

Washington's unbeaten 2018 champion juvenile, Baja Sur continued where he left off with a gate-to-wire five-length tally in Emerald Downs' six-furlong Auburn Stakes on May 19. He followed that sharp win with a 1 1/2-length score, while going a half-furlong longer, in the Cocoa-Cola Stakes on June 16 at the Auburn oval.

It would be nearly four months before Baja Sur would make his next start, and his first start in California and away his Emerald Downs base, in the \$100,000 Harris Farms Stakes, which was run on October 5 during the Fresno fair meet. The six-panel race, carded for California-bred and/or -sired three-year-olds and up, drew a field of six with four-year-old Fashionably Fast the \$1.60-to-one favorite. Baja Sur and Touching Rainbows went off as the second choices at two-to-five. Fashionably Fast, who was bred and is co-owned by Harris Farms, rallied to take home the winner's share with Baja Sur three-quarters of a length behind him in second. Fashionably Fast would follow that win with stakes victories at Del Mar and Santa Anita.

Baja Sur made his final start of the year in the Oakland Stakes at Golden Gate Fields on November 16. Again, Baja Sur would be facing older runners, but in an unrestricted sprint. The second betting choice in the field of seven, Baja Sur drew off to "close with authority and win going away" by 4 1/4 lengths.

The 2017 WTBOA Summer Sale topper stems from a strong female line that also includes 2019 Washington-bred sophomore stakes winner Makah Lane.

Baja Sur is one of a dozen stakes winners for his Grade 1-winning sire Smiling Tiger, California's first, second and third crop leading sire (2017-19). A son of European champion two-year-old Hold That Tiger, Smiling Tiger has so far sired the earners of over \$5.6-million and seven other stakes-placed runners. He stands the 2020 breeding season for a \$7,500 fee at Harris Farms in Coalinga, California.

Both the Maryanskis and the Schneiders like to spend time in Mexico and the name Baja Sur refers to the small Mexican State of Baja California Sur. It is the second smallest Mexican state by population and the 31st admitted state of the 31 states that, along with the Federal District, make up the 32 Federal Entities of Mexico.

2004 Washington horse of the year and champion older horse Demon Warlock (who was raced during his championship season by Tim Floyd, his father Allen Floyd and Jim Nist) became the third runner of that stature to sire a Washington champion when his talented daughter Alittlelesstalk was named 2019 champion state sophomore filly.

The other two were 1960-61 horse of the year Sparrow Castle, who sired 1970 champion three-year-old filly Reminiscent, and 1980-81 horse of the year Trooper Seven, who sired 1989 champion older filly Spring Trooper.

There have been a few other Washington champions who went on to sire other Washington champions, most significantly Knights Choice - who sired 1985 horse of the year Hilco Scamper and 1986 horse of the year Delicate Vine (both multiple graded stakes winners) among his many state champions. Also, state champions Blue Serenade, Colonel Stevens and Sharper One each went on to sire a Washington champion.

It should be noted that in the last 70 years, counting 2019, 62 individuals have been named horse of the year, and of those at least 30 were geldings, while 15 were fillies or mares.

Demon Warlock is one of 18 stakes winners sired by 1987 Arkansas Derby (G1) winner Demons Begone. A \$609,944 multiple stakes-winning son of classic winner Elocutionist, Demons Begone began his stud career at Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky, before moving to El Dorado Farms LLC in 1996. Before his death on July 4, 2001, Demons Begone also sired 2000 Washington champion two-year-old filly Best Judgement.

After winning a \$10,000 maiden claiming race at Emerald Downs at two, Alittlelesstalk made her sophomore debut with a close second in a \$15,000 waiver claiming race at the Auburn track in April. Next up was the Seattle Stakes, where Alittlelesstalk was runner-up to Mucho Amor. The Demon Warlock filly next rolled to nearly sixlength win in an allowance/\$30,000 optional (N) claimer.

In June, Alittlelesstalk scored a neck win over rival Mucho Amor in the Kent Stakes and then, after a fifth-place finish in the Irish Day Stakes, her connections opted to take on the colts in the open Muckleshoot Derby where she outfinished all but fellow Washingtonbred My Grandpa.

Alittlelesstalk capped off her Emerald season with a half-length victory in the restricted WA Cup Sophomore Filly Stakes.

nraced at two, Grinder Sparksaglo made his racing debut at three at Emerald Downs where he was a six-length winner of a maiden/\$25,000 optional claiming race in August. He followed that with a victory in an allowance/\$40,000 optional (N) claimer before heading to Portland Meadows where he won the Stallion Stakes and ran third in the Frog Lake Handicap.

At four, Grinder Sparksaglo won another allowance/\$40,000 optional claimer at Emerald and finished third in Portland Meadows' Mt. Hood Stakes. He also ran fourth in the Chinook Pass Stakes that season.

At five, the runner once again returned to Emerald Downs for the spring and summer and was runner-up to multiple champion Stryker Phd in the WA Cup Muckleshoot Tribal Classic.

Grinder Sparksaglo's second stakes win came in the September running of Portland Meadow's Inaugural Handicap, which was followed by three stakes seconds in the Mt. Hood, Crater Lake and Portland Mile handicaps.

After again summering in Washington the now six-year-old runner travelled south to take a trio of Portland stakes: Inaugural, Flying Huey and Mt. Hood handicaps.

Then in January 2018, Grinder Sparksaglo scored back-to-back stakes wins in the Oregon HBPA handicap and – in the richest race of his career – the \$25,000 Portland Mile. His third win of the year was in an allowance/\$32,000 optional claimer in which he defeated six other past or future stakes winners in the field of eight talented geldings. The Grindstone gelding also ran third in the Inaugural Handicap in November.

The whole of Grinder Sparksaglo's champion season was spent at Emerald Downs where the now eight-year-old runner won two allowance/\$30,000 optional claiming races, once for a tag. Grinder Sparksaglo's best stakes finish of the year was in the Governor's Stakes behind winner Anyportinastorm and Oh Marvelous Me (who finished just a head in front of the champion in the six-panel race).

Grinder Sparksaglo joins the 11 Oregon champions sired by 1996 Kentucky Derby (G1) winner Grindstone, who also sired ten graded stakes winners – led by classic winner Birdstone – before the stallion moved from Kentucky to Oakhurst Thoroughbreds in Oregon in the fall of 2009.

Grinder Sparksaglo is the second and final foal produced out of Cule Flyer, whose lone victory came as a three-year-old at Emerald Downs in a \$7,500 maiden claimer, which she won by 2 1/2 lengths.

Cule Flyer is one of four winners produced out of triple Yakima Meadows stakes winner Flyer Aglo, whose dam Sparkle Aglo won the 1988 Grants Pass Thoroughbred Futurity in her first outing.

The "aglo" name addition has proved to be a lucky charm in this female line, with three stakes winners and \$41,039 earner Angel Aglo, among the four carrying the suffix.

o Talking Back became a fourth generation Washington champion distaffer after her exemplary season that saw her take a trio of stakes wins at Emerald Downs.

Placed at two and three – including a second to champion Risque's Legacy in the WA Cup Two Year Old Filly Stakes – No Talking Back easily won her first start at four by five lengths. That marked the first of two consecutive allowance/\$32,000 optional (N) claiming wins for the dark bay filly who then placed in three consecutive Emerald Downs stakes (Washington State Legislators and Boeing stakes and Emerald Distaff Handicap). One Horse Will Do Corporation and Steve Shimizu's talented miss finished the year with a 2 1/4-length triumph in the mile Fan Appreciation Day Stakes.

In 2019, after three unsuccessful attempts at sprint distances, No Talking Back blossomed at five to win her final three outings of the year: the 1 1/16-mile Boeing Stakes (by three-quarters of a length), the 1 1/8-mile Emerald Distaff Handicap (by one-length) and the 1 1/16-mile WA Cup Filly and Mare Stakes (by three-quarters of a length).

Her granddam Infernal McGoon also earned her championship as an older filly when she won both the Emerald Breeders' Cup Distaff Handicap and Belle Roberts Stakes as a four-year-old. No Talking Back's dam, Talk to My Lawyer, and third dam, Flame McGoon, earned their championship seasons for their prowess as juveniles.

Jody Peetz, who races under One Horse Will Do Corporation, also campaigned both Infernal McGoon and Talk to My Lawyer.

Infernal McGoon is currently owned by former Montana State Senator Dale Mahlum who has bred Infernal McGoon's last nine foals, including Talk to My Lawyer and two-time Emerald Downs stakes winner Ima Happy Cat. The five-year-old California-bred daughter of Smiling Tiger added an allowance win at Golden Gate Fields on February 8 and was second in an allowance test on March 22 at the Albany track to push her earnings to \$221,038.

No Talking Back is the first of only two foals produced out of 2011 Gottstein Futurity winner Talk to My Lawyer, who unfortunately died soon after producing her second foal, an unraced 2015 gelding by Harbor the Gold.

No Talking Back is one of 56 black-type winners sired by Claiborne Farm's A. P. Indy stallion Flatter, who is standing the 2020 breeding season for a \$40,000 fee. Although only being Grade 2-placed himself, Flatter is a full brother to Grade 2 winner and successful sire Congrats. As Flatter stems for the bluest of Blue Hens, *La Troienne, the number of top runners and sires in his female line is staggering.

Flatter is also the sire of 2017 three-year-old Eclipse Award winner West Coast, 2018 Canadian champion juvenile colt Avie's Flatter and at least 17 other graded stakes winners. Flatter entered stud in 2004 and his 958 progeny (three and up) have earned over \$71.3-million through the end of March 2020.

anwja Elison's Unmachable is another Washington champion who stems from a strong line of state honorees. His dam Point of Reference earned champion older filly or mare honors in 2011, the year she won the California State Fair Sprint Handicap at Sacramento and the Harvest Handicap at Fresno for Unmachable's breeders, brothers Jack and Ivor Jones.

While Unmachable's second dam It's Stevie Time was only a three-race winner, her dam, the classy and durable Run Away Stevie (who also raced for the Jones brothers), was a Washington champion at two and again at six. A successful stakes horse at both Longacres and in Northern California, Run Away Stevie won nine stakes and placed in an additional 13 stakes from her 40 starts. The talented daughter of three-time leading Washington sire Table Run retired after six seasons of racing with \$468,267 in earnings and a 9.92 SSI.

Purchased privately by Elison, Unmachable made his race debut in the September 8, \$50,000 WA Cup Juvenile Colts and Geldings Stakes, going off at \$10.60-to-one in the ten-horse field. He took the 6 1/2-furlong race by 1 1/4 lengths.

For his second start he faced a full field of 11 others in the 82nd running of the \$100,000 Gottstein Futurity. The co-second betting favorite (with future filly champion Windy Point) at \$3.70-to-one, Unmachable defeated all but Kentucky-bred Race Day in the 1 1/16-mile race, which was run on Emerald Downs closing day of the meet.

Sent south to Turf Paradise, Unmachable made one more start before being turned out for the winter. Run on December 28, a field of seven went forward for the \$30,000 Lost in the Fog Stakes. Arizona Jeremy won the about 6 1/2 -furlong stakes by two lengths with Race Day and Unmachable fighting it out for second and third. Race Day prevailed over his Emerald rival. but by only a neck.

Unmachable is a son of 2000 Eclipse Award juvenile colt Macho Uno, a gray stallion sired by 1994 Horse of the Year Holy Bull, who was also a gray. Both Macho Uno and his half-brother, "elite" racehorse and sire Awesome Again, are out of 2000 Kentucky broodmare of the year Primal Force.

Among Macho Uno's best runners are three Panama champions – led by Cigar Handicap (G1) winner Private Zone – and \$5.6-million earner Mucho Macho Man, who is the sire of 2020 Pegasus World Cup (G1) winner Mucho Gusto. Macho Uno is also the sire of Grade 1 winners Macho Again and Wicked Style

Macho Uno, who went to stud in 2004, stands at Adena Springs in Paris, Kentucky, where his 2020 fee is \$10,000.

indy Point was bred and is raced by Jean Harris and her son Jeff Harris in the name of their Clemans View Racing with partner and Yakima veterinarian Michelle Beaunaux. Clemans View Farm also bred 2016 Washington champion sprinter Kaabraai.

Windy Point began her racing career in June with a 2 1/2-length tally in her first outing, a 4 1/2-furlong maiden special weight race at Emerald Downs. The Coast Guard filly next finished second in the 5 1/2-furlong Angie C. Stakes - behind For You Only - and was also runner-up behind Kentucky-bred Cakewalk in the six-panel Barbara Shinpoch Stakes.

The restricted WA Cup Juvenile Filly Stakes is the final two-yearold distaff stakes of the Emerald meet. A field of ten drew into the 6 1/2-furlong race with Windy Point going off as the \$1.70-to-one favorite. With Juan Gutierrez aboard, Windy Point led from start to finish to earn her first stakes victory, drawing off by 3 1/2 lengths with "complete authority."

In her final race of the season, Windy Point was eased after leading for the first half-mile in the 1 1/16-mile Gottstein Futurity.

Windy Point is the second state champion sired by El Dorado Farms' Grade 1-placed Coast Guard, following 2016 juvenile male So Lucky. Coast Guard also sired three other juvenile stakes horses in 2019, led by King County Express Stakes winner Show Me the Mints.

Windy Point is the first winner from the first three foals produced out of twice Northern California stakes-placed Windy Sails, a daughter of fellow El Dorado Farms stallion Private Gold. Both Windy Point and Windy Sails were raced by Billie Klokstad and Helen Sherry and trained by Billie's Washington Racing Hall of Fame husband Bud Klokstad. Windy Sails' granddam, Shuggleswon, had finished second in the Grade 3 Monrovia Handicap for fellow Washingtonians Al and Sandee Kirkwood, who had purchased the future \$163,367 earner for \$20,000 from the 1991 Keeneland September Yearling Sale.

Windy Point's fifth dam Lady Christian, by *Forli, was a full sister to Grade 2 winner Forlana and Grade 3 winner McCann and a half-sister to stakes winner and \$497.140 earner Blade of the Ball.

Tusi Bella, the stakes-winning dam of Lady Christian, was one of four stakes winners out the *Nizami II mare Paula, dam of 1966 Blue Grass Stakes winner Abe's Hope and Hawthorne Derby (G3) winner Winter Fox. But probably the most famous of Paula's foals was Bee Bee Bee, who foiled Riva Ridge's chance for a Triple Crown when he won the 1972 Preakness Stakes in the mud to become William S. Farish's first classic winner. Abe's Hope, Tusi Bella and Bee Bee Bee were all sired by the Reigh Count grandson Better Bee.

n 2019, Lode the Gold was one of only three Washington-breds who won six or more races. In February he won two races at Turf Paradise, for a \$3,000 price, while trained by Elizar Salas. In May Lode the Gold was turned over to Dawson LaVanway and the runner won four in a row at Albuquerque in July and August with wins in \$6,250 (two) and \$15,000 claimers and a conditioned allowance. Lode the Gold also took five runner-up spots in his final ten races of the year while running at Albuquerque, Zia Park and Turf Paradise.

On March 3, 2020, Lode the Gold won for the eleventh time lifetime after the now six-year-old gelding took an \$8,500 claiming race at Turf Paradise by 2 1/2 lengths.

Lode the Gold is a half-brother to \$114,932 earner Royal Moses, a 2009 daughter of Cahill Road who placed in six Emerald Downs stakes for Squatting Dog Stable and Rusty Warwick.

A now \$91,239 earner, Lode the Gold, a son of 11-time leading Oregon sire Harbor the Gold, is a full brother to winners Notdabossame and Pearl Ofthe Harbor, a three-race winner who had two scores last year at Arapahoe Park and Sweetwater Downs.

All four winners are out of two-race winner Miss Wagon Lode, who took an allowance at Prairie Meadows by six lengths as a three-year-old. Miss Wagon Lode is one of nine winners out of Kaaaching, dam of 2016 Washington champion sprinter Kaabraaj and \$247,290 stakes winner Follow the Lite.

