a maiden special weight run at Golden Gate on December 26. A daughter of Alternation—September Charmer, by Septieme Ciel, Team Hollywood is a Kentucky-bred filly who has made three trips through the sales ring, including as a \$19,000 RNA at the 2016 WTBOA Sale while consigned by El Dorado Farms. After taking a starter allowance race in February, Team Hollywood rolled to her third win in four starts when taking a six-panel allowance/\$40,000 optional claiming

(N) race at the Albany track on March 11. She has earned \$37,640.

Ridgefield Rocket won a \$30,000 maiden claiming race at Santa Anita on December 30. The 2015 colt by Stay Thirsty—Adorable Lydia, by Carson City, was bred in Washington by Terry and Mary Lou Griffin and High Point Bloodstock, races for Al and Sandra Kirkwood and is trained by Mark Glatt.

Rewired, a California-bred colt by Acclamation—Knows No Bounds, by Boundary, who races for Dr. Rodney E. Orr, won a 5 1/2-furlong starter allowance race at Golden Gate on February 19. The colt took his third win in four tries when he annexed a six-panel allowance/\$40,000 optional claimer (N) on March 16 at Golden Gate. He has bankrolled \$45,100.

Mixo, who had been twice stakes-placed at Emerald Downs at two, won a maiden/\$30,000 optional claiming (N) race at Turf Paradise on New Year's Day. On February 20, Mixo added a tally in a six-panel allowance test at the Arizona track and upped his earnings to \$57,400. The now four-year-old son of El Dorado Farm stallion Abraaj out of Valour Road, by Honour and Glory, was bred in Washington by Oak Crest Farm.

Martin Riggs, the first foal out of Washington horse of the year E Z Kitty (He's Tops), went gate-to-wire to take a mile \$100,000 maiden claiming race by 1 1/2 lengths over Santa Anita's turf course on January 5 while racing for the partnership of Dan J. Agnew, Gerry Schneider and John V. Xitco. Bred in Kentucky by Highlander Racing Stable LLC, the three-year-old colt is trained by Mark Glatt.

Carat Queen improved her record to 4-2-0 from ten starts after she took an allowance test by 5 1/4 lengths at Portland Meadows on January 7. The four-year-old Oregon-bred filly by Grindstone—Talent Queen, by Elusive Quality, was bred by Gordon L. Tallman and Dr. Jack B. Root Jr., races for Marjorie Avery and is trained by Dennis Hurley. She has earned \$23,097.

Mardi Gras Delight, in her second start, won a 5 1/2-furlong maiden/\$35,000 optional claiming race by 2 1/4 lengths for owner Art McFadden on January 8 at Portland Meadows. Trained by Jonathan Nance, Mardi Gras Delight, a three-year-old Washington-bred daughter of Ministers Wild Cat, became the fifth winner from six starters for Prisco and Elizabeth Vacca's Bertrando mare Creole Delights.

Percy's Bluff took his 2018 debut on January 14 in a 5 1/2-furlong starter allowance at Golden Gate. The six-year-old gelding races for and is trained by Jerry Hollendorfer and was bred in Washington by Nina and Ron Hagen. It marked the 18th win for the son of El Dorado Farms LLC's Raise the Bluff—Persephonie, by Conquistador Cielo, who was Washington's 2016 most improved claimer. Percy's Bluff has earned \$223,133.

Mitch and John E earned his second victory at the 2017-18 Portland Meadows meet when the four-year-old son of Run Away and Hide—Artic Mist, by Son of Briartic, went gate-to-wire to take an allowance test by 4 1/4 lengths on January 15. Bred in Washington by Rick and Debbie Pabst, the five-race winner competes for Lisa Baze and Chuck Hilton and is trained by Rigoberto Velasquez. He has earned \$38,200.

C R Bullitt won a six-furlong maiden special weight race at Golden Gate on January 21 for R. E. V. Racing. Trained by Frank Lucarelli, the new winner – a three-year-old son of Atta Boy Roy out of Washington champion racemare Aunt Sophie, by Altazarr – was bred in Washington by Barbara L. Barth and Connie Belshay. C R Bullitt next finished second by three-quarters of a length in a six-panel allowance/\$40,000 optional claiming (N) race at Golden Gate on February 19.

Pyscho Sister – a half-sister to newly crowned 2017 Washington two-year-old champion Elliott Bay – went gate-to-wire to take a mile allowance/\$62,500 optional claiming race by 2 3/4 lengths at Golden Gate on February 24. The five-year-old mare by Freud out of stakes winner Marva Jean, by Cahill Road, who was bred in Washington by Rick and Debbie Pabst, has earned \$84,120.

Kaboom proved a five-length winner of a maiden \$16,000 claiming race at Santa Anita on January 21. Bred in Washington by Billie Klokstad, Kaboom is a four-year-old gelded son of Gibson Thoroughbred Farm stallion Parker's Storm Cat and is the fourth winner out of the unraced stakes-producing Slewdledo mare Special Return.

Always Enuff ran third in a six-panel allowance race at Fair Grounds on January 26 for owner Ten Broeck Farm Inc. and trainer Grant T. Forster. It was only the second outing for the four-year-old daughter of Tiz Wonderful—Witching Meeting, by General Meeting, who had won a maiden special weight race by ten lengths last year at Emerald Downs while under trainer Tim McCanna's shedrow. Bred in Washington by Patricia Murphy and Rick and Debbie Pabst, Always Enuff next outdistanced her rivals by 5 3/4 lengths in a six-furlong allowance at Fair Grounds on March 15 in her third start to push her earnings to \$40,706.

Smiling Tiger was named 2017 California leading freshman sire. The first crop of the multiple Grade 1 sprinter earned \$485,752, over double what second place Indian Evening's runners achieved. Smiling Tiger's top earner was the stakes-winning filly Spiced Perfection (\$167,260), and he is also the sire of Oregon champion juvenile colt Grinning Tiger and Emerald Downs two-time stakes-placed Brown Tiger.

Kast Intention, a three-year-old Washington-bred daughter of El Dorado Farms LLC's Abraaj, won her first start for owner Brett Brophy and Beauttenmuller

Inc. on February 28 at Turf Paradise. Trained by Jeff Metz and bred by Nina and Ron Hagen, the filly out of the unraced Chilean-bred Crémé, took the 5 1/2-furlong maiden/\$30,000 optional claiming (N) race by one length. Kast Intention made it two-for-two when she won an allowance/\$20,000 optional claiming (N) race by 2 3/4 lengths at the Arizona track on March 19. She is the fourth foal and winner for her dam, who has also produced stakes-placed Camano Comet.

Cinderella Liberty, Washington's 2003 champion juvenile filly, has so far produced four winners from her first five starters. Among them is the five-year-old gelding Nevadan, by Mesa Thunder, who earned his fifth victory when he took a mile starter allowance on the grass at Turf Paradise on March 4, pushing his earnings to \$38,269. Cinderella Liberty is a daughter of West Coast Training Center's Liberty Gold out of Notjustanyknight, by Knight Choice, and was bred by Claudia A. Canouse.