Back at Emerald Downs at three, she ran second in an allowance/\$25,000 optional claiming race (N) and then finished third behind Ima Happy Cat and Bella Mia in the Seattle Stakes. Brilliant Bird's first win of the season was a 6 1/2-length tally in an August allowance/\$32,000 optional claimer (N). She was also runner-up to Dontkissntell in the WA Cup Sophomore Filly Stakes.

At four, Brilliant Bird was dropped into a \$15,000 claiming race, which she won, and was claimed. In her next race she won for a \$25,000 tag for Jenny Fernandez. Brilliant Bird finished her year by running second in the Horsemen Appreciation Stakes over Emerald's closing weekend. Sent to Grants Pass, Brilliant Bird ran second in the TMB Girls Stakes and finished 2019 with a 6 3/4-length win in the Grants Pass Distaff Stakes.

On March 1, Brilliant Bird added her seventh victory in a Golden Gate Fields allowance/\$25,000 optional claiming race. The win increased her earnings to \$110,462.

Brilliant Bird is the first winner bred by Bret Christopherson, son of Bar C Racing Stables' Neal and Pam Christopherson.

Back to Wine is one special and accomplished horse. For the fourth consecutive year, Christina Klein's former winning racehorse has been named the top Washington-bred off-the-track Thoroughbred (OTTB) by The Jockey Club Thoroughbred Incentive Program (TIP) points.

Back to Wine's illustrious career has come in a wide variety of disciplines. Last year, he was named top overall Western horse after being named grand champion in the Games, Trail and Other divisions and reserve champion in both Western Pleasure and Ranch Riding. The chestnut gelding also finished as reserve champion horse in the Equitation West division. Their varied schedule saw the Yakima duo named champions in the Leadline/Costume division and earn first place in Halter/In Hand. Both of those titles came in the General category, where Back to Wine ranked second overall. In the English Pleasure category. Back to Wine and Klein were the champions in the West division.

In her award acceptance speech, Klein said, "The Thoroughbred – they will run their heart out to hear us cheer and then do the same in a second career with the same willingness, loyalty, determination, sensitivity and unquestionable smarts. The Thoroughbred reaches down to give all with a big strong heart ... In a world of Quarter Horses, Arabs and Painted ponies, I choose the Thoroughbred to be my all-around ride.

"Back to Wine shows kindness to keep me safe and enthusiasm to learn any new task that I may ask of him. Back to Wine and myself may not be the best at everything we try, but we go out and give our all, showing that the Thoroughbred can be accomplished both on and off the track."

Finishing in second place by 2019 TIP points was Winter Knight with 1,042 points. Shown under the name Maei Platinum Star by Khilia Giacobone of Sandston, Virginia, Winter Knight (2015, gelding, Harbor the Gold—Silver City Lilly, by Tiffany Ice) was bred by Bar C Racing Stable and won one race and \$16,843 while racing at Emerald Downs for Q Stable and trainer Bonnie Jenne.

Lucky Tiger (2013 gelding, Rallying Cry—Jillybell, by Peterhof) finished in third place. He earned 515 TIP points for Kate Sharkey of Snohomish. Lucky Tiger was bred by Wilwin Stable and Allaire Farms. Also racing at Emerald Downs, he won one race for Look West Racing and one for JMSO Race Stable with a \$21,280 total while being trained by Bob Meeking.

red by Tommy Town Thoroughbreds LLC in California, Trainingat the Bar began her race career running for the Santa Ynez nursery in late December as a two-year-old at Golden Gate Fields. Then in January, the bay filly broke her maiden in her next start, a \$12,500 maiden claimer (six furlongs) that she drew away to take by four lengths. Next sent to Bay Meadows, she won a 1 1/16-mile, \$12,5000 claiming event by 4 1/2 lengths. Upped to a \$16,000 tag, Training the Bar finished second in that 1 1/16-mile race and was claimed by trainer John F. and Jennifer Martin. Spiked to \$20,000, while going 7 1/2 furlongs, Training the Bar had her third win and was claimed by trainer Ed Moger Jr. on behalf of Scott Gruender. After she finished out of the money in a mile turf race, which had been carded as an allowance/\$32,000 optional claimer (N), Training at the Bar made her first appearance at Emerald Downs, taking a \$3,500 claiming race by nearly eight lengths while tackling the six-furlong race for Gruender's Horseplayers Racing Club and new partner, Tim Floyd's Warlock Stables. Her final win came in a 1 1/16-mile Emerald starter allowance, which she won by 2 1/2 lengths "going away." Sent to Turf Paradise later that fall, she was unplaced in her two starts and retired.

Trainingat the Bar was sired by Valid Wager, a son of Valid Appeal who won the Grade 2 Hutcheson Stakes over Mr. Greeley. A foal of 1992, Valid Wager raced as a homebred for Harry Mangurian Jr. and was retired to Mangurian's Florida-based Mockingbird Farm. In 2001, Valid Wager was moved across county to Tommy Town Thoroughbreds, where he stood until his death from cancer in 2007.

Trainingat the Bar produced her first foal, and stakes winner, Redsolocup, in 2011. At four, the gelded son of 2004 Washington horse of the year Demon Warlock would win the Chinook Pass Stakes at Emerald Downs at nearly 24-to-one odds and later run third in Turf Paradise's Luke Kruytbosh Stakes.

After two missed years, Trainingat the Bar produced her second stakes winner, also by Demon Warlock. Oregon-bred Lovethisbar placed in two stakes at Portland Meadows at two. At five she added a victory in the Donna Jensen Memorial Handicap in the Rose City track's final 2018-19 season of racing.

Bred to California-based Vronsky, Trainingat the Bar produced Oldtoytrain, who would be stakes-placed at Turf Paradise at both two and three.

In 2016, she foaled her best runner to date, 2019 Washington champion sophomore filly Alittlelesstalk, who was also sired by Demon Warlock. Alittlelesstalk won or was runner-up in four Emerald Downs stakes last year.

Trainingat the Bar produced her fourth foal by Demon Warlock in 2017. Alotmoreaction finished unplaced in her only start at two, but appeared on the Emerald Downs workout tab on March 5, breezing the best of 25 runners going three furlongs.

Trainingat the Bar foaled a colt by Pontiff on April 8, 2020, in Kentucky. Plans are for her to be covered by 2012 Florida Derby (G1) winner Take Charge Indy, who stands at WinStar Farm LLC for a \$17,500 fee.

ATTA BOY ROY

El Dorado Farms Sire of the Year

Stands Property of Atta Boy Roy Syndicate at Blue Ribbon Farm

ultiple Washington champion racehorse Atta Boy Roy has now led one of the state sire ranks since his first foals reached the races. He was the state's leading freshman sire (third leading juvenile sire) in 2016 and top second crop and leading juvenile sire (second on general sire lists) in 2017. In 2018, not only did Atta Boy Roy lead all third crop sires, but he topped the overall Washington ranks with \$481,540 and was the third leading juvenile sire.

Last year the Blue Ribbon Farm stallion topped the general rankings for the second year in a row when his runners earned \$640,623. His leading runner for the past three years has been Minnesota champion Mr. Jagermeister. That same runner, who is trained by Valorie Lund (who guided Atta Boy

Roy through his highly successful racing career) has propelled Atta Boy Roy to the early lead in the 2020 sire ranks. As of March 9, Mr. Jagermeister has earned \$78,668 of his sire's \$96,064 total, which includes a stakes win at Turf Paradise and a runner-up in the \$150,000

Among Atta Boy Roy's other 2019 stakes horses were Oregon champion three-year-old filly She Flys Forever, WA Cup Sophomore winner Makah Lane and juvenile Rumpleminx, a California-bred full sister to Mr. Jagermeister that ran third in the Prairie Gold Lassie Stakes at Prairie Meadows. Mr. Jagermeister's top two 2019 placings were victories in the Chesapeake Stakes at Colonial Downs and the Minnesota Sprint Championship at Canterbury Park. Both were \$100,000 events.

Atta Boy Roy also was third on the 2019 juvenile list.

Hot Springs Stakes at Oaklawn Park.

Ranking second on the 2019 general sire list was El Dorado Farms' Coast Guard with \$482,675. Coast Guard also ranked second on the juvenile list with \$160,105 and led the sires of turf runners with \$89,465. Among Coast Guard's six stakes horses were 2019 Washington champion two-year-old filly Windy Point, juvenile stakes winner Show Me the Mints and two others that placed in two-year-old stakes -Brett and You Go Girl. His leading turf horse was Mystic Lake Turf Spring Stakes winner Satellite Storm, also trained by Lund. Another runner, Trump Itz, was runner-up in the Muckleshoot Tribal Classic Stakes.

Finishing third on the general list (\$319,406), but leading all two-year-old sires (\$217,005) was another El Dorado Farms stallion. Abraaj had three juvenile stakes horses: Angie C. Stakes winner For You Only, Ascot Graduation Stakes winner Capilano Canyon and WTBOA Lads third Wilson to Lockett. Another of his runners, Carson's Fireball, placed in three Alberta stakes.

West Coast Training Center's Gotham City finished fourth on the general sire list with \$198,671 and led all sires in the all-weather track category with \$56,088.

Unfortunately, both Abraaj and Gotham City passed away in 2019.

Rounding out the top five on the general list was former seven-time leading Washington sire Parker's Storm Cat with \$170,373. The now 20-year-old pensioned Gibson Thoroughbred Farm stallion had five stakes horses last year led by TMB Girls Stakes winner Parkers Rose.

avid Thorner, the 22nd recipient of the S. J. Agnew Award since the award's inception in 1980, was born and raised in Southern California. After graduating magna cum laude from The College of Idaho in 1969, he attended the University of Washington Law School. After graduating and passing the bar in 1972, David and his wife Sophie moved to Yakima.

In 1977, David, Jim Kennedy and Wade Gano started the law firm of Thorner, Kennedy & Gano P.S. which continues today.

David's interest in Thoroughbreds began in 1973, while he was serving with the US Army at Fort Benjamin Harrison in Indiana. The couple made a fateful trip to nearby Churchill Downs and were present when the great Secretariat won the Kentucky Derby.

Later, while Sophie worked at the Yakima Meadows Turf Club as a cashier/ticket seller, she met Robert Mead. Bob owned a small chain of grocery stores in Eastern Washington and dabbled in racing. His big horse was Washington champion Crafty Native. In 1982, Bob offered David a breeding to Crafty Native, if he would purchase a mare at the WTBOA Winter Mixed Sale at Longacres. David successfully bid on Ebony Spirit, a five-year-old mare by Barbaric Spirit. Ebony Spirit produced three winners for the Thorners, two by Crafty Native, including their first winner, Crafty Connection. David was hooked.

The couple's first homebred stakes winner was 1994 Ingenue Stakes winner Ms Phantom Slew, who they raced with trainer Larry Wolf. More recently the Thorners bred and raced 2015-16 Emerald Downs top two and three-year-old filly Princess Kennedy, who won the Barbara Shinpoch Stakes and the Washington Oaks, and her stakes-placed half-sisters Afleet Hope and Lady Campbell, all trained by Tom Wenzel.

David and Sophie have been WTBOA members since 1983. David served on the WTBOA Board of Trustees from 2001 through 2007. During that stint, David led the association as president from 2004 through 2007. David also served on Washington HBPA Board, WTBOA Horsemen's Short Course Committee and as a member of the NTRA.

In 2000, David was pivotal in successfully helping to return Breeders' Awards to breeders after the final 1998 Yakima Meadows meet. Sophie and David have two sons, Michael, who is a partner in the law firm, and Daniel, who is a urologist in Yakima. They also have "five terrific grandchildren."

JOHN & JANENE MARYANSKI and GERALD & GAIL SCHNEIDER

NTRA Leading Owners

ongtime friends and former business associates John and Janene Maryanski and Gerry and Gail Schneider's home addresses are about 15 minutes apart, which is probably handy since they all share passions for horse racing, travel, golf and fishing.

They first met some 30 years ago when the Maryanskis' JJ Plumbing provided services for the Schneiders' Schneider Family Homes.

Today, the couples both have condos in Mexico (though that will soon change with the completion of the Schneiders' new house) where John and Gerry compete in fishing tournaments, and all enjoy the sun and spending time on the Schneiders' boat.

They all also share a passion for horse racing and last year the Maryanskis and Schneiders successfully raced two Washington-bred geldings in partnership: horse of the year Baja Sur (see page 8) and stakes-placed Trump Itz. The two runners, both trained by Blaine Wright, together made nine starts in 2019 and had total earnings of \$128,312 to propel them to the top of the 2019 owners of Washington-bred money earners list.

Both runners were acquired through the WTBOA Sales program. Baja Sur, the second leading Washington-bred money earner last year (\$102,150), had three stakes wins and a stakes second among his four outings. The year-older Trump Itz, had five outings with a 1-1-2 record and \$26,162 in earnings. The Coast Guard gelding also placed in his third stakes (second in Muckleshoot Tribal Classic) and upped his lifetime total to \$88,292 with a 4-4-3 record from his 15 total starts.

"We enjoy sharing horse ownership with Gerry and Gail. It makes it so much more fun," said Janene Maryanski. "And our grandkids are also racing fans."

Three two-year-olds join Baja Sur and Trump Itz in the 2020 Mayanski/Schneider stable: La Uno, a filly by Tale of Ekati (who is also co-owned by Wright); Top Executive, a colt by Street Boss; and Colavito, a colt by Smiling Tiger.

Ranking second among owners was newcomer Chad Christensen, who also calls Auburn home. His stable, trained by Frank Lucarelli, made 52 starts and earned \$126,184. His top earner was the 2013 gelding Cross Creek, by Parker's Storm Cat, who won two races and earned \$31,806 in his colors.

The third leading owner by Washington-bred earnings was the California partnership of Tom Acker, Edward J. Brown Jr., Thomas C. Stanford and Corey Smith, whose single Washington-bred, Uno Trouble Maker, won four races and earned \$104,642. The 2015 daughter of Successful Appeal was the leading Washington-bred earner of 2019.

Where We At, a partnership of Jack Fabulich, of Edgewood, and Paul Heist, of Tacoma, ranked fourth courtesy of one runner, the talented two-year-old Pas de Panique, a son of Smiling Tiger who made five starts on the Southern California circuit. After taking a Santa Anita maiden special weight in his second outing, Pas de Panique was awarded second in the \$100,000 Graduation Stakes at Del Mar and finished the year with two fourth-place stakes finishes and earnings of \$89,000.

Todd and Shawn Hansen, of Scatter Creek Racing Stables in Tenino, finished fifth, only \$979 behind Where We At. Their top earner for the year was their homebred Perfect Dude, who won the Auburn Stakes and placed in two other Emerald Downs stakes. Perfect Dude amassed \$48,225 of the Hansen's \$88,021 total. The Hansens also bred the previously mentioned Uno Trouble Maker, but lost her in her second outing, a winning effort in a \$30,000 maiden claiming race at Santa Anita in 2017.

NINA & RON HAGEN

Daily Racing Form Leading Breeders

 $2019\,$ marks the fifth time that Nina and Ron Hagen, owners and managers of the 100-acre-plus El Dorado Farms, have risen to the top of the Washington breeder ranks. The Enumclaw couple also stood at the top in 2008-10 and 2017.

Although they also breed a few runners each year in partnership, the 27 Thoroughbreds bred solely in the Hagen name in 2019 won 21 races and earned \$330,964. Among their top runners, all running at Emerald Downs last year, were two-year-olds For You Only, who took the Angie C. Stakes; Show Me the Mints, winner of the King County Stakes; and twice stakes-placed You Go Girl. Older runner Trump Itz was runner-up in the Muckleshoot Tribal Classic.

The Hagens' leading 2019 earner was San Marcos, who earned his \$45,740 while running at Laurel and Delaware parks,

San Marcos, Show Me the Mints, Trump Itz and You Go Girl are all offspring of the Hagens' good stallion Coast Guard. For You Only's sire Abraaj was also an El Dorado Farm mainstay until his tragic death in May 2019. The Enumclaw stallion station and nursery also stands Private Gold, Raise the Bluff, Gold Rush Dancer – whose first foals arrive this spring – and newcomer Raised a Secret, whose first foals are yearlings in 2020.