Reba Is Tops, Washington's 2009 horse of the year and a five-time stakes winner of \$464,267, is the dam of the five-year-old Tribal Rule mare Rebarules Again, who won a six-furlong allowance at Golden Gate on March 4 for her owners and breeders Eric Schweiger, Gordy Jarnig and Kenny Marshall. The California-bred, who has earned \$121,882, is trained by Tim McCanna.


Pep o' Gold, a winning Washington-bred daughter of Slew o' Gold who was a 1999 WTBOA Summer Yearling Sale RNA, is the dam of seven-race winner and \$57,465 earner Tiz o' Gold, by Cee's Tizzy. Tiz o' Gold's first foal, Bravazo, who had run second in the 2017 Breeders' Futurity (G1) at Keeneland, won the \$400,000 Risen Star Stakes (G2) at Fair Grounds on February 17. The Calumet Farm homebred, by Awesome Again – who is trained by D. Wayne Lukas – has earned \$436,528. Pep o' Gold was one of ten foals – including stakes-placed Pewterville, by Petersburg – bred by Charlie and Cindy Hoctor and Hugh and Kathy Shiels, out of the winning The Irish Lord mare Ginger Up.

and up the seven-year-old California-bred's earnings to \$131,698 . . . **Steven Sarkowsky** and Martin J. and Pam Wygod's three-year-old filly Paradise Woods finished second to future 2017 champion female sprinter Unique Bella in the \$300,000 La Brea Stakes (G1) held at Santa Anita the day after Christmas. The Washington-bred daughter of Successful Appeal is one of three foals and starters out of the Broken Vow mare Hope and Vow, whose first offspring is the Hansens' three-time Washington champion racemare Ethan's Baby. On March 4, the Hansens' first-time starter Best of Me, a three-year-old Kentucky-bred filly by Super Saver, won a 5 1/2-furlong maiden special weight race at Santa Anita by 3 1/4 lengths . . . **Ron Crockett Inc.** homebred Close the Show Lo, a 2013 Kentucky-bred daughter of Pure Prize, won a \$40,000 claiming race at Golden Gate on December 31. It marked the third win for the Frank Lucarelli trainee who has earned \$61,573. Close the Show Lo is one of nine winners out of four-time stakes

Two-year-old Ippodamia's Girl, a Kentucky-bred daughter of Stormy Atlantic, won the mile \$85,320 Blue Norther Stakes run over Santa Anita's turf course on December 31. Both she and her Grade 1-winning half-brother Georgie Boy are among the seven winners out of Washington-bred stakes winner **Ippodamia**, a daughter of Peterhof whose dam and granddam were also Washington-bred stakes winners. The \$55,115 earner races for **Steve Moger** and is trained by his brother Ed Moger Jr . . . **Horseplayers Racing Club** and trainer **Tim McCanna's** Bornonvalenteday took her second consecutive win when the three-year-old Kentucky-bred daughter of Data Link went gate-to-wire in a starter allowance at Golden Gate on January 12 . . . **Dr. George Todaro** and trainer Jerry Hollendorfer's multiple graded stakes winner G G Ryder went gate-to-wire to win an allowance/\$62,500 optional claiming race at Golden Gate on January 21. The seven-year-old California-bred son of Emerald Downs stakes winner Chhaya Dance has won 14 races and earned \$555,305. On March 10, Todaro and Hollendorfer LLC's Allaboutaction, a five-year-old gelding by Candy Ride (Arg), won a six-furlong allowance/\$40,000 optional claiming race at Golden Gate. Her \$128,921 stakes-placed dam Classy Landlady – a full sister to \$689,510 Grade 2 winner Stage Classic – had been purchased carrying Classy Atlantic by Halvorson Bloodstock Services, as agent, for \$25,000 at the 2014 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale . . . **Luigi DiPietro's** Lazzarella, a four-year-old daughter of Tizbud bred in California by DiPietro Thoroughbreds, won an turf allowance at Turf Paradise on January 28. It marked her third win and gives her \$46,456 in earnings . . . In his first 2018 start, two-time Portland Meadows stakes winner **Keller's Gold** ran third in the \$75,000 Budweiser Handicap at Sunland Park on

February 10. The four-year-old son of Liberty Gold—Glory Hallelujah, by Honour and Glory, was bred in Washington by Keith and Jan Swagerty and now races for Linda Eidal. Hollendorfer LLC, **Mark Dedomenico LLC** and **George Todaro's** Street Sweets, a Kentucky-bred daughter of Street Sense, rewarded her owners with a gate-to-wire win in a mile maiden special weight race at Golden Gate on March 9 . . . Jomelo, an eight-year-old gelding by Oakhurst Thoroughbreds' Kentucky Derby (G1) winner **Giacomo**, took the 12-furlong Turf Distance Series Final Stakes run at Turf Paradise on March 17. Twice stakes-placed at two, the Ontario-bred runner has earned \$437,810.

The now 20-year-old Shandra Smiles has a yearling colt by Tale of the Cat . . . **Horseplayers Racing Club LLC (HPRC)** and Above the Crowd Stable LLC's Fire Lake went over the \$100,000 mark on January 27 with his gate-to-wire victory at Fair Grounds in an allowance/\$12,500 optional claiming race. The five-year-old Louisiana-bred gelding by Haynesfield has seven wins and \$115,980 in earnings. HPRC's three-year-old Cajun Creed, a Louisiana-bred gelding sired by Jimmy Creed, took a mile allowance at

Delta Downs on February 23. He has earned \$116,600 . . . Three-year-old Empire Line remained unbeaten after scoring his second victory in the Damon Runyon Stakes at Aqueduct on January 15. Sired by Grade 1 winner Morning Line, by Tiznow, Empire Line stems from the same female line as Illinois Derby (G3) winner **Dynamic Impact**, who is also a son of two-time Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) winner Tiznow. \$421,006 stakes winner Dynamic Impact entered stud this year at Bar C Racing Stables . . . Hogy, who was originally purchased for \$17,000 by **Dana Halvorson's** Halvorson Bloodstock Services LLC, as agent, as a short yearling out of the 2010 Keeneland January sale, took his seventh stakes win, and third Grade 3 race, when he won the \$150,000 Canadian Turf Stakes at Gulfstream Park on March 3. The gelded son of Offlee Wild has won 19 races and earned \$1,321,837 . . . Three-time graded-placed Wild About Deb, a five-year-old son of Eskendereya out of Emerald Downs champion Smarty Deb, by Smart Strike, bred by **Northwest Farms LLC** in Kentucky, upped his earnings to \$309,270 after he won a nine-panel allowance at Aqueduct on March 3 . . . Former prominent Washington jockey **Jose Corrales**, 57, saddled his first graded stakes winner when Stronach Stables' Something Awesome, a seven-year-old son of Awesome Again, won the \$250,000 General George Stakes (G3) at Laurel Park on February 17. Ridden by Corrales' nephew Elvis Trujillo, it marked the seventh win for the gelding and upped his earnings to \$341,051. Corrales, whose last recorded mount came at Emerald Downs on September 11, 1998, won 1,031 races from his 6,860 mounts that earned over \$4.4-million. Some of Corrales' top mounts included Washington champions Harmony Creek, Spring Trooper and Zulu Whiz and Oregon horse of the year Polynesian Flyer. As a trainer Corrales has had 358 wins – including 40 in 2018 – from 2,098 starters who have earned over \$7.1-million through March 19 . . . Eight Da Hardway, a five-year-old gelding by Proud Citizen, won a six-furlong allowance/\$25,000 optional claiming (N) race at Parx Racing on March 17. West Coast Training Center Adds Lord Lochinvar to Stallion Roster

Lord Lochinvar enters stud at Keith and Jan Swagerty's West Coast Training Center in Auburn for the 2018 breeding season.