In addition, among the other 2019 winners the Hagens bred with others were Wicked Winnings (who recently ran second in 2020 Turf Paradise Derby and was bred with Holly Sturgeon), Fleet Marie (bred with Ron McCormack), Bullet Drill (bred with Larry and Miriam Bonwell) and Tap That Spot (bred with Ron Crockett Inc.).

Finishing second in the breeder standings last year were Rick and Debbie Pabst and their Blue Ribbon Farm, Washington's leading breeders from 2011-14 and again in 2018. The Buckley couple had 26 starters in 2019, which won 17 races and earned \$273,405. Their leading runners for the year were: Runnin'withdadevil (\$42,300 and a Santa Anita maiden special weight winner), six-time winner Das Bear (\$33,661), stakes-placed Suddenly Awesome (\$31,382) and stakes-placed Time 'n Time Again (\$27,580).

In partnership with Patricia Murphy, the Pabsts bred the additional stakes-placed filly Magical Spell and three-time Oaklawn Park allowance-placed Always Enuff (\$45,600).

Finishing third among top Washington breeders was Neal and Pam Christopherson's Bar C Racing Stables with 17 wins among 21 starters who earned \$267,966. The Hermiston, Oregon-based Bar C Racing Stables, who foal the majority of their foals at friends and partners Melodie Bultena and Doak Walker's Desert Rose Racing in Kennewick, had topped the Washington breeders' list in both 2015 and 2016. In 2019 their leading runner was \$38,501 earner Seahawk Wave, who raced at all four of California's major tracks, but is now based at Sam Houston Racetrack in Texas.

Among the Christophersons' winners last year were Hastings Racecourse stakes winner Dr John H and four stakes-placed runners: Turntheclocktozero, Harbors Rule, Somethin'bout Iris and My Chief, all offspring of house stallion Harbor the Gold.

Partners Bar C Racing Stables and Desert Rose Racing LLC also figured high on the year-end list, finishing in eighth place with a \$106,540 gross of which \$89,000 was earned by the juvenile Pas de Panique, who ran second in the Graduation Stakes at Del Mar.

Todd and Shawn Hansen, Scatter Creek Racing Center in Tenino, ranked fourth with \$192,663, which included the earnings of Washington's leading 2019 money earner, Uno Trouble Maker, who had four consecutive wins at Santa Anita and \$102,642 in earnings.

Jack Hodge

Owner, breeder, racetrack executive and industry leader

ack Hodge Jr. has touched nearly all facets of the horse industry, with his numerous achievements earning him a place among the lifetime achievement award winners in the Washington Racing Hall of Fame in 2012. Perhaps his greatest achievement is being involved in the construction of Emerald Downs, which opened in 1996.

"I think that was the most fun, possibly because my background is in real estate," Hodge said. "It's what I'm most proud of."

Now he gets to watch his own homebreds become standout runners over the racecourse he helped design, and where he works as vice president. With four Washington champions earning nine titles to his credit, Hodge has left an indelible mark on the local sport.

A native of Cleveland, Hodge wouldn't be in Washington but for the hand of fate: he met his wife Theresa in San Francisco, but her family was from Washington. "It just stuck," he said of the move to the Evergreen State.

The real estate mogul was and still is involved with the construction of multifamily homes, such as apartment complexes. "I was looking for a sideline to entertain me," Hodge said. "I had sold some major properties in Denver and thought I would take the profit and do something different."

Hodge knew how to read past performances from time spent at racetracks in Ohio as a kid, so it made sense to try when a stockbroker friend, who was claiming horses at Longacres, suggested he buy in on a new claim. That was back in 1980; since then, Hodge runners have earned over \$1.8-million under his Oak Crest Farm banner.

The Horses

"I ended up getting in so deeply that I bought a farm," said Hodge, noting his rapid rise from being the owner of one claiming horse (Mostly Malarkey) to running an entire breeding operation on a 70-acre spread in Enumclaw. In the early 1980s the Hodges acquired the farm from noted Thoroughbred breeder Maurice McGrath, who had bred such stellar state runners as Koko's Pal and Crafty Native under the Takhoma Farm banner.

The stakes winners came quickly though, with the Oak Crest-bred Colonel Stevens winning three races in 1983 en route to being named Washington's champion two-


year-old colt. A year later, he ran third in the Longacres Derby (G3).

In 1985, Hodge got his first stakes win as an owner with Golden Screen, who won the Miss Grillo Stakes at Santa Anita. Washington sprint champion Crystal Run was a graded stakes-placed, stakes winner that raced for Hodge in partnership from 1987 through 1992. Homebred Finally Free won seven of 27 starts and was named Washington's champion older mare in 1988, the same year that the Washington-bred won stakes races in California and Illinois.

In 1990, the Hodges were named the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association's Washington breeders of the year, which was the same season a filly they bred won the first of her four state champion accolades.

Peterhof's Patea

Peterhof's Patea, a gray daughter of Peterhof out of the Hodges' homebred Drone mare Tea At Ten, was sold by the Hodges for \$11,500 at the WTBOA Summer Yearling Sale in 1989. At two, she reeled off wins in the Green River Valley Stakes, Broderick Memorial and Longacres Lassie Stakes before finishing second in the Joe Gottstein

Futurity against males and being named state champion two-year-old filly. She was campaigned by Roger Williams and Patty Strait and trained by Bud Klokstad, and although she won three stakes at Longacres the following year, it wasn't enough to earn a second championship title. Despite nearly dying of pneumonia, Peterhof's Patea rebounded to excel at four and five, winning five of nine starts in 1992 and a title of champion older filly or mare, and three of 14 starts in 1993. Those latter three wins all came in California, and not only earned Peterhof's Patea her second title as champion older mare title, but also Washington horse of the year status.

Peterhof's Patea's 16 wins in 52 career starts and earnings of \$623,367 ultimately earned her a place in Washington's Racing Hall of Fame in 2007. She was the best Washington racehorse Oak Crest Farm has bred, but Guinevere is the best Washingtonbred the Hodges campaigned themselves.

The daughter of Fit to Fight won eight of 24 starts, including the Grade 3 Brown Bess Handicap at Bay Meadows and the Washington Oaks at Emerald Downs. She was a three-time Washington champion, including horse of the year in 1998. Her final foal was Guinevere's Finale, who won the 2016 Boeing Stakes at Emerald Downs in the Hodges' silks.

Although a Kentucky-bred, one of Hodge's most memorable homebreds was Sutra, who won the Grade 1 Frizette Stakes at Belmont Park. Hodge has also campaigned several horses in partnership, such as multiple graded stakes winners Upperline and

millionaire Willcox Inn, who finished third in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (G2). The 75-year-old Hodge never gets tired of the game.

'The whole thing turned out to be a lifestyle change," Hodge said. "I tell my wife that if I'd never taken that turn and gone into the sideline of Thoroughbred racing and breeding, gosh knows where I would have been professionally. We've had fun."

The personal triumphs have been just as great. Hodge's children were raised at the farm, and a daughter is still living there with her husband and twin five-yearold sons.

process of gaining the entitlements, zoning, permitting and fighting for the license,' Hodge recalled. "I'm somewhat detailoriented and I love the detail of construction. I had been to enough racetracks around the country that I understood what we needed, something beautiful like Santa Anita or Belmont Park, but a condensed version of that." Hodge was elected to Emerald Downs'

Professionally, his greatest slam-dunk has come with the building of Emerald Downs. "I was fortunate enough to have (leading investor) Ron Crockett ask me to sit by his side as we went through the

board of directors in 1992, and has served as the vice president since the track began. "It was a huge team effort," Hodge said, "between the folks that designed it and the people that we hired to do the work, despite all the elements they battled with one of the wettest winters we had. The employees here are some of the finest I've worked with in any endeavor. Our team here is like family to me."

Hodge also served on the board of the WTBOA from 1996-2002, including terms as first and second vice president.

With five foals on the ground in 2019, Hodge isn't planning on changing his lifestyle any time soon. "The thing that will keep me going is that I can't be idle," he said. "We'll raise these foals and see what they can

Washington Top 50 Breeder Record

From 1983 through 2019, Jack and Theresa Hodge or their Oak Crest Farm were listed 32 times among the top 50 breeders of Washington-breds. Their runners earned them a top 20 spot on 15 occasions and their names appeared among the top ten rankings five times with their best finishes (fourth place) coming in 1990 and 1993.

Peterhof's Patea

A gray comet

The petite gray recorded her fourth stakes victory in the 1991 Ingenue Handicap, in which she was partnered by 2015 Hall of Fame rider Gary Boulanger.

A stakes winner in each of her five seasons of racing, Peterhof's Patea was the epitome of class and endurance.

She was foaled on May 1, 1988, one of four Washington champions and two horses of the year bred by Jack and Theresa Hodge at their Enumclaw-based Oak Crest Farm.

Peterhof's Patea was offered as a yearling in the 1989 WTBOA Summer Sale through Halvorson Bloodstock, as agent, where she was purchased by Roger L. Williams for \$11,500, just below the \$12,692 average that the 164 yearlings brought at that summer venue. Five years later an oil painting of the champion filly would grace the cover of the 1994 WTBOA August sale catalog. The lovely portrait had been painted by noted Pacific Northwest artist Pam Parker before the small, but striking debutante had made her first start, so highly was she thought of by her connections.

Here Comes Patea

The silver-tinged comet first streaked across the Pacific Northwest racing scene at two, flying the silks of Williams and his future wife Patty Strait. Williams was getting back into racing after a 12-year absence.

Strait (now Nelson), who feels that Peterhof's Patea gave her and Roger "the best years of their lives," fondly remembers her first encounters with both Roger and the filly.

"I had my first date with Roger right after he purchased the filly. He was so excited about her, so that's the first place we went, to the paddock where she was being kept. I thought she was gorgeous. I've always loved horses. Roger always teased that I fell in love with the horse, he just happened to be her owner. Partly true, I loved them both. He did give me a half-interest in her for Christmas that year. Best Christmas present I ever got! Every time she raced it became a family affair, as our kids all loved her too and tried to make every race they could.

"Peterhof's Patea [pronounced Pat-TEE] was an exceptional filly; very intelligent. She was also very gentle and patient and stayed that way until she won her first race – and then she understood immediately that she was something special and we (or I) should pay attention."

Sent to master trainer Bud Klokstad, who was inducted into the Washington Racing Hall of Fame in 2005, Peterhof's Patea

made her debut on June 17 at Longacres and finished third in a maiden special weight race. A second place finish in another maiden allowance followed a month later.

Klokstad wasn't hesitant to send Peterhof's Patea (who he would later nickname "Iron Legs") forward in the Green River Valley Stakes for her next outing and she duly broke her maiden by a half-length. Thirteen days later she returned to post an easy three-length win in the Mary Broderick Stakes. "Peterhof's Patea was already developing a nasty closing kick," wrote Vince Bruun in the "Longacres Report" for the Washington Thoroughbred.

"Patea didn't just have a closing kick," said Nelson. "She gave a signature salute with her tail when going to the lead. She'd flick and twirl her tail every time, and of course we got a big kick out of it."

Her rider Gary Boulanger (also a Washington Hall of Fame inductee) was quoted as saying after her second stakes win, "I still don't know how good this filly is, but she's obviously very, very talented."

Peterhof's Patea ran a disappointing fourth in the Mercer Girls Stakes, which was excused when it was found she had been shin-sore.

In the richest race of the meet for her age and gender, Peterhof's Patea went off at six-to-one in the \$100,000 Longacres Lassie Stakes, which she rebounded to win by 1 1/2 lengths with a "rousing drive to the wire."

She finished the season with a second to her stablemate Time to Pass in the Gottstein Futurity. The two Klokstad-trained runners were voted best juveniles of the 1990 Longacres meet and later took the state titles as well.

In seven starts, the filly with the powerful closing kick had a 3-2-1 record and had grossed earnings of \$172,187.

Sophomore Campaign

Peterhof's Patea made her 1991 debut at Yakima Meadows, where she finished second in the Yakima Debutante Stakes. An allowance win at her Longacres' home-base followed in May. Her fourth stakes tally

came in the Ingenue Handicap, where she got up in the final strides to take the victory from Sheltered View. Williams commented after her half-length score, "I know this filly so well, she's such a tiger. If she has a chance, she'll get the job done."

After a strong second to nemesis Cadette Stevens in the Bellingham Handicap, Bruun

wrote in his "Longacres Report" recap, Peterhof's Patea "continues to fire bullets in every race she wins."

The champion filly followed with a two-length score in the Belle of Rainier Handicap, but would then finish her season with four consecutive stakes fourths, the final three at Bay Meadows.

The state sophomore filly title had basically been decided in July after the speedy Zama Hummer won the Grade 2 Prioress Stakes in New York.

Twice Crowned

Williams and Strait's talent-laden distaffer made her four-year-old debut in a 5 1/2-furlong allowance at Longacres on April 1 and scored a last-to-first win by 3 1/2 lengths.

After two punchless fourth-place efforts in the Fashion and Rhododendron handicaps, the petite filly found her way back to the

winner's circle with a 2 1/2-length rally in the mile Everett Handicap. "All she really needed, it turned out, was simply more ground." wrote Bruun.

Next on her calendar was the 1 1/16-mile Prima Donna Handicap, which she won going away by another 2 1/2 lengths.

The consummate racemare was even more impressive in the Budweiser Handicap on July 26. In what many considered a "brilliant" victory – in which she became the all-time leading money earning distaffer to run at Longacres (\$345,087) – the gray filly "swooped" to the lead to take the mile race by three lengths in a good time of 1:35 4/5.

When her rider Tim Doocy was questioned about his mount's desire to win,

he stated, "Some horses have it and believe me, she's got it. She's just all class."

Unfortunately, a few days after the race Peterhof's Patea gave all her connections quite a scare, coming down with a severe case of pneumonia. It would be December before her name would once again be seen in the entries.

She finished her season with two solid performances at Bay Meadows. First by running second in the 1 1/16-mile Brown Bess Breeders' Cup Handicap on the grass, and then coming back 14 days later to win the Ladyhawke Ranch Handicap by a nose over fellow Washington champion Bonne Nuite.

The daughter of now Washington-based Peterhof had nine starts that yielded a 3-2-1 record, \$100,730 in earnings and her second Washington champion title.

A Year in California

With Longacres now shuttered, the "Patea" team elected to keep their special distaffer on the Northern California circuit. In her most ambitious season, she ran 14 times, all in stakes, and she only missed a start in the month of June. She had begun her year in the same way she had ended the previous one, with a win in a Bay Meadows stakes, taking the 1 1/16-mile Cecilia deMille Harper Invitational Handicap by 1 1/4 lengths on January 1.

Peterhof's Patea next ran second in the Harvey's Handicap, also at 9 1/2-furlongs, to Fantastic Kim, who had finished third behind her in the previous January stakes. Another stakes second followed at the same distance, but this time at Golden Gate Fields where she was runner-up in the Campanile Invitational Handicap

The gray mare's next three outings all came in Grade 3 races at Golden Gate. With her third place earnings in the first, the Miss America Handicap, she surpassed Belle of Rainier to become Washington's leading distaff performer. She next finished third in the Golden Poppy Handicap. Both of those races were also run at the 1 1/16-mile distance. When they tried to stretch her out to nine furlongs on the turf for the Countess Fager Handicap, Peterhof's Patea could only manage to run fifth, though beaten less than four lengths for it all.

A month later, and back at 1 1/16 miles, the game mare added her twelfth stakes win in the Pacific Heights Handicap, taking the turf race by two lengths. Among the other distaffers in the field of eight were Washington champions Runaway Stevie and Bonne Nuite and Colonel Steven's topnotch daughter Cadette Stevens. In fact, between those four superlative Washingtonbred distaff runners, they won 40 stakes and earned \$1,921,334!

Cadette Stevens and Peterhof's Patea met three weeks later in the Alameda County Handicap, where the G & N Thoroughbred's homebred runner soundly defeated her stellar rival.