A 2011 son of 1982 Horse of the Year and leading sire A. P. Indy, Lord Lochinvar is one of nine winners out the winning Lord At War (Arg) mare Lady Lochinvar.

A Golden Gate Fields maiden special weight winner, Lord Lochinvar is a full brother to five-time graded stakes winner and \$1,137,188 earner Master Command and a three-quarter brother to Grade 3 winner Aurora Lights (\$277,076) and G1-placed X Star, both daughters of Pulpit; and a half-brother to \$94,215 stakes winner Street Lad, by Street Cry (Ire). Lady Lochinvar has a 2016 filly by Candy Ride (Arg) named Candavar.

Lady Winborne, the second dam of Lord Lochinvar, was a half-sister to multiple European champion Allez France, by *Sea-Bird. The Group 3-placed daughter of Secretariat excelled as a broodmare, producing six stakes winners among her 13 winners of over \$2.7-million. Two were Grade 1 winners, Al Mamoon and La Guerriere, while Lost Soldier won a Grade 3 and Bold Wild won the 1995 Magna Austrian Derby.

Lady Winborne's dam, Priceless Gem, beat the great Buckpasser in the (Aqueduct) Futurity and was a full sister to stakes winner Admiring, both by Hail to Reason, and half-sister to two-time champion and 18-time stakes winner Affectionately, who in turn produced 1970 champion three-year-old Personality.

Lord Lochinvar's sire A. P. Indy needs little introduction, as the champion sire is one of many champions sired by 1977 Triple Crown winner Seattle Slew and is one of two classic winners and top sires out of broodmare of the year Weekend Surprise, by Secretariat.

West Coast Training Center also stands Liberty Gold, a Grade 3-winning son of Crafty Prospector, who has a trio of Washington champions to his credit; Gotham City, a \$2-million two-year-old sired by Saint Ballado; and Mr. Rancho Vista, a 15-race winner by Northern Afleet, whose first foals arrived in 2017.

Each stallion will stand the 2018 season for a \$1,250 fee (live foal), which includes a \$250 booking fee.

\$492,130 Stakes Winner Raised a Secret to Oakhurst Thoroughbreds

Dr. Rodney Orr's Raised a Secret has been retired to stud for the 2018 breeding season to Dr. Jack and Margaret "Cookie" Root Jr.'s Oakhurst Thoroughbreds in Newberg, Oregon.

One of over 40 stakes winners sired by Grade 1 winner Songandaprayer, Raised a Secret won the \$100,000 Harris Farm Stakes and placed in six other stakes while running

from two through six, including placements in the Grade 3 Los Angeles Stakes and the Gottstein Futurity.

Twenty of Raised a Secret's 31 starts (5-10-8) came in dirt sprints where he tallied a 3-6-5 record and earned \$290,610 of his \$492,130 total. His race total SSI was 4.49, with a sprint SSI of 4.38.

Raised a Secret is the second leading earner sired by Songandaprayer, one of 120 stakes winners by major winner and sire Unbridled's Song. The leading sire in North America in 2017, Unbridled's Song is the sire of five champions, including North America's leading money earner Arrogate and 2017 Eclipse Award winner Forever Unbridled.

Raised a Secret – who won an Emerald Downs maiden special weight race by 2 1/2 lengths in his first outing – is the first foal out of \$50,080 winner Sensitive Soul, a daughter of Bernstein who has produced three other winners, including \$283,157 stakes-placed Image of Joplin.

The second dam of Raised a Secret is twice Santa Anita stakes-placed Kindred Soul, a daughter of Woodman who earned \$106,077.

Updated AAEP Biosecurity Guidelines Now Available

The American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP) has published updated biosecurity guidelines to help minimize the occurrence and mitigate the spread of potential disease outbreaks.

The downloadable PDF file incorporates comprehensive information and step-by-step protocols in three distinct areas: identification of key personnel, important contacts and reference materials; routine biosecurity protocol; and outbreak response. The AAEP's Infectious Disease Committee updated the protocols.

The outbreak of an infectious disease can inflict significant economic hardship due to loss of horses, loss of use and shutdown of industry activity. To further reduce risk, the AAEP has a companion fillable PDF worksheet that will serve as a practical resource for practitioners to use with their clients in planning for an outbreak.

2018 Keeneland Horses of All Ages Sale

The four-day Keeneland sale (January 8-11) cataloged 1,583 horses, consisting mainly broodmares and short yearlings. Of those, 1,227 went through the ring with 909 changing hands for a \$34,996,000 gross, \$38,499 average (up 28.53 percent) and a \$12,000 median (up 14.29 percent). RNAs were down 5.49 percent from the 2017 sale and 28 horses sold for \$200,000 or more this year versus 17 in 2017.

Topping the Kentucky venue was broodmare prospect Mrs McDougal, a Grade 2 stakes-winning daughter of Medaglia d'Oro out of the Eaton Sales consignment, who was purchased by Steven G. Young, agent, for \$1.6-million. The nearly \$500,000 earner made her final career starts in the name of Washington Racing Hall of Fame breeder Theline Scheumann's 2 TY LLC.

A yearling colt from the first crop of Triple Crown winner American Pharoah topped all of the 2017 offspring offered with a \$1-million bid.

Washington bloodstock agent Dana Halvorson signed for two horses: a yearling daughter of Flat Out, who is a half-sister to \$256,659 stakes winner Wildeysouthernboy and six other winners; and stakes producer Princess Hillary, by Maria's Mon, who had been bred to Strong Mandate.

California-based Tom Grether Farms, which races and sells in Washington, purchased an Awesome Again yearling half-sister to Grade 3 stakes winner Tiz a Minister.

Don Lockwood, as agent, signed for Preciouspurplerain, a daughter of Dehere out of stakes winner Callmenicepick, who had been covered by Flat Out.

Goodlookinwife, a \$70,075 earning full sister to 2012 Emerald Downs horse of the meet Class Included (both daughters of Include out of 2005 Emerald champion sophomore filly A Classic Life), was sold bred to Verrazano for \$60,000.

You Vow Me, a \$85,172 winner by Broken Vow out of Angie C. Stakes-placed Light of a Star (family of graded winners Hilco Scamper and Summer Hit and Emerald champion sprinter Starbird Road) sold as a broodmare prospect for \$50,000.

Stakes-placed Diva's Seastar, a daughter of Broken Vow who has already produced the earners of nearly \$400,000, was sold for

\$45,000 while covered by Twirling Candy. Diva's Seastar is a half-sister to Washington champion Handyman Bill and Grade/Group 3 stakes winners Elusive Diva (dam of 2017 Eclipse sprint champion Roy H) and Tropics, all offspring of Washington broodmare of the year Taj Aire.

A yearling filly by Grade 1 winner Cross Traffic, out of 1998 Washington champion two-year-old filly Western Woman, brought \$40,000. Western Woman has already produced six winners, led by \$489,141 stakes winner and Grade 3-placed Modern Cowboy, Grade 3-placed Hype and stakes-placed Tis a Man.

2018 Barretts January Mixed Sale

The California sale was held on January 17 with 189 cataloged and 13 supplemental entries. Of those 202, 112 horses were sold for a \$1,226,400 total, \$10,950 average (up 37.5 percent) and \$5,750 median (up 55.4 percent). The RNA rate rose from 22.4 percent in 2017, to 30.4 percent.

Topping the venue was a two-year-old colt by Quality Road. Consigned by Andrian Gonzalez's Checkmate Thoroughbreds LLC, agent, the handsome bay was purchased by O. I. Jauregui, agent for Highland Yard, for a \$120,000 bid.

Washington trainer Candi Tollett, as agent, signed for three: a yearling filly by Lucky Pulpit out of a half-sister to Grade 3 winner and Grade 1-placed Just Wonder (GB), German stakes winner Just Time and French stakes-placed Just Queen; and two unraced four-year-olds, a gelding by Tiznow and a filly by Majesticperfection.

Conditioner Jonathan Nance purchased a yearling colt by Marino Marini out of a winning half-sister to \$289,622 stakes winner Just for Keeps; and Bella San (GB), a \$144,632 winning half-sister to three stakes horses bred to Grazen.

2018 Fasig-Tipton Winter Mixed Sale

Fasig-Tipton held their annual two-day sale at their Kentucky headquarters on February 5-6. After the addition of 57 supplemental entries, this year's venue featured 574 horses, down 66 horses from 2017.

Girl Talk, a stakes-placed daughter of Medaglia d'Oro, was the top seller at \$310,000. Overall, 471 head went through the ring with 364 selling for a \$10,436,800 gross, \$28,673 average (up 5.9 percent) and \$10,500 median (up 16.7 percent).

Emerald Downs Vice President Jack Hodge purchased two yearlings: a colt by Justin Phillip, who is a half-brother to Grade 1-placed \$317,190 earner Aripeka, and a colt from the initial crop of Grade 1 juvenile winner Competitive Edge out of a \$95,190 winning half-sister to \$274,716 stakes winner Crumlin Spirit and \$171,357 stakes-placed Henny's Heart.

Kara Toye's Moxie Bloodstock signed for a yearling filly by \$1.1-million earner Bourbon Courage for Rick Kessler.

Corby, a \$127,650 stakes-placed daughter of Quality Road and half-sister to Grade 1 winner Celtic Melody, brought \$160,000 as a racing or broodmare prospect. The five-year-old mare stems from the immediate family of Washington horse of the year Delicate Vine and additional graded stakes winners House of Fortune, Altazarr, Irish Gypsy, Rendezvous and Georgie Boy.

Among the others selling with a Washington connection were a Haynesfield yearling filly out of a winning daughter of Washington champion and Grade 2 winner Favored One; and four-year-old broodmare Seneca Theatre, a daughter of Gio Ponti out of \$596,404 Grade 2 winner and stakes producer The Niagara Queen – a daughter of Washington-bred Inspirational, who is a half-sister to three Washington-bred stakes horses – bred to Justin Phillip.

Roy H Among 2017 Eclipse Award Winners

The 2017 Eclipse Award ceremonies were held in January at Gulfstream Park in Florida. There were few surprises during the festive night, which featured Gun Runner's landslide coronation as Horse of the Year and champion older male dirt runner.

Another popular vote tally was the champion male sprinter title awarded Gary Hartunian's Rockingham Ranch and David Bernstein's three-time Grade 1 winner Roy H. The now six-year-old gelded son of More Than Ready – who was named to honor Hartunian's late grandfather – finished the year with a 5-1-0 record from his six races with \$1,270,900 in earnings. The "icing on the cake" was his length victory in the TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) last year at Del Mar.

Though bred in Kentucky by Ramona S. Bass LLC, Roy H has deep ties to the Evergreen State. His dam, three-time Grade 3 winner Elusive Diva, was bred by Washington Racing Hall of Fame breeders John and Doris Konecny and their Czechmate Farm; and his second and third dams were the Enumclaw couple's Washington broodmares of the year Whimsical Aire, by Messenger of Song, and her daughter Taj Aire, by Taj Alriyadh. This is also the immediate family of Washington champions Silky Steel (Roy H's fourth dam), Handyman Bill, Mahaska, Enumclaw Girl and Quizzical.

There is also another Washington connection through Roy H's trainer Peter Miller, as he trained two WTBOA Sales graduates who would become state champions. The first was 1986 Washington champion three-year-old and turf horse Fast Parade, who was bred by the Konecny's son Dr. Michael Konecny; and the second was the late 2016 California two-year-old colt champion California Diamond, who was bred by now Eastern Washington resident Stormy Hull.

Roy H easily took his 2018 debut in the \$200,000 Palos Verdes Stakes (G2) on February 3 at Santa Anita, winning the six-panel sprint by 3 1/2 lengths and improving his record to 7-4-1 in 18 starts. The six-year-old gelding has earned \$1,479,765. Winning rider Kent Desormeaux said after his mount's 1:09.68 clocking over a fast track, "He's a super horse . . . he's the best sprinter I've ever ridden."

Quality Road – who is a full brother to Gibson Thoroughbred Farm stallion Linchpin, whose first crop races in 2018 – was represented by two Eclipse winners: three-year-old filly Abel Tasman and two-year-old filly Caledonia Road.

The other horses and people honored with a 2017 Eclipse Award trophy were: Forever Unbridled (older dirt female); World Appeal (male turf horse); Lady Eli (female turf horse); Unique Bella (female sprinter); Good Magic (two-year-old male); West Coast (three-year-old male); Scorpincer (Ire) (steeplechaser); owner (Juddmonte Farm); breeder (Clearsky Farm); trainer (Chad Brown); jockey (Jose Ortiz); and apprentice jockey (Evin Roman – who rode John Parker's homebred Gold Rush Dancer to victory in the 2017 Grade 3 Longacres Mile).