After three consecutive thirds on the Northern California fair circuit – which included another Grade 3 placement in the Hillsborough Handicap – the gallant daughter of Peterhof returned to the winner's circle with a one-length victory in the mile Los Altos Invitational Handicap in November. Peterhof's Patea ended her long season with a second in the 1 1/16-mile Brown Bess Breeders' Cup Handicap, beaten by a half-length while giving the winner four pounds, over Bay Meadows turf course on December 4.

For her exemplary year in which she won a trio of stakes and placed in nine others, Williams and Strait's pride and joy earned the well-deserved 1993 Washington horse of the year and champion older filly or mare titles.

Still Going Strong at Six

Washington's "gray lady" went forward in a dozen races as s six-year-old, with her lone win coming at Solano in July in the mile James Wiggins Breeders' Cup Handicap. She also had three stakes seconds in the Santa Clara Invitational Handicap – to Run Away Stevie; the Alameda County Fillies and Mares Handicap – to another fellow Washington-bred Late Sailing; and the Mandysland Farm Handicap.

After two off-the-board stakes finishes in October and November, Peterhof's Patea was retired.

At the time of her resignation from racing, Peterhof's Patea was the leading Washington-bred distaffer and also top WTBOA-sold performer with \$623,367. She still reigns, 26 years later, as the top Washington-bred distaffer of all-time, but two Kentucky-breds, Smiling Tiger and the mare City by City, now perch on top of the WTBOA Sales horse standings.

To the Land of the Rising Sun

The Williams decided to offer their multiple champion at the 1995 Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale, where the maiden mare was sold on a \$100,000 bid to

Zenya Yoshida's Fontainebleau Farm. She was then bred to 1992 Horse of the Year A. P. Indy and exported to Japan.

The Washington champion would only produce four foals: the fillies Take the Dream, by A. P. Indy, and Raptured, by Dr Devious, both who failed to enter the winner's circle; minor winner Country Pater, a colt by Timber Country; and finally Jolly Dance, a 2001 filly by Dance in the Dark, a champion son of Japan's powerhouse stallion Sunday Silence. Her Japanese owners had thought so highly of Peterhof's Patea that they bred her to Sunday Silence in 1996, but unfortunately no live foal was produced.

Peterhof's Patea had saved her best until last, as her gray daughter Jolly Dance was a multiple stakes winner, Grade 2 winner and Grade 1-placed earner of \$2.7-million.

Jolly Dance also has a rather light production record, with only four foals listed. Her only filly, Terme de Caracalla, a 2012 daughter of the British stallion Harbinger, won four of her 23 starts, but earned \$734,447. Jolly Dance's final foal, Swag (Jpn), a 2014 colt by Empire Maker, was a winner of one race with \$15,085 in earnings while racing in the US. His lone victory came in 2018 at Delaware Park.

Pedigree Notes

n 1980 Jack Hodge purchased two young mares at the November Kentucky sales. One was Momma Taj, who was carrying the Hodges's first state champion Colonel Stevens; and the other was the chestnut Mississippian mare Remuneration. Remuneration was carrying her first foal, a colt by the good Maryland sire Rollicking. That offspring, future winner Mississippi Rolls, was dropped in Kentucky and Remuneration was bred back to Drone, a speedy, though volatile, unbeaten son of Sir Gaylord.

Unraced at two, Drone never made it out of the allowance ranks at three, but was impressive enough to be retired to Claiborne Farm. Peterhof's Patea's gray coat would come through him, via his second dam Ghazni, a daughter of 1936 Epsom Derby winner *Mahmoud – who traced back to the wild-colored and brilliant racehorse The Tetrarch through that runner's daughter, "The Flying Filly" Mumtaz Mahal.

Drone would sire 52 stakes winners (ten percent), have a 2.23 AEI and also become a significant damsire.

The result of the Drone—Remuneration breeding was the gray filly Tea At Ten, who after breaking her maiden at three at Santa Anita, would shift to Illinois where she would win and place in allowance company at Hawthorne and Sportsman's Park. She retired at age four with earnings of \$48,718.

Tea At Ten was covered the following spring by English and Irish group winner Peterhof, who was then standing at Darrell and Lendy Brown's Stonereath Farms in Paris, Kentucky, for a \$5,000 fee. Hodge had purchased a share in Peterhof while the colt was racing in Europe. Peterhof was sent to D. Wayne Lukas's barn when he returned to North America, but he never started and he entered stud in 1984 at the Browns' Kentucky farm for a \$30,000 fee.

A diminutive son of Northern Dancer's flashy 1977 Epsom Derby (G1) winning son The Minstrel, Peterhof was one of three group-winning colts (the other two being by "The Dancer's" English Triple Crown winner Nijinsky II) out of the unraced Cornish Prince mare Millicent, a half-sister to Paul Mellon's European Horse of the Year and leading sire Mill Reef (whose wins included the Epsom Derby and Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe).

Even with those classic influences so close up in his pedigree, Peterhof's best distance was five furlongs. *Timeform of 1981* reported "he has the look of a speedy two-year-old about him" and "although a strong, shapely colt he was very small, with a short sharp action, and he had to make a lot of use of himself against his bigger, long-striding opponents."

Peterhof would eventually be sold and move on a westward trajectory. He next stood at Billingsley Creek Stud in Idaho and then was moved to DanDar Farm in Tenino, Washington. When DanDar's valuable property was sold in 1993, Peterhof spent his final long days in the care of Nina Hagen at El Dorado Farms where the much-loved "Little Big Man" passed away in February of 2015 at the grand age of 36.

Remuneration's dam, the Promised Land (another gray) mare House of Cards, produced four-time Canadian stakes winner Jacksboro – whose tallies included a victory in the 1985 King Edward Gold Cup Handicap (G3) – among his 16 wins. The 1979 son of Ace of Aces also placed in 19 other races during his 58-race career, earned \$467,263 and had a 10.07 SSI.

Unfortunately Remuneration would have a troubled career as a broodmare, producing only two other live foals: Peterhof's Patea's full brother Mitigation, who won three races and earned \$56,160; and the unraced Star de Naskra mare Digital Beats, who also only produced a trio of foals, led by Emerald Downs stakes-placed Altastarr, a 1997 gelding by Altazarr who won six races and earned \$65,371. Mitigation also set the 6 1/2-furlong mark twice during Emerald Downs' inaugural season.

The Foal Project

elcome to the Foal Project. It will be an insight into the world of the Thoroughbred from behind the scenes. A small number of foals from different Washington breeders will be tracked from their birth. Insight from their breeders and owners regarding raising and training, will be included. The plan is to follow these youngsters through to the WTBOA Summer Yearling and Mixed Sale, and hopefully on through their training. The project will conclude when they race for the first time.

Two key players are the owners and the breeders, but the world of the Thoroughbred is really a trifecta for the first year and it is incomplete without the equine reproductive veterinarian.

Selection of sires for respective mares is an intriguing combination of knowledge of bloodlines, experience, and an ability to choose sires who will balance and enhance the traits and conformation of the mare to be bred. A healthy foal is the first step, but the goal and the challenge are to breed a sound athlete, and ideally a superior one. In that respect little has changed for hundreds of years.

In a 1908 New York Times article entitled "Where the Ponies Run for the Masses," the author discusses the origins of horse racing in 1665 on Long Island. Prize money was not even offered in the beginning, and it was stressed that owners and breeders ran their best horses because of their love of horse racing.

Meet the First Two Foals

The first foal was born at Nina and Ron Hagen's El Dorado Farms in Enumclaw. She's a dark bay filly with a star sired by Coast Guard and out of the Matty G mare Ms. Moscow Mattie. She was born on March 6, 2020, at 7:40 p.m. At birth she was 43 inches tall and weighed 127 pounds. By 8:30 p.m. she was standing and had progressed to nursing at 9 p.m.

Nina reported, "She's very sweet and smart and went along with everything like a champ."

Furthermore, her dam "is very sweet and trusting and loves her baby."

A rather unique ambassador for the farm is a handsome cat called Jock Jock. He is an observer for every birth and breeding!

There is a strict protocol for newborn foals. It is not the purpose of this article to discuss the veterinary details, but one key test is crucial and performed within 12 hours of birth, namely the IgG to ensure that the foal has the appropriate levels of antibodies, and if not, more colostrum may be given from the colostrum bank (if the mare's levels are insufficient).

According to Nina, foals are assessed for any conformational challenges and a strategy is put in place to enable Mother Nature to correct in her time frame, before any major medical decisions are made.

Early training involves haltering the foal within 24 hours, as well as picking up legs and desensitization exercises. Nina stressed the importance of the foal learning to trust humans from the beginning. Her quote resonated with me: "You can teach a horse one of two things. To trust you or to fear you." The goal at El Dorado Farms is to try and make every new experience for the foal a positive one.

In the beginning and weather permitting the mare and her new offspring are turned out for a few hours each day. The footing must be good and the turnout is deliberately small to discourage mares from running too fast with their brand new foals.

The second foal was born at Debbie and Rick Pabst's Blue Ribbon Farm in Buckley. Her owners are well known at Emerald Downs, namely Mullan and Pat Chinn. She's a bay filly with a large star sired by Nationhood and out of the Harbor the Gold mare Val de Saire. She was born at 12.01 a.m. on March 8, 2020. At birth she was 43" tall and weighed 146 lbs. She stood by herself in 44 minutes and nursed in one hour and 20 minutes. According to Debbie she has a lovely temperament like her dam.

At Blue Ribbon the veterinarian typically visits the mare and her new foal within ten to 15 hours post foaling to conduct a wellness exam and to conduct the IgG test. The Chinn's filly was healthy with IgG results in the normal range (800-plus).

Debbie explained that once the vet had carried out the examination, halter training commenced. The filly was led, cradled or encircled with a butt rope, behind her dam. The first outing for the mare and new filly was to the farm's 60-foot round pen. They come back in at night and then gradually

will progress to a larger paddock where they can be observed during the day.

A key point is how the mare is behaving with her foal and in Debbie's words "Val de Saire is exemplary and makes sure her foal has shelter if the weather is changeable."

At Blue Ribbon Farm the foal is haltered and handled every day for seven-to-ten days prior to turnout with its dam. At that point Debbie will turn out two compatible mares and foals on a daily basis. Over time, pending weather and equine well-being, the mares and foals will progress to larger turnouts for 24 hours a day.

Both Nina and Debbie stressed the importance of early and correct handling to give the foals a positive foundation for their interactions with humans.

I look forward greatly to introducing the additional foals and to watching their development and training unfold in the coming months. Watching them grow and become racehorses will be an adventure for equines and humans alike.

Genomic tools have the potential to improve the recognition of useful patterns

Commentary

The art of horse production is pattern recognition. The most obvious pattern is that offspring resemble their parents. These resemblances can be found in phenotypes such as size, conformation, durability and performance. Using phenotypes and pedigrees, breeders have applied selection, resulting in profound changes in horses since their domestication 5,500 years ago.

Today, hundreds of breed registries exist, reflecting diverse goals among horse breeders. These interests span divergent phenotypes related to racing, pulling, jumping, dressage, performing special gaits and characteristics associated with coat color or size. The commonality among these traits is they have a large genetic component. Foundation stock were identified exemplifying traits of interest.

The path to improvement has been to identify quality breeding stock, cross them to foundation horses and select the best for future breeding stock. As a result, foundation stock are represented many times in horse pedigrees and contribute to the distinctive phenotypic characteristics within those breeds.

Recently, a reference whole genome sequence of the horse was determined. Scientists identified genes for discrete traits such as coat colors and some hereditary diseases. However, despite a great deal of research, no single gene has been found responsible for complex traits such as racing, jumping and gait. This is not surprising since athletic performance involves a combination of muscle strength, cardiovascular capability, competitiveness and coordination.


Yes, a few genes have been identified that influence performance (e.g., DMRT3 for gait and MSTN for sprinting); however, the development of champions involves many other genes, as well as the art of the trainer and skill of the rider. This relationship is remarkably complex since variation exists despite generations of selection. The resilience of genetic variation may reflect the diverse ways in which a horse can become a champion.

Northern Dancer and Secretariat were champion Thoroughbred racehorses; however, while Northern Dancer was relatively small in stature, Secretariat was renowned for his large size and stride length.

While the old breeding adage is "breed the best to the best and hope for the best," the skill of the successful breeder is to identify hereditary patterns among the best and make judicious choices. There is no single genetic test that will replace the skill of the breeder.

Genomic tools have the potential to improve the recognition of useful patterns. Horse genes are distributed among 32

pairs of chromosomes (see image). These chromosomes contain the genetic material under selection. Genetic recombination occurs during production of eggs and sperm in each generation that divides these genetic blocks into subsets of chromosomes. It

is possible to identify the specific block inherited from each parent and relate those blocks to blocks found in the grandparents. Likewise, one might even discern the blocks back to the foundation stock. Unfortunately, such a tool does not yet exist for horses, but a similar commercial application is used by people to identify the origin of their ancestors. We anticipate horse breeders may seek to use such a tool one day.

Today we can apply genomics to assess one of the concerns of horse breeders, namely inbreeding. As noted above, the establishment of breeds relies on the identification and use of foundation stock. An unintended consequence of this is inbreeding and the attendant risk of inbreeding depression and the appearance of deleterious hereditary diseases. The article that follows below, "Inbreeding and Genomics," describes the concern and identifies ways in which genomics can be used to monitor inbreeding and assist breed registries to anticipate problems.

Inbreeding and Genomics

Inbreeding has played a key role in the improvement of livestock breeds, resulting in more uniform populations with highly specialized performance traits. Selection for desirable traits entails identifying individuals with superior performance and often mating them to relatives (inbreeding) who possess the same superior traits. The goal of this practice is to increase the frequency of the desired characteristics and thus of the beneficial genes in the offspring.

At the same time, negative consequences of inbreeding are well known. In small populations, such as captive-bred species, the loss of diversity associated with inbreeding is a major concern, and significant losses of diversity may lead to extinction. The increased expression of recessive deleterious genotypes can also lead to embryonic loss or other defects, some of which can be fatal.

Furthermore, inbreeding can lead to a phenomenon called inbreeding depression. Inbreeding depression is commonly manifest in poor performance of traits that are complex (due to contributions of many different genes), such as fertility and athleticism. Mindful of the dangers inherent with inbreeding, breeders traditionally balance the benefits and dangers of inbreeding by monitoring their breeding stock, culling poor performers and avoiding matings of closely related individuals.

Recently, genetic tools have become available that provide an alternative approach to unambiguously quantify and manage inbreeding relative to the traditional use of pedigrees. Today, a genomic survey of a horse's DNA may cost \$70 to \$180. A comprehensive whole genome sequence, including analyses, may cost \$1,000 to \$2,500. So far, over 1,000 horses have had their entire DNA sequenced in connection with research projects. Those genome sequences have been used to identify the genetic bases of diseases, coat colors and even some performance traits.

Nevertheless, the overall performance of horses is complex, involving over 20,000 genes and probably millions of other functional elements. Studying genes one at a time is unlikely to be effective to significantly improve performance. Genomic tools, however, make it possible to identify associations between the genome and traits that contribute to success or which may cause problems.

One of the areas in which genomics excels is in determining levels of inbreeding. An animal's inbreeding coefficient is the likelihood that both parents transmitted the same piece of DNA to their offspring that they each inherited from a common ancestor. Traditionally, we measured inbreeding by identifying all common ancestors – those that appear in the paternal and maternal sides of an individual's pedigree. After common ancestors are identified, the relationship between the parents of the individual in question can be calculated. Using this

method, on average, pedigree-based inbreeding coefficients for Thoroughbred horses are reported to be between 12.5-13.5 percent. However, individual horses may have values that range from less than five percent to over 20 percent.

When genomic measures have been made in other species, geneticists discovered that inbreeding levels calculated from pedigrees are poorly correlated (50-80 percent) with genomic measures of inbreeding. This is not surprising since pedigrees inaccurately assume a random and equal transmission of genes each generation. Which variant of each gene is inherited, however, is not predictable. For example, full-siblings share, on average, 50 percent of their genes; however, at any particular part of the genome they may share zero, 50, or 100 percent. Further, genes are not randomly distributed in a breed since selection practices are applied in mating horses. If we are good breeders, the genetic constitution of our current generation is not a random representation of the ancestors, but rather, a selection of the genes contributing to their success.