Three-year Racehorse Depreciation Returns Retroactively for Fiscal Year of 2017

In February 2018, President Donald Trump signed into law the Bipartisan Budget Act, which among other measures, extends retroactively for fiscal year 2017 uniform three-year racehorse depreciation, an important tax provision supported by the National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA) that expired in 2016 alongside certain other expired tax provisions.

Three-year depreciation is an investment incentive for racehorse owners that had been in place for several years.

Prior to the 2008 Farm Bill, which became effective January 1, 2009, racehorses 24 months of age and younger when purchased and placed in service, were depreciated on a seven-year schedule that did not accurately reflect the length of a typical racehorse's career; only racehorses over 24 months old were depreciated using a three-year schedule.

794 Trainers Accepted to Compete at 2018 Thoroughbred Makeover

The Retired Racehorse Project (RRP) announced that a record 794 trainers have been accepted to compete for their share of \$100,000 in prize money at the 2018 Thoroughbred Makeover, presented by Thoroughbred Charities of America and to be held October 4-7 at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington. This is a 37 percent increase from the 578 trainers accepted in 2017.

The application process for the 2018 Thoroughbred Makeover required trainers to demonstrate their skills and expertise through competition results, videos and

references. RRP's selection committee evaluated candidates based on their ability to effectively retrain an off-track Thoroughbred, as well as their commitment to RRP's mission of promoting off-track Thoroughbreds for second careers.

The accepted trainers include four-star eventers, dressage riders who have earned their US Dressage Federation Gold Medals, A-circuit hunter riders, grand prix show jumpers, high-goal polo players, decorated barrel racers and many horsemen who work within the racing industry. They represent 40 states and the District of Columbia, plus three Canadian provinces. Professionals make up 46 percent of the field; 42 percent are amateurs and 12 percent are juniors. The youngest trainer is 11; the oldest is 71. Thirty-one percent have participated in a prior Thoroughbred Makeover. Among the trainers listed are 11 from Washington and four from Oregon.

AHCF Announces Results of 2017 Economic Impact Study

The American Horse Council Foundation (AHCF) announced the results of the 2017 Economic Impact Study of the US Horse Industry.

The equine industry in the US generates approximately \$122-billion in total economic impact, an increase from \$102-billion in the 2005 Economic Impact Study. The industry also provides a total employment impact of 1.74-million and generates \$79-billion in total salaries, wages and benefits. The current number of horses in the United States stands at 7.2-million. Texas, California and Florida continue to be the top three states with the highest population of horses.

"Those involved in the equine industry already know how important it is to the US economy. Having these updated numbers is critical, not only to the AHC's efforts up on Capitol Hill, but also for the industry to demonstrate to the general public how much of a role the equine has in American households," said AHC President Julie Broadway.

Another bright spot for the industry: 38-million, or 30.5 percent of US households, contain a horse enthusiast, and 38 percent of participants are under the age of 18. Additionally, approximately 80-million acres of land is reserved for horse-related activities.

Pre-publication orders can be placed by calling Old Friends main office at (502) 863-1775. According to Old Friends, "The anticipated publication date is August 2018 and the artist is graciously donating 100 percent of the sale proceeds to benefit the horses of Old Friends" . . . TIP Increases Shows, Offerings and Youth Ambassadors for 2018

The Jockey Club Thoroughbred Incentive Program (TIP) will offer awards and classes at more than 1,200 shows in 42 states and six Canadian provinces in 2018.

Awards are available for multiple disciplines, including eventing, dressage, Western and English pleasure, hunter/jumper, endurance, Western performance, games and polocrosse. Awards are also available at some events for Thoroughbreds within their first two years of showing or for Thoroughbreds within two years of their last start.

In 2018, TIP has added championship divisions for dressage, Western dressage and Western pleasure. The second annual championships will be held on Sunday, September 9, 2018, at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington.

In addition to the dressage and Western pleasure divisions, the 2018 TIP Championships will offer 12 divisions for hunters, jumpers and English pleasure. All of the championship divisions will offer ribbons, prizes and prize money. The championships will again take place at the conclusion of the New Vocations All-Thoroughbred Charity Horse Show, which is being held September 7 and 8. A full prize list is available on the TIP website. Entries for the show will open on May 1. All horse show entries must be received no later than August 15. TIP also announced its Youth Ambassadors for the 2018 TIP Youth Ambassador Program. The 12 ambassadors – which include Anna Phillips and Aubrey Newbrey from Washington – range from eight states and two Canadian provinces and cover multiple disciplines, including hunters, jumpers, eventing, Western, dressage and equitation.

The Jockey Club announced that beginning with the 2018 breeding season, it will charge \$35 for each mare reported bred by a stallion on the annual Report of Mares Bred form. The fee will supplement the industry support already provided by The Jockey Club for Thoroughbred aftercare initiatives, including the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance (TAA), Thoroughbred Charities of America (TCA) and Thoroughbred Incentive Program (TIP).

“The Jockey Club has examined its rate structure, and a fee for mares reported bred is consistent with fees required by other Thoroughbred breed registries worldwide,”

said James L. Gagliano, president and chief operating officer of The Jockey Club.

“The Thoroughbred Incentive Program has done a tremendous job in furthering the careers of Thoroughbreds by giving owners and riders a goal to strive toward,” said Dell Hancock, Thoroughbred owner and breeder and initiator of TIP. “We should all be proud to support initiatives such as TIP, TAA, TCA and any program that better the lives of Thoroughbreds.”

In coordination with The Jockey Club of Canada, funds raised from Canadian customers of The Jockey Club will be directed to Canadian Thoroughbred aftercare organizations to supplement their efforts, and likewise, funds from Puerto Rico will be dedicated to support Thoroughbreds at recognized programs in that commonwealth.

Michael Bryan Baze

Michael Bryan Baze, 58, passed away on December 15, 2017, from injuries suffered in a fall in Mesa, Arizona.

He was born on May 26, 1959, in Portland, Oregon, the fourth of six children of Carl and Alice Baze.

Michael was Longacres leading rider in 1978 at age 19 with 105 winners. He ranked tenth in the overall Longacres rider standings with 542 victories, including stakes wins aboard champions Briar Rose, Brief Grief and Crafty Native, as well as additional stakes victories at the Renton oval astride Courageous Charley, Firey Star, Knight O’Morn, Lovely Flight, Make Me an Offer, Montera, My Runaway, O K So Far, Palicia, Run n’ Prince and Splendid Bay.

Michael rode consistently from 1976 through 1990. He was off for 1991, but back in the saddle in 1992. It would be another 15 years (2007) before his name was seen again in the jockey ranks. He also rode briefly in 2011. His last official ride came on November 28, 2011, at Turf Paradise.

All total, he had 9,081 rides with a 1,271-1,153-1,135 record and \$5,538,904 in earnings.