There are other ways to apply genomics to horse breeding. As noted above, both the genome and the traits we value are complex. Our genomic tools are powerful, and we can begin to seek genetic patterns correlated with measures valued by horse owners. The limitation for such studies is the quality and availability of data for traits related to fertility, conformation, durability and athleticism. Collecting these data and using genomics to identify genes associated with these complex traits would be a more sensible way to improve performance, rather than simply seeking to limit inbreeding.

2019 Breeders' Awards

B reeders' awards distributed to breeders of Washington-breds who finished first, second or third in 2019 Emerald Downs races totaled \$172,452, compared to \$175,630 in 2018.

Mandated by the state's racing act in accordance with RCW 67.16.175, breeders' awards are funded from a percentage of the exotic pari-mutuel wagering during live racing at Emerald Downs and its OTBs (off-track betting locations) and are paid at the end of the race year. Beginning in 2004, of the Source Market Fees collected from advance deposit wagering, 2.5 percent goes to owners' and breeders' awards (WAC 260-49-070).

Breeders' Awards Factor

For many years, it was assumed that Emerald Downs retained six percent from daily gross receipts for exotic wagering on both live racing and simulcasting. Of that six percent, one percent was designated for breeders' awards.

In 2017, it was determined that, in actuality, Emerald Downs had not been retaining six percent from the daily gross receipts on exotic wagering from simulcasting. Hence, going forward, breeders' awards will be calculated on exotic wagering from live racing only.

The total of \$172,452 for 2019 is allocated as 75 percent for first, 15 percent for second and ten percent for third. These totals are divided by the total amount of corresponding purse monies earned by Washington-breds, which creates three corresponding factors. The appropriate factor is then multiplied by the total purse monies won by each Washington-bred to arrive at the breeders' award amount.

Owners' Bonus Awards

The Washington-bred bonus was first established in August 1969. One percent of the pari-mutuel wagering, per RCW 67.16.102(1), during live racing at Emerald Downs and its OTBs (off-track betting locations) is paid at the end of the race year to all licensed owners whose Washington-bred horses place first, second, third or fourth at Emerald Downs.

Beginning in 2004, of the Source Market Fees collected from advance deposit wagering, 2.5 percent goes to owners' and breeders' awards (WAC 260-49-070).

In 2019 the payment factor was 17.72 percent, compared to 18.7 percent in 2018.

Although Swagsational was disqualified from first and moved to fifth in the \$25,000 Startac Stakes at Turf Paradise on January 25, he redeemed himself three weeks later with a victory in the \$50,000 Turf Paradise Derby. Finishing

second in the Derby was fellow Washington-bred Wicked Winnings with 2019 Gottstein Futurity hero Race Home third in the field of nine. Both Wicked Winnings and Race Hero are owned by Tim Bankers, who purchased the duo at the 2018 WTBOA Summer Sale.

Swagsational is the first stakes winner for both his sire and dam and also the first Washington-bred stakes winner in 2020. In 2019 the first Washington-bred stakes winner didn't appear until May 4, when Dr John H, by Harbor the Gold, took the Jim Coleman Province Stakes at Hastings Racecourse.

Gallant Son, the nine-time stakes-winning sire of Swagsational, won a trio of Emerald Downs stakes as a two-year-old, including a six-length win over future two-time Washington horse of the year Noosa Beach in the Gottstein Futurity. The grandson of Unbridled was also a stakes winner in California at three, four, five and seven. Led by a victory in the G3 Inglewood Handicap at four, Gallant Son's stakes wins came over all three surfaces - dirt, turf and all weather - and at distances ranging from six to 8 1/2 furlongs. After standing his first season at Bar C Racing Stables in Oregon, the versatile racehorse was then moved to Daehling Ranch LLC in Elk Grove, California. This past February, Keith Swagerty moved the promising stallion to his West Coast Training Center in Auburn.

Bullysima, the dam of Swagsational, had been a \$50,000 2005 Keeneland September Yearling Sale purchase. After beginning her racing career in Southern California at two, the daughter of Holy Bull didn't break her maiden until the following year in her 12th start, a \$25,000 maiden claiming race at Hollywood Park, which she won by 8 1/2 lengths. Her only other win came as a four-year-old at Bay Meadows for a \$4,000 tag.

Bred to Monsajem, who was a three-time English stakes-placed son of Woodman out of a stakes-placed three-quarter sister to four stakes winners including champion and major sire Sadler's Wells, Bullysima produced four other runners, but only two single-race winners.

Three unreported years followed her 2014 foal, with Swagsational becoming her fifth foal in 2017. Bullysima produced colts by Gotham City in both 2018 (Bat Man's Bull) and 2019.

Bullysima was the biggest earner among the four winners out of unraced Blondie Cutie, who was offered on the auction block nine times.

Blondie Cutie was one of 14 foals produced out of \$118,619 stakes winner Belle of Dodge Me, by Creme dela Creme. Belle of Dodge Me was a full sister to nine-time stakes winner Barely Even (\$300,604) and half-sister to eight-time stakes winner Barely Once (\$239,674) and Grade 3 winner Pool Court (\$134,080).

Multiple Grade 1 stakes winner Spiced Perfection was named California horse of the year in 2019 for the second year in a row. The now five-year-old daughter of **Smiling Tiger** won a trio of graded stakes last year and earned \$592,000. A 2008 WTBOA Summer Sale graduate, Smiling Tiger is also the sire of 11 other divisional champions, including 2019 Washington horse of the year Baja Sur, 2019 California co-champion two-year-old male El Tigre Terrible and 2019 Oregon champions Grinning Tiger and Jaded Tiger (see next article).

2019 OTOBA Champions

The 2019 Oregon Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association champions were announced at the OTBOA Annual Awards Banquet held on February 22.

Tyree Wolesensky's Grinning Tiger was named Oregon horse of the year and champion older gelding. The son of Smiling Tiger—Karlee's Kitten, by Pioneering, had previously been named state champion three-year-old gelding in 2018 and the top juvenile male of 2017. Bred by Patrick Cosgrove, Grinning Tiger had a 2-2-1 record from his

11 starts last year, including two allowance/optional claiming wins at Los Alamitos. He also was runner-up in the \$100,000 California Flag Stakes (at Santa Anita) en route to 2019 earnings of \$87,091. A four-time Portland Meadows stakes winner, Grinning Tiger has won seven races and earned \$149,301.

Grinning Tiger is one of six named foals, including a 2018 filly by Harbor the Gold named Pat's Gold, out of \$173,741 earner and 2019 Oregon broodmare of the year Karlee's Kitten, who is also the dam of 2014 Oregon champion juvenile filly Kozzy's Kitkat and two-time stakes winner Jet Set Kitten.

Bar C Racing Stables' Harbor the Gold was the champion sire for the 11th straight year.

Jerry Carmody and John Sneesby's Stay in Grace added her third championship title. The 2015 daughter of Understatement—Bridled Style, by Grindstone, won three of her nine starts last year, all at Emerald Downs, while running at the \$5,000 to \$10,000 claiming level and earned \$21,165 to push the three-time stakes winner's earnings to \$48,617. She is trained by Linda Northam.

Stay in Grace was one of two 2019 champions bred by now ten-time leading Oregon breeders Dr. Jack and Margaret "Cookie" Root. The Roots were also named the Oregon TOBA winners for the seventh time.

The Roots' other year-end winner was two-year-old gelding Baquero Flies, who races in Cookie's name and is trained by National Racing Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas. Baquero Flies (Baquero—Thebannersflies, by Dynaformer) broke his maiden by two lengths in a \$12,500 maiden claiming race at Churchill Downs last December and earned \$23,285.

Cookie Root also partnered with her son, trainer Ben Root, and Dan Warden to race Jaded Tiger, who was named top two-year-old filly. The third offspring of California-based Smiling Tiger to earn a year-end Oregon title, Jaded Tiger was purchased by Ben Root for \$4,000 from her breeder Dr. Rodney Orr at the 2018 WTBOA Summer Sale. Orr also bred and raced 2018 Oregon champion filly Sari's Tiger, another offspring of the multiple Grade 1 winner Smiling Tiger, who Orr bred and sold at the 2008 WTBOA Sale. Jaded Tiger broke her

maiden in her first start, a \$25,000 maiden claiming race at Emerald Downs before the filly out of Jadelet, by Skip Away, ran third in the TMB Futurity and won the OTOBA Two Year Olds Stakes, both run at Grants Pass. She earned \$21,356.

2019 champion three-year-old gelding Sharp Dressed Beau had good success at Century Mile for owner Empire Equestrian, who now stands his sire at their Alberta farm. The son of former Pacific Northwest stallion Car Talk (Ire) won three races at the Edmonton, Alberta, track, led by a nearly five-length victory in the Count Lathum Handicap and a two-length tally in the Western Canada Handicap. Sharp Dressed Beau had six starts last year with a 3-1-1record and with his \$61,436 earnings upped his two-year total to \$72,141. Bred by Neil Knapp, Sharp Dressed Beau joins Suddenly Adele and Gracie Gold as the third Oregon champion out of Knapp's Speed Jaro (Jpn) mare Sudden.

Three-year-old filly champion She Flys Forever was bred and is owned by Penny Hoeft and trained by Jonathan Nance. The third state champion sired by Blue Ribbon Farm stallion Atta Boy Roy, She Flys Forever had a 4-4-2 record from her ten starts last year and made \$19,994. Placed in her only two starts at two, She Flys Forever went gateto-wire to win a maiden/\$25,000 optional claiming (N) race at Portland Meadows. She followed that with three wins at Grants Pass, including a 3 1/2-length tally in the Hers Stakes. She also ran second in the open Grants Pass Thoroughbred Derby. She Flys Forever is third winner from four foals out of four-time winner Sheelfly, by Cee's Tizzy.

Sharon Balcom took Oregon trainer of the year honors.

Grants Pass Downs Update

Grants Pass Downs cancelled its spring race meet, which was scheduled to begin on May 10, due to health and safety concerns surrounding the COVID-19 outbreak.

Grants Pass Downs' management explored every possible avenue for continuing with the planned racing schedule. However, as none of the options aligned with their commitment to the health and safety of staff, athletes, horsemen and women, racing fans and community, they we had to make this difficult decision.

As this crisis passes and they have better information about their racing future, they will share details with horsemen. Grants Pass Downs will be exploring all opportunities to honor their summer and fall race meets. That will include dates to open the backside, setting final race dates and getting back to racing.

Former Oregon HBPA executive director Randy Evers has joined Grants Pass Downs as its new president.

Grade 3-winning Millionaire Rise Up Retired to Stand in Oregon for 2020 Season

Grade 3-winning two-year-old and millionaire Rise Up has been retired from racing and entered stud in 2020 at Oakhurst Thoroughbreds as the property of Lee and Connie Erickson, who recently acquired Rise Up in a deal brokered by George Adams of Housatonic Bloodstock LLC.

Bred in Kentucky by Cottonwood Stables LLC, Rise Up was originally campaigned by his breeder in partnership with Blazing Meadows Farm LLC, for whom he broke his maiden second-time out going five furlongs at Presque Isle while trained by Tim Hamm. He next won the \$100,000 Mountaineer Juvenile Stakes by 4 3/4 lengths.

Subsequently acquired by Paul and Andrena Van Doren and turned over to trainer Tom Amoss, Rise Up then scored by 6 1/2 lengths in the \$200,000 Jean Lafitte Stakes going a mile, before a six-length, gate-to-wire romp in the \$1-million, Grade 3 Delta Downs Jackpot at 1 1/16 miles.

As a three-year-old, Rise Up added a 10 3/4-length victory in the \$100,000 Robert Hilton Memorial Stakes at Charles Town going seven furlongs and closed out that season with a 3 3/4-length win in the mile Woodchopper Stakes over a sloppy Fair Grounds' surface.

He was also victorious in the \$100,000 Wild N Wonderful Stakes at seven furlongs as a five-year-old at Charles Town.

"Rise Up gave me the greatest professional thrill of my career outside of this year's Kentucky Oaks [2019 winner Serengeti Empress]," said Amoss, referring to the Delta Jackpot victory. "He had brilliant speed that he could carry two turns, and he showed up every time. I love that horse."

Rise Up is a son of the multiple graded stakes winner Rockport Harbor, who also sired Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) winner and Canadian champion Ria Antonia.

Rise Up is one of seven winners from seven foals to race from his dam, the Johannesburg mare Appenzell, who also produced 2019 Hopeful Stakes (G1) winner Basin (by Liam's Map, and like Rockport Harbor, a son of Unbridled's Song).

"We believe Rise Up's precocity and durability give him a great shot to be a very successful sire," said Connie Erickson. "To win 12 races from five furlongs to a mile and a sixteenth, and race from two through eight, including a victory in a million dollar Grade 3 by six lengths, it takes a heck of a horse to do that, and he should be a perfect fit for the Oregon program."

Gallant Son to West Coast Training Center

Nine-time stakes winner Gallant Son arrived at his new home at Keith and Jan Swagerty's West Coast Training Center in Auburn on February 22. Owned by a partnership, Gallant Son stands the 2020 season for \$1,250 live foal, which includes a \$250 booking fee.

The Swagertys became interested in standing the \$552,528 graded stakes winner after their three-year-old Swagsational finished first in two stakes at the 2019-20 Turf Paradise meet.

Originally raced by Randall and Rossi LLC and trained by Frank Lucarelli, Kentucky-bred Gallant Son won a trio of Emerald Downs stakes – including a sixlength tally in the Gottstein Futurity at two – en route to being named the track's top juvenile colt of 2008.

Gallant Son would add six more stakes wins and eight additional stakes placings, led by a win in the Grade 3 Inglewood Handicap at Hollywood Park. He also placed in the Grade 3 San Francisco Mile (three times) and Daytona Stakes.

A versatile runner, Gallant Son won stakes over dirt, turf and synthetic surfaces and at five, six, eight and 8 1/2 furlongs.

Sired by a Grade 3-winning son of champion and sire maker Unbridled, Gallant Son stems from a female line which includes sprint champions Apelia and Street Rebel, and additional champions and/or graded/group winners Saoirse, Thethiefatmidnight, Street Ballet, More Happy, Hide and Chic and Brushed By a Star. Another good runner from this family is \$1.7-million earner and Japan Cup Dirt winner Fleetstreet Dancer.

Champion Kaabraaj Retired from Racing

2016 Washington champion sprinter Kaabraaj has been retired from racing. The eight-year-old gelded son of Abraaj won nine Thoroughbred races during his five-year campaign and earned \$197,527. Among those wins were back-to-back victories in the 2016-17 Luke Kruytbosch Stakes at Turf Paradise where he also won the 2016 Bienvenidos Stakes. While at Emerald Downs Kaabraaj finished third in the Governor's Stakes and set a new record for six furlongs in 1:08.86.

Kaabraaj also started in four Quarter Horse sprints at Turf Paradise in 2019. He had a win and a second with an additional \$8,165 in earnings.

Bred by Jean Harris and her son Jeff

Harris at their Clemans View Farm, Kaabraaj is one of nine winners out of Kaaaching, a \$113,140 earner by River Special. Kaaaching is also the dam of \$247,290 stakes winner and stakes producer Follow the Lite, \$90,585 earner Credit Line and \$65,762 earner Guardingthemoney. Her winning daughter Miss Wagon Lode is the dam of six-time Emerald Downs stakes-placed Royal Moses and 2019 Washington plater of the year Lode the Gold.

Claimed from his breeders in his first start (a second place finish in a \$10,000 maiden claiming race in 2015), Kaabraaj made the rest of his starts for the partnership of Warlock Stables, Horseplayers Racing Club and trainer Jeff Metz's Saratoga West.

According to Metz, Kaabraaj retired "sound and happy and is now at my home in San Dimas and is a member of the Metz family."

He went on to note "Kaabraaj had been turned out over the summer and had a stall injury to his hind rib area. He could never quite overcome that. In his last race [on January 12, 2020, jockey Scott] Stevens said the horse pulled himself up.

"I will more than likely make him a pony horse, trail horse, jumper or all of the above," Metz continued.

"Kaabraaj has always had a soft spot with me because he was quirky, but fast. He really mellowed with age and has settled right into retirement life. He always had the first stall at my barn and those will be some big shoes to fill for the next horse."

Stakes winner Seattles Best Copy, a half-sister to Washington champions Baja Sur and Castinette Dancer, is being returned to Grazen...2011 Pegasus Thoroughbreds Two-year-olds in Training Sale graduate Eltoninadress, who had a 16-15-9 record from her 53 starts and earnings of \$195,243, produced a filly from the first US-bred crop of 2012 dual classic winner I'll Have Another this spring. It was the second foal for the daughter of Songandaprayer who has a 2019 colt by Bluegrass Cat.

2020 Keeneland September Yearling Sale Goes Ahead as Planned

Keeneland announced on April 10 that the sales company is going ahead with its plans to hold their annual September yearling sale. The entry deadline for the sale will remain May 1, but any horse entered and withdrawn by June 12, will not pay any portion of the entry fee.

Plans are for the sale, which is scheduled to begin on September 14, to mirror the 2019 format.

Book 1 (September 14-16) will be followed by a dark day on Thursday, September 17, and then continue with Book 2 (September 18-19), followed by week two of the sale.

According to Keeneland President and CEO Bill Thomason "We are committed to work in partnership with our consignors and buyers to provide the same world-class marketplace for which Keeneland is known."

Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale

The five-day Keeneland Horses of All Ages Sale was held January 13-17, 2020. Including the 29 supplemental entries in the first two sessions, the Kentucky auction house cataloged 1,827 horses, and after 431 withdrawals, saw 1,396 horses and stallion shares enter the ring, where 1,106 were sold for a \$42,480,500 gross (down 12 percent from the 2019 sale), \$38,409 average (down 24 percent) and \$14,000 median (down 30 percent). There were 290 RNAs (20.77 percent).

Topping the venue for was the \$640,000 paid by agent James Schenck for the four-year-old Uncle Mo filly Enaya Alraab, a Grade 1-placed earner of \$133,00, who was sold as a broodmare prospect. The half-sister to Grade 3-placed Hattaash is out of a stakes winner Lotta Rhythm, whose stakes-winning half-sister Lotta Kim produced Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra.

Washington bloodstock agent Dana Halvorson signed for three newly-turned yearlings. The first was a Shackleford half-sister to 2018 Gottstein Futurity winner Northwest Factor. She was followed by a colt by Commissioner out of Florida stakes winner Pick of the Pack and a filly by Overanalyze out of Saratoga stakes-placed Victory Island.

Former Washington resident and trainer Pete Axmaker signed for a filly by first crop stallion Connect and a colt by Orb.

Other individuals sold with a Pacific Northwest connection include a four-year-old Candy Ride (Arg) half-sister to recent Oakhurst Thoroughbreds stallion addition Rise Up (\$1.2-million) and 2019 Hopeful Stakes (G1) winner Basin, which brought a final bid of \$105.000.

A half-sister to 2016 Gottstein Futurity winner Blazinbeauty from the first crop of Cupid sold for \$35,000.

A four-year-old Medaglia d'Oro filly out of 2013 Emerald Downs horse of the meet and \$249,728 earner Stopshoppingdebbie (who was raced by the late Jerre Paxtpn's Northwest Farms) was a \$35,000 bargain. Another with a connection to Northwest Farms was a yearling half-brother to Grade 3 winner and sire Super Ninety Nine and Washington Oaks winner Elusive Horizon from unbeaten Mastery's first crop, which was a \$150,000 purchase.

Also spotted was the three-year-old American Pharoah filly Seagal. Both Seagal, who missed winning a maiden special weight race in her first start by a neck, and her Grade 1-winning dam Sunset Glow, were raced by Dave Mowat's Ten Broeck Farm and trained by Wesley Ward. The broodmare prospect brought a \$28,000 bid.

Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Winter Mixed Sale

Fasig-Tipton held their Kentucky Winter Mixed Sale on February 10 and 11, 2020. While 542 horses were originally cataloged, the sale also featured 109 late entries to bring a 651 total.

Topping the sale was broodmare prospect Remedy, a five-year-old graded stakes-placed daughter of Creative Cause that brought a \$570,000 bid. The highest-priced yearling was a filly by Street Sense that sold for \$265,000.

After the dust had settled, 368 horses had changed hands for \$9,777,100 with a \$26,568 average (down 10.1 percent) and a \$9,500 median (down 43.35 percent).

Among those horses selling was a Washington-bred filly, foaled April 6, 2019, by champion Honor Code and out of stakes winner and multiple stakes producer Taste the Passion, which brought a \$36,000 bid. 1999 Emerald Downs champion Taste the Passion has produced three Emerald champions.

Two-time winner Bourbon Endowment, a 2016 half-sister to two stakes winners, sold as a broodmare or racing prospect for \$51,000. Sired by Sky Mesa, Bourbon Endowment is out of Emerald Downs' stakes-placed Light of a Star, a half-sister to three-time graded stakes winner Summer Hit and Emerald champion sprinter Starbird Road. Bourbon Endowment's fourth dam produced Washington horse of the year and Hall of Famer Hilco Scamper.

2020 WTBOA Board Officer Elections

The WTBOA board of trustees officer elections for 2020 were held at the February board meeting. Dana Halvorson, who has served as the association's president since 2008 (except for a one-year hiatus), was re-elected to that office. Jim Engstrom returned as first vice president, while Mary Lou Griffin remains as second vice president. Also returning to office were secretary Jenny Webber and treasurer Debbie Pabst. Greg Luce will serve with the officers on the finance committee.

Retired Racehorse Project Bill of Sale Available for Download

The Retired Racehorse Project (RRP) has made a bill of sale available to download at retiredracehorseproject.org/ottb-horses-for-sale/bill-of-sale. RRP is encouraging any horsemen who are being forced to retire horses prematurely due to the COVID-19 outbreak to use the bill of sale as they arrange for new homes for their off-the-track Thoroughbreds.

A bill of sale protects both the buyer and the seller. It also provides proof of ownership for the buyer. The bill of sale page also links to The Jockey Club's Retired from Racing Form, which helps to ensure a horse will not be returned to the racetrack if the intention was to retire it from racing.

Three-year Racehorse Depreciation Extension Signed Into Law by President Trump

A key provision that extends three-year tax depreciation for all racehorses through

2020 was signed into law by President Trump on December 20, 2019. The racehorse provision, which received bi-partisan support within both Houses of Congress, was passed by the Senate by a vote of 71-23 and passed by the House of Representatives by a vote of 297-120.

'We are very pleased that Congress and the President worked together on a bi-partisan basis to reinstate tax extenders legislation, including three-year depreciation for racehorses," said NTRA President and Chief Executive Officer Alex Waldrop. "We especially applaud Senate leader McConnell, Rep. Andy Barr and Rep. John Yarmuth for helping to make this happen for Kentucky's signature industry and the many other jurisdictions throughout the United States that contribute to this \$36.6-billion sport and agribusiness. We also thank the sales companies and thousands of individuals who support our legislative efforts in Washington."

Uniform three-year racehorse depreciation was among numerous tax provisions across many industries that either expired at the beginning of 2018 or 2019 or were set to expire on January 1, 2020. The bill reinstates the three-year schedule for all racehorses retroactive to 2018 and through 2020.

The provision allows taxpayers to depreciate, on a three-year schedule, racehorses 24 months of age and younger when purchased and placed into service, as opposed to a seven-year schedule.

"Three-year depreciation is important because it allows racehorse owners to better align the deduction for any yearling purchase with income opportunities when the horse is racing," said Jen Shah, director of tax services for Lexington, Kentucky-based Dean Dorton accounting firm and a consultant to the NTRA legislative team on federal taxation matters impacting the horse breeding and racing industry.

Three-year racehorse depreciation was most recently available to the industry in 2017, but Congress did not renew it for 2018 as part of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA) passed in December 2017. The TCJA did include 100 percent bonus depreciation and a \$1-million Sec. 179 expense allowance for qualified depreciable property, two important investment incentives that lessened the need for three-year depreciation in many cases. However, three-year depreciation continues to be a beneficial option for many racehorse owners, especially racing partnerships with multiple passive owners, as it better aligns deductions with corresponding income opportunities on an annual basis.

The signing into law of three-year depreciation capped a nearly 24-month effort by the NTRA to have the tax option re-instated. The NTRA legislative team, which is supported by the Washington, DC-based lobbying firm The Alpine Group, is charged with promoting and protecting

the Thoroughbred industry's interests at the federal level. Funding for the NTRA's federal political activities are derived from contributions from thousands of individuals and national and regional horse sales companies that support the NTRA 1/4-percent Check-Off Program and Horse PAC, the NTRA-owned and managed Federal Political Action Committee.

Maintaining the three-year recovery period for racehorse purchases has been a top legislative priority for the NTRA federal legislative team since the provision's initial enactment as part of the 2008 Farm Bill.

Regulatory Veterinarian Continuing Education Conference

Sixty regulatory and official racetrack veterinarians from jurisdictions around the world participated in the third annual Regulatory Veterinarian Continuing Education Conference held at Santa Anita Park on March 2 and 3, 2020.

Presented by the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC) and National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA) Safety & Integrity Alliance, the meeting provided training and presented best practices related to racehorse injury prevention and track and veterinary preparedness.

The California Horse Racing Board's Dr. Barrie Grant gave a demonstration and led a discussion on pre-race exams. Attendees participated in on-track emergency drills and simulations, led by Indiana Grand Racing and Casino's Dr. Michael Hardy and Churchill Downs Inc.'s Dr. Will Farmer. Dr. Sue Stover presented a lecture and lab on pre-existing conditions and lessons learned from UC Davis's Necropsy Program. Attendees engaged in interactive sessions on gait assessment and media preparedness.

Other lectures covered topics such as cardiology, post-race assessment and case follow-up and investigating injury occurrence, including surface considerations. A demonstration on the Equine Injury Database was also featured.

Topics covered over the two-day conference can be viewed at ntra.com/ reg-vet-ce/.

"[This] Reg Vet CE should be a staple for every regulatory veterinarian," said Dr. Tara Law of Finger Lakes Gaming Racetrack. "I was blown away for the second year in a row. It just gets better and better!"

Dr. Gemma Silvestri of Queensland Racing added, "Outstanding CE meeting with an excellent line-up of expert speakers at the forefront of the industry. I've learned a lot and it has been well worth the trip over from Australia."

Another international attendee, Dr. Paula Soza of Chile, noted, "Sharing knowledge is the only way to keep improving the Thoroughbred racing activity all over the world. I am sure this will be a great contribution to the Chilean industry."

Also mentioned was older grass mare Vasilika, a multiple Grade 1 winner who was shy a neck from taking the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf (G1) and who was raced by Dr. George Todaro and partners, which included trainer Jerry Hollendorfer... In Jay Hovdey's The Final Turn column (February 4, 2020, BloodHorse) titled "Something Amiss" he wrote about the lack of having an Award of Merit being given at the recent Eclipse Award ceremonies. He offered three suggestions to the Award of Merit Committee for 2020, including Ron Crockett for the impact he made on Thoroughbred racing and breeding in the Pacific Northwest, in view of Emerald Downs' 25th anniversary this year... In the final print issue of the Canadian Thoroughbred, which arrived at the WTBOA offices on February 18, their last feature, fittingly, was "The 25 Most Influential People Today in Canadian Racing" and among them was British Columbia stalwart Glen Todd...The February 22, 2020, issue of *BloodHorse*, in their regional column, featured an article on Debbie and Rick Pabst and their Buckley-based Blue Ribbon Farm titled "On the Right Foot," written by Frank Angst with photos by Cheri Wicklund...2015 Washington Racing Hall of Fame rider Gary Boulanger is among those who will be inducted into the 2020 Canadian Racing Hall of Fame. The Alberta native was a three-time leading rider at Longacres and twice led the Calder jockey colony. His mounts have won over 3,600 races - led by 41 graded stakes victories and have earned nearly \$80-million.

TIP Announces Shows, Award Offerings and Youth Ambassadors for 2020

The Jockey Club Thoroughbred Incentive Program (TIP) announced on February 10 that it has approved nearly 7,000 awards and classes at more than 1,400 shows in 41 states and six Canadian provinces in 2020.

Awards are available for multiple disciplines, including eventing, dressage, Western and English pleasure, hunter/jumper, endurance, Western performance, games and polocrosse. Awards are also available at some events for Thoroughbreds within their first two years of showing or

for Thoroughbreds within two years of their last start.

In addition, TIP hopes to host two championship horse shows at the Kentucky Horse Park in 2020 in conjunction with New Vocations All-Thoroughbred Charity Shows. The first championship horse show is currently scheduled for September 4-6 and will offer classes for hunters, jumpers, Western pleasure and English pleasure; and the second championship horse show is scheduled for October 4 and will offer classes in dressage, Western dressage and a combined test.

TIP also announced its youth ambassadors for the 2020 TIP Youth Ambassador Program. The 13 ambassadors come from eight states and two Canadian provinces and cover multiple disciplines. Among them are Megan Farnsworth, of Washington, and Amy Demetrick, of British Columbia.

This year's Fact Book includes three new statistics: percentage of mares bred by stallion covering year; percentage of firsttime starters by age; and percentage of foal crop that won a race by racing year.

The 2020 editions of State Fact Books, which feature detailed breeding, racing and auction sales information specific to numerous states, Canadian provinces and Puerto Rico, are also available on The Jockey Club website. The State Fact Books are updated monthly.

The Jockey Club Video and FAQs to Facilitate Digital Certificate Management

The Jockey Club Registry has made available a video tutorial and FAQs to assist industry stakeholders with managing digital certificates. Digital certificates were introduced in 2018 to streamline management of the official certificate of registration throughout the life of a Thoroughbred.

"A digital certificate follows a Thoroughbred from the farm to the sales to the racetrack to the breeding shed and even into retirement," said Rick Bailey, registrar, The Jockey Club. "The foals of 2018 are now two years old, and they are the first Thoroughbreds to arrive at the racetrack with digital certificates. We want to help racing office personnel, trainers and other interested parties learn how to manage digital certificates to ensure the process is smooth and efficient for everyone. For Thoroughbreds three years old and older, the paper certificate process stays the same."

For those who do not have an Interactive Registration (IR) account, the first step to managing digital certificates is creating an account at registry.jockeyclub.com. IR has been used by breeders, owners and agents for more than two decades to submit names, registration applications and other materials to the registry office. Sign-up is free and anyone with a valid e-mail address can sign up for an account.

When a horse is registered, the person performing the registration is prompted to designate the first certificate manager. The certificate manager has control of the digital certificate, similar to having possession of a paper certificate. If a horse is consigned to a sale before registration is complete, the certificate is automatically assigned to the sales company.

A certificate manager can assign a certificate to an individual/entity, sales company, racetrack or The Jockey Club Registry. During the assignment process, current ownership information can be updated, and if certificate management is assigned to a racetrack, a trainer must be selected.

Digital certificates also show logos that indicate Breeders' Cup nomination, Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau digital tattoo status, many state breeders' programs and other important designations. Documents such as Coggins or a bill of sale can be uploaded to a digital certificate and are indicated by a paperclip icon.

Gerry David Brodsky

Longtime Pacific Northwest horseman Gerry Brodsky, 76, passed away February 15, 2020, in Austin, Texas. He was born March 7, 1943, in Indianapolis, where he graduated from Shortridge High School. Gerry earned degrees from Indiana University and the University of Oregon.

Gerry worked at Fairview Hospital, the Oregon School for the Deaf and the Oregon Mental Health Division before founding Public Knowledge with his friend and colleague Jay Smith. The company grew into a national management consulting company that works with public agencies and non-profit organizations. Gerry retired in 2012. He served on the boards of Salem Hospice, the SMART reading program and College Possible.

Gerry also volunteered his evaluation expertise to the Bravo Youth Orchestra.