He was preceded in death by his father, Carl; and son and fellow jockey, Michael Carl “M.C.” Baze. Michael is survived by his mother, Alice; brothers, Gary, Earl, Randy and Kelly; sister, Toni; daughter, Cheyenne; several grandchildren; and numerous other relatives from both the Baze and Cochran sides of the family.

Ruth Helen Baze

Ruth Helen Baze, 88, passed away on January 19, 2018, in Kennewick after a lengthy illness. Helen was born January 25, 1929, in Ponderay, Idaho, the daughter of John and Susan (Neva) Pomerinke, the youngest of their seven children.

After her father’s illness, her mother became a hardworking single parent, a rarity at the time. Her mother’s examples of hard work,

integrity and deep faith were life lessons that Ruth carried with her throughout her years.

The family moved to Toppenish when Helen was five, where she grew up and attended school. On March 3, 1948, while attending a dance at the Sunnyside Community Hall, a handsome young man by the name of Rolland Baze asked her to dance. They became lifelong partners and were married in Sunnyside on October 24, 1948.

Their early years were spent racing horses at various “bush” tracks in the Northwest. Their mornings started at 2 a.m. taking care of the horses. They were in the orchards working by 4 a.m. and were back at the track by 4 p.m. to take care of the horses again. They began farming in the early 1950s and continued over the next 18 years, settling in Prosser in 1955. In 1968 they returned to racing and breeding Thoroughbreds at their farm near Whitstran, a life they continued for more than 25 years.

Helen, raised a “city girl,” was fully engaged in their endeavors, driving tractor and truck in the 50s and 60s and conquering her fear of horses to the point of handling the high-strung Thoroughbreds both on and off the track. When times were tight, she worked off the farm in Prosser and drove to the tracks on weekends to be with her husband and help with the horses.

Helen was a loving and supportive mother, encouraging her children throughout their lives.

She had a wonderful sense of humor, loved music and was constantly singing snippets of songs. She eventually encouraged both of her kids to sing professionally.

Rolland and Helen sold their farm and retired in Kennewick in 1998, spending winters in Arizona. With declining health issues, Helen was moved to assisted living where Rolland was constantly by her side.

Helen was preceded in death by her parents; twin sister, Ruby Pomerinke; sister, Dorothy “Duck” Logsdon; and brother, Ernie Pomerinke. She is survived by her husband, Rolland; daughter, Rachele (Dennis) Pleasant, of Prosser; son, Roddy (Rindi) Baze, of Kennewick; granddaughters, Denelle (Jared) Lind and Nikelle (Johnny) Hill; grandsons, Travis (Taryn) Baze, Justin (Jessica) Baze and Ron (Lyndsey) Baze; sisters, Isabel Noe, Elaine Reichert and Irene Gallipo; and eight great-grandchildren.

Ernest Matthew Braithewaite

Ernie Braithewaite, 80, passed away peacefully in Surrey, British Columbia, on March 6, 2018. He had suffered from progressive supranuclear palsy (PSP) in his final years.

Born on October 20, 1937, and raised in Dewberry, Alberta, he was one of three children born to Joe and Olga Braithewaite. The hard-working farm boy later became a highly-competitive hockey player at the University of Alberta, where Ernie pursued a bachelor of commerce degree.

At 19, Ernie travelled to study at the University of Geneva in Switzerland and play and teach the locals hockey. After touring Europe, Ernie returned to Edmonton to resume his commerce degree. It was then that he met his future wife Marlene.

After graduation, Ernie worked in accounting for companies around Edmonton, ending up in the nearby oil boomtown of Drayton Valley, still playing hockey, then for the Lacombe Rockets. Taking advantage of a vocational training program, Ernie returned to the University of Alberta to become a teacher. The family later moved to Medicine Hat where Ernie taught high school.

Ernie taught business and accounting for two years. One of the speakers he invited was a securities broker. Ernie was impressed by the speaker's success and soon moved the family to Calgary where he started in the securities business with Richardson Securities. Meanwhile, Ernie was recruited to play senior hockey with the Drumheller Miners, who won the Allen Cup in 1967 and were Canada's representative team in European play.

He and Bill Grafam started the Calgary office of Cochran Murray. Ernie then completed part-time MBA studies at the University of Calgary, later teaching courses in the program. Ernie next shifted into the oil industry, working first with Sunningdale Oil. This broadened his horizons to Dubai and elsewhere. Eventually Ernie, Roy Gillespie and George Rostoker formed Cherokee Resources.

While in Calgary, Ernie met numerous colorful people, such as Jesse Knight, who flew Ernie into the bandito-lands of Mexico in search of silver; and the aristocrat-born White Russian painter Nicholas de Grandmaison, who survived German internment camps in World War I and eventually came to Canada to produce acclaimed portraits of Indigenous people that earned him an Order of Canada and burial – where Ernie served as one of the pallbearers – on the Peigan reserve in Southern Alberta where de Grandmaison had been made an honorary chief.

Ernie and Marlene then began pursuing their interests in horses, acquiring a couple of Thoroughbreds and soon moving to a farm south of Calgary. In the early 1980s, he and Marlene bought a mare in Kentucky and moved to Whidbey Island to breed Thoroughbreds. Ernie also made several trips to Saratoga, and he even got a trainer's license, to better train his trainers.

The longtime horseman, WTBOA member and former Oak Harbor resident and his wife bred 1996 Washington champion three-year-old filly Another Sparkle, a daughter of Son of Briartic who earned \$105,863. They also bred that filly's \$265,419 stakes-winning, graded stakes-placed half-sister Late Sailing. Their best Washington-bred was the Son of Briartic gelding Royal Reach. The \$383,885

earner was acknowledged with a special Washington turf award in 1990.

More recently the Braithewaites had been active with British Columbia-bred runners with their Seattle-based partner I. M. "Sonny" Gorasht. Their stellar broodmare La Belle Creole, whose dam Sweet n Precious was a stakes-producing half-sister to Another Sparkle and Late Sailing, foaled five stakes winners for the partnership: British Columbia champions Suva and La Belle Rose, and Gotta Find Bubba, La Belle Fleur and Locket (her leading earner with \$190,537). They also raced the latter two distaffers.

Ernie also served on the board of directors of the Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society.

Other stakes winners they bred include Washington-bred Dash Eight and BC-bred Lasting Rose.

During the 1990s the Braithewaites were eight times ranked among the top 40 breeders in Washington, including their second place finish in 1990 and fifth place ranking in 1999.

From 2002-16, the Braithewaites, either alone or with Gorasht, had 26 wins and won over \$490,000. Earlier US earnings are not available on Equibase.

The Braithewaite family spent many summers camping around Alberta and British Columbia, which included plenty of bridge, cribbage, fishing, ukuleles and singing.

Ernie is survived by his wife, Marlene; sons, Murray (Tracey), Gary (Silvia) and Neil (Michele); grandchildren, Ross, Allison, Emerson, Cesar and Martin; brother, Lorne; and sister, Sharon.

Allen Emery Floyd

Allen Floyd, of Othello, 82, passed away on November 30, 2017, in Spokane.