He had a passion for breeding racehorses and served two terms as president of the Oregon Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association (OTOBA). The family-owned business, Two Stamps Stables, continues to have broodmares in Paris, Kentucky. Among the horses he owned was the broodmare Kivi, whose son Regally Ready won the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (G2) the year after Gerry had purchased her. The son of More Than Ready won nine stakes and earned over \$1.8-million. Kivi later produced 2018 stakes winner Sir Truebadour.

In early 2019, an accident left Gerry with a severe spinal cord injury. Throughout a difficult year of adjustment, rehabilitation and a move to Austin, his optimism never wavered. He was continually positive, kind and engaged. He tackled therapy with intense determination and a great sense of humor. He was an inspiration to his family, friends and all who met him after his accident.

Gerry is survived by his wife, Meredith; daughter, Kate (Tim) Abel; and grandson, Brooks.

Family and friends will gather at Black Butte Ranch in August to celebrate his life.

Christopher "Kit" Victor Dowman

Christopher Dowman, 81, passed away December 7, 2019, at his Auburn home. He was born in London, England, May 13, 1938. Bryson Endres, 30, passed away December 22, 2019, in Olympia. He was born in Aberdeen on May 17, 1989, to Paul Endres and Allison Vaughn. After graduating from Elma High School. Bryson became an exercise rider and jockey, following horses all over the country. As a jockey, he rode from 2009-15 with a 16-21-27 record.

Trainer Kay Cooper said Bryson's career at the track ended in 2018 after he was severely injured when a horse stepped on his ankle.

His other interests included writing songs, Uno card games and cooking (he was the camp cook for his stepfather's guiding service).

He was predeceased by his grandmother, Ella Endre; his grandma, Jan; his grandpa, Larry Vaughn; and great-grandmothers, Martha Winckler and Arlene West. Bryson leaves behind his parents, Paul Endres and Allison Vaughn; step-father, Mike Vaughn; grandparents, Jim and Marlene West and Larry and Janet Vaughn; brothers, Tanner and Tyler; sister, Alexandria Ragan; aunts, Angela Endres, Lisa Hayes and Teresa Saueressig; and uncle, Dan Hayes.

George Dewitt McIvor

George McIvor, 98, passed away January 6, 2020. George was born March 5, 1921, in Seattle to Colin and Mary Ellen McIvor and raised in Ballard. He graduated from Ballard High School.

He was working for Boeing when World War II broke out. George enlisted in the US Army. The young First Lieutenant became a B-26 bomber pilot. He flew 65 missions in Europe, including 14 during the Normandy invasion. He was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Upon his stateside return, George attended the University of Washington and later tried several jobs, including being a record presser at RCA, a Los Angeles cab driver and an air traffic controller.

His first racehorse was a minor winner named Golden Laddie, who unfortunately died soon after being sold to George.

George saddled his first winner, Taffeta, a 1947 daughter of Sirasia, in Stockton in 1951. His first win at Longacres came with seven-year-old Argenta in the first race on the June 26, 1953, opening day card, He also owned that runner.

George's biggest win at the former Renton track came with Full Regalia, a colt by Middleground whom he and his partners had purchased from breeder King Ranch the year before. Full Regalia won the 1963 Longacres Mile and Seattle Handicap.

While at Longacres George helped to found the Washington division of the HBPA.

George also trained 1979 William S. Boeing Stakes winner Native Lancer.

George had a successful career training in Southern California and at Turf Paradise.

For many years George held the position of Washington racing steward and he also served as executive director of the Washington Horse Racing Commission.

Among George's early clients were tennis star Jack Kramer and war hero turned actor Audie Murphy. He later trained at Longacres and Emerald Downs for Murdock MacPherson.

George's final winner came on September 8, 2008, when he saddled Aqaba – who he raced in partnership with veterinarian William Lien – to win a maiden claiming race at Emerald Downs. George saddled 29 winners at the Auburn oval.

Horses were his life, though he occasionally enjoyed a game of golf.

He was preceded in death by his parents; and sister, Maxine. George leaves his wife of 43 years, Judy LaDouceur McIvor; and stepson, Davide McIvor.

Michael L. McLaughlin

Mike McLaughlin, 87, passed away February 18, 2020. He was born February 10, 1933, in Buffalo, Wyoming, to Patrick and Leah McLaughlin. His family soon moved to Spokane where Mike attended St. Al's Elementary School and Gonzaga Prep High School. After graduating from Gonzaga University, Mike served with the US Army in Korea for two years.

In 1960, Mike went to work for IBM, but he was involved in horse racing for nearly all of his life.

Patrick D. McDowell

Pat McDowell, 84, passed away March 20, 2020. He was born August 28, 1935, and graduated from Rodgers High School in Spokane. In his youth he had been an assistant golf pro in Spokane. He later served four years in the US Army.

He married his wife Janice in 1962 and they had two children.

Pat was self-employed as a jockey agent for 42 years, dating back to the late 1950s on the West Coast and at Turf Paradise. Pat had great success in the 1960s and '70s with Jerry Lambert, who was best known as the regular rider of the legendary California-bred Native Diver. Among the other top riders he booked mounts for were National Racing Hall of Fame inductee Johnny Longden, Patrick Valenzuela, Bill Mahorney, Justin Vitek and Bryson Cooper. He also represented National and Washington Hall of Famer Russell Baze, for a time, when he rode full-time in Southern California in 1989-90, as well as Baze's fellow Washington Hall of Fame inductees and relatives, Joe and Gary Baze, and Dale Baze. Pat loved that job the most.

Always a popular figure at the track, Pat spent the last 20 years as a paddock judge at Emerald Downs, becoming known as the "Candy Bubblegum Man" and for the funny outfits he dressed up in on holidays.

Pat was also an avid golfer and loved the Auburn Golf Course.

Pat McDowell is survived by his wife, Janice, who works in the race office at Emerald Downs; children, Peggy Sue and Patrick Jr.; and grandchildren, Robert, Taylor, Madison, Blair and Zachery McDowell.

Wendell L. McMinimy

Wendell McMinimy, 79, passed away September 20, 2019. He was born November 29, 1940, in Colville to Clair F. and Mattie O. McMinimy. Wendell graduated from Sprague High School and attended Central Washington University.

In 1959, he joined the US Marines, attaining the rank of Lt. Corporal. He served in Germany, where he met his future wife

Roswitha. He also was in Cuba during the Cuban Missile Crisis.

After his discharge in 1964, Wendell returned to Washington and became a claims adjuster for Mutual of Enumclaw. In 1973 he opened McMinimy Insurance in Kent. He sold the company in 2005, but worked there until his retirement in 2017.

In partnership with fellow insurance men Duane Weber and Dick McMurtrie, Wendell raced 1984 Washington horse of the year and Grade 1 stakes winner Flag de Lune. In addition to Flag de Lune, he raced 11 other horses in partnership at Longacres, including additional favorites Cyclone West and Amber Away, and also Macho Fellow and Twelve Midnight.

Wendell also loved to fish and paint.

He was proud of serving on the WTBOA Art Show Committee, which included time as the committee chairman.

He was predeceased by his parents; and sister, Jacqueline McMinimy. Wendell is survived by his wife, Roswitha Ellis; son, Scott (Debbie) McMinimy; and brother, Carl McMinimy.

Hilbern R. "Pat" Mullens

Hilbern R. "Pat" Mullens, 92, passed away December 28, 2019, in Puyallup. He was born February 21, 1927, in Alcorn County, Mississippi, to George and Dessie Mullens.

Pat served in the US Air Force for 21 years.

After his retirement from the military he began a second career and passion of training Thoroughbred racehorses. He trained for 47 years at several West Coast tracks, finishing at Emerald Downs. Pat was the oldest trainer at Emerald Downs to win a stakes race (2018 Muckleshoot Tribal Classic with Washington champion older horse Hit the Beach), among his many other victories. Pat was honored with the Martin Durkan Award – for leadership, sportsmanship and cooperation – at Emerald Downs in 2001 and 2004.

His biggest earner was 2006 Washington champion three-year-old filly She's All Silk (\$218,454). Stakes winner Chickasaw Park also went over the \$200,000 mark. Among the other stakes winners Pat conditioned were Mode o' Defense, Gold Deville, Carry On John, Wave Her On, Musical Wine and Bijou Barrister.

Pat began his career training Thoroughbreds in the early 1970s and his first winner was Trespasser at Longacres in 1972. Equibase only shows information from 1977-2019. During that period, Pat had 4,554 starters with a 573-549-551 record and \$4,178,074 in earnings. His final recorded winner was Hit the Beach on August 4, 2019, at Emerald Downs.

He was preceded in death by his parents; wife, Mary; sisters, Tish Farris and Helen Mabry; and brother, Ron. Pat is survived by his sons, Winford (Cindy) and Darrell; grandchildren, Erin Mullens, Jodie Mullens

(Jason), Cyndal (Jonathan) Ellis, and Zach Mullens; great-grandchildren: Kayla Oxborough, Michael Martinson, Wiley Adams, Pearl and Lincoln Ellis; sisters, Nettie White, Elizabeth (Junior) Durbin and Juanita Johnson; and brothers, Don (Louise) and Arn.

A memorial service will be held later this year at Emerald Downs.

Kenneth Arthur Paulson

Ken Paulson, 90, passed away March 29, 2020. He was born January 31, 1930, in Opheim, Montana. Ken believed all of life's problems could be solved by working harder.

After graduating from Glasgow High School in 1948, Ken signed joined the Marines. At 19, he was one of the youngest staff sergeants in the Corps. He spent 14 months in Korea, taking part in the Inchon landing, Battle of Seoul and the Chosin Reservoir and earned a Letter of Commendation from General Thomas for his courage and leadership.

When Ken returned stateside he went to work at a sawmill in Longview for a few months. He then carried mail for four years until friends convinced him he should sell Purple Cross Insurance.

Ken was a natural-born salesman. In 2001 alone he wrote over \$1-million in insurance and was nominated and accepted into the "Million Dollar Round Table." He sold over \$8-million in insurance between 1958-70, insuring over 10,000 lives. Ken retired from Purple Cross after 60 years.

Growing up on a ranch had instilled a love of horses in Ken and he would later be a part of Regency Racing Stable with trainer Len Kasmerski, winning a total of 87 races in their first five years and racing such runners as stakes winner Gold Cannon and stakesplaced Racey Champ.

After the success of Regency, Ken and his older brother Earl purchased 110 acres outside of Granger and formed Paulson Bros. Thoroughbred Ranch and Training Center, which opened to horsemen in the spring of 1984.

From 1994 through 2010, Paulson Bros. Ranch alone and in various partnerships ranked among the 50 top Washington breeders 28 times, including holding the number two spot from 2011-05. Together and in partnership, Ken and Earl Paulson bred the earners of over \$4.7-million, led by four Washington champions: 2004 horse of the year and successful sire Demon Warlock, two-time filly champion Ladyledue and Grade 3 winners I'madrifter and King Slewie.

Tops among the successful sires the brothers stood was 2002-05 leading state sire Slewdledo (for longtime partner Roy Dane), sire of ten Washington champions, including the previously mentioned I'madrifter, King Slewie and Ladyledue. Other stallions on their roster through the years included Rolls Aly, Crafty Native and Irish Bear.

In 2004, Ken and Pat Paulson and Pam and Neal Christopherson partnered to sell the saletopper at the WTBOA Summer Yearling Sale, a filly by Slewdledo that brought \$92,000.

He sponsored and coached the Purple Cross basketball team that would go on to win State AAU championships in 1987 and 1988. He served as agency director for the board of directors for Purple Cross,

Zola Vern Proffitt

Zola Proffitt, 86, of Edgewood, passed away April 7, 2019. He was born May 21, 1932, in Tuckerman, Arkansas. He and his three older brothers were raised by his father John.

After serving in the US Army, Zola moved to the Pacific Northwest in the 1950s and worked for .Bethlehem Steel for 35 years.

The Proffitt family also raced He's Not Bluffin, who finished second in the 2012 Northwest Stallion Slewdledo Stakes in his first start at two. More recently Zola was a member of Poseidon Partners, who raced 2018 WA Cup Juvenile Colts and Geldings Stakes runner-up Time 'n Time Again. All of the Proffitt horses were trained by Jim Penney and later his daughter Kay Cooper.

Zola also loved bowling and was bowling just two weeks prior to his death.

Zola was one of the most loyal and happiest people you could want to know and will be well-remembered for his hugs.

Zola leaves sons, James (Karen) Proffitt, Miles Proffitt, Randy Proffitt and Jerry Proffitt; daughters, Carrie Safford and Sheryl Pilkington; and numerous grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

Constance "Connie" A. Roberts

Connie Roberts passed away February 27, 2020.

Connie and her husband, trainer Craig Roberts, were mainstays on the Washington and California racing circuit from the early 1970s until Craig's passing in May 2009.

Connie and Craig, who were married for 38 years, raced under the name September House and co-owned several of the stakes winners Craig conditioned.

Craig, who took out his trainer's license in 1964, trained five Washington champions – led by Washington horses of the year Rock Bath and Dusty County – and two Oregon champions – Solamente Un Vez and Tani Moro. Among his many other training successes were Hollywood Gold Cup (G1) winner Slew of Damascus and additional stakes winners, such as Flying With Eagles, Great Threads, Go Gremlin Go, Condotierri, He's a Cajun, Ben Adhem, Exclusive Eagle and Westsideclyde.

Connie's final starter and winner was Ghost Tree on September 25, 2011, at Emerald Downs. Ghost Tree had been runner-up in the 2010 Belle Roberts Stakes.

Connie is survived by her son, Michael (Donna) Robbins, of Kent; brother, Larry (Rebecca) Shields, of Hayden, Idaho; two grandchildren; and three great-grandchildren.

John M. Roche

Lifelong Yakima resident John Roche, 79, passed away December 28, 2019. He was born October 11, 1940, to Patrick and Aileene Roche. He attended Marquette High School and Gonzaga University.

John met future wife Mary Zirkle in the summer of 1962 in Selah. They were married for 55 years and had three children.

John enjoyed his rich Irish heritage. His father Patrick had immigrated from Doonbeg, County Clare, Ireland, as a very young man to join his uncle Mike Roche in a small fruit company in Yakima, which carried the family name, Roche Fruit (est. 1918). Patrick took over running the company in 1935.

The Roches first got into racing Quarter Horses in 1977. In 1980 their first crop of Thoroughbreds was foaled. Through the years John has bred many good horses, but none more talented than 1985 Washington horse of the year and 2012 Washington Racing Hall of Fame inductee Hilco Scamper, who took John and his partners (brother-in-law Larry Wright and friend George Cross) on trips to the winner's circle after stakes wins at Hollywood Park, Golden Gate Fields, Monmouth Park and Longacres. John also raced 1987 Washington champion three-year-old Soft Copy. Among the Soft Copy descendants bred by John are state champions Baja Sur (2019 Washington horse of the year) and Castinette Dancer (2014) and additional stakes winners Premo Copy (2018 Washington broodmare of the year), Seattle Best Copy, Run a Copy and Copy Begone. Other stakes winners bred at Roche Farms include My Lyon, Nagafu Six, Sir Lyon, Tough Knight and Written Statement. Tough Knight also became a successful Washington sire.

From 1984 through 2019, the Roches have been among the state's 50 top breeders on 29 different occasions, topped by fourth place finishes in both 1985 and 2011. In 2019, the Roches ranked seventh.

John had a big heart and was very generous in many areas, including but not limited to, health care and educational organizations. His favorite local charities include: St. Joseph Marquette, LaSalle, Union Gospel Mission, Gonzaga scholarships for local students, the Memorial Foundation and Catholic Charities.

As an avid sportsman he enjoyed many years of duck hunting at the Royal Duck Club with his friends and loyal dog Ivan.

He is preceded in death by his parents; and sisters, Patricia Busey and Mary Wright. John is survived by wife, Mary; sons, Patrick and Michael; daughter, Molly Roche; grandchildren, William, Alice and Johnny; as well as the Wright, Busey and Zirkle families.