He was born on September 12, 1935, in Harrah to Alfred and Nina (Allen) Floyd.

On June 11, 1955, he married Janet Humes and together they raised three children, Susan, Tim and Pat. Allen was an icon in Othello, both as an owner of Harvest Fresh Produce and as an avid supporter of the Othello community. He played an integral role in potato farming in central Washington and nationally throughout his career, finally retiring in March 2016. He and Janet moved to their cabin on Eloika Lake shortly thereafter.

Allen was involved with horse racing for over 50 years with runners at Longacres, Playfair, Yakima Meadows and Emerald Downs, as well as up and down California, at Arapahoe Park and in Canada.

His first win came at Coeur d'Alene Racetrack in the late 1960s with the Kaneohe Bay filly Dyes Inlet.

Some of the major horses that he was involved with include Yakima Futurity winner Turn to Glory, Kent Handicap winner Dolly's Hit Lady and 2004 Washington horse of the year Demon Warlock, as well as on many of Demon Warlock's successful offspring.

In 2017 Allen was involved in the partnerships that raced stakes-placed Oldtoytrain and Max the Kitty.

Among the many partnerships he raced under were Yo Racing, Clockwise Racing, Warlock Stables, Let's Go Racing, Elite Racing and Pacific Rein.

One of the more important horses that he purchased was a weanling filly named Felice the Cat. After racing her with trainer Jonathan Nance, she was given to Pam and Neal Christopherson, for whom she produced multiple Washington champion and 2017 horse of the year Mach One Rules.

More recently Allen was instrumental in the purchase of the recently-retired Pontiff, who began his stud career at El Dorado Farms this spring.

His awards and accolades are too numerous to list and his impact and influence on those around him were immeasurable.

He was preceded in death by his father, Alfred Floyd; mother, Nina Herron; father-in-law, Glenn Herron; infant son, Allen Floyd Jr; and brother, Charles Floyd. Allen is survived by his children, Susan Egbert, Tim Floyd and Pat Floyd; eight grandchildren; eight great-grandchildren; and siblings, Raymond Floyd, Marilyn Marsh and Marlene McMartin.

Michael Lee Marbet

Mike Marbet, 56, of Maple Valley, passed away on January 4, 2018, after a lengthy illness.

He was born in April 1961 and grew up in Skyway near Renton. He graduated from Rainier Beach High School in 1979 and lived in Maple Valley for over 30 years. By trade, Mike was an electrician.

Mike became a Thoroughbred fan through his proximity to Longacres and his father Don's interest. More recently he was a member of WWDD Stables, which claimed and raced the winning filly Ila Veiw. On June 23, 2017, Ila Veiw tied the Emerald Downs track record for six furlongs.

Mike enjoyed all sports and traveling with his family and friends.

Frank Andrew Williams

Former jockey and trainer Frank Williams, 63, passed away in Spokane on March 6, 2018, after a long battle with cancer.

Frank was known for his love of horses. He enjoyed spending time with them throughout his life and long career, in which he rode, broke and trained horses.

He was preceded in death by his sister, Donna R. Wallis. Frank is survived by his children, Amie Yeager, Nicki Williams, Dustin Wynn and Russell Wynn; grandchildren, Kassie Yeager, Brenin Scheufer, Payton Wynn, Riley Wynn, Charlie Wynn, Caleb Wynn and Caden Wynn; sisters, Janine C. Williams, Teri J. Stockner and Kim E. (Dale P.) Wright.

EQUINE IN MEMORIAM

Cocktails Anyone

Three-time Washington champion distaffer Cocktails Anyone, 24, passed away on December 21, 2017. Bred and owned by Washington Racing Hall of Fame breeders Guy and Barbara Roberts, she was foaled on April 5, 1993, at their Guy Bar Farm in Sunnyside.

Cocktails Anyone made her racing debut – and only start as a two-year-old – at Yakima Meadows where she finished a close second to future stakes winner Cielo Otono in a maiden special weight.

At three, the daughter of Guy Bar Farm stallion Petersburg won her first out, a maiden allowance at Emerald Downs, by 5 1/2 lengths. In her next outing, the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Handicap, the Tim McCanna trainee finished second. In her final two starts of the year, Cocktails Anyone finished with a first and a second in allowance company at the Auburn track.

Her four-year-old debut came in a \$50,000 claiming race at Emerald where she defeated 1995 Washington champion two-year-old filly Candles n Moonlite.

Three weeks later she had her first meeting with a certain California buzz saw – Ropersandwranglers – and finished third to the future Washington Racing Hall of Famer in the Ingenue Handicap. After finishing in the top three in a trio of \$50,000 Emerald claimers, whose fields read more like stakes races, Cocktails Anyone was sent to the barn of Michael Puhich at Del Mar and promptly won an allowance. Cocktails Anyone ended her 1997 campaign with a 3-1-2 record and \$51,885 in earnings, and earned her first Washington champion older mare title.

Back once more at Emerald Downs, Cocktails Anyone's first start of the 1998 season was in the Mountain View Stakes, where she again ran third behind the speedy Ropersandwranglers. After finishing back-to-back seconds to that same rival in the Auburn and Boeing handicaps, Cocktails Anyone rebounded once more at Del Mar with a gate-to-wire victory in an \$80,000 optional claiming (N) race, which she won by three lengths.

She then finished second in both the Mae de Vol Sprint and Charles H. Russell handicaps at Bay Meadows. Sent to Golden Gate Fields, the Guy Bar mare impressively won the six-furlong Powder Room Handicap by seven lengths. She ended her 1998 campaign with a second in the Orinda Handicap in December. With a campaign that included seven stakes wins or placements from ten starts and with \$125,045 in earnings, Cocktails Anyone was again voted champion older filly or mare and added the state sprint title as well.

In the talented mare's final season of racing, Cocktails Anyone's five races included a tally in the Vacaville Handicap at

Solano, a second to Washington champion Fleet Pacific in the Auburn Handicap at Emerald Downs and a third in the Golden State Lassie Stakes at Sacramento, in what would be her final outing.

In her 28 starts spent over five seasons at the track, Cocktails Anyone sported an 8-10-4 record – all in sprints – and earned \$242,545.

Cocktails Anyone was a half-sister stakes-placed runners Champaign Avenue, Tall Press and Bar Boy, all offspring of the Princely Native mare Cocktail Talk. Other prominent runners from this immediate female family include Grade 2 Belmont Park stakes winner and Washington champion Zama Hummer, 1984 Washington champion and Joe Gottstein Futurity winner Table Express, and additional Longacres stakes winners Speech Test, Soft Refrain, Delta Echo and Press to Test.

Cocktails Anyone would produce five named Thoroughbred foals, four of which would become winners. Her leading earners were the twice stakes-placed Siberian Summer gelding Siberian Cocktail, who won eight races and earned \$102,824; and minor Emerald Downs stakes winner Free Cocktails, a gelded son of Free House who won nine races and earned \$77,871.

Her final three named foals were offspring of Quarter Horse stallions. Her 2009 son Smr Bronte, by Brimmerton, won seven of his 18 starts, ran second in the Covered Bridges Stakes (G3) and had earnings of \$63,995. In 2010 and 2011 she foaled fillies by the palomino Quarter Horse Frenchman's Falcon, neither of which started. Her 2011 daughter, French Twizzler, is owned by the Roberts' daughter and son-in-law Cindy and Charlie Hocter.

Mula Gula

Steven Gula's four-time stakes winner and Grade 1-placed stallion Mula Gula died at Midas Hill Farm in Bryan, Texas, on March 3, 2018.

Originally purchased by Halvorson Bloodstock Services Inc., as agent, for \$6,000 on Gula's behalf as a weanling at the 1996 Kentucky Fasig-Tipton Kentucky sale, the son of 1992 Kentucky Derby (G1) winner Lil E. Tee was bred by former WTBOA board member Jim Plemmons at his Old Frankfort Stud in Kentucky.

The bay colt began his racing career at Emerald Downs in the summer of 1998, where the Steve Bullock-trained runner broke his maiden in the WTBOA Lads Stakes. In his next start Mula Gula finished second to Vino Rossi in the \$100,000 Gottstein Futurity.

At three, he returned to the races in California under the care of future Hall of Fame trainer Jerry Hollendorfer, where he finished second to Red Sky's in the \$125,000 California Derby.

Next, in his first graded attempt, Mula Gula ran fourth in the Affirmed Handicap (G3) at Hollywood Park. Sent to Del Mar, Gula's runner won the Oceanside Stakes. Mula Gula also won the \$150,000 Bay Meadows Breeders' Cup Derby (G3).

In what would be his most important victory, Mula Gula won the \$250,000 Oak Tree Derby (G2). He was ranked at 113 pounds on the Experimental Free Handicap for three-year-old turf runners.

Though Mula Gula didn't win at four, his memorable season – all in graded races – included seconds in the Grade 2 Winnercomm Handicap at Churchill Downs, where he was beaten a head, and in Arlington Park's Washington Park Handicap. Then, in his only Grade 1 appearance, Gula's colt ran third in the \$2-million Arlington Million.

In his 19 starts before retiring to stud at El Dorado Farms in 2001, Mula Gula had a 5-5-3 record with \$684,070 in earnings and an SSI of 15.55. In the summer of 2002 Mula Gula was moved to Plemmons' Old Frankfort Stud in Kentucky and later to Texas.

Mula Gula was the only foal produced out of the Ascot Knight mare Night Tan, a half-sister to stakes winner and Grade 1-placed Erin's Word, before she was exported to Thailand.

In his 13 small crops Mula Gula sired 43 foals, including two yearlings of 2018, of which 36 started and 30 won. They had total earnings of \$707,921, of which \$154,853 came from his top earner Mula Gold, a 2004 Kentucky-bred mare.

Noosito

2014 Washington champion Noosito passed away unexpectedly on January 25, 2018, just a week shy of two years after the death of his champion brother Music of My Soul. Ken Alhadeff had raced two-time champion and Gottstein Futurity winner Music of My Soul in the name of his family's historic Eltaes Stable. Upon the death of Music of My Soul, Noosito was purchased by Alhadeff in order to give the handsome dark horse the chance at stud that his brother never had.

One of three champion brothers from the cross of Oregon leading sire Harbor the Gold to Washington broodmare of the year Julia Rose, Noosito – the youngest of the threesome – won four stakes at Emerald Downs and placed in six others from his 17 starts from 2013-16. The eventual \$199,955 earner was named 2014 Washington champion three-year-old colt during a season in which he won the Seattle Slew and Auburn handicaps and Chinook Pass Stakes while racing for Last Rose Stable.

He was affectionately named Noosito ("Little Noosa") in honor of his two-time Washington horse of the year brother Noosa Beach, a gelding who earned \$524,472 and seven state champion titles.

All three of the champion siblings were trained by Doris Harwood, who with her husband Jeff bred both Noosa Beach – as well as racing him – and their dam Julia Rose, a daughter of Basket Weave.

Noosito's only crop of foals will be born this spring. Music of My Soul's single crop of foals arrives at the races in 2018. Both Noosito and Music of My Soul stood at El Dorado Farms. ■

***WTBOA Sales Incentive Program (SIP)**

Beginning with the 2015 WTBOA Sale, all yearlings and weanlings that go through the sales ring and are made fully eligible will earn a lucrative bonus if they break their maiden at Emerald Downs at **age two or three** in one of **two levels of racing**.

- **\$2,500 SIP Owners' Incentive Bonus** if a SIP-eligible horse wins its first race in a maiden special weight, allowance or stakes race.
- **\$1,000 SIP Owners' Incentive Bonus** if a SIP-eligible horse wins its first race in a maiden \$25,000 or more claiming race.**

A two-part process funds the SIP and is required to make the horse fully eligible:

- (1) Consignors – who must be current WTBOA members in order to consign a horse to the sale – will automatically contribute \$50 to make each yearling or weanling in their consignment provisionally eligible for the incentive program.
- (2) Buyers will then be offered the opportunity to make their purchase fully eligible by paying an additional fee. All buyers who wish to participate in the Sales Incentive Program must be WTBOA members in good standing for the year that the horse will be racing.
 - For current WTBOA members, the final SIP eligibility fee is \$50 per horse.
 - Non-WTBOA members will pay a \$180 fee (includes \$50 SIP fee and \$130 WTBOA “early bird” membership fee good for the year of purchase through the following calendar year) for the first yearling or weanling, but only a \$50 SIP fee for each additional yearling or weanling.
- (3) Should a SIP-eligible horse change hands prior to breaking its maiden, the new owner must be a current WTBOA member during the year the horse wins an eligible SIP race (either at two or three), payable by opening day of the race year.

***In a \$22,500/\$25,000 maiden claiming race, the horse must be entered at the \$25,000 level to qualify for the \$1,000 bonus.*

****WTBOA Homebred Incentive Program (WHIP)**

Beginning with the 2016 season, a one-time **Owner's Incentive Bonus of \$1,000** will be awarded when a horse breaks its maiden at Emerald Downs. **Two-year-olds** and **three-year-olds** are eligible for the bonus.

- Payment goes to the owner of the horse at the time that the horse breaks it maiden.
- The payment is made by the WTBOA within 30 days of the win.
- The horse must break its maiden at Emerald Downs.
- The horse must be a Washington-bred.
- The horse must *not* have gone through any sale (either sold or RNA).
- The horse must break its maiden at the \$25,000 level or better.
- The owner(s) must be members of the WTBOA by Emerald Downs' opening day of the year in which the bonus is paid. A horse that is managed by a member will also receive the award. For instance, if a racing partnership or syndicate owns the horse, as long as the person who manages the entity is a member, they will receive the bonus.
- The owner of the horse does not have to be the breeder of the horse.