Gloria Aida Taylor

Gloria Taylor, 91, passed away peacefully in her Seattle home December 16, 2019. She was born January 9, 1928, in West New York, New Jersey, and raised by Italian immigrant parents in Dabury, Connecticut.

Gloria and her mother moved to Ojai, California, in 1941 and lived there for many years.

In 1969, she married Gene Taylor and brought her family to Seattle. Gene was a rising star at the John F. Sullivan Company and became CEO and chairman of Sullivan Pane. Throughout his career, she was truly "the woman behind the man" and a proud and relentless supporter of his drive and accomplishments.

In 1986, Gene and Gloria started their own brokerage firm, Taylor Reinsurance, where Gloria served as vice president. Several years later, they sold the company to Aon Corp.

From a young age, Gloria was an avid equestrian and she always had an interest in hunter/jumpers.

In 1979, she bought a mare in an estate sale, that, unbeknownst to many, including herself, was in foal, to prominent Washington sire Table Run.

So began her new love and business that both she and Gene enjoyed. Having built a gentleman's farm in Issaquah in 1977, she expanded Fox Hill Farm into a 20-acre market-breeding horse farm and embarked on a successful career as a breeder of Thoroughbreds. At its height, the farm was home to over 45 Thoroughbreds and there was also a racing stable at Longacres. In 1983, after only five years in the business, the Taylors sold the highest-selling colt at the WTBOA Summer Sale. Six years later the couple purchased the top-priced yearling at the Washington sale. Fox Hill Farm broodmares included stakes winners Quina Reigh, Frenchie's Kay and Brave Front. Among the many winners they bred were stakes-placed Bruce's Song and Impressive

A devoted mother, she also cultivated

her passions as a sculptor and painter, was an accomplished classical pianist and a voracious reader. Gloria had wide-ranging creative skills from interior design to landscape design, to artistic pursuits of all kinds, including executive producing three independent films. She loved fishing and crabbing in the San Juan Islands. She was a gourmet cook, and later studied cooking in France to foster her love of the culinary arts. She also made her own wine with a wine group, devoting herself to becoming a knowledgeable wine connoisseur. She was a Renaissance woman in the truest sense.

Gloria and Gene Taylor had a loving 31year marriage full of family, adventure and accomplishments.

They were avid philanthropists, donating to various organizations and underwriting many benefits, including the Little Bit Therapeutic Riding Center.

Gloria also gave generously to FareStart, a Seattle-based non-profit social entrepreneurial organization that operates a job placement and training program benefiting homeless and disadvantaged men, women and youth, which she was passionate about.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Gene, in 2002; and daughter, Melissa Carter. Gloria is survived by three children, Charmaine Hartshorne, Charles Goodwin, and Amanda Goodwin; many grandchildren; great-grandchildren; and her pug Sophie. She cherished all her animals.

Troy Taylor

British Columbia Hall of Fame trainer and Pacific Northwest legend Troy Taylor, 88, passed away December 14, 2019, at his home in Langley, Washington. He was born September 11, 1931, one of five sons and two daughters born to Herb and Thera Taylor. While born in Nebraska, Troy and his siblings were raised in Payette, Idaho. They grew up on their parents' Payette farm. His father was a trainer and two of his brothers, Roy and J. D., also became trainers. J. D. was also the lead outrider at Longacres for 40 years. Another brother, Hubert, was a well-known racetrack farrier.

Troy, Roy and J. D. all served with the military during the Korean War where Troy was a machine gunner.

After his return home Troy took out his trainer's license in 1953. The three brothers bought a few horses and formed Taylor Brothers stable. In his over six-decade career at the track, Troy was leading trainer eight times at Hastings Racecourse (his first occurring in 1963 – with 34 wins – and his second in 2007, with six more titles following in the next decade). He also led the standings at Portland Meadows (in a hotly contested race with his good friend Carl Baze) and Playfair, where he led with 19 winners in 1960 and his twin brother Roy led the ranks in 1961 (26 winners) and 1962 (23 winners).

In 2010 Troy was elected to the British Columbia Racing Hall of Fame in the trainer category.

In the mid-1950s future Washington Racing Hall of Famer Howard Belvoir, then 13, had his first job in horse racing with the Troy, Roy and J. D. Taylor.

Among the many stakes winners conditioned by Troy were Washington champions Turn to Fire (1971-72), Marching Duke (1978), Brief Grief (1983) and Castinette Dancer (2011). He was also the trainer of record when Sandy Fleet (sire of Brief Grief) set the world record for 6 1/2 furlongs at Longacres in 1966. In addition, he trained Longacres stakes winners Grandy Dandy and Rainy's Joy.

Glen Todd said the affable horseman had over 130 stakes winners for Todd's North American Thoroughbred Horse Company Inc. until his retirement in October 2016. Troy and Glen had met in 1963, while Glen was covering horse racing for the *Columbian* newspaper.

Among Troy's top Canadian runners were Holy Nova, Summer Song, Commander, Taylor Said and Taylors Deal.

From 1964 through 2016 Troy is credited (on Equibase) with 5,285 starts, a 961-727-631 record and \$10,329,302 in earnings. His highest earner was Evelyn's Dancer, who won \$322,046 and was owned in partnership by North American Thoroughbred Horse Company Inc. and Mark Dedomenico LLC.

While trainer Mike Puhich's name is officially listed as the trainer of record for 2012 Longacres Mile (G3) winner Taylor Said, Troy conditioned the \$277,991 earner in each of his other six wins, including the runner's 6 1/4-length tally in the British Columbia Cup Classic 13 days before the Mile.

According to a profile written when he was inducted into the British Columbia Hall of Fame, Sandy Fleet and Turn to Fire were two of his favorites during his Longacres era and more recent favorites include eight-time stakes winner Holy Nova and Sir Gallovic, both graded stakes winners at Hastings.

Troy was loved by everybody on the backside and never had a bad word to say about anybody.

When not at the track, Troy enjoyed playing golf.

Troy and Judi were married in Tahoe on February 24, 2014. Judi had first met Troy at Longacres in 1953, when she was just 16.

Troy and Judi lived for the past few years in their home on Whidbey Island, which originally had been Judi's grandfather's – Washington Horse Racing Commissioner and Seattle Fire Chief William Fitzgerald – fishing cabin.

Troy leaves behind his wife, Judi; twin brother, Roy; and sister, Darlene Dolan.

Diane Bailey Tice

Diane Tice, 84, passed away January 5, 2020. She was born July 29, 1935, to Glen

and Ruth Bailey. Raised in West Seattle, Diane graduated from West Seattle High School and went to Seattle University where she graduated in 1959 with a degree in education. She also attended the University of Washington (1960-61).

Diane was the co-founder with her late husband Lou Tice of The Pacific Institute, which began in Seattle in 1971 and now has a "global experience" in over 60 countries,

The Tices first got involved with racing in the late 1970s and one of their first runners was stakes-placed B. N. Ticed. They also raced 2009 Longacres Mile (G3) winner and Emerald Downs horse of the meet Assessment. Among the other stakes winners that raced for Tice Ranch Stable LLC were Hoodoo Peak and Lucky Bluff. Diane also bred 2016 Washington champion three-year-old colt/gelding The Press, who continues to race for their longtime trainer Howard Belyoir.

Equibase lists the Tices' record as owners, from 2000-13, as 49-64-58 from 370 starts and with earnings of \$1,029,463,

Diane belonged to the Business and Professional Women/USA and Women Business Owners of Seattle and the Puget Sound Region.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Louis Earl "Lou;" adopted sons, Glen Tice and Michael Tice; and sister, Joan Mraz. Diane is survived by adopted children, Mary Denney Adlam, Bonnie Marie Matheu, Edward Malcom Tice and Nancy Lee Tice; foster daughter, Kady Fiddler; brother-inlaw, T. R. Blackford; 13 grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

Paul Jay Tillotson, DVM

Equine veterinarian Paul Tillotson, 86, passed away in Auburn on December 9, 2019. Previously, Paul had lived at his beloved Stonegate Farm on Lake Moneysmith, near Black Diamond.

Paul was born in 1933 in Shields, Kansas, on his great-grandfather's homestead. He attended primary school in Shields and graduated in 1952 from Dighton High School. As a young man Paul joined the International Four-H Youth Exchange program and went to work on farms and ranches in the Mexican state of Sonora. After returning from Mexico, Paul joined the US Navy and served for four years in Panama.

Paul attended Kansas State University where he graduated from its school of veterinary medicine in 1964. His sons, Jeff and Doug, were born while he was finishing his doctoral degree.

After completing his degree Paul worked at a veterinary clinic in Topeka. While living in Topeka his daughter Amy was born. In 1967 Paul accepted an opportunity to teach large animal medicine at Michigan State University.

Paul loved his family, animals and wild places. He was an adventurer and enjoyed meeting people. Paul was a reader and storyteller with broad interests. He was ambidextrous and really good with his hands. He studied art and could draw and paint. Words mattered to him and his vocabulary was large. He was concise and sometimes poetic.

Raymond Eugene Tracy Jr.

Ray Tracy Jr., 59, passed away January 4, 2020. He was born in Helena, Montana, May 21, 1961, to Raymond "Topper" and Cathy Tracy. The family moved to Miles City, Montana, when Ray was two.

By the time Ray was in sixth grade, his parents had gotten their first racehorse, after which the Tracy family would spend most of their summers at the racetrack.

From 1980 through January 4, 2020, Ray is credited on Equibase with a 1,418-1,332-1,192 record from 10,112 starts and \$20,905,665 in earnings. His first listed winner was Joyous Venture, in a maiden special weight race at Billings on August 31, 1980.

He is credited with three starts and two wins at Fair Grounds in 2020. The wins came on January 1 and 2, with Sho Pole and Chop Chop Charlie. Ray's final starter, Dimikate, finished sixth on the day of his passing.

Among Ray's Washington-based stakes winners were 1995 Washington champion two-year-old colt Knights Image and double 1995 Playfair futurity winner Red Silver Hope. He was co-leading trainer by wins (with Elwin Gibson) during the spring 1990 Yakima Meadows meet with 15 wins.

In addition, Ray saddled multiple stakes winners Sakakawea (his leading earner at \$371,850), Dayjob, Wolf Pack Jack and Deputy Flag.

Ray and his family enjoyed going to the lake or the ocean (to fish for salmon), as well as camping, hunting and skiing. He enjoyed all sports and was also a big Oakland Raiders fan.

In 2000, Ray and his family moved to Iowa where he remained working and living during his five-year battle with cancer.

To Ray, his parents, siblings, close friends and family meant everything.

He was preceded in death by his sister, Lisa. Ray is survived by his wife, Sherri; parents, Cathy and Topper; children, Tanner (Erin), Jake and Geena; grandchildren, Tatum, Aspen and Quinton; and siblings Greg (JoDee), Jim, Liz (Zack), Rita and Jennifer (Kevin).

Alfonso Velador

Alfonso Velador, 54, passed away December 31, 2019. Alfonso was born January 23, 1965, in Chihuahua, Mexico.

His first job in the US was in 1983 for Washington trainer Martin Kenney. Each December Alfonso would journey back to Mexico to spend Christmas with his family.

Alfonso is survived by his wife of 18 years, Terri Davidson Velador; mother, Paz; and six siblings.

Jonathan "Jon" Phillip Wolbert

Jon Wolbert, 58, passed away January 29, 2020, of an apparent heart attack at home in Kent. Jon graduated from Tumwater High School and after graduation began a career in the Thoroughbred racing industry. He started as a groom and then became an exercise rider before taking out his trainer's license. He trained horses for a number of years in Washington and around the country.

From 1985 through 1990, Equibase lists Jon with a 18-23-25 record from 276 starts and with \$86,470 in earnings. His first winner came with Kerra Bear at Portland Meadows on April 5, 1986, and his final winner was Cool Fortune on October 18, 1990, at Playfair.

He was also an important part of the family business as a commercial pesticide operator. Recent health issues had forced an end to Jon's working life.

He was an avid fan of the Minnesota Vikings and could most often be seen in their jerseys and gear.

Jon was also a great fan of hydroplane racing, which was a family endeavor for much of his youth, and he remained a fan throughout his life.

He preceded in death by his parents, Warren and Mary Wolbert. Jon is survived by his son, James Wolbert (Colleen); daughters, Taylor Osborne-Wolbert and Paige Osborne-Wolbert; six grandchildren, Quinton, Jadin, Kellen, Jillian, Keagan and Haven; five brothers (including Emerald Downs trainer Tyler Wolbert) and sisters; and his longtime partner, Debbie McGuire.

John Frederick "Fred" York

Fred York, 83, passed away February 22, 2020. Fred was born in Corvallis, Oregon, to George and Velma (Blanchard) York.

He worked all over the Pacific Northwest before settling in Spokane. Fred worked as a farrier and long-haul distance truck driver and had a lifelong passion of racing horses.

He was preceded in death by his parents; brother, Clifford; and sister, Linda "Sue" Huckleberry. Fred is survived by his wife of 63 years, Lois Ann; sons, Rocky, Ty, Rody and Joey; 13 grandchildren; 17 great grandchildren; and brothers, Donald, Kenneth, and Larry "Butch."

Equine In Memoriam

Del Rio Harbor

Washington champion two-year-old Del Rio Harbor, nine, was humanely euthanized on March 19, 2020, due to complications from a tendon injury.

Bred in partnership by Neal and Pam Christopherson's Bar C Racing Stables and Melodie Bultena and Doak Walker's Desert Rose Racing, Del Rio Harbor began his 44race career at Emerald Downs while racing in their silks in the summer of 2013. After taking a maiden special weight in his second start, he stepped up to stakes company and the Doris Harwood-trained youngster would have been unbeaten during the rest of his season except for a neck loss to future champion Noosito in the Daily Racing Form Dennis Dodge Stakes. As it was, Del Rio Harbor coasted to victories in the Emerald Express and WTBOAS Lads stakes and was a 1 1/4-length victor of the pivotal Gottstein Futurity.

In his six starts at three, Del Rio Harbor won the Coca-Cola Handicap and an

allowance and finished second or third in four stakes. After he was runner-up in the Emerald Downs Derby, Del Rio Harbor was turned over to trainer Marshall Allen for whom he ran third in the Grade 3 British Columbia Derby.

At four, Del Rio Harbor won two Emerald Downs allowances and placed in Emerald's Mt. Rainier Handicap and Harbour View Stakes at Hastings Racecourse, in his nine starts that year.

Del Rio Harbor was basically sidelined his entire five-year-old season with his only start coming in a late December at Turf Paradise where he was claimed for \$20,000.

At six, Del Rio Harbor continued to drop down in claiming price until he was haltered at Turf Paradise in November for \$3,000. The gallant gelding finished his year with a nearly two-length victory in a mile starter allowance.

In his final season of racing, Del Rio Harbor won a \$5,000 claiming race and a starter allowance in his first two starts of the year at the Arizona track. In the final of his three outings at Turf Paradise, in which the hard-knocking runner finished third or fourth, Del Rio Harbor was claimed for \$3,000 and sent to Oregon where he ran third in the Grants Pass Mile Stakes, but "went wrong and was pulled up" in the Art Smith Memorial Stakes on July 14 at Crooked River.

Unable to race again, horsewoman Mary Tate was instrumental in finding the gelding a new home. Jody Peetz, who owns both his two- and three-year-old full siblings – Call Her Back and Brothers, joined with his former trainer Marshall Allen to bring Del Rio Harbor back to Washington where he was turned out for the last months of his life at Brenna Loften's farm in Selah.

Del Rio Harbor was one of a trio of Washington champions from the combination of 11-time leading Oregon sire Harbor the Gold and 2015 Washington broodmare of the year Bahati, by Horse Chestnut (SAf). In addition to Del Rio Harbor, Bahati produced 2010 Washington champion iuvenile Couldabenthewhisky, who won four stakes and earned \$184,695; 2018 Washington horse of the year and champion sophomore Sippin Fire, a five-time stakes winner of \$173,602; and stakes-placed Legion of Boom, all by Harbor the Gold. In addition, Bahati's daughter Bahati Gold, by Soft Gold (Brz), won Portland Meadows' 2012 Oregon Ms. Stakes.


